#### SUMMARY

a. Until shortly after midnight 9 March 1953, the 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines, continued its aggressive defense of the sector of Line JAMESTOWN for which it was responsible. At 0007, the morning of the 10th of March 1953, the relief of the battalion by the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines, was completed, and the battalion commenced a tactical withdrawal exercise to positions on the KANSAS Line, occupying the WYOMING Line enroute after which it was helicopter lifted to the KANSAS Line. The battalion remained on the KANSAS Line until the following day when the battalion was ordered to proceed to the campsite (CS 102973) and assume the missions of left reserve battalion, division reserve regiment. After several days devoted to "Company Commander's Time" during which personal items of clothing, and equipment were inventoried and ordnance items checked and repaired, the battalion commenced a regular training schedule. During the period, a total of eighty-three (83) personnel attended schools such as Division Machine Gun, Division NCO School, and Regimental Mine Warfare School. At 12001, 9 March 1953, the security of SPOONBILL BRIDGE (CS 088972) was made a responsibility of the battalion. A force of twenty-four (24) men were billeted at that location and provided the security for the SPOCNBILL BRIDGE.

b. While occupying the JAMESTOWN Line, a normal day's operations required the provision of eight (8) listening posts (maintained by fire team reliefs), one (1) squad-sized or larger combat patrol, and from three (3) to six (6)





reconnaissance and layout patrols. While in reserve the training period was six hours per day, six days per week, with three (3) hour platoon to company-sized exercises nightly. Rear area security patrols were dispatched by the Battalion S-2, both daily and nightly, to provide additional security to the regular system of Command Post sentries and outposts.

c. During the month of March 1953, the battalion was directed to prepare plans and train its personnel for participation in MARLEX XIX which was scheduled for execution during the period 29 March 1953 through 1 April 1953. However, due to the tactical situation, from 26 - 29 March 1953, in the division's sector of responsibility, primarily on combat outpests, "Reno", "Vegas" and "Carson", MARLEX XIX was cancelled. The battalion was, at various times during the latter period, placed on a thirty (30) minute alert status and prepared to execute counter-attack plans or occupy blocking positions as designated.

## 2. CHRONOLOGY

## 282400I - 012400I

A friendly combat patrol (G-68) utilized small arms and automatic weapons fire to kill two (2) enemy and wound an estimated three (3) enemy digging in a trenchline in the vicinity of CT 017042 at approximately 0030. The enemy withdrew and friendlies moved to the objective and destroyed one (1) bunker with a satchel charge. Enemy troops did not return fire during action. Friendly artillery was called to VT the objective after the patrol had cleared.



## 052400I - 062400I

A marine combat patrol after killing four (4) enemy occupying a listening post, was attacked by an estimated enemy squad while attempting to retrieve the bodies, forcing a withdrawal from the objective. Friendlies employed small arms, automatic weapons, hand grenades, mortars and artillery. Enemy returned small arms, automatic weapons, and mortar fire. Friendly patrol suffered no casualties but counted four (4) enemy KIA, and estimated two (2) KIA and four (4) WIA.

062400I - 072400I

No contact of battalion elements was made with the enemy, but relief of the 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines from the right battalion, center regiment sector, of Line JAMESTOWN by elements of the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines, commenced.

082400I - 092400I

Relief of the battalion continued. There were no contacts with the enemy along the battalion front.

0924001 - 1024001

At 0007 the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines, assumed responsibility for the right battalion, center regiment sector, of Line JAMESTOWN. The 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines, then conducted a tactical withdrawal to the KANSAS Line, via the WYOMING Line, and was fully in position at 1335.







