Pursuant to adjournment a meeting of the Board of Aldermen is held this day at 7:30 O'clock P.M. President Johnson Presiding

The Minutes of the Regular Meeting July 6th 1903, were read and approved.

During the reading of the Minutes Alderman Kelly enters and takes his seat in the Board.

A Communication from the City Attorney, transmitting four Ordinances providing for certain Police regulations, was read and ordered filed.

An Ordinance Regulating the occupying of Regular Stands or places for any Business Calling upon the Public Streets is read and referred to Health and Morals Committee.

An Ordinance Providing for the Licensing of Fortune Tellers, Spirit Mediums, Seers, Soothsayers, Clairvoyants etc, is read and referred to the Health and Morals Committee.

An Ordinance empowering Police Officers to make arrests, is read and on motion of Alderman Perrin the same is adopted by the following vote to wit:

Ordinance No.

An Ordinance Empowering Police Officers To make Arrests in the City of - San Diego, California,

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Be It Ordained By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows;

Section 1. That the violation of the Ordinances of the City of San Diego, California, where there is a penalty provided by such Ordinance for such violation, is hereby declared to be a misdemeanor.

Section 2. That whenever a warrant has been or may hereafter be issued by any magistrate, charging any person with the violation of any of the provisions of any of the Ordinances of said City, where there is by such ordinance imposed a penalty for such violation, and when such warrant has come into the hands of any of the police officers of the said City, it is hereby made the duty of such police officer to arrest such person so charged, and take him before some justice of the peace within said City, to be there dealt with according to law, but if such arrest is made on a legal holiday or at such time when the justice Court in said City is not in session, then such police officer shall take such person so arrested to the police office, where such person may put up bail for his appearance at the said justice Court, at the opening of its next session, and in default of bail such party must be confined in the City jail of said City until such Court convenes, when he shall be brought before such Court to answer such charge.

Section 3. That whenever the provisions of any of the ordinances of the said City are violated, or when an attempt is made to violate any such provisions, in the presence of any police officer of the City, for the violation of which said ordinance there is by said ordinance a penalty imposed, it is hereby made the duty of such police officer to at once arrest such person without a warrant and take him before some justice of the peace within said City and file, or have filed a complaint against such person charging him with such offense, and when such arrest is made on a legal holiday or in the night or at such time, when the justice Court in said City is not in session, such officer shall take said person to the police office in said City, where such person may put up bail for his appearance at the first session of the said justice Court thereafter, when a complaint shall be filed charging such person with said offense, and in default of bail said person shall be confined in the ^{said} City jail until

such time as the said justice Court shall be in session, when he shall be brought before such Court to be dealt with according to law, when bail shall have been given.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 5. That the City Clerk of the said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to publish this Ordinance or cause the same to be published once in the City official newspaper of said City, to wit: the San Diego Union and Daily Bee, immediately after its passage and approval.

An Ordinance to prevent Drunkenness and Disorderly Conduct and Fixing a Penalty for its violation, is read and on motion of Alderman Steade the same was adopted by the following vote to wit:

Ordinance No. 1394.

An Ordinance To Prevent Drunkenness and Disorderly Conduct, and Fixing a Penalty for its violation, in the City of San Diego California.

Be It Enacted by the Common Council of the City of San Diego as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to be drunk in or upon any public street, sidewalk, highway, square, park, alley, or in any saloon, store, or other public place within the said City of San Diego, California.

Section 2. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to be guilty of any offensive or disorderly conduct in or upon any of the streets, alleys, sidewalks, squares, parks, or in any saloon or store, or other public place in said City, and it shall be unlawful for any person to make any loud noises, or disturbance, or use any loud noise or disturbance, or use any loud, noisy, boisterous, vulgar, or indecent language on any of the streets, alleys, sidewalks, square park or in any saloon or store or other public place in said City.

Section 3. That any person violating any of the

provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.) — or by imprisonment in the City jail of said City for not exceeding twenty-five (25) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. That it be and is hereby made the duty of every police officer within the said City, to arrest and bring before the justice of the Peace in said City, any person, who shall have violated any of the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 5. That Ordinance No. 306 of the Ordinances of said City approved on the 31st day of July 1895, and all ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 7. That the City Clerk of the said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the passage and approval of this ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit: The San Diego News and Daily Bee.

