Board Meetings

Regular Board meetings are typically scheduled the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 7:30 p.m. at the Orange Unified School District Education Center, 1401 North Handy Street, Building H. The purpose of the Board meeting is to conduct business. This is done in **Open Session**. Matters dealing with students and employees are reserved for **Closed Session** to provide confidentiality as required by law. Other Closed Session topics include: pending litigation, property negotiations and collective bargaining issues with employee associations.

Special Board Meetings

Meeting notices for **special meetings** are posted 24 hours in advance of the meeting and shall indicate the business to be transacted at the meeting. No other business shall be considered at the special meeting. The public will be provided an opportunity to address the item described in the notice.

Emergency Board Meetings

When the Board determines that an emergency situation exists, it may call an **emergency meeting**. The Board may hold an emergency meeting without complying with the 24-hour notice or 24-hour posting requirement for special meetings pursuant to Government Code 54956. The Board shall comply with all other requirements for special meeting during an emergency meeting.

Agendas

Agendas contain a brief description of each item to be discussed or transacted at the meeting. Copies of the agenda are available in the Superintendent's Office, Building B, at the District Education Center or on the web site at www.orangeusd.k12.ca.us/board/calendar/asp.

Consent Items are routine in nature and generally require no discussion. These items are acted upon by one motion; however, any such item may be considered separately at a Board member's request. **Action Items** are acted upon separately. Board members may ask questions or request that staff make a presentation before voting on an item. **Information/ Discussion Items** do not require action by the Board. The Board may take action only on those items listed in the printed agenda, except for emergencies.

Any member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent at least ten working days before the scheduled meeting date.

Addressing the Board

Persons wishing to address the Board are requested to fill out a "Communications to the Board" **blue card** available at the meeting on the information table. The **blue card** should be submitted to the Superintendent or the Board Clerk **prior to the start of open session**.

Speakers are limited to three (3) minutes per speaker with a maximum of twenty (20) minutes per topic. With Board consent, the Board President may modify the time allowed for public presentation. **Power Point and computer presentations are not allowed**. A speaker may not relinquish his/her time to another. When addressing the Board, speakers are requested to state their name for the record and address the Board from the podium. If the topic has been previously addressed, it is requested that the speaker's remarks be limited to **new points only**.

Speakers will be called upon at the appropriate time during the meeting. Agenda items may be addressed during the Board's consideration of the item. Items **not on the agenda** may be addressed during the "Communications to the Board" section. Items not on the agenda may not be acted on or discussed by the Board, but will be researched and responded to in any one of the following ways: 1) by telephone after research; 2) by mail after research; or 3) at a subsequent Board meeting as an agenda item.

No boisterous conduct shall be permitted at any Board meeting. Persistent boisterous conduct shall be grounds for summary termination by the Board President of that person's privilege of address.

"Any person who willfully disturbs any public school or any public school meeting is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500)."(CEC § 32210)

Complaints against employees will normally be heard in Closed Session. The District's complaint procedure should be followed before discussion with the Board.

Requests for Information

Requests for information from the Board shall be made in writing and submitted to the Superintendent's Office during regular business hours. There is a nominal charge of \$.10 per page for copies of public records.

TOPIC: CONSIDER SETTING FOR PUBLIC HEARING AND ADOPTION A RESOLUTION OF CENSURE PERTAINING TO STATEMENTS MADE BY STEVE ROCCO AT THE SEPTEMBER 14, 2006 BOARD MEETING

DESCRIPTION: Board Bylaw 9005 provides the policy and procedure for adopting a Resolution of Censure with respect to a member of the Board of Education. Board President Nichols and Board Member Poutsma have presented a request for a Resolution of Censure that the Board of Education set for public hearing and adoption for the next regularly scheduled Board meeting, October 12, 2006. A copy of the Resolution of Censure is attached.

In accordance with the provisions of Board Bylaw 9005(c), the request for a censure hearing was submitted to the Superintendent. A copy of the proposed resolution requesting censure was sent to all Board members, including Steve Rocco, by the Superintendent's office at least five business days prior to the September 28, 2006 Board meeting.