TASK ORGANIZATION: Annex ABLE

- 1. Purple forces have successfully accupied undefended islands in the TOKCHOK-MUNDO and established radar stations thereon to give early warning against U. S. air attacks. Because of the effectiveness of these radar inshallations in giving warning of U. S. air efforts, the 1st Marine Division has been assigned the mission of executing an operation against the islands occupied by the Purple Forces.
  - a. Annex BAKER, Intelligence.
- b. The 7th Marines assumes the mission of division reserve and lands one (1) battalion on the island of TOKCHOK-TO to seize, occupy, and defend that island in order to deny enemy early warning and to establish an air-sea rescue base thereon.
- 2. a. BLT 3/7 lands on Beach RED at H-Hour, D-Day; seizes, occupies, and defends the island of TOKCHOK-TO; three (3) rifle companies (reinf) in the assault, land by LVT's and LCVP's, one (1) rifle company land on call as reserve.
- b. For beaches, boundaries, formation, zones of action, direction of attack, administrative line, and \*bjective (See Annex CHARLIE).

- 1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION
- a. Appendix (1), Overlay of enemy dispositions and install-ations.
- b. Recent friendly agents report indicate that the island of TCKCHOK TO is defended by approximately three hundred (300) purple partisians and sympathizers. They have been organized into a quasimilitary force by the Purple Military Crew and man the islands defensive positions as well as one (1) radar station.

The defending force is known to be well-armed with Mossin Magant 7.52mm rifles and some PPSH-41 SM G's and at least two (2) HMG's (possibly M1910 MAXIM).

API reports indicated several possible mortar positions and a number of bunkers and prepared fighting positions on the high ground overlooking all possible landing beaches.

- o. This enemy is capable and is believed to be willing to put up a very determined defense.
- 2. ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF INFORMATION
- a. Does the enemy have mortars? If so, what size? Where are they located?
  - b. What is the nature of the defense?

- c. Captured enemy material and recovered friendly material will be delivered to battalion supply as soon as practicable. Battalion supply will submit a report on such captured or recovery to battalion S-2 immediately, and dispose of such material through normal channels.

AREA STUDY- TOKCHOK TO

#### 1. GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The island of TOKCHOK TO is located approximately thirty-two (32) miles SW of Inchon, one of many islands of the MARIE FORTUNNE ARCHIPELAGO. TOKCHOK TO is approximately 50 miles in length on its long sxis, the widest extremity is 20 miles. Estimated population is 4,000 mixed Japanese and Korean, prodominantly Korean.

- 2. METEROLOGICAL DATA
  - (a) See Appendix (3)
- 3. TOPOGRAPHY
- (a) The principal terrain features are a series of prominent ridges with small valleys sloping to the South and Southwest. The crest lines are of uniform height averaging 700 feet in elevation. Mt FIJO BONG, 954 feet in elevation dominates the south end of the island. Several small fresh water springs are located on
- (b) Vegetation consists of thickly wooded areas located 300 to 500 yards inland of all beaches. The wooded areas increase in density up the slopes, and near the ridge line thicken perceptively to extremely heavy growth. The trees are of hard pine and oak with average height of 9 feet, varying in diameter from 2 to 5 inches. Generally, the entire area consists of very dense mixed vegetation, pines, oaks and scrub growth. Vegetation in non-wooded areas consists of small cultivated farm patches and rice paddies in the vicinity of villages.
- (c) The entire central area of this island is covered by an impenetrable Mangrove swamp which is covered by 8 to 15 feet of water at high tides. The floor of the swamp consists of soattered outeroppings of volcanic rock and coral heads surrounded by almost bottomless quicksand. Foot or vehicular traffic is impossable between the North and South ends of the island. (For South boundary of swamp area, see ADMINISTRATIVE LINE, Operation Overlay.)

- (d) With the exception of fort trails, small villages and cultivated areas, there are no man made changes in the topography. Torchor To.
- 4. RED BEACH
- (a) The 975 yd expanse of beach located in protected cove at the southwestern part of the island is known as gopto-ribeach and will be designated as RED BEACH for this operation.
  - (b) Location
    - (1) The center of the peach is located 37°13'N 126°07'E.
  - (c) Length
- (1) There is approximately 700 yds of usable beach. The flank has a small man made rock jetty 100 ft long, with a 12 ft base and approximately 4 ft wide at the top. Both beach flanks are bounded by steep headlands with small trees.
  - (d) Width
    - (1) Average width at high tide is 60 Yds.
  - (e) Composition and Trafficability.
- ability of the beach is good on all tides. The beach has a large berm scarp for a depth of 60 ft with a granient of 1.1. Movement inland is by the berm scarp and a sand dune of approximately 275 yds. The sand dune area in the hinterland will provide good cover and concealment due to heavy growth. Matting will be required for vehicles in the backshore and hinterland areas.
  - (f) Hydrography
    - (1) Underwater gradient Offshore 1:100, Foreshore 1:25.