At this time Alderman Landis enters and takes his seat in the Board

An Ordinance Ratifying the Action of The Board of Public Works in reinsuring certain property of the City of San Diego California,

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows;

Section 1. That the action of the Board of Public Works of said City in reinsuring the City Stables and contents for three years from July 20, 1903, for the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2000.) at an expense as premium of sixty dollars (\$60); and for the reinsuring of the stables and contents of the Water Department of said City for one year from July 27, 1903, in the sum of thirteen hundred dollars (\$1300) at an expense of thirteen dollars (\$13) as premium; and for the reinsuring of the Pump house and machinery for the Water Department of said City, for one year from July 27, 1903, in the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5000) at an expense of fifty dollars (\$50) as premium, be and the same is hereby ratified and approved, and that claims therefor be allowed when properly presented to the Auditing Committee of said City.

An Ordinance Providing for the Construction of a sewer on Ivy Street in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:—

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be and the said Board is hereby authorized and directed to construct or cause to be constructed a main sewer six (6) inches in diameter running from the main sewer in the intersection of Fifth Street and Ivy Street to a point one hundred and seventy (170) feet East of the place of beginning provided that the expense thereof shall not exceed the sum of \$144.53. Said work to be done according to plans and specifications to be

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prepared by the said Board of Public Works.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and approval.

Be It Ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be and said board is hereby authorized and directed to purchase 3900 feet of lumber for the purpose of repairing the "H" Street bridge and 12000 feet of lumber for the purpose of repairing the old Town Bridge in said City, provided the expense thereof shall not exceed \$350, also, ten tons of asphaltum for repairing the paved streets in said City, provided the expense thereof shall not exceed the sum of \$180, provided that should more than \$300. worth of such material be purchased at any one time, that said Board shall advertise for bids and let a contract therefor as provided therefor by the Charter of said City.

Commencing at a point where the north line of "B" street intersects the west line of Third Street; thence running east along the said north line of "B" street to a point where the said north line of "B" street intersects the

east line of Seventh Street; these running north along the said east line of Seventh Street to a point where the said east line of Seventh Street intersects the south line of "K" Street; these near along the said north line of "K" Street to a point where the said north line of "K" Street intersects the said west line of Third Street to the place of beginning, at a rate of speed faster than four miles an hour over or across any street crossing or street intersection within the said described District.

That it be and it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to run, drive, or operate, or cause to be run, driven, or operated, or operated any automobile, steam carriage, motor bicycle, or other self-propelled vehicle operated or propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or other power at a speed faster than ten miles an hour upon any of the streets in that portion of the City of San Diego, California, bounded and described as follows, to wit:

That permission be and is hereby given to Horace G. Low, H.J. Jenkins, N. Landing, Lewis R. Kirby, S.J. Barker and T.J. Daley, the owners of the real property constituting the quarter blocks adjoining and cornering upon the crossing or intersection of Grape and Second streets in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, to grade, at their own expense, to the official grade thereof, said intersection of Grape and Second streets in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, and the sidewalks of said intersection. That when said grading shall have been performed, the City Engineer of said city shall issue a certificate setting forth the number of cubic yards of cutting and filling made by the said owners, and to certify that the same has been done to the established grade of said intersection and crossing, and that thereafter said owners shall file such certificates with the Superintendent of Streets of said city, which certificates said Superintendent of

Streets shall record in the book kept for that purpose, and thereafter, when the said Common Council orders the grading of Grape street, or Second street, or either of said streets, including said intersection and crossing, the said owners, or their successors in interest, shall be entitled to a credit on the assessment of said property adjoining and cornering on said intersection, to the amount of cubic yards of cutting and filling set forth in said certificate.

 An Ordinance prescribing certain regulations for the laying of sidewalks and curbs in the



City of San Diego, California.

B E I T O R D A I N E D, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to lay or put in place any sidewalk or curb in or upon any street in the City of San Diego, California, without first obtaining permission so to do from the Board of Public Works of said city. Any person desiring to construct a sidewalk or curb upon any street in the said City of San Diego shall make application in writing to the said Board of Public Works for permission so to do; said application shall state the place where said sidewalk or curb is to be laid, and the number of feet of said sidewalk or curb to be constructed.

Said applicant shall deposit with the said Board of Public Works the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of sidewalk and curb, or fractional part thereof where the applicant desires to construct both a sidewalk and curb at the same time in front of the same property, or ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of sidewalk, or fractional part thereof, where the applicant desires to construct a sidewalk without constructing a curb at the same time in front of the same property, or ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of curb, or fractional part thereof, where the applicant does not desire to construct a sidewalk at the same time in front of the same property, as security for the removal of all debris and surplus material from the street in said city when said sidewalk or curb has been constructed, and also as security that said sidewalk and curb shall be laid to the official grade of said street and according to specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, and that the portion of the sidewalk not paved shall be graded to the official grade thereof, provided that in lieu of the cash deposit above specified, any contractor regularly engaged in the business of laying cement or other sidewalks, or in constructing concrete, natural stone, or other curbs in the said City of San Diego, California, may furnish and deliver to the said Board of Public Works a bond payable to the said City of San Diego in the penal sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00), with two sufficient sureties, to be approved by the said Board of Public Works, as security for the removal of all debris and surplus material from the street in said city, when the said work shall have been constructed, and also as security that said sidewalk and curb shall be laid to the official grade of said street, and according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, and also as security that that portion of the said sidewalk not paved shall be graded to the official grade thereof.

That in the event any person giving such bond, or his assigns, shall fail for a period of five days, after the completion of said work, to remove said debris or surplus material from said street, or to grade the unpaved portion of said sidewalk to the official grade thereof, the said Board of Public Works shall cause said debris to be removed from said street, or the unpaved portion of said sidewalk to be graded to its official grade (as the case may be) and said person giving said bond, and the sureties thereon, shall be liable to said city, in a civil action, upon said bond, for the expenses so incurred, and in the event that said person giving said bond shall fail to construct said sidewalk or curb to the official grade of said street, or according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said city of San Diego, and shall fail or refuse for a period of ten days, after having been notified by the owner of the property, in front of which and for whom said work is being done, or his agent, to put and construct said sidewalk or curb to the official grade of said street, or

according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, then the said owner may put and construct, or cause to be put and constructed said work to the official grade of said street, and the said person giving said bond and the sureties thereon shall be liable upon said bond for all costs and expenses incurred by the owner of said property in putting and constructing said work to the official grade of said street, or according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego (as the case may be), and also for all damages suffered by said owner on account thereof.

Every bond so executed under the provisions of this ordinance is in force and obligatory upon the principal and sureties therein, to and for the said City of San Diego, and to and for the use and benefit of all persons who may be injured or aggrieved by the person giving said bond failing to remove said debris and surplus material or to construct said work to the official grade of said street, or according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, or to grade the unpaved portion of said sidewalk to the official grade thereof; and any persons so injured or aggrieved may bring suit upon such bond in his own name, without any assignment thereof; no such bond is void on the first recovery of a judgment thereon, but suit may be afterwards brought, from time to time, and judgment recovered thereon by the said City of San Diego, or by any person to whom a right of action has accrued against the principal and the sureties of said bond, until the whole penalty of said bond is exhausted; whenever such bond does not contain the substantial matter or conditions required by this ordinance, or there are any defects in the approval or filing of said bond, it is not void so as to discharge such person giving such bond and his sureties, but they are equitably bound to the said city of San Diego or any party interested, and the said city or such party may, by a civil action in court, suggest the defect in such bond, approval, or filing, and recover the proper and equitable demand or damages from the principal of such bond and the persons who intended to become and were included as sureties in such bond. In the event that the said Board of Public Works shall find and determine, after having given the contractor an opportunity to be heard, that such contractor has violated any of the provisions, conditions, or obligations of such bond, either to construct such work to the official grade of the street, or according to the said specifications therefor, or by failing to grade the unpaved portion of the sidewalk to the official grade thereof, or by failing to so remove such debris or surplus material, the said Board of Public Works shall immediately thereafter report such fact to the said Common Council and shall not thereafter issue any permit to the person giving such bond for doing any other work, or for any such work to be done by such contractor, unless specifically authorized so to do by said Common Council.