The Board Bylaw provides that upon receipt of a request for censure, the Board of Education shall determine that either:

- a. Further investigation of the charges is required; or
- b. The matter is to be set for public hearing; or
- c. No action is required.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

RECOMMENDATION: Board President Nichols and Board Member Poutsma recommend that the Board of Education set for public hearing and adoption the Resolution of Censure of Board Member Steve Rocco for the next regularly scheduled Board meeting, October 12, 2006.

RESOLUTION NO. 10-06-07

**RESOLUTION OF CENSURE OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE
ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT CENSURING BOARD MEMBER
STEVE ROCCO REGARDING STATEMENTS MADE AT THE
SEPTEMBER 14, 2006 OPEN SESSION BOARD MEETING**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has adopted a Censure Policy and Procedure pursuant to Board Bylaw 9005 providing in part that, “To maximize Board effectiveness and public confidence in District governance, Board members are expected to govern responsibly and hold themselves to the highest standards of ethical conduct;” and

WHEREAS, the Censure Policy and Procedure is intended to provide the mechanism by which the Board of Education can discipline any of its members who violate state or federal laws applicable to the District or for violation of the Board policies or bylaws of the Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, Article 1, section 1 of the California Constitution provides all people with inalienable rights including the right to privacy; and

WHEREAS, the Ralph M. Brown Act, at Government Code section 54957 specifically providing for the personnel exception to the open meeting requirements of the Act, was adopted by the California Legislature to protect the employee from public embarrassment and to permit free and candid discussions of personnel matters in closed session by a local government body; and

WHEREAS, Board Bylaw 9005(a)5 provides that each individual Board Member shall: . . . “5. Keep confidential matters confidential;” and

WHEREAS, Board Bylaw 9005(b) provides that the Board of Education shall . . . “5. Govern within Board-adopted policies and procedures;” and

WHEREAS, on September 14, 2006, Board Member Steve Rocco made the following statements during the open session of the Orange Unified School District Board of Education meeting:

Steve Rocco publicly stated he “would fire” a certain school administrator and district employee whom Steve Rocco named by name, that he “would vote to fire” this administrator, and that he would ask the administrator if he came to a school board meeting, “why aren’t you fired yet?” and

WHEREAS, Steve Rocco has publicly stated that he will not attend any closed sessions of the Board and Steve Rocco, after attending one closed session at the beginning of his term of office, has not attended any other closed sessions of the Board; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of the right of privacy in the California Constitution, Article 1, section 1, the Ralph M. Brown Act, at Government Code section 54957 and 54963, and Board Bylaws 9005(a)5 and 9005(b)5, school board members are required to discuss, deliberate and take action on matters pertaining to the discipline, dismissal, release, and performance evaluation of school district employees in closed, not public session of the school board; and

WHEREAS, students and community members, along with school administrators, district administrators and teachers, routinely attend school board meetings in the Orange Unified School District, including but not limited to, the open session Board meeting of September 14, 2006.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

(A) That the following statements were made by Steve Rocco during an open session of the regularly scheduled Board of Education meeting held September 14, 2006:

Steve Rocco publicly stated he “would fire” a certain school administrator and district employee whom Steve Rocco named by name, that he “would vote to fire” this administrator, and that he would ask the administrator if he came to a school board meeting, “why aren’t you fired yet?”

(B) Steve Rocco is censured by the Board of Education for the statements made by him that are set forth above in paragraph (A) of this Resolution. These statements were made by Steve Rocco and they are clearly in violation of the provisions of the California Constitution Article 1, Section 1, the Ralph M. Brown Act at Government Code sections 54957 and 54963, and Board Bylaws 9005(a)5, and 9005(b)5, which protect an individual’s right of privacy.

(C) It is expected that Steve Rocco will, in the future, exhibit the appropriate conduct and judgment warranted in all matters relating to School District or Board of Education affairs relating to the constitutional and statutory privacy rights of public employees of the District.

(D) Steve Rocco has been and will continue to be offered training through the California School Boards Association (CSBA) on matters pertaining to confidentiality and the requirements and obligations of school Board Members pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act, Government Code section 54950 et seq.

TOPIC: BIENNIAL REVIEW: UPDATING OF BOARD BYLAW 9270 — CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION NO. 06-06-07 AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF REVISED CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE TO BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ORANGE COUNTY FOR APPROVAL

DESCRIPTION: The Political Reform Act requires every local government agency to review its conflict of interest code biennially to determine if it is accurate or, alternatively, if the code must be amended.