#### TRANSFER LINE PLAN

#### 1. GENERAL:

A Transfer Line will be established approximately 1000 yards to seaward of the beach as indicated in the Transport Area Disgram, Appendix I to Annex I (Naval Operation Plan) in order to provide additional training for the Landing Force and to facilitate unloading of cargo during periods of adverse tide.

#### 2. TRANSFER OF TROOPS:

- a. Personnel transfer operations from LCVP to LVT will be conducted in Wave 7. During reembarkation troops will transfer from LVT to LCVP at the Transfer Line. If sea conditions prevent LCVP-LVT marriages, Transfer Barges will be used to transfer troops from one craft to the other.
- b. Operations at the Transfer Line will be under the general supervision of the Central Control Officer assisted by Transfer Line Control Officer (TALLEDEGA Beat Group Commander and one assistant). Transfer Line Control Officer will insure that landing craft maneuver alongside the LVT in each instance of marriage. LVT will do no maneuvering during approach and marrying of landing craft.
- (1) When CTE 90.85 signals "Commence Reembarkation" TALLEDEGA will dispatch all LCVP in waves to the PCEC for use in transporting troops from Transfer Line to appropriate vessel.
  - c. (1) As each boat completes its transfer, it will cast off, proceed to the nearest flank of boat lane and return to parent vessel keeping well clear of incoming traffic.
    - (2) After being loaded, LVT will be dispatched to the beach by the Transfer Line Control Officer.

# 3. TRANSFER BARGES:

a. Transfer Barges will be dispatched by WHETSTONE in time to follow Wave 6 and will anchor on right and left flank of boat lane respectively by H/40. Transfer barges will be used to transfer equipment and supplies from boats to amphibious vehicles. If sea conditions necessitate, the transfer barges will be used to transfer troops from one craft to another.

# 1. GaNERAL

- a. The purpose of this training order is to prescribe a training program consistant with the operational commitments for this battalion for a four (4) week period commencing to Larch 1953.
- b. Basically, training will be in ground warfare subjects with particular emphasis on patrolling and small unit tactics. However, this battalion will also train for, and participate in, an amphibious exercise tentatively scheduled for the early part of April.
- c. It is anticipated that one or more CFX's and one FEX will be conducted during the training period.
  - Training will be accomplished to insure:
    - Progressive schooling or the individual Marine in weapons proficiency, individual conduct, patrolling, and combat tactics.
    - (2) Proficiency of all tactical units of this battalion in offensive and defensive techniques, and in night operations.
    - (3) Proper integration of replacement personnel.
    - (4) Specialist and technical training necessary to the accomplishment of the mission of this pattalion.
    - A review in the techniques of amphibious warfare.

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# 2. FLAN

- a. Training Feriods:
  - (1) Units will conduct training consistant with the immediate tactical situation and their operational commitments.

- (3) Intelligence training will be coordinated by Regimental S-2 and will conform to provisions of Division Training Lemorandum 23-52.
- (4) H&S Company will conduct schooling on general and special military subjects. A minimum of 8 hours instruction per weak will be scheduled to include small arms, safety regulations and precautions, and range firing.
- (5) Officer and Staff NCO School will be conducted by this Battalion. There will be a minimum of two hours instruction per week.
  - (6) A Forward Observer School will be conducted for all rifle platoon and squad leaders and such other personnel as unit commanders may designate. Details will be published in a separate memorandum.

# 3. INSPECTIONS

a. Training programs will be closely supervised by unit commanders. Informal inspections will be made by representatives of


During the month of March 1953, there was a total of 690 patient visits at the 3d Battalion, 7th Marines Aid Station: These are classified as following:
