Ordinance No. 1150.

An Ordinance Providing For the Grading of a Portion of El Cajon Avenue, in the City of San Diego.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as Follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be, and said Board is hereby authorized and directed to repair and improve El Cajon Avenue from Park Boulevard easterly for a distance of seven hundred feet, in accordance with the recommendation of the City Engineers of said City dated May 24th, 1902, and filed in the Office of the Clerk of said City on May 24th, 1902, provided, that said work shall be done by the street force of said City, and the expense thereof shall not exceed the sum of one hundred forty-six and 60/100 Dollars (\$146.65)

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Ordinance No. 1151.

An Ordinance Providing For the Execution of a Contract for the purchase of water by the city of San Diego, California, from the San Diego Steam Company.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the city of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the city of San Diego, California, enter into a contract for the purchase of water, fit and proper for domestic use, from the San Diego Steam Company during the months of June, July, August, September, October and November, 1902; provided, that the amount thereof shall not exceed the amount of water demanded by and necessary to supply the consumers of said city of San Diego with water over and above the amount that can at any time during said months be furnished by the pumping plants of the water distributing system of said city in Mission Valley, and that such amount shall not exceed thirty million (30,000,000) gallons in any one month during said time, and the amount to be paid therefor shall be five (5) cents per one thousand (1,000) gallons; the water furnished in any one month to be paid for in warrants of said city drawn upon the water fund thereof on the first Thursday of the following month.

That the mayor of said city be and he is hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf, in the name, and as the act and deed of said city, to enter into a contract with the said San Diego Steam Company for the purchase of said water as above provided, and that the City Clerk of said city be and he is hereby authorized to attest the execution of said contract by affixing thereto his signature and the seal of said city.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

An Ordinance Providing for the insurance of certain Steam Boilers Owned by the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as Follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be, and said Board of Public Works is hereby authorized and directed to insure or cause to be insured the steam boilers at Mission Valley at a value of Twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) for three (3) years; Provided, that the expense thereof shall not exceed the sum of one hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$175.00) for said Mission Valley boilers. Said boilers belonging to the system of Water Works of the said City of San Diego, California.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Ordinance No. 1153.

An Ordinance Providing For the Payment of Certain Bills for Material, Supplies, and Labor incurred By the Water Department of the City of San Diego, California, for the month of May, 1907.

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, has authorized the Board of Public Works of said City to incur an indebtedness in the purchase of materials and supplies in a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars (\$300.00) in any one month; and

Whereas, the said Common Council has authorized the said Board of Public Works to incur an indebtedness for labor in operating, repairing, maintaining, and conducting the system of water works of said City (besides the office force) in a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) in any one month and

Whereas, the said Board of Public Works has purchased material and supplies during the month of May, 1907, in the sum of \$1003.86, as shown by the accompanying bills numbered 2417, 2426, 2439, 2475, 2480, 2489, 2497, 2506, 2507, 2539, 2548, 2566, 2570, 2574; and

Whereas, the said Board of Public Works has incurred an indebtedness for labor during the month of May, 1907, in repairing, operating, maintaining, and conducting the said system of water works (besides the office force) in the sum of \$2055.65, being \$55.65 over and above the said sum of \$2,000.00 authorized by the said Common Council, as shown by the accompanying claims numbered 2428, 2498, 2546, 2550, 2551, 2553, and 2576.

Therefore, Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the said claims, and each of them, be and they are hereby approved and allowed, and the Auditing Committee of said City is hereby authorized to provide for the issuance of a warrant for each of said claims, when properly presented to said Committee.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

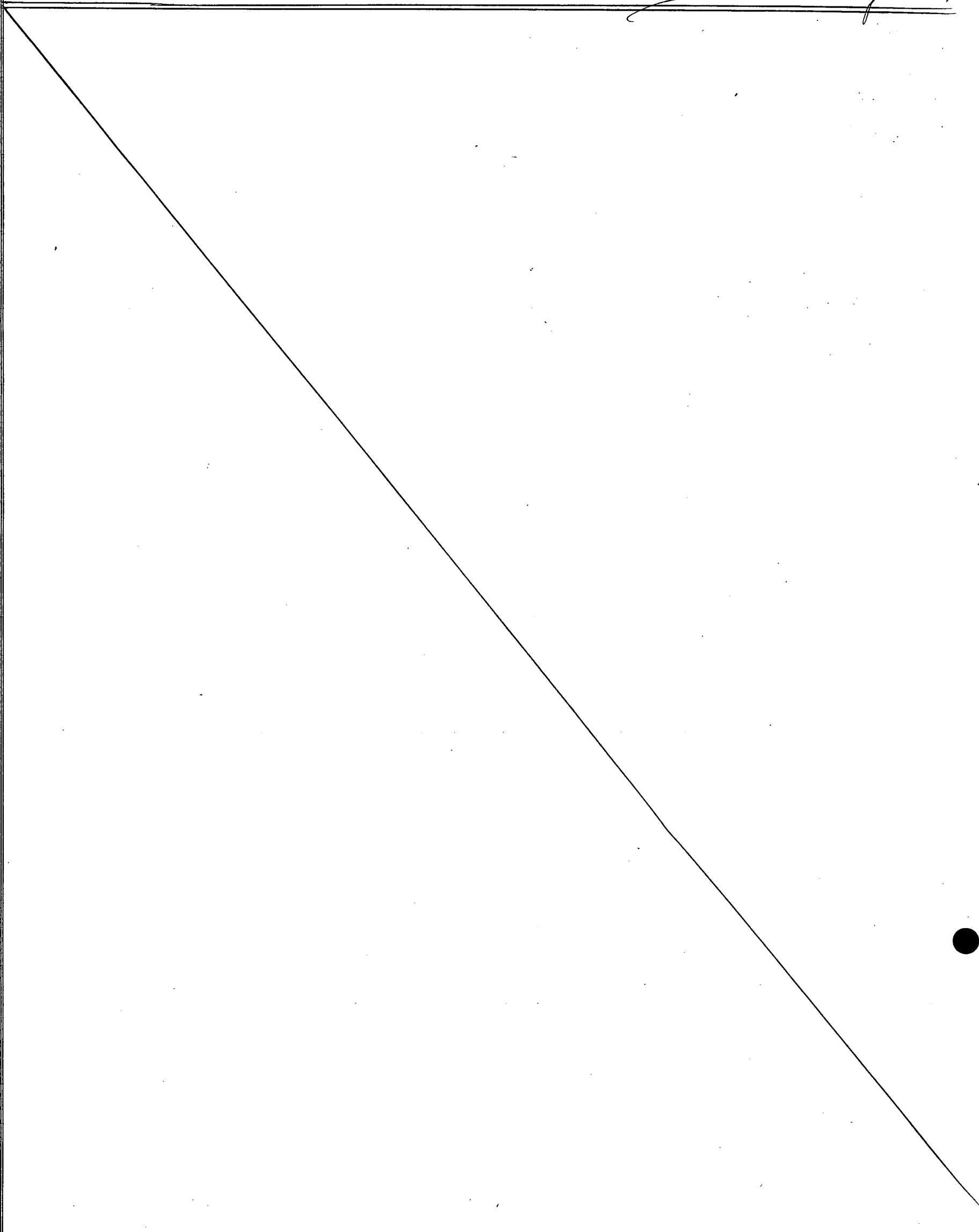

Ordinance No. 1157.