Consistent with this requirement, Parker & Covert has reviewed the District's existing and previously approved Conflict of Interest Codes and determined that revisions were necessary. The attached Board Bylaw 9270 reflects those revisions.

Upon approval of the revised Board Bylaw 9270, Resolution No. 06-06-07 will be forwarded to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors along with the revised Conflict of Interest Code. The "2006 Agency Biennial Notice" must be returned to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors no later than October 1, 2006.

FISCAL IMPACT: None

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve revised Board Bylaw 9270 for a second and final reading.

Bylaws of the Board

Conflict of Interest

Governing Board members shall not engage in any employment or activity which is inconsistent with, incompatible with, in conflict with or inimical to the Board member's duties as an officer of the district. (Government Code § 1126)

Conflict of Interest Code

Governing Board members and designated employees shall adhere to the district's Conflict of Interest Code adopted pursuant to the provisions of Government Code § 87300. This code shall comprise the terms of the California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, together with a district attachment specifying designated positions and the specific types of disclosure required for each position.

Board members and designated employees shall submit statements of economic interests to the district in accordance with requirements of the Conflict of Interest Code. These statements shall be available for public inspection and reproduction. (Government Code § 81008)

Upon receiving the statements of Board members and the Superintendent, the district shall make and retain copies and shall forward the originals to the code reviewing body. Statements for all other designated employees will be retained by the district.

When reviewing and preparing conflict of interest codes, the district shall provide officers, employees, consultants and members of the community adequate notice and a fair opportunity to present their views. (Government Code § 87311)

The Board shall review the district's conflict of interest code in even-numbered years and send the code reviewing body either an amended code, by October 1 of that year, or a statement to the effect that no change is necessary. (Government Code § 87306.5)

Financial Interest

Board members and designated employees shall not be financially interested in any contract made by the Board or in any contract they make in their capacity as Board members or designated employees. (Government Code § 1090)

A Board member shall not be considered to be financially interested in a contract if any of the exceptions set forth in Government Code § 1091.5 apply.

BB 9270(b)

A Board member shall not be deemed to be financially interested in a contract if he/she has only a remote interest in the contract and if the remote interest is disclosed during a Board meeting and noted in the official Board minutes. The affected Board member shall not vote or debate on the matter or attempt to influence any other Board member to enter into the contract. A remote interest shall be any of those defined in Government Code § 1091, including the interest of a parent in the earnings of his/her minor child. (Government Code § 1091)

A Board member shall not be deemed to be financially interested in a contract between the Board member's spouse and the district provided the contract concerns the same employment as that held by the spouse when the Board member was elected or appointed, and provided the spouse has been employed in that same position for at least one (1) year prior to the Board member's election or appointment. (Government Code § 1091.5(a) (6) and 69 Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 255)

If a Board member or designated employee determines that he/she has a financial interest in a decision, this determination shall be disclosed and made part of the Board's official minutes. In the case of a designated employee, this announcement shall be made in writing and submitted to the Board. (Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18700) Pursuant to Government Code § 87105, a Board member's disclosure of a financial interest must include detail sufficient to be understood by the public, except that disclosure of the exact street address of a residence is not required. Additionally, the Board member must recuse himself or herself from discussing and voting on the matter and also leave the room until after the discussion, vote, and any other disposition of the matter is concluded, unless the matter has been placed on the portion of the agenda reserved for uncontested matters.

A Board member shall abstain from voting on personnel matters that uniquely affect a relative of the Board member. A Board member may vote, however, on collective bargaining agreements and personnel matters that affect a class of employees to which the relative belongs. (E.C. § 35107)

Gifts/Honoraria

Except as reimbursement for actual travel expenses and reasonable related subsistence, Board members ~~and designated employees~~ shall not accept from any single source in any calendar year any gifts in excess of the prevailing gift limitation specified in law. Designated employees shall not accept gifts from any single source in any calendar year in excess of the prevailing gift limitation specified in law if the employee would be required to report the receipt of the gifts from that source on his/her statement of economic interests. (Government Code ~~89501~~ § 89503)

The above limitation does not apply to any gift from an individual's spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle or first cousin or the spouse of any such person unless the donor is acting as an agent or

intermediary for a person not herein identified. (Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18932.418942)

BB 9270(c)

~~Board members and designated employees shall not accept any honorarium, which is defined as any payment made in consideration for any speech given, article published, or attendance at any public or private gathering. This prohibition does not apply to earned income for personal services customarily provided in connection with a bona fide business, trade or profession unless the sole or predominant activity of the business, trade or profession is making speeches. (Government Code 89501, 89502)~~ Board members, without regard to whether an honorarium is required to be reported, and designated employees, if required to report an honorarium on his/her statement of economic interest, shall not accept any honorarium, which is defined as any payment made in consideration for any speech given, article published, or attendance at any public or private gathering. This prohibition does not apply to earned income for personal services customarily provided in connection with a bona fide business, trade or profession unless the sole or predominant activity of the business, trade or profession is making speeches. (Government Code §§ 89501, 89502)

18730. Provisions of Conflict of Interest Codes.

- (a) Incorporation by reference of the terms of this regulation along with the designation of employees and the formulation of disclosure categories in the Appendix referred to below constitute the adoption and promulgation of a ~~Conflict of Interest Code~~ conflict of interest code within the meaning of Government Code ~~Section~~section 87300 or the amendment of a ~~Conflict of Interest Code~~ conflict of interest code within the meaning of Government Code ~~Section~~87307section 87306 if the terms of this regulation are substituted for terms of a ~~Conflict of Interest Code~~ conflict of interest code already in effect. A code so amended or adopted and promulgated requires the reporting of reportable items in a manner substantially equivalent to the requirements of ~~Article~~article 2 of ~~Chapter~~chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Government Code ~~Section~~sections 81000, et seq. The requirements of a ~~Conflict~~conflict of ~~Interest Code~~interest code are in addition to other requirements of the Political Reform Act, such as the general prohibition against conflicts of interest contained in Government Code ~~Section~~section 87100, and to other state or local laws pertaining to conflicts of interest.
- (b) Terms of a ~~Conflict~~conflict of ~~Interest Code~~interest code amended or adopted and promulgated pursuant to this regulation are as follows:
- (1) Section 1. Definitions.
 The definitions contained in the Political Reform Act of 1974, regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission (2 Cal. ~~Adm.~~ Code ~~Section~~s of Regs. sections 18100, et seq.), and any amendments to the Act or regulations, are incorporated by reference into this ~~Conflict of Interest Code~~conflict of interest code.
 - (2) Section 2. Designated Employees.
 The persons holding positions listed in the Appendix are designated employees. It has been determined that these persons make or participate in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on ~~financial~~economic interests.
 - (3) Section 3. Disclosure Categories.
 This code does not establish any disclosure obligation for those designated employees who are also specified in Government Code ~~Section~~section 87200 if they are designated in this ~~Code~~code in that same capacity or if the geographical jurisdiction of this agency is the same as or is wholly included within the jurisdiction in which those persons must report their ~~financial~~economic interests pursuant to ~~Article~~article 2 of ~~Chapter~~chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Government Code ~~Section~~sections 87200, et seq.

In addition, this code does not establish any disclosure obligation for any designated employees who are designated in a conflict of interest code for another agency, if all of the following apply;

- (A) The geographical jurisdiction of this agency is the same as or is wholly included within the jurisdiction of the other agency;
- (B) The disclosure assigned in the code of the other agency is the same as that required under ~~Article~~ article 2 of ~~Chapter~~ chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Government Code ~~Section~~ section 87200; and
- (C) The filing officer is the same for both agencies.^{1/}

Such persons are covered by this ~~Code~~ code for disqualification purposes only. With respect to all other designated employees, the disclosure categories set forth in the Appendix specify which kinds of ~~financial~~ economic interests are reportable. Such a designated employee shall disclose in his or her statement of economic interests those financial interests he or she has which are of the kind described in the disclosure categories to which he or she is assigned in the ~~appendix~~. Appendix. It has been determined that the ~~financial~~ economic interests set forth in a designated employee's disclosure categories are the kinds of ~~financial~~ economic interests which he or she foreseeably can affect materially through the conduct of his or her office.

- (4) Section 4. Statements of Economic Interests: Place of Filing.
The code reviewing body shall instruct all designated employees within its code to file statements of economic interests with the agency or with the code reviewing body, as provided by the ~~Code~~ code reviewing body in the agency's conflict of interest code.^{2/}
- (5) Section 5. Statements of Economic Interests: Time of Filing.
 - (A) Initial Statements. All designated employees employed by the agency on the effective date of this code, as originally adopted, promulgated and approved by the code reviewing body, shall file statements within ~~thirty~~ (30) days after the effective date of this code. Thereafter, each person already in a position when it is designated by an amendment to this ~~Code~~ code shall file an initial statement within ~~thirty~~ (30) days after the effective date of the amendment.
 - (B) Assuming Office Statements. All persons assuming designated positions after the effective date of this ~~Code~~ code shall file statements within ~~thirty~~ (30) days after assuming the designated positions, or if subject to State Senate confirmation, ~~Thirty~~ (30) days after being nominated or appointed.

- (C) Annual Statements. All designated employees shall file statements no later than April 1.
- (D) Leaving Office Statements. All persons who leave designated positions shall file statements within ~~thirty~~(30) days after leaving office.

(5.5) Section 5.5. Statements for Persons Who Resign Prior to Assuming Office.

Any person who resigns within ~~twelve~~(12) months of initial appointment, or within ~~thirty~~(30) days of the date of notice provided by the filing officer to file as assuming office statement, is not deemed to have assumed office or left office, provided he or she did not make or participate in the making of, or use his/ or her position to influence any decision and did not receive or become entitled to receive any form of payment as a result of his or her appointment. Such persons shall not file either an assuming or leaving office statement.

- (A) Any person who resigns a position within ~~thirty~~(30) days of the date of a notice from the filing officer shall do both of the following:

1. File a written resignation with the appointing power; and
2. File a written statement with the filing officer declaring under penalty of perjury that during the period between appointment and resignation he/ or she did not make, participate in the making, or use the position to influence any decision of the agency or receive, or become entitled to receive, any form of payment by virtue of being appointed to the position.

(6) Section 6. Contents of and Period Covered by Statements of Economic Interests.

- (A) Contents of Initial Statements. Initial statements shall disclose any reportable investments, interests in real property and business positions held on the effective date of the code and income received during the ~~twelve~~(12) months prior to the effective date of the code.

- (B) Contents of Assuming Office Statements. Assuming office statements shall disclose any reportable investments, interests in real property and business positions held on the date of assuming office or, if subject to State Senate confirmation or appointment, on the date of nomination, and income received during the ~~twelve~~(12) months prior to the date of assuming office or the date of being appointed or nominated, respectively.

- (C) Contents of Annual Statements. Annual statements shall disclose any reportable investments, interests in real property, income and business positions held or received during the previous calendar year provided, however, that the period covered by an employee's first annual statement shall begin on the effective date of the code or the date of assuming office whichever is later or for a board or commission member subject to Government Code section 87302.6, the day after the closing date of the most recent statement filed by the member pursuant to 2 Cal. Code Regs. section 18754.

- (D) Contents of Leaving Office Statements. Leaving office statements shall disclose reportable investments, interests in real property, income and business positions held or received during the period between the closing date of the last statement filed and the date of leaving office.

(7) Section 7. Manner of Reporting

Statements of economic interests shall be made on forms prescribed by the Fair Political Practices Commission and supplied by the agency, and shall contain the following information:

- (A) Investments Investment and Real Property Disclosure. When an investment or an interest in real property^{3/} is required to be reported^{4/}, the statement shall contain the following:

1. A statement of the nature of the investment or interest;
2. The name of the business entity in which each investment is held, and a general description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged;
3. The address or other precise location of the real property;
4. A statement of whether the fair market value of the investment or interest in real property equals or exceeds ~~one~~ two thousand dollars (\$2,000), exceeds ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), ~~or exceeds one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000)~~, or exceeds one million dollars (\$1,000,000).

- (B) Personal Income Disclosure. When personal income is required to be reported^{5/}, the statement shall contain:

1. The name and address of each source of income aggregating ~~two~~ five hundred ~~fifty~~ dollars (\$~~250~~500) or more in value, or fifty dollars (\$50) or more in value if the income was a gift, and a general description of the business activity, if any, of each source;
2. A statement of whether the aggregate value of income from each source, or in the case of a loan, the highest amount owed to each source, was one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less, greater than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or greater than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or greater than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000);
3. A description of the consideration, if any, for which the income was received;
4. In the case of a gift, the name, address and business activity of the donor and any intermediary through which the gift was made; a description of the gift; the amount or value of the gift; ~~a description of the gift;~~ and the date on which the gift was received;

5. In the case of a loan, the annual interest rate and the security, if any, given for the loan and the term of the loan.

(C) Business Entity Income Disclosure. When income of a business entity, including income of a sole proprietorship, is required to be reported~~6/~~, the statement shall contain:

~~E 9270(e)~~

1. The name, address, and a general description of the business activity of the business entity.

~~E 9270(e)~~

2. The name of every person from whom the business entity received payments if the filer's pro-rata share of gross receipts from such person was equal to or greater ~~that~~ than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

(D) Business Position Disclosure. When business positions; are required to be reported, a designated employee shall list the name and address of each business entity in which he/ or she is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or in which he/ or she holds any position of management; a description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged; and the designated employee's position with the business entity.

(E) Acquisition or Disposal During Reporting Period. In the case of an annual or leaving office statement, if an investment or an interest in real property was partially or wholly acquired or disposed of during the period covered by the statement, the statement shall contain the date of acquisition or disposal.

(8) Section 8. Prohibition on Receipt of Honoraria.

(A) No member of a state board or commission, and no designated employee of a state or local government agency, shall accept any honorarium from any source, if the member or employee would be required to report the receipt of income or gifts from that source on his/ or her statement of economic interests. This section shall not apply to any part-time member of the governing board of any public institution of higher education, unless the member is also an elected official.

Subdivisions (a), (b), ~~(c), (d)~~ and (ec) of Government Code Section ~~89502~~89501 shall apply to the prohibitions in this section.

~~(B) No member of the governing board of a special district or designated employee of a local government agency shall accept any honorarium.~~

- (A) No member of a state board or commission, and no designated employee of a state or a ~~state~~ local government agency, shall accept gifts with total value of more than ~~two hundred eighty dollars (\$280)~~ \$360 in a calendar year from any single source, if the member or employee would be required to report the receipt of income or gifts from that source on his/ or her statement of economic interests. This section shall not apply to any part-time member of the governing board of any public institution of higher education, unless the member is also an elected official.

In addition, a decision in relation to which a violation of the disqualification provisions of this code or of Government Code section 87100 or 87450 has occurred may be set aside as void pursuant to Government Code section 91003.

1/ Designated employees who are required to file statements of economic interests under any other agency's conflict of interest code, or under article 2 for a different jurisdiction, may expand their statement of economic interests to cover reportable interests in both jurisdictions, and file copies of this expanded statement with both entities in lieu of filing separate and distinct statements, provided that each copy of such expanded statement filed in place of an original is signed and verified by the designated employee as if it were an original. See Government Code section 81004.

2/ See Government Code Section 81010 and 2 Cal. Adm. Code Section of Regs. section 18115 for the duties of filing officers and persons in agencies who make and retain copies of statements and forward the originals to the filing officer.

3/ For the purpose of disclosure only (not disqualification), an interest in real property does not include the principal residence of the filer.

In addition, the disclosure of persons who are clients or customers of a business entity is required only if the clients or customers are within one of the disclosure categories of the filer.

Upon receipt of the statements of the Superintendent and members of the Board of Education, the ~~agency~~ Orange Unified School District shall make and retain a copy and forward the original of these statements to the Orange County Board of Supervisors. Statements for all other designated employees will be retained by the ~~agency~~ Orange Unified School District.

TOPIC: **RESOLUTION NO. 12-06-07 DECLARING SUPPORT FOR PROPOSITION 1D IN THE NOVEMBER 7, 2006 STATEWIDE ELECTION**

DESCRIPTION: The District started modernization at some of its schools using proceeds from the sale of real property and the sale of Certificates of Participation (COPs), using the revenue generated from redevelopment agencies to pay back the COPs.

The state School Facility Program (SFP) provides modernization funds for schools based on a fixed grant amount per student attending the school. The grant amount varies based on the grade level of the student (elementary, middle or high) and any special needs students (severe or non-severe). Buildings must be 25 years old to be eligible for modernization, portables must be 20 years old. Sites that do not house students, i.e., a district office or maintenance yard, are not eligible for modernization funding. The SFP program is advertised as a 60/40 program, where 60% of the modernization funding is provided by the state and the local contribution is 40%. In reality, the state portion is limited to not more than the grant amount per student times the number of students, *regardless of the condition or age of the school*. Districts are required to contribute 40% to the state 60% to obtain the state modernization dollars. Any additional funds needed to truly modernize the site and provide equity between sites are solely the responsibility of the school district.

The District has received conditional state approval for one project since the Proposition 55 modernization funds were exhausted with applications filed in November 2005. Funding for that project is deferred until the voters pass a school construction/modernization bond. The project involved the installation of new air conditioning and heating equipment (HVAC), energy efficiency controls for the HVAC equipment, improved lighting, restroom upgrades for access compliance per the Americans with Disabilities Act and new asphalt in the parking lot, tennis and basket ball courts at El Rancho Middle School. The District will be reimbursed approximately \$1.9 million for this project if the statewide proposition passes.

The District awarded the Prospect Elementary School modernization contract at the July 20th Board of Education meeting. The total project will cost approximately \$6.1

million. The scope of work includes asbestos abatement of the ceilings and floors, installation of new roofing, accessibility upgrades at each classroom and restroom, floor coverings, teaching walls, telephones, technology access, lighting, playground drainage, electrical service, sewer repairs, redesigned teacher work space, replacing accordion wall partitions between classrooms with soundproof, permanent walls and a covered lunch shelter. The District will be reimbursed approximately \$1.8 million for this project if Proposition 1D passes. Additionally, the District is in the design phase for modernization projects at Jordan and Esplanade Elementary Schools and Portola Middle School. The total project costs for these schools are estimated at \$23.1 million. If the state proposition passes, the state contribution will be approximately \$6.3 million.

To alleviate the ongoing problem of aging and inefficient HVAC equipment at Crescent Intermediate School, and Canyon and Villa Park High Schools the District has awarded a contract to replace and upgrade the HVAC equipment, controls and lighting. The value of this work is approximately \$8.0 million. The state contribution, assuming passage of the proposition, is \$4.8 million.

The Phase 2 of the modernization program includes California, Fairhaven, Lampson and Sycamore Elementary Schools and Yorba Middle School. The approximate total budget for the modernization of these schools is \$39.4 million. The state contribution is approximately \$10.9 million.

In summation, the District will receive approximately \$25.7 million from the passage of Proposition 1D for completion of the modernization program and the energy conservation modernizations through Phase 2. Ultimately, the District will be eligible for an additional \$66.9 million when the local contribution (40% match) is obtained from either the sale of property, additional COPs or by passing a local general obligation bond.

FISCAL IMPACT: Potential Revenue for Modernization..... \$25,700,000

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the board of Education approve Resolution No. 12-06-07 declaring its support of the Kindergarten – University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2006, Proposition 1D.

TOPIC: EXTENSION OF LEASE AGREEMENT DATED SEPTEMBER 10, 2003 BETWEEN VOSKI, INC. (GEO/ZOV, INC.) AND ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

DESCRIPTION: The Lease Agreement ("Lease") was originally approved in September 2003 for three years through September 30, 2006. The original Lessor was GEO/ZOV, Inc. but ownership has been assigned to Voski, Inc., a California Corporation. The leased location, 1746 Meats Ave., Orange, CA, is in a small retail center at Meats and Tustin. The location has approximately 1,260 square feet with two small office areas, one larger classroom area, a storage area and two restrooms. The student restroom is ADA compliant and the site is able to accommodate students in wheelchairs.

The purpose of the Lease is to provide a location for a job training center for developmentally disabled students. Approximately twenty students are enrolled in this class. The availability of sites to accommodate this type of program, situated close to public transportation, are limited. The students access public transportation for travel to local jobs.

The extension of this Lease is slightly below the current market rates for retail space in the area. The proposed monthly base rent is \$1.75 per square foot adjusted annually by four percent. Common area maintenance will be fixed at \$315 per month. The proposed extension is for five years with an option to extend for one additional five-year period. Monthly rent for year one will total \$2,520 (base rent of \$2,205 plus common area maintenance of \$315).

TOPIC: TEACHER ASSIGNMENT/CONSENT - VARIABLE OR SHORT TERM WAIVER

DESCRIPTION: The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 44830(a), Variable Term Waivers that have to do with educator preparation and credentialing, and with the ability of employers to employ or assign persons who are not appropriately credentialed for their assignment. Requests for Variable Term Waivers may be submitted by employing agencies to solve a temporary certification or assignment problem, when the employing agency finds there are an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the specified employment criteria for a position.

The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 80122 employing agencies to grant a short-term waiver provided it is issued one time only for any one credentialed teacher and one time only for a given classroom. They are valid for no more than one semester.

The teacher(s) whose name(s) is/are listed on the attached has/have met the requirements, has/have consented to the assignment, and has/have been judged by the site administrator to be competent in the subject matter. Likewise, all other means of credentialing and reassignment have been explored. The passage of this waiver will allow us to remain compliant with SB 435, which requires that all teachers be appropriately assigned.

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the variable term waiver as presented.

TOPIC: ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS REORGANIZATION

DESCRIPTION: The Educational Services Division currently maintains the position entitled Principal, Continuation School. This position has primary responsibility for Richland Continuation High School as well as other special programs including independent study and opportunity programs. It is recommended that the position of Principal, Continuation School (leadership range 111) be eliminated and that a new position entitled Principal, Alternative Schools (leadership range 114) be established in its place. This new position designation is to reflect continued responsibility for Richland, but also for increased responsibilities which are to include the development and expansion of the areas of alternative education, independent study, opportunity school, community day school, and the development of programs to meet the needs of additional students who might otherwise leave the District to enroll with other agencies. The development of such programs would have the effect of retaining students in the District.

FISCAL IMPACT: It is estimated that a net savings to the District will be realized based upon student enrollment retention in alternative settings. Each unit of student average daily attendance results in an estimated income of \$5,531 annually to the District. The estimated annual cost differential between the position of Principal, Continuation School (leadership range 111) and the new position of Principal, Alternative Schools (leadership range 114) is \$2,417.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the reduction of the position "Principal, Continuation School", the addition of the position entitled "Principal, Alternative Schools" assigned to leadership pay range 114, and the assignment of the incumbent to the position of Principal, Alternative Schools.


2. All employees eligible for health and welfare benefits shall be provided plans which have been determined by the joint Employee Benefits Committee within the cost limits set forth herein. For employees utilizing the HMO plans, the District's annual cost for the 2006-2007 benefits year shall not exceed \$4,264 for employee only, \$8,833 for employee plus one dependent, \$12,602 for employee plus family coverage. For employees utilizing the PPO plans, the District's annual cost for the 2006-2007 benefits year shall not exceed \$3,960 for employee only, \$8,210 for employee plus one dependent, \$11,710 for employee plus family coverage.

It is also agreed that the life insurance benefit will increase from \$20,000 to \$40,000 and that the Blue Cross prescription plans will be changed to a \$5/\$20/\$30 co-pay.

Both CSEA and the District, through their Insurance Committee, will continue to work with employees to improve their understanding of insurance plans and how effective measures may be taken regarding the use of both the medical and prescription components of all health insurance plans.



The Orange County Department of Education will provide technical assistance to Handy Elementary School and Prospect Elementary School to write a High Priority Schools Grant Implementation Plan. These schools have received a planning grant for the High Priority Schools Grant Program (HPSGP) for the 2006-2007 school year. Under the requirements of the grant, the District must contract with an outside approved provider to provide technical assistance in developing a comprehensive plan designed to improve student learning and school academic performance.

The OCDE will work with the school staff, staff and community planning team, and administrator at each school, and the district support staff to: analyze student achievement trends; analyze systems for student instruction and support; survey the staff and community to identify challenges and opportunities; provide training for the administrators and staff in the processes and protocols for collaborative teams; facilitate the development of the High Priority Schools Plan; and provide training to the staff in content areas of need identified through the analysis.
