Mrs C. S. Heneray and H. W. Pearce representing the City Playground Commission, appeared before City Council and requested that an additional appropriation of \$50 be granted by reason of additional equipment being installed at the playgrounds. After discussion of same, Council decided to appropriate an additional \$25 per month, beginning in March 1, 1936, by the following vote,
Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

Communication from Mrs. J. M. Albergotti, chairman of the City Playground Commission, advising City Council of the resignation of Mr. D. A. Gardner as a member and recommending the appointment of Mr. L. F. Wolfe to fill the vacancy created, was approved by the following vote,
Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

Mr. John J. Salley, local plumber, appeared before City Council requesting that the city revise their present plumbing code and same was received as information.

Upon recommendation of City Board of Health, City Council decided to put on a campaign to rid the city of rats and pay 2¢ for dead rats and 3¢ for live rats.

City Engineer Hawes, reported Mr. W. F. Fairey, Jr., who operates the Edisto Coal and Wood Company located on Seaboard Avenue on property adjoining that of the City, was using part of the City's property as a driveway and also had a gate opening on the City's property. City Clerk was instructed to write Mr. Fairey to correct these conditions immediately.

City Engineer Hawes reported that Mr. John J. Salley local plumber had not remedied faulty plumbing work installed in December at #66 E. Glover street and he had written him several times regarding this matter. City Clerk was instructed to write Mr. Salley to remedy this condition immediately or his license would be revoked.

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A BUILDING LINE ON EAST AMELIA STREET passed second reading by the following vote,

Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

City Engineer reported that the War Department had granted a permit to the City of Orangeburg for the clearing of the North Edisto river until December 31, 1936.

City Clerk was instructed to write Mr. R. B. Hair of the Atlantic Coast Line that the City would pay the costs of constructing the dam under the Coast Line Railway trestle, the cost not to exceed \$889.09. The Atlantic Coast Line railway to proceed with the work and the City to pay them this amount.

Council instructed City Clerk to notify Southern National Bank and First National Bank in Orangeburg that Mr. W. A. Cooper had been designated as official representative of the City to sign checks on funds for the building of the Tri-County Hospital.

City Engineer was authorized to extend sanitary sewers on Stanley Avenue to McKewn Street a distance of 410 feet to cost approximately \$406.25 by the following vote,

Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

Mr. F. W. Herlihy and Adjutant J. A. Shipp requested that the appropriation to the Salvation Army be increased from \$35 to \$50 a month, on account of the increased demands for assistance as well as the large number of transients passing through Orangeburg. Council appropriated an additional \$15 for the months of March and April by the following vote,

Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

Mr. F. W. Herlihy presented a petition signed by the wholesale gasoline dealers in the city of Orangeburg requesting that the ordinance requiring the filling stations to be closed from 10:30 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. each Sunday be rescinded and all filling stations be allowed to stay open during these hours. Council granted this petition by the following vote,

Yea, the Mayor, Councilman McNamara; Nay, Councilman Brailsford.

Mr. Smith A. Westberry appeared before City Council and requested that the sanitary sewers to be constructed on Stanley Avenue to continue on from McKewn Street to Highland Avenue. Mr. Hawes stated that this distance would be about 284 feet additional to cost approximately \$286.40 more, making a total of 694 feet on Stanley Avenue to cost \$692.65 if extended to Highland Avenue. Council authorized Mr. Hawes to proceed with this work at once by the following vote;

Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

Mr. John J. Salley appeared before City Council and replied to a letter received from the City Clerk instructing him to remedy plumbing conditions at 66 E. Glover Street at once. Mr. Salley stated that he would not remedy this faulty plumbing and the matter was referred to City Attorney for immediate action.

Mr. D. H. Dantzler appeared before Council representing Catherine Humpheries regarding street paving on North Boulevard. Council advised Mr. Dantzler that this matter had been brought up on several occasions by Rev. J. S. Taylor and that there was nothing the City could do about it. Council agreed to let the matter stand open until Mr. Dantzler could investigate further.

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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG TO BORROW TWENTY THOUSAND (\$20,000.00) DOLLARS AND TO PLEDGE IN RE-PAYMENT THEREOF THE EARNINGS OF THE ORANGEBURG WATER AND LIGHT PLANT.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, in Council assembled, and by authority of the same:

That His Honor, the Mayor, R. H. Jennings, be and he is hereby authorized to borrow the sum of Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars for the City of Orangeburg and to pledge in payment of the sum so borrowed the earnings of the Water and Light Plant of the said City; further that the said R. H. Jennings, as Mayor of the City of Orangeburg, is hereby authorized to execute two notes of the City of Orangeburg, each in the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars and payable, one at the Southern National Bank and the other at the First National Bank, both of this City; that the said notes shall be dated when executed and become due December 1, 1936, and bear interest at the rate of four per cent; that the City Clerk and Treasurer, L. F. Theiling, be and he is hereby instructed to attest said notes as obligations of the City of Orangeburg.

That the said notes represent loans to the City of Orangeburg for the purpose of extending its electric light and power lines, and are to be repaid out of the earnings of the water and light plant of the said City; that a copy of this resolution, attached to either or both of the said notes, shall constitute a pledge of the said earnings as may be necessary to the full payment of the said notes.

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS the City of Orangeburg by ordinance duly passed and ratified on the 26th day of November, 1936, authorized an issue of bonds not exceeding One Hundred and Twenty-five Thousand (\$125,000.00) Dollars for the construction of a municipal hospital, and

WHEREAS up to this time only Ninety-eight Thousand (\$98,000.00) Dollars of the said bonds have been issued, and

WHEREAS the said municipal hospital is now under construction with the proceeds of the sale of the said Ninety-eight Thousand (\$98,000.00) Dollars of bonds and a grant from the Federal Emergency Administrator of Public Works in the sum of Eighty Thousand One Hundred and Eighty-one (\$80,181.00) Dollars, and

WHEREAS when the bids for the construction of the said hospital were received it was found that the lowest acceptable bid exceeded the estimated cost of the project and the said City of Orangeburg guaranteed an additional sum of Eight Thousand One Hundred (\$8,100.00) Dollars in order that the contract could be let, with the expectation that subsequently additional bonds would be sold, and

WHEREAS it is desirable and necessary to make certain additions and improvements to the hospital as now being constructed and to provide for the proper equipment and furnishings for the said hospital, for which funds are not available from any other source,

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Orangeburg apply to the Federal Emergency Administrator of Public Works for an additional loan of Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars and a grant of Twenty Thousand Four Hundred and Thirty-eight (\$20,438.00) Dollars, making a total of Forty-five Thousand Four Hundred and Thirty-eight (\$45,438.00) Dollars for the said changes and additions to the said hospital and for the purchase of the said equipment and furnishings, and that the City of Orangeburg issue Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars of Hospital Revenue Bonds, which shall be

subject to all of the provisions and conditions affecting the previous issue of Ninety-eight (\$98,000.00) Dollars in bonds, including the pledge of the revenues of the said hospital for payment thereof as provided for in the ordinance of the City of Orangeburg passed on the 26th day of November, 1935, the said issue of Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars of bonds to have such maturities as shall be subsequently determined, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proceeds from the sale of the said bonds and the additional grant shall be applied and used for the following purposes:

SCHEDULE No. 7—For Association Consumers Outside City Limits.

No obligation, liability, or duty outside the city limits attaches to the city under this schedule, and service is furnished only thru organization of not less than two customers.

City will connect primary meter to association lines at City limits, and charges will be based on meter readings, with a minimum charge of \$6.00 per month, and when connected load is greater than 4 Kilo-Watt, the minimum charge will be 56c for each additional Kilo-Watt of connected load.

Every Association must name a secretary who will attend to all matters outside city limits. Bills will be rendered said secretary for entire service under contract, and must be paid as a whole by said secretary.

CONSUMER'S CONTRACT

This Agreement made and entered into in the City of Orangeburg, S. C., this.....day of.....193....., by and between the City of Orangeburg, hereinafter referred to as the City, and..... hereinafter referred to as the Consumer.

WITNESSETH:—

1. That the said City agrees to connect its service wires with the consumer's wires at.....Street, used as..... and there install a meter in a meter loop, which has been provided by the Consumer, and furnish electric current to the Consumer, under electric current rate schedule....., for a connected load of.....Kilo-Watts and the Consumer agrees to use electric current furnished by the City Plant for the purpose permitted under said schedule, and to pay for the same at the schedule rates.

2. That the said City agrees to furnish metered water through a.....inch pipe line, connecting the Consumer's pipes at.....Street to the water mains on.....Street, and the Consumer agrees to use water furnished by the plant of the said City.

The Consumer agrees that the use of Electric Current and Water shall be subject to the rules, rates and regulations of the ORANGEBURG WATER and LIGHT PLANT, as adopted by resolution or ordinance of the City Council, and to pay for service of electric current and water at the office of the ORANGEBURG WATER and LIGHT PLANT, monthly, as specified in the above mentioned rules, rates and regulations, which are hereto attached and made a part of this contract.

This Contract shall be effective until October 1st, after date, and shall be automatically renewed yearly unless notice to the contrary is given thirty days prior to its expiration by either party to this agreement.

This contract shall not be binding unless approved by the Superintendent, or acting Superintendent of the ORANGEBURG WATER and LIGHT PLANT.

RULES, RATES AND REGULATIONS

Orangeburg Water and Light Plant of the City of Orangeburg

Adopted by Resolution, March 1st, 1936

1. Bills for water and electric service will be issued monthly, and while the City will make every reasonable effort to see that each patron of the plant receives his bill, no responsibility will be assumed for non-delivery when same has been mailed at the Postoffice.

2. All charges for water and electric current service (1) are due and payable at the office of the City Clerk and Treasurer, during office hours, on the SIXTEENTH day of each month and EXCEPT WHERE SPECIFICALLY STATED TO THE CONTRARY in these regulations and rates. All bills for WATER and ELECTRIC CURRENT paid on or before the FIFTEENTH day of the month in which the bill is dated will be subject to a discount of 10%. Bills will be dated on the first day of the month and will cover service for one month prior to date of bill.

3. All services will be metered. Where meters fail to register, bills shall be arrived at by taking an average of the three most recent months.

4. The consumer making payment by mail is entitled to discount only when Postoffice cancelled stamp evidences mailing on or before the FIFTEENTH day of the month in which payment is due.

5. All bills that have not been paid on the last day of the month in which bill is dated, will have added a FIFTY CENT collection charge and will be turned over to a collector who will present the bill at the place where water and electric service is being furnished for payment. If this bill together with the collection charge is not paid service will be discontinued.

6. When service has been discontinued for non-payment as in paragraph (5) charges for all service to date become due immediately and service will not be re-instated until all bills due, together with collection charges, and cut in charge of FIFTY CENTS per service has been paid and a forfeit deposit, similar in amount to the amount paid in settlement, made with the City.

7. A deposit equal to two month's probable service will be required from all users of water and electric current; provided, that the owner of any premises served with water or electric current will be exempted from such deposits, if the owner signs the contract governing the premises to be served; provided further, that in the event that the owner rents the said premises to a tenant, the tenant will be required to make the deposit, unless the owner by signing the contract assumes all obligations in regard to service rendered said premises, and, in the event that the tenant fails to pay bills for service rendered, the owner agrees to pay the same and until said bills are paid in full, no further or future service will be furnished the said premises.

8. No claim or demand that the consumer may have against the City shall be considered as an offset against the payment for service furnished under these regulations.

9. The City agrees to use reasonable diligence in providing regular and uninterrupted supply of water and current, but in case the supply of water or current should be interrupted or fail by accident, or any cause whatsoever, the City shall not be liable for such interruption or failure.

10. No additional service will be installed until a contract, clearly stating rates, discounts, charges, etc., has been entered into.

11. Any service cut in prior to the 20th of any month, will be charged not less than the minimum charge of the appropriate schedule, and billed on the first of the succeeding month.

12. No contract shall be binding upon the City unless it has been accepted in writing by the Mayor or acting Mayor of the City of Orangeburg.

13. These Rules, Regulations and Rates are referred to in, and made a part of, each contract for water and electric service.

WATER

All water meters will be installed on the streets, which is the property of the City of Orangeburg, S. C.

No flat rate service will be furnished, EXCEPT to such carnivals and traveling shows as it would be inadvisable to meter, and then a special rate will be proposed.

The following rate is based on the usage for one month and the charge is per 100 cubic feet (1 cubic foot is equal to 7 1/2 gallons.)

.20c per 100 Cu. Ft. for the first 5,000 Cu. Ft. a month.

.16c per 100 Cu. Ft. for the next 10,000 Cu. Ft. a month.

.14c per 100 Cu. Ft. for the next 15,000 Cu. Ft. a month.

.12c per 100 Cu. Ft. for all in excess of 30,000 Cu. Ft. a month.

PROVIDED that the bill in no case be less than the following schedule of minimum rates which are based on the size of pipe supplying the service. Provided, also, that where one tap and service pipe supplies more than one building the minimum rate will be obtained by multiplying the minimum rate shown in the schedule for the size of the pipe used by the number of buildings supplied, EXCEPT that in case of factories, warehouses, etc.; used in connection with stores or general offices under one management the single minimum as stated in schedule shall apply.

ELECTRIC

1. The City will erect necessary wires, etc., to conduct electricity to the premises of the parties using current, free of charge, provided the service is not over 300 feet from a line that is available for the classes of service desired. If this distance is greater than 300 feet, the customer shall pay the actual cost incurred due to the greater distance. Provided that this shall only apply to where wires are for overhead consumption. Should other form of construction be required, it will be furnished and installed at the cost of consumer.

2. The Consumer must erect at his expense, the necessary wires and apparatus to be used in dwellings, premises, or enclosures to which the current is carried, bringing out necessary "cut-ins" leads and "meter-loop," where located by the City and be responsible for their up-keep and repairs. All work and material must meet Standard Fire Underwriters Rules. Improper fusing is positively prohibited and any damage resulting to City's property, from such causes, will be charged to consumer. The City reserves the right to refuse to give service, or if already furnishing, to discontinue it for any violation of this section.

3. Each "cut-in" shall be considered as a separate service. If there is more than one "cut-in" at the same location the consumption recorded by the meters will not be added to arrive at the rate.

4. For re-connecting any electric range, anywhere, a charge of \$5.00 will be made.

SCHEDULE No. 1—Residential Service. This Schedule applies only to private homes or individual family apartment.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE AUTHORIZATION OF ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$125,000.00) DOLLARS HOSPITAL REVENUE BONDS OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG, ORANGEBURG COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A MUNICIPAL HOSPITAL.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG, ORANGEBURG COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined and declared that an estimate of the cost of constructing a municipal hospital has heretofore been made and filed with this body at its instance by engineers heretofore employed for that purpose, and that the amount of such estimate is One Hundred Seventy-eight Thousand One Hundred and eighty-one (\$178,181.00) Dollars, which estimate is hereby adopted and approved, and that an issue of Hospital Revenue Bonds of the City of Orangeburg in an amount not exceeding One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand (\$125,000.00) Dollars is hereby authorized for the foregoing purpose.

Section 2. That in order to provide for the payment of the cost, in excess of the grant made to the said City by the United States of America, of constructing the hospital described in Section 1 hereof, there shall be issued at the present time Ninety-eight Thousand (\$98,000.00) Dollars of Hospital Revenue Bonds of said City dated October 1, 1935, of the denomination of one Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, numbered from one to ninety-eight, inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of four per centum (4%) per annum, payable semi-annually on April 1 and October 1 of each year, first interest payable April 1, 1936; said bonds shall mature in numerical order on the first day of October in years and amounts as follows: \$2,000 - 1936 to 1945, both inclusive, \$3,000 - 1946 to 1953, both inclusive, \$4,000 - 1954 to 1959, both inclusive, and \$5,000 - 1960 to 1965, both inclusive.

Pursuant to Section 24 of said Act No. 500, as amended, there are hereby created funds designated respectively "Operation and Maintenance Fund", "Depreciation Fund" and "Contingent Fund", and there are hereby pledged and ordered to be paid into said funds in each fiscal year from the remaining revenues and in the following order:

- (a) INTO THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE FUND, a sum of not less than Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars to provide for the payment of all reasonable expenses of administration, operation, and such expenses for maintenance as may be reasonably necessary to preserve the hospital in good repair;
- (b) INTO THE DEPRECIATION FUND, a sum of not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars to build up a reasonable reserve for depreciation of said hospital; and
- (c) INTO THE CONTINGENT FUND, a sum of not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars to build up a reasonable reserve for improvements, alterations and extensions to said

hospital, other than those expenses which are reasonably necessary to maintain the same in good repair as hereinafore provided for.

Any revenue of the hospital remaining after the foregoing payments may be disposed of as the governing body of said City shall determine to be for the best interest of said City.

Nothing contained in this section of this ordinance shall be deemed to prevent the transfer of any moneys contained in said "Operation and Maintenance Fund", "Depreciation Fund" or "Contingent Fund", pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by Sections 26, 27 and 28 of said Act No. 200, as amended.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the rates for the facilities and services furnished by said hospital shall, until otherwise fixed and revised pursuant to said Act No. 200, as amended, be as follows, to wit:

- (1) Operating room fee Two (\$2.00) Dollars to Twelve (\$12.00) Dollars.
- (2) Administering anesthesia Five (\$5.00) Dollars to Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.
- (3) Rooms (a) In wards Three (\$3.00) Dollars per day; (b) Class B, private, Three and 30/100 (\$3.30) Dollars to Six (\$6.00) Dollars per day; (c) Class A, private, Six (\$6.00) Dollars to Eight (\$8.00) Dollars per day.

The foregoing rates whenever necessary shall be revised so as to meet the requirements of this ordinance and said City hereby covenants and agrees at all times to maintain such rates for the facilities and services furnished by said hospital as shall be sufficient to provide for the payment of the interest on and principal of all of said bonds, and when the same become due and payable, and to create a bond and interest redemption fund therefor (including a cushion fund to assure the payment of said interest and principal) and to provide for the payment of the expense of administration and operation and such expenses for maintenance of the hospital as may be necessary to preserve the same in good repair, and to build up a reserve for depreciation of the hospital, and to build up a reserve for improvements,

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betterments and extensions to the hospital other than those necessary to maintain the same in good repair as hereinabove provided.

Section 6. Prior to the time when any revenues shall be derived from said hospital there shall be designated as custodian of such revenues a bank or trust company duly qualified and doing business within the State of South Carolina and thereafter all funds derived from the operation of said hospital, as they are received, and all other funds required to be deposited with said custodian by Section 24 of said Act No. 299, as amended, shall be deposited with said bank or trust company, as provided in said Act, and there shall be filed with such custodian written instructions complying with said Section 24 of said Act and with Section 4 of this ordinance.

Section 7. In the event the said City of any department, agency, or instrumentality thereof, shall avail itself of any facilities or services rendered by the hospital, the reasonable value of said facilities or services shall be collected from said City, department, agency or instrumentality monthly as the same accrues. The revenues so received shall be deemed to be revenues derived from the operation of the hospital and shall be deposited and accounted for in the same manner as other revenues of the hospital.

Section 8. All moneys received from the sale of any bonds issued pursuant hereto, exclusive of accrued interest, shall be applied solely for the construction of the hospital as herein authorized, provided that such proceeds, together with all moneys received as accrued interest, shall be used also to pay the interest on said bonds during the period of construction and six months thereafter.

Section 9. It is covenanted and agreed by said City with the holder, or holders, of the bonds herein authorized to be issued that it will perform all duties with reference to the hospital required by the constitution and the statutes of South Carolina, and said City hereby irrevocably covenants, binds, and obligates itself not to pledge, mortgage or otherwise encumber the hospital or any part thereof, or any revenues therefrom except in the manner set forth in Section 11 hereof, and will not sell, lease or dispose of any substantial portion of said hospital, until all the bonds issued hereunder

shall be paid in full, both principal and interest, or unless and until provisions shall have been made for the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon in full, and said City further covenants and agrees with the holder, or holders, of said bonds to maintain in good condition and to operate said hospital and to charge and collect such rates and charges for the facilities and services rendered by said hospital, within the limits prescribed by law, so that the income and revenues of the hospital will be sufficient at all times to meet the requirements as set out in Section 4 hereof.

Section 10. For the further protection of the holders of the bonds herein authorized to be issued and the coupons thereto attached, a statutory lien upon said hospital is hereby granted and created as provided in Section 8 of said Act No. 299, as amended, which statutory lien is hereby recognized as valid and binding upon said City and said hospital, and shall take effect immediately upon the delivery of any bond authorized to be issued under the provisions of this ordinance, and any holder of said bonds or any of the coupons may, either in law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceeding, enforce and compel the performance of all duties required by said Act as amended, including the making and collecting of sufficient rates, segregating of the income and revenues and the application thereof.

If there be any default in the payment of principal or interest of any of said bonds, then, upon the institution of suit by any holder of said bonds or of any of the coupons, any court having jurisdiction of the action may appoint a receiver to administer said system on behalf of said City with the power to charge and collect rates sufficient to provide for the payment of the bonds or obligations outstanding against said hospital, and for the payment of the operating expenses and to apply the income and revenues in conformity with this ordinance.

Section 11. While any of the bonds herein authorized remain outstanding, said City shall not issue any additional bonds payable from the revenues of said hospital, unless the lien of such bonds on the revenues of said hospital is made junior and subordinate in all respects to the lien of the bonds herein authorized.

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Section 12. So long as any of said bonds are outstanding the said City shall:

- (a) Maintain insurance for the benefit of the holders of the bonds herein authorized of a kind and in an amount which usually would be carried by private companies engaged in a similar type of business, and to pay the cost of such insurance from the Operation and Maintenance Fund hereinbefore described;
- (b) Keep proper books of records and accounts (separate from all other records and accounts) in which complete and correct entries shall be made of all transactions relating to said hospital. The said City will furnish the original purchaser of said bonds and to any holder or holders of any of said bonds, at the written request of such holder or holders, not more than thirty days after the close of each six months' fiscal period, complete operating and income statements of the said hospital in reasonable detail covering such six months' period, and not more than sixty days after the close of each fiscal year, complete financial statements of the said hospital in reasonable detail covering such fiscal year certified by the City's auditors; and
- (c) Grant to any holder or holders of 25% of outstanding bonds or to any purchaser from the original purchaser of 25% of the bonds herein authorized, the right at all reasonable times to inspect the said hospital and all records, accounts and data of the City relating thereto.

Section 13. The officers of said City required by this ordinance to execute said bonds are hereby authorized and directed to execute said bonds and the City Clerk and Treasurer of said City is authorized and directed to deliver said bonds to the purchaser or purchasers to whom they may be sold from time to time, pursuant to the provisions of said Act No. 299, as amended, upon receiving the purchase price to be paid by said purchaser or purchasers,

and to deposit said purchase price in a special account in a bank to be designated by this body. Said deposit shall be secured in the manner provided by Section 13 of said act No. 200, as amended.

Section 14. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this ordinance.

Section 15. All ordinances, resolutions and orders or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

Section 16. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