An Ordinance Providing For the vacation of the men in the Fire Department of the City of San Diego, California, For Ten (10) Days Each, and Authorizing the Employment of Extra men as substitutes in their places.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Fire Commissioners of the City of San Diego, California, and Board is hereby authorized and directed to grant to one (1) Chief Engineer, two (2) Engineers of Steamers, Nine (9) Drivers of Apparatus, and one (1) Captain of Chemical Engine in the Fire Department of said City a vacation of ten (10) days each after the approval of this Ordinance, and to employ extra men for the period of ten (10) days as substitutes for and to take the place of the said employees of the said Fire Department hereinbefore mentioned; that said vacation shall be granted without making any deduction from the salaries of the men to whom such vacation is granted, and is so given, Provided, that the expense of such extra men shall not exceed the following sums, to-wit:

Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for Chief Engineer, thirty dollars (\$30.00) for each Engineer of Steamers, Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each of said Drivers, and Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the Captain of Chemical Engine.

And Provided further, that the total sum to be paid such extra men shall not exceed the sum of three hundred and thirty-five dollars (\$335.00).

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Ordinance No. 1155,

An Ordinance Providing For the Placing and maintaining of a Telephone in the Residence of the Foreman of the pipe System of the Water Department of the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be, and said Board of Public Works is hereby authorized and directed to place and maintain, or cause to be placed and maintained a telephone in the residence of the Foreman of the pipe System of the Water Department of the City of San Diego, California, for the use of the said City of San Diego. Provided, the Expense thereof shall not exceed the sum of one and 25/100 Dollars (\$1.25) Per month.

Ordinance No. 1187.

An Ordinance Prescribing Regulations for the Placing and Maintaining of Signs in the City of San Diego, California.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person or persons, company or corporation to paint, place, post, nail, or fasten any sign or advertisement of any kind whatever upon any of the curbs, sidewalks, or shade trees in any street, highway or park in the City of San Diego, California; provided, that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to bicycle racks two feet wide and four feet high with the name of the owner and his place of business thereon placed near the edge of the curb; nor to movable signs not more than two feet wide and four feet high placed near the building and within two feet six inches therefrom; and provided further that nothing in this section shall apply to drinking fountains erected by special permission of the Common Council.

Section 2. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person or persons, company or corporation to place or maintain any sign on the front, rear, or sides of any building more than one story in height, other than frame buildings, higher than its blocking course or fire wall, or above the roof of any frame building in said city more than one story in height, unless such sign is composed of or covered with non-inflammable material; provided, that the provisions in this section shall not apply to signs already in place.

Section 3. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person or persons, company or corporation in the said City of San Diego to place or maintain any sign which shall project out from the building into the street or over the sidewalk more than thirty (30) inches beyond the face of the wall of such building, or be less than eight (8) feet above the sidewalk; provided, that the provisions of this section shall not apply to signs painted on awnings, and provided further, that all signs attached to buildings shall be securely bolted to the building to which they are fastened or upon which they are placed.

Section 4. That any person or persons, company or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the city jail of said city for a period not exceeding fifty (50) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

An Ordinance Authorizing and Directing the Mayor of the City of San Diego, California, to Execute, and the City Clerk of Said City to Attest the Execution of Quit-Claim Deeds in the Name, for and On Behalf, and As the Act and Deed of the City of San Diego, California, to the Owners of Lots in Gardner's Addition to the Said City of San Diego, and Directing the Said City Clerk to Deliver Such Deeds to the County Recorder of the County of San Diego, State of California, for Recordation.

Whereas, it appears from the records and proceedings of the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, that the President and Trustees of said City, by the vote of the duly qualified electors of the said City of San Diego at an election for that special purpose held in said City on the 25th day of May, A. D. 1868, in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled, "An Act to repeal the Charters of the City of San Diego, and to create a Board of Trustees", approved January 30th, 1852, were directed, authorized, and empowered to sell pueblo or city lands, the property of said City; and

Whereas, on the 5th day of February, A. D. 1869, the said President and Trustees in compliance with said vote and the said Act of the Legislature sold to William X. Gardner the northwest corner of Pueblo Lot 1148 of the Pueblo Lands of the said City of San Diego, containing forty (40) acres according to the official map of said City made by Charles H. Poole, A. D. 1858, and on file in the office of the Secretary of said Board; that said land was sold to the said William X. Gardner at and for the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00), and that said sum was paid to and received by said City therefor, and that by mistake of said Trustees the deed conveying said property was inadvertently and incorrectly executed to William H. Gardner as the grantee therein, instead of to William X. Gardner, which is the true and correct name of the purchaser of said property, and the deed which was executed by the said City of San Diego by its said Trustees should have been executed to William X. Gardner; and

Whereas, said 40-acre tract has since said sale and the execution of said deed been subdivided into lots and blocks and is known as "Gardner's Addition"; and Whereas, lots and blocks in said Gardner's Addition have been sold according to the map of said Addition on file in the office of the County Recorder of said County of San Diego; and

Whereas, it appears that the said City of San Diego has no right, title or interest in or to said property, or any portion thereof, except for delinquent taxes, or where said City has acquired title to the said lot or lots in said Gardner's Addition since said 40-acre tract was so subdivided; and

Whereas, the Common Council of said City is desirous of correcting any and all errors in the execution of said deed;

Now, therefore, be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

An Ordinance Amending Section 4 of Ordinance No. 706 of the Ordinances of the City of San Diego, California, Approved on the 6th Day of February, 1900.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. And it shall also be the duty of said Police Force to take charge of all horses, one-horse rigs, and teams found within said portion of said City hereinafter in this section described which are not in the personal charge of some one, or not in some way tied or fastened, either by being tied to some stationary object or to some heavy weight fastened with a strap or rope to the bit or bridle, or by having the lines so fastened to the wagon or vehicle to which said team or horse is hitched, with the brake on such wagon or vehicle set, so that the said team or horse cannot start or run without pulling said wagon or vehicle by the bit or bridle.