Upon said application being made and said sum being so deposited with said Board of Public Works, or said bond being so furnished, the said Board of Public Works shall issue a permit to the applicant for the construction of the work described in the application, and shall immediately notify the City Engineer of said city of the issuance of such permit, and thereafter the said City Engineer shall set the grade stakes for the construction of the said work, which stakes shall be to the official grade of said street; and thereafter said work shall be constructed according to the said grade stakes and according to the official grade of said street, and according to the specifications prescribed for doing such work by

the ordinances of said city in force at the time such work is done, and not otherwise; and the unpaved portion of said sidewalk shall be graded to the official grade thereof.

After said work shall have been so constructed, the said City Engineer shall survey the same for the purpose of ascertaining whether said work has been constructed to the official grade of said street, and that the unpaved portion of said sidewalk has been graded to its official grade, and according to the stakes set therefor. If the said City Engineer shall find that the said work has been constructed according to the official grade of said street, and that the unpaved portion of said sidewalk has been graded to the official grade, he shall issue, to the person for whom the said work has been constructed, a certificate in writing certifying that fact, but he shall not issue any certificate if he finds that the said work has not been constructed according to the official grade of said street, and the unpaved portion of said sidewalk has been graded to the official grade thereof; when the said City Engineer issues such certificate, the said Board of Public Works shall thereafter return said deposit, provided, that said surplus materials and debris have been removed from said street upon which said work has been so constructed, and the unpaved portion of said sidewalk graded to the official grade thereof. If the said City Engineer shall find that the said work has not been constructed according to the official grade of said street, or that the unpaved portion of said sidewalk has not been graded to the official grade thereof, he shall immediately notify the said Board of Public Works of that fact, and said deposit shall not be returned until said work has been constructed according to the official grade of said street, and the unpaved portion of said sidewalk graded to the official grade thereof, and a certificate issued to that effect by the said City Engineer.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that no permit shall be issued by the said Board of Public Works for the construction of bituminous rock or asphalt sidewalks or wooden curbs; nor shall a permit be issued by said Board of Public Works for the construction of a concrete or other sidewalk or curb after a resolution of intention has been passed by the Common Council of said city to sidewalk or curb that portion of the street upon which the applicant desires to construct such sidewalk or curb, without special permission having first been had and obtained from the Common Council of said city.

The said City Engineer shall charge the regular fees for making such survey and setting such stakes as prescribed by the ordinances of this city, except that no extra fees shall be charged for checking up work after the completion thereof.

This ordinance shall not apply to work done under a contract by the Superintendent of Streets under the general street law of the State of California, where an assessment is to be levied therefor.

Section 2. That it shall be and it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person, constructing any sidewalk or curb under any permit issued by the Board of Public Works of said city, as herein provided, to fail or refuse, for a period of five days after the completion of said work, to remove from said street upon which said work has been constructed, all debris or surplus material, or to lay or construct any sidewalk or curb other than to the official grade of the said street, or not according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, or to fail or refuse to grade the unpaved portion of said sidewalk to the official grade thereof.

Section 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. That any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) or by imprisonment in the city jail of said city for a period of not exceeding one hundred days (100), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 6. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the city official newspaper of said city, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

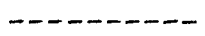

Resolution of Intention to change the grade of Twenty-fifth street in the City of San Diego, California, at certain points thereon, between the south line of "F" street and the north line of "J" street.

WHEREAS, the owners of a majority of the property affected by the herein proposed change of grade of that portion of Twenty-fifth street in the City of San Diego, California, at a point on the west line of Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southwest corner of "F" and Twenty-fifth streets; also at a point on the east line of Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southeast corner of "F" street and Twenty-fifth street; also at the northwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "G" streets; also at the northeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "G" streets; also at a point on the west line of Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "G" streets; also at a point on the east line of the said Twenty-fifth and "G" streets; also at a point on the west line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "H" streets; also at a point on the east line of Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "H" streets; also at the northwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets; also at the southwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets; also at the northeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets; also at the southeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets; also at a point on the west line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets; also at a point on the east line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets, have petitioned the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, to change the grade of that portion of the said Twenty-fifth street at said points; and

WHEREAS, the said Common Council of the said City of San Diego, California, hereby finds that said petition contains the names of the owners of the majority of property affected by the said proposed change of grade.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the said Common Council of the said City of San Diego, to change and establish the grade of that portion of said Twenty-fifth street at the points above designated, as follows:

At a point on the west line of Twenty-fifth street 150 feet south of the southwest corner of "F" and Twenty-fifth streets change the grade elevation from 175.25 feet above the datum line of levels as fixed by Ordinance No.3 of the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, entitled, "An ordinance establishing a datum line for the grading of streets in the City of San

Diego, State of California, and providing for the manner of establishing grades by ordinance," approved on the 30th day of June, 1886, to 176.75 feet above said datum line of levels.

At a point on the east line of the said Twenty-fifth street 150 feet south of the southeast corner of "F" and Twenty-fifth streets, change the grade elevation from 175.25 feet above said datum line of levels to 176.75 feet above said datum line of levels.

At the northwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "G" streets, change the grade elevation from 171 feet above the said datum line of levels to 172.25 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the northeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "G" streets, change the grade elevation from 171 feet above the said datum line of levels to 172.25 feet above the said datum line of levels. At a point on the west line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "G" streets, change the grade elevation from 163.50 feet above the said datum line of levels to 164.50 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At a point on the east line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "G" streets, change the grade elevation from 163.50 feet above the said datum line of levels to 164.50 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At a point on the west line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "H" streets, change the grade elevation from 142.50 feet above the said datum line of levels to 143.50 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At a point on the east line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "H" streets, change the grade elevation from 142.50 feet above the said datum line of levels to 143.50 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the northwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets, change the grade elevation from 130 feet above the said datum line of levels to 130.70 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the southwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets change the grade elevation from 128 feet above the said datum line of levels to 128.70 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the northeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets change the grade elevation from 130 feet above the said datum line of levels to 130.70 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the southeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets change the grade elevation from 128 feet above the said datum line of levels to 128.70 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At a point on the west line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southwest corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets, change the grade elevation from 115 feet above the said datum line of levels to 116 feet above the said datum line of levels.

At a point on the east line of the said Twenty-fifth street, 150 feet south of the southeast corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" streets, change the grade elevation from 115 feet above the said datum line of levels to 116 feet above the said datum line of levels.

The grade elevation of all points heretofore fixed by the ordinances of said city to be and remain as they now are on the said Twenty-fifth street, except as herein specified to be changed.

That there shall be a uniform ascent and descent between all points at which said grade elevations shall have been established on the said Twenty-fifth street when such grade elevation shall have been so changed.

That the districts to be benefited by the said proposed change of grade, and to be assessed to pay the cost of the same, be and the same is hereby designated and established as follows:

Commencing at a point where the west line of Twenty-fifth street intersects the south line of "F" street, thence running along the said south line of "F" street to the east line of Twenty-fourth street, thence running south along the said east line of Twenty-fourth street to the north line of "J" street, thence running east along the north line of "J" street to the west line of the alley running north and south in block twenty-one of Kimball addition, thence running north along the west line of the alley in blocks twenty-one, twenty-two, and fractional block twenty-three of Kimball's addition, and fractional block twenty-three and block twenty-four of Breed and Chases' addition, to the south line of "F" street, thence running west along the south line of said "F" street to the place of commencement.

All of said exterior boundaries being in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California.

The City Clerk of said city is hereby directed to cause this resolution of intention to be published for ten days in the newspaper in which the official notices of the Common Council of said city are usually printed and published, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee, a daily newspaper published and circulated in said city, in every regular issue of said newspaper during said period of ten days, which newspaper is hereby designated as the newspaper in which the resolution of intention shall be published in the manner and by the person required by law.

The Superintendent of Streets of said city is hereby ordered and directed, within five days after the first publication of this resolution, to cause to be conspicuously posted in the manner and form required by law within the district herein above designated as the district to be benefited by the proposed change of grade, notice of the passage of this resolution.

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Alderman Steade now moves that the action of this Board heretofore taken, in defeating an ordinance providing for the keeping of premises and streets in a clean and wholesome condition and for the repair of streets, be reconsidered, which motion is adopted by unanimous consent.

Alderman Perrin now moves that said ordinance be referred back to the Street Committee, and that said Committee eliminate therefrom certain portions of said ordinance providing for the repair of streets to the center line thereof by the property owner in front of his property, which motion is adopted.

The Joint Street Committee submits herewith the following report in the matter of the maintenance of sidewalks and curbs throughout the City:

During the large amount of street work now being done in all parts of the City, particularly the construction of sidewalks and curbs, any maintenance or repair large percentage of property owners decline to contribute sidewalks and curbs by private contract, we believe that better results will be obtained by requiring this class of work along the lines heretofore used. The system heretofore used will greatly facilitate the clearing up of streets in which sidewalks with the present manufacturing results so often seen in streets where the sidewalks and curbs are all constructed except in front of an occasional lot. We therefore recommend the adoption of an ordinance providing for the improvement of a street or portion thereof.



thereof, which improvement includes the construction of sidewalks and curbs, said Council shall for a time within which property owners desiring so to do may contract and make cures and curbs in front of their property by private contract.

And, That when the improvement of any street or portion thereof has been decided upon, and the time fixed within which property owners may do their own work, as herein before provided, it shall be the duty of the City Engineer to immediately prepare a profile of the sidewalk of said street or portion thereof, which profile shall be kept on file in the office of said City Engineer, the said City Engineer is also hereby authorized to furnish to each one applying therefor an estimate of the number of cubic yards of earth necessary to be moved to bring any portion of the sidewalk on any such street or portion thereof to its original grade. When the time within which property owners may do their own work, as herein before provided, has elapsed, it shall be the duty of the City Engineer to furnish the Council a detailed report showing the amount of sidewalking and curbing yet remaining to be done on said street or portion thereof.

And, That when the Council has decided upon the improvement of a street or portion thereof and has fixed the time within which property owners may do their own work, as herein before provided, it shall be the duty of the City Clerk to advertise the fact that said improvement has been decided upon, and that property owners desiring to contract sidewalk and curbs may do so before the date fixed by the Council; and also that said work must be commenced within a reasonable time after the date fixed by the Council; and also that the provisions of the ordinance let an accordance with the provisions of the ordinance of the City regulating the construction and finish of sidewalks and curbs for such work, said advertisement shall be published in the City official news paper not to exceed three times, when the time within which property owners may do their own work, as herein before provided, shall be the duty of the City Clerk to inform the Council of that fact.

We recommend that the former recommendation of this Committee providing for giving notice of proposed sidewalk and curbing by advertising the same, and directing the City Engineer to furnish any person asking it with a copy of the estimate of the yardage necessary to bring the sidewalks on streets proposed to be improved to the official grade, be included in this Ordinance.

We also recommend that a proviso be inserted in said Ordinance that Contractors shall not be obliged to grade sidewalks to the property line where there are permanent obstructions, such as retaining walls, buildings, fences etc, but shall grade to said obstructions.

We also recommend that the time for cleaning up a street after the completion of the work be increased and fixed at 15 days.

We also recommend that a proviso be inserted in said Ordinance that the provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to work for which permits have already been issued by the Board of Public Works, nor to work for which contracts have already been entered into prior to the approval of this Ordinance, the permits for all such work to be taken out within 10 days after the approval of this Ordinance; further that all work for which permits have already been issued or may hereafter be issued, as provided herein, must be finally completed within 90 days after the approval of this Ordinance.

We also recommend that the request of the Cement and Stone Contractors Association that the penalty clause of said Ordinance be stricken out, be denied.

We present herewith an Ordinance in accordance with this report, and recommend its adoption.

be unlawful for any person to own keep, or harbor  
any fierce, vicious, mischievous, or dangerous dog in  
the City of San Diego, California, except such dog be  
so kept within the premises of such person, that  
such dog cannot do injury to any person in the  
pursuit of lawful business.

Section 2, That it be and is hereby declared to  
be unlawful for any person, to own keep, or harbor  
any dog in the City of San Diego, California, which

disturbs the peace or quiet of any neighborhood or person within the said City of San Diego.

Section 3. That any person violating any of the provisions of either Section 1 or section 2. of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail of said City for a period not exceeding fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful and a nuisance for any fierce, vicious, mischievous, or dangerous dog to run at large in the said City of San Diego, or for any dog to disturb the peace or quiet of any neighborhood or person in said City, and the Police officers of said City are hereby authorized and directed to kill or otherwise dispose of such fierce, vicious, mischievous, or dangerous dog running at large in said City, and to kill or otherwise dispose of any dog which disturbs the peace or quiet of any neighborhood or person in said City.

Section 5. That Ordinance No. 42 of the Ordinances of said City, approved on the 26th day of November, 1889, be and the same is hereby repealed.