That portion of the said City of San Diego, California, to which this section applies, is bounded as follows, to-wit: On the north by the north line of "C" street, on the east by the west line of Eighth street, on the south by the south line of "L" street, and on the west by the west line of Fourth street.

All horses, one-horse rigs, and teams so taken charge of shall be taken to the Police Headquarter, and, if not called for within two hours, shall be turned over to the said Poundkeeper, who shall take said horses, one-horse rigs, or teams to the said City Pound to be treated as other horses that are taken up by the said Poundkeeper under said Ordinance No. 706, but the wagon or vehicle, and its contents shall be, by said Poundkeeper, delivered to the owner on demand, without any charge therefor.

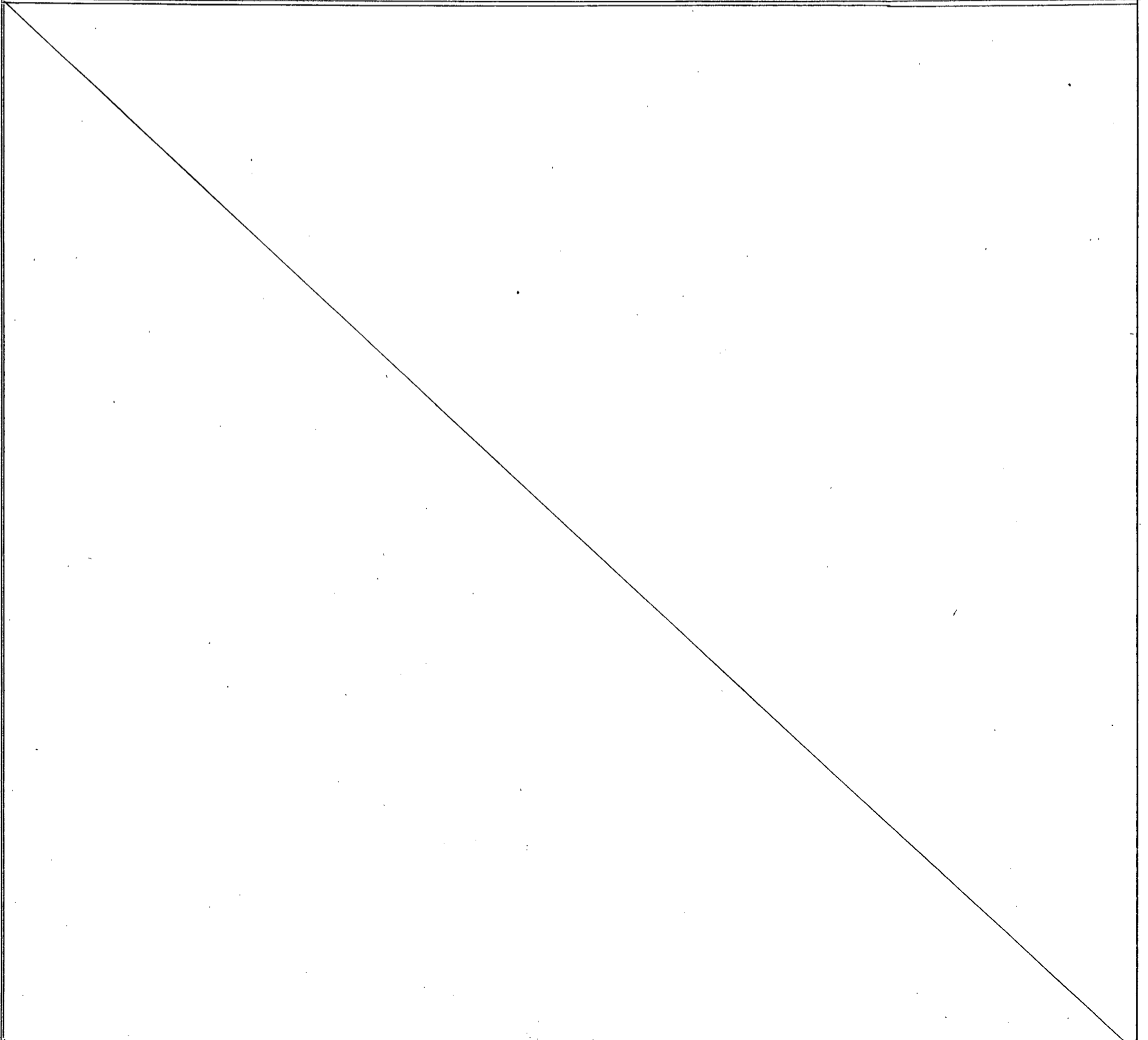

That the said Board of Public Works be and said Board is hereby authorized and directed to employ eighteen men, which number shall include a hostler, the salary of sixteen of which men, not including the said hostler and the driver of the street sweeper, shall be and the same is hereby fixed at sixty dollars (\$60.00) per calendar month, to work upon the streets, alleys, avenues, highways, plazas, parks, and public places of said City, and to care for the personal property of said City, under the direction of the said Board of Public Works and the Superintendent of Streets, as hereinafter provided: not more than nine (9) of all of said men shall belong to any one political party, which men shall be citizens and electors of said City; that the salary of the driver of said street sweeper shall be and the same is hereby fixed at sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) per calendar month; that after being employed by the said Board of Public Works, as herein provided, no one of the said men shall be removed or discharged except for incapacity, neglect of duty, dishonesty, or the conviction of a misdemeanor or crime.

Section 2. That section 11 of said Ordinance No. 675 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 11. That in addition to the employes hereinbefore provided for, the said Board of Public Works shall be and said Board is hereby authorized and directed to employ a blacksmith, who shall be a competent horse-shoer, who shall shoe all of the horses owned by said city, and perform such other work as he may be directed to perform by the said Board of Public Works and the said Superintendent of Streets; that the compensation of such blacksmith shall be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of eighty dollars (\$80.00) per calendar month, and that he shall also be subject to removal and discharge, only, as provided by section 4 of this ordinance.

Section 4. That the salary of the blacksmith's helper in the City of San Diego, California, be and the same is hereby fixed at sixty dollars (\$60.00) per calendar month.

Section 5. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

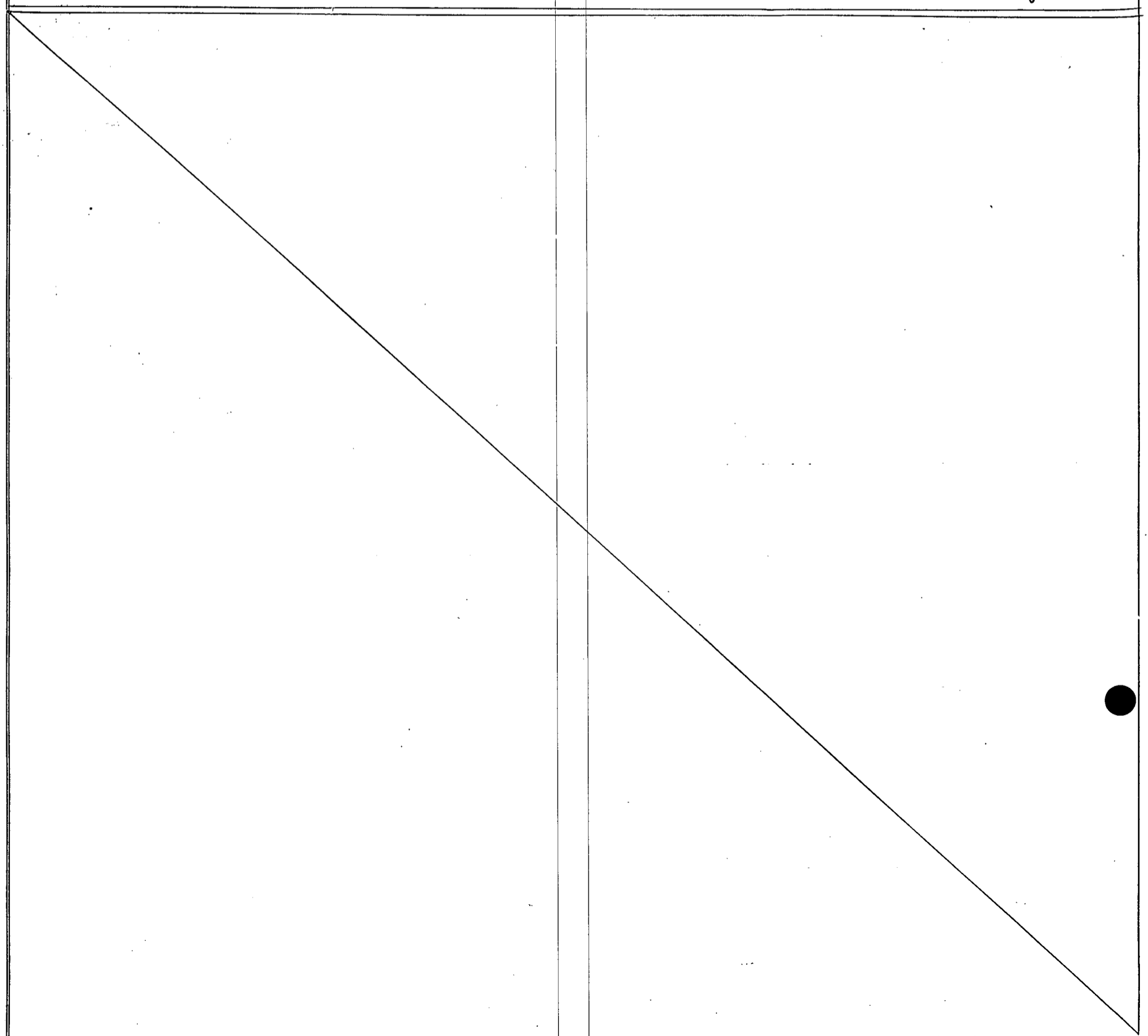

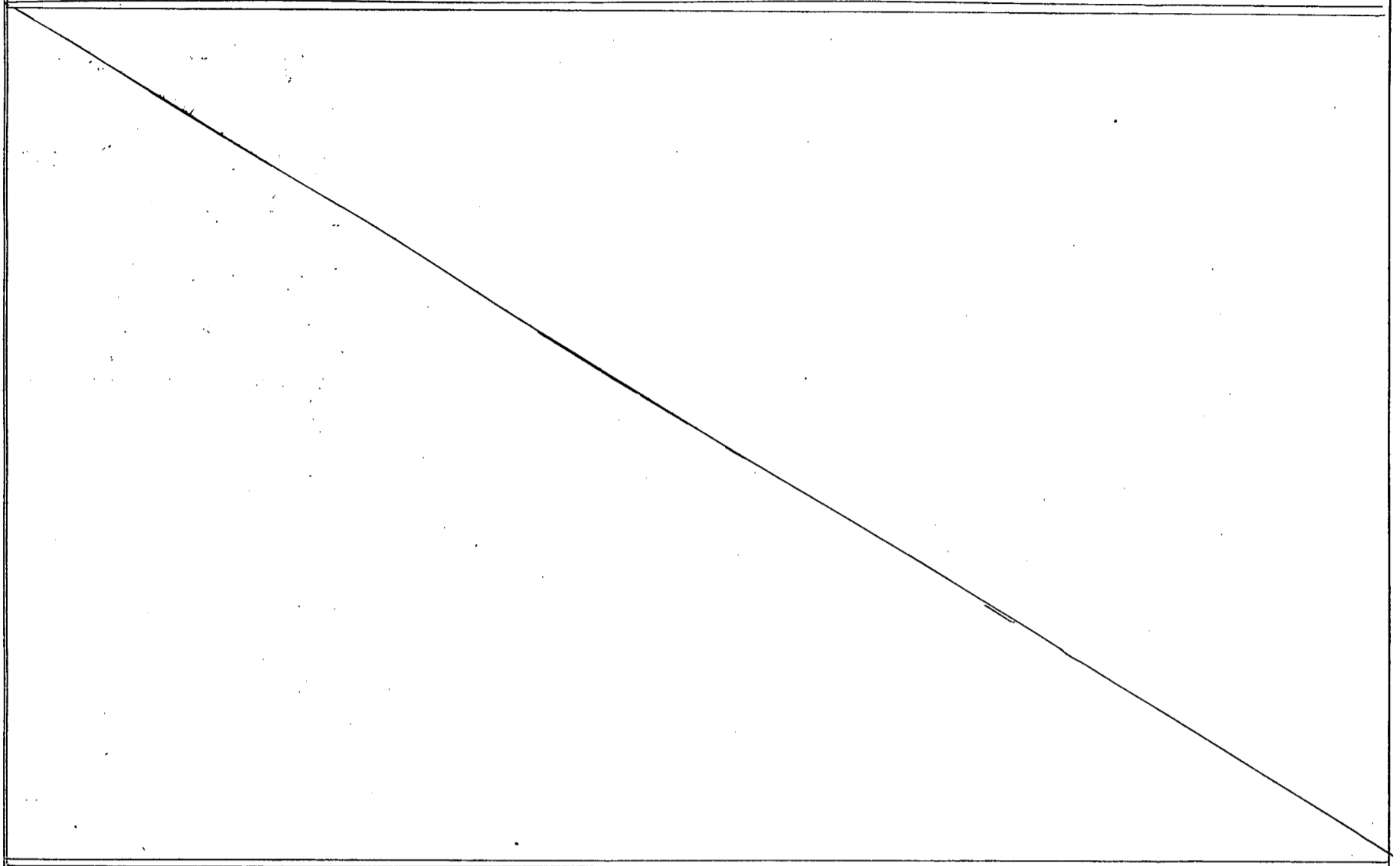

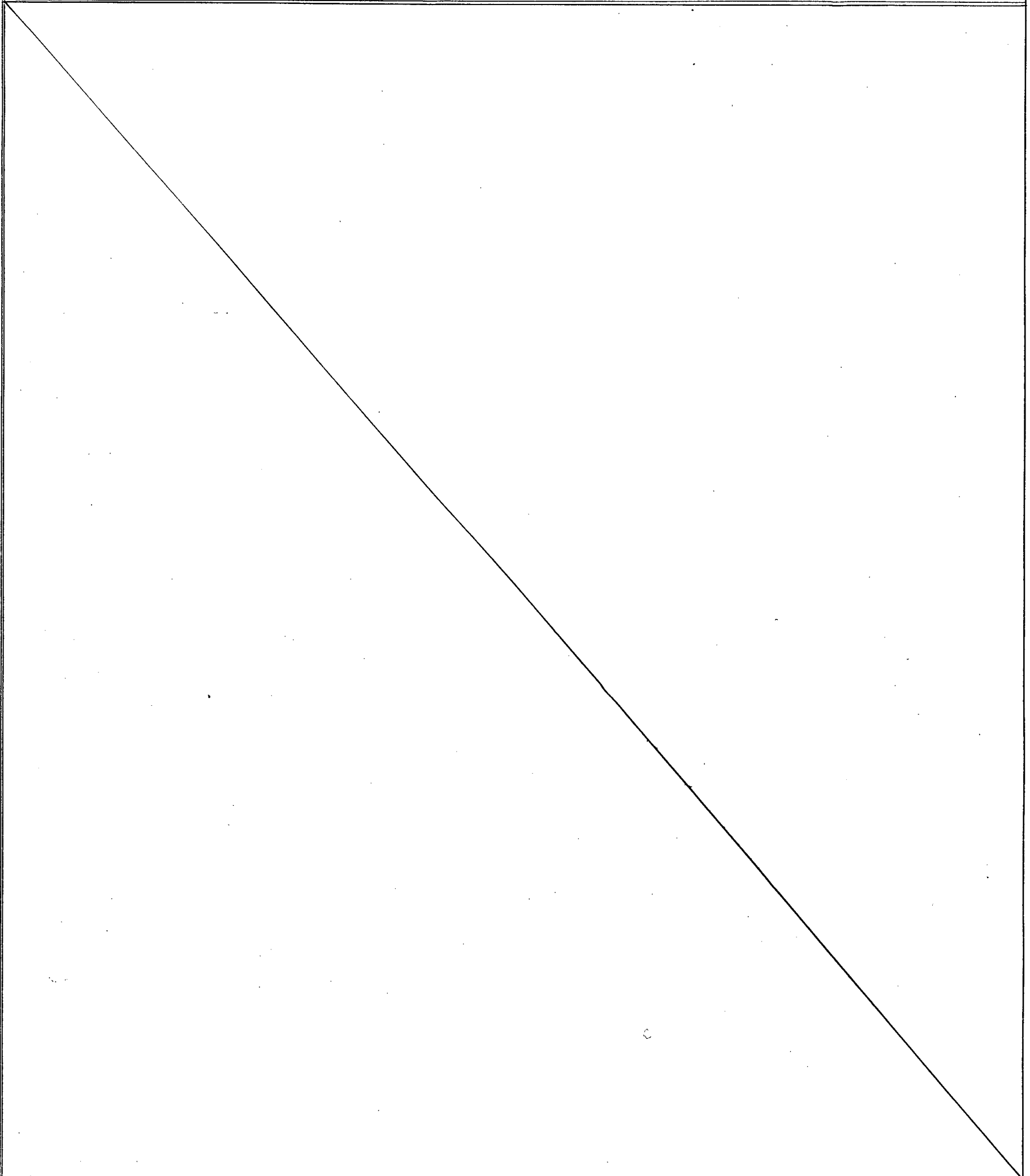

Ordinance No. 1272.

An Ordinance Providing For the issuance of Correction Deeds to Lots Two and Seven in Block Nineteen of La Playa in the City of San Diego, California.

Whereas, it appears from the records of the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego, California, and from a deed dated September first, 1870, executed by the Trustees of said City to Otto H. Meyer, and filed for record in the Office of the County Recorder of San Diego County, State of California, on the 15th day of March, 1871, and thereafter recorded in Book 12 of Deeds at page 151 et seq., that the said City sold to the said Otto H. Meyer the property hereinafter described, and received therefor the consideration expressed in said deed, which deed, however, does not correctly describe said property, in this, that said property was described therein as "Lot Number two (2) in block No. One hundred and twenty-three (123). Situate and being in what is known as "La Playa" according to Chas. H. Poole's map of 1856", when in fact said block 123 is not subdivided into lots upon said map made by Chas. H. Poole; and

Whereas, it is apparent from the records of said Board of Trustees, and from said deed, and from the maps of the said La Playa, that the said Board of Trustees intended to convey lot two in block "19" of La Playa, according to the map made by C. J. Couls, as hereinafter described; and

Whereas, it appears from a deed, dated on the 18th day of March, 1856, executed by the City of San Diego, to Thomas Whaley by the Board of Trustees of said City, (signed as individuals and not as Trustees), which deed was recorded in Book One of Deeds at Page 238 in the County Recorder's Office of the said County of San Diego, and that the said City attempted to convey lot seven in block 123 "as designated and delineated in and on the official map of said City; and

Whereas, from the said deed and the various records and maps of La Playa, it is apparent that said deed did not correctly describe said property, in this, that said property was described therein as lot seven in block 123 "as designated and delineated in and on the official map of said City", but that said City intended to convey lot seven in block nineteen of La Playa, according to the map thereof made by C. J. Couls; and

Whereas, said lot two and said lot seven have both been conveyed by mesne conveyances several times to various persons; and

Whereas, it appears that the said City of San Diego has no right, title, or interest in or to said lots, or either of them, or any portion thereof, except for delinquent taxes; and

Whereas, the Common Council of said city is desirous of correcting any and all errors in the said deeds, or either of them, or in any part of both, or either of said deeds, Now, therefore,

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor of the City of San Diego, California, be, and he is hereby Authorized and Empowered, and instructed to execute and acknowledge deeds correcting said errors for and on behalf, in the name, and as the act and deed of the said City of San Diego, and that the City Clerk of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to attest the execution of such deeds so executed by the Mayor of said City, by endorsing his name thereon and affixing the Corporate Seal of said City thereto, to all persons who are the Owners of said lots, or either one of them, or any part or portion thereof, or any interest therein (not including however, the City of San Diego as the Owner), and that the City Clerk of said City be and he is hereby further authorized and directed to deliver said deeds to the Owners of said property, viz: the grantees in said deeds to be so executed by the said Mayor of said City, by delivering said deeds, and each one of them, to the County Recorder of the said County of San Diego, State of California, for the Owners of said property, and instructing him to record the same.

That said deed to said lot two shall contain a recital that it is made pursuant to this Ordinance to correct a defect in the description in the said deed made by the said City to the said Otto H. Meyer, bearing date the first day of September, 1870, and recorded on the 28th day of March, 1871, in the Office of the County Recorder of the said County of San Diego, State of California, and that the said City of San Diego does not convey any interest which said City has acquired in said property for delinquent taxes since said deed dated September first, 1870, was so executed. It being the intention of the said Common Council that said deed to said lot two, to be executed by the Mayor of said City, shall correct any and all errors in the description and in the execution of said deed so executed in the said year 1870.

That said deed to said lot seven shall contain a recital that it is made pursuant to this Ordinance to correct a defect in the description and in the execution of the said deed made by said City to Thomas Whaley on the 18th day of March, 1856, and recorded in the Office of the County Recorder of the said County of San Diego in Book One of Deeds on Page 238, and shall also recite that the said City of San Diego does not convey any interest which said City has acquired in said lot seven for delinquent taxes, or otherwise, since the said deed was so executed on the

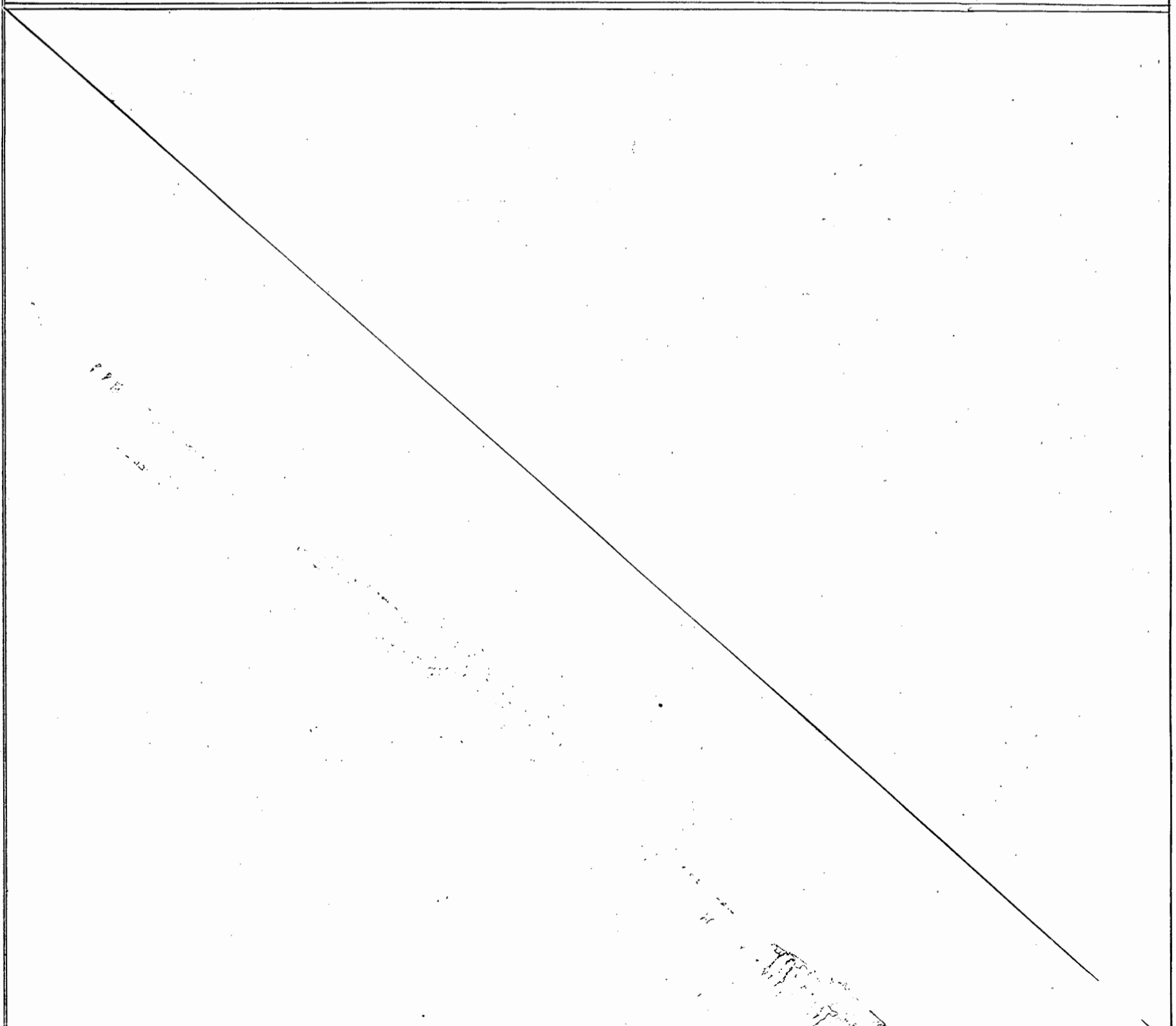

n Ordinance Providing for the Holding and Giving Notice of a City Primary Election to Be Held in the City of San Diego, California, on Tuesday, the 24th Day of February, A. D., 1903; Containing the Names of the Political Parties Which Are Entitled to Nominate Candidates for Public Offices by Convention, and Which Are Entitled to Participate in the Said City Primary Election Next, Ensuing, the Offices for Which Nominations May Be Made; a Designation of Precincts; the Location of Polling Places; the Names of Said Primary Election Officers, Together With the Number of Delegates and the Apportionment Thereof, Which Each Party is Entitled to Elect from the Said City or Any Ward or Precinct Therein; and Fixing the Compensation of Said Election Officers, and Authorizing and Directing the City Clerk of Said City to Prepare and Have Printed the Requisite Number of Ballots, and to Procure Other Election Supplies as Required by Law.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council, of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That in accordance with and pursuant to an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, approved March 23d, 1901 (Statutes of 1901, page 606 et seq.), a City Primary Election will be held in the election precincts of the City of San Diego, California, hereinafter particularly named, on Tuesday, the 24th day of February, 1903, at which City Primary Election the qualified electors of the said voting precincts of the said City of San Diego are to vote for delegates to the City Conventions and subdivisions thereof; that the following named political parties have complied with the provisions of Section 1361 of the Political Code of the State of California, and are entitled to participate in the said City Primary Election, and to elect delegates to said City Conventions and subdivisions thereof, to-wit: "The Republican Party" and "The Democratic Party";

That the delegates, to be elected at said City Primary Election to represent the respective political parties aforesaid at the City Conventions of said respective political parties, and subdivisions thereof, are to nominate candidates for public offices to be voted for within the said City of San Diego, California, at the next ensuing general municipal election to be held within said City on April 7th, 1903, and to make nominations for candidates for public offices to be voted for at any special municipal election within the same territory, which may be called within two years after the said City Primary Election, for the purpose of filling any vacancy in any public office for which such convention is entitled to make nominations, and to elect the City Central Committees of said political parties, respectively, which shall be in each instance the governing body of said political parties, respectively, in said City of San Diego, and for the transaction of such other business as may come before said City conventions or any subdivisions thereof;

That said delegates elected to serve in the said City Conventions, aforesaid, shall serve in said City Conventions for the purpose of nominating a Mayor of the City of San Diego, a City Treasurer, four members of the Board of Aldermen of the Common Council of said City for the full term of four years, one member of the Board of Aldermen of the Common Council of said City to fill the unexpired term of G. M. Hawley, and one member of the said Board of Aldermen of said Common Council to fill the unexpired term of Sam'l G. Ingle; also five trustees of the San Diego Public Library; and said delegates so elected shall also serve in all the respective subdivisions of such local conventions for the purpose of nominating members of the Board of Delegates of the Common Council of said City as follows:

An Ordinance Providing For Continuing the Employment of the Assistants in the City Engineers Office in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, and the City Engineer of said City be and they are hereby Authorized and directed to continue to employ one assistant engineer and two additional employees for an additional period of thirty (30) days over and beyond that granted by Ordinance No. 1242 of the Ordinances of said City, entitled, "An Ordinance providing for the employment of Assistants in the City Engineers Office of the City of San Diego, California," approved on the 5th day of January, 1903; provided, that the expense thereof shall not exceed the sum of \$225.00.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 3. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego be, and he is hereby Authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this Ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the City Official Newspaper of said City, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

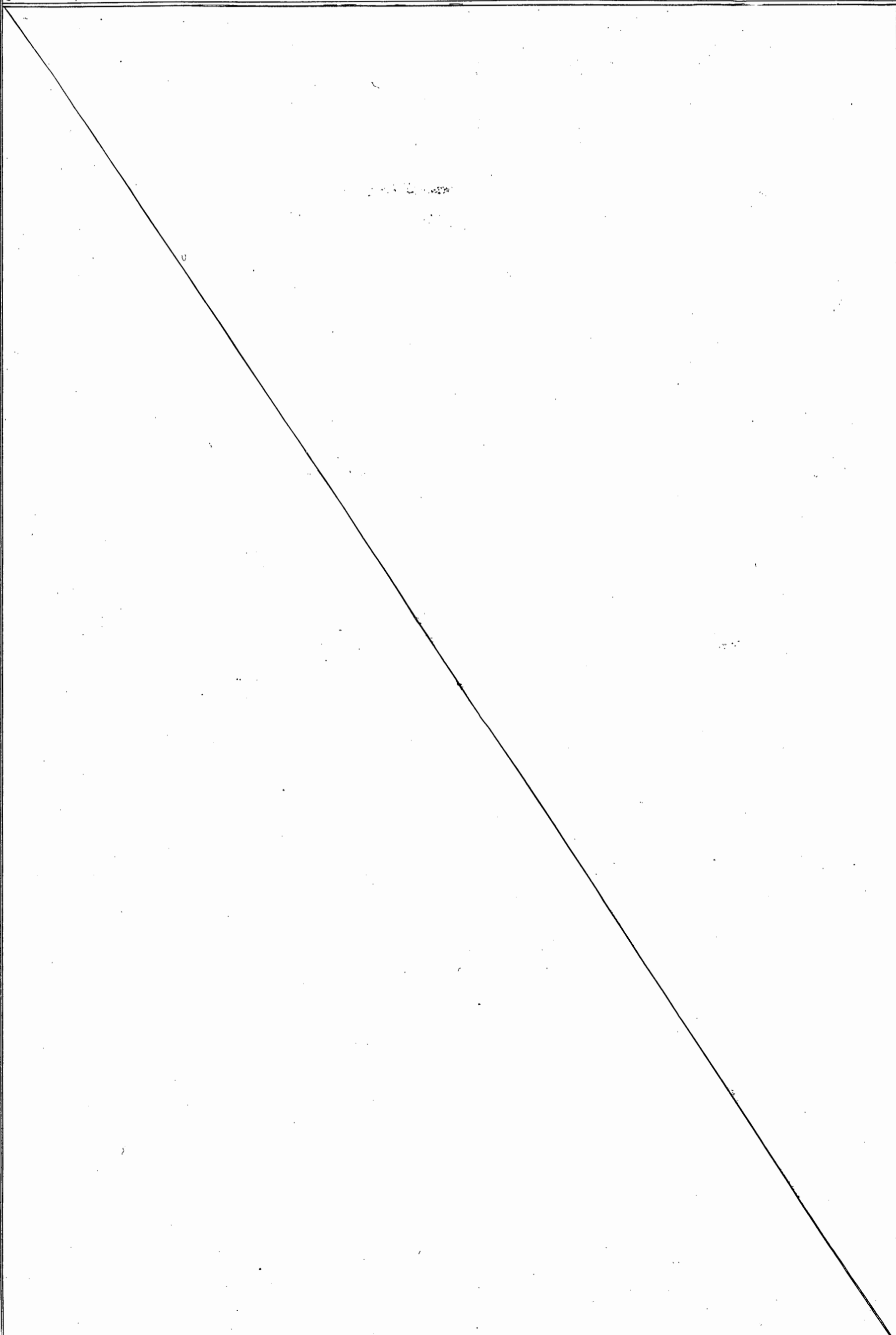

Ordinance No. 1276.

An Ordinance to Redistrict the City of San Diego, California, into Nine Wards, and to Divide Each of Such Wards into Precincts.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That in pursuance of the provisions and directions of Section 12 of Chapter 1 of Article 1 of the Charter of the City of San Diego, California, said City shall be and is hereby divided into nine wards, as follows:

FIRST WARD.

Section 2. The First Ward shall include all that portion of said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the center line of Upas street in Middletown intersects the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence running northeasterly along the center line of said Upas street in Middletown, to a connection with the west end of Upas street in Horton's Addition; thence running easterly, following the center line of said Upas street in Horton's Addition, to the west line of the City Park; thence running north along said west line to the northwest corner of said Park; thence running east along the north line of said City Park, and along the north lines of pueblo lots numbered eleven hundred and twenty-eight (1128) and thirteen hundred and fifty (1350) to the eastern boundary of said City; thence running northwesterly following the eastern boundary of said city to a point where the said boundary intersects the Pacific ocean; thence running southerly, following the shore line of said ocean to the most southerly end of Point Loma; thence running in a northeasterly direction, following the water line of said Point Loma and the shore line of the Bay of San Diego to the point of commencement.

SECOND WARD.

Section 3. The Second Ward shall include all that portion of said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the center line of Ash street in Middletown intersects the easterly shore line of the bay of San Diego; thence running northerly, following the said shore line of said bay to the center line of Upas street; thence running northerly and easterly, following the center line of said Upas street, both in Middletown and Horton's Addition, to the west line of the City Park; thence running south along the said west line of the City Park to the center line of Date street; thence running west on the center line of Date street to the center line of Fifth street; thence running south on the center line of said Fifth street to the center line of Ash street; thence running west along the center line of said Ash street to the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego, and place of beginning.

THIRD WARD.

Section 4. The Third Ward shall include all that portion of said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at the intersection of the center line of Ash street with the easterly shore line of the bay of San Diego; thence running easterly along the center line of said Ash street to its intersection with the center line of Fifth street; thence running south on the center line of Fifth street to its intersection with the center line of "D" street; thence running west on the center line of "D" street to the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence running northerly on the said shore line of said bay to its intersection with the said center line of Ash street, and place of beginning.

FOURTH WARD.

Section 5. The Fourth Ward shall include all that portion of said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at the center of the intersection of Ash and Fifth streets; thence running north on the center line of Fifth street to its intersection with the center line of Date street; thence running east on the center line of Date street to the west line of the City Park; thence running north on the said west line of the City Park to the northwest corner of said City Park; thence running east on the northern boundary line of said City Park, and south line of pueblo lots numbered eleven hundred and twenty-seven (1127) and thirteen hundred and forty-nine (1349) to the eastern boundary of the city; thence running southeasterly along the said eastern boundary line of said City to a point where the center line of "D" street, if extended easterly to such boundary line, would intersect the said eastern boundary line; thence running west along the center line of "D" street, so extended, to the eastern end of "D" street, as now opened; and thence running west along the center line of "D" street to its intersection with the center line of Fifth street; thence running north on the center line of Fifth street, to its intersection with the center line of Ash street, and place of beginning.

FIFTH WARD.

Section 6. The Fifth Ward shall include all that portion of said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at the point where the center line of "D" street intersects the easterly shore line of the bay of San Diego; thence running east along the center line of said "D" street to its intersection with the center line of Fifth street; thence running south along the center line of Fifth street to its intersection with the northerly shore line of the bay of San Diego; thence running northwesterly along the shore line of said bay to its intersection with the center line of "D" street, and place of beginning.

SIXTH WARD.

Section 7. The Sixth Ward shall include all that portion of said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the center line of Fifth street intersects the center line of "D" street; thence running east along the center line of said "D" street to its intersection with the center line of Ninth street; thence running south along the said center line of Ninth street to a

point where such center line, if extended southerly, would intersect the northerly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence running northwesterly along such shore line to its intersection with the center line of Fifth street; thence running north along the center line of Fifth street to its intersection with the center line of "D" street, and place of beginning.

SEVENTH WARD.

Section 8. The Seventh Ward shall include all that portion of the said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the center line of "D" street intersects the center line of Ninth street; thence running east along the center line of said "D" street to a point where the said center line of "D" street, if extended easterly, would intersect the eastern boundary line of said City; thence southeasterly on said boundary line to its intersection with the center line of "H" street, where said "H" street extended easterly to said boundary line; thence running westerly along the center line of said "H" street, so extended, to its intersection with the center line of Ninth street; thence running north on the center line of Ninth street to its intersection with the center line of "D" street, and place of beginning.

EIGHTH WARD.

Section 9. The Eighth Ward shall include all that portion of said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the center line of Ninth street intersects the center line of "H" street; thence running easterly along the center line of said "H" street to a point where such center line, if extended easterly, would intersect the eastern boundary line of the said city; thence running southeasterly along such eastern boundary line of said city to its intersection with the center line of "N" street, where such center line extended to the said eastern boundary line of said City; thence running west on the center line of said "N" street, so extended, to its intersection with the center line of Ninth street; thence running north long said center line of Ninth street to its intersection with the center line of "H" street, and place of beginning.

NINTH WARD.

Section 10. The Ninth Ward shall include all that portion of said City of San Diego within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the center line of "N" street intersects the center line of Ninth street; thence running east on the center line of "N" street to its intersection with the eastern boundary line of the said city, where such center line extended easterly to such eastern boundary line; thence running southeasterly along said boundary line to its intersection with the southerly boundary line of said city; thence running westerly along said southerly boundary line of said city to its intersection with the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence running northwesterly along said shore line to its intersection with the center line of Ninth street where said center line of "N" street extended southerly to the northerly shore line of said bay; thence running north along the center line of Ninth street, so extended, to its intersection with the center line of "N" street, and place of beginning.

Section 11. That the jurisdiction of all wards bounded by the Bay of San Diego shall extend to the center of Ship's Channel, at right angles with the shore line.

Section 12. That all that portion of the Bay of San Diego within said City of San Diego, and not included within any of the above and foregoing described wards, is hereby declared to be and is included within the said First Ward of said City.

Section 13. That for election purposes each of the said several wards of said City, as above described, be and are hereby divided into precincts, as follows:

FIRST PRECINCT, FIRST WARD.

The first precinct of the First Ward shall consist of all that portion of the First Ward of said City as described in Section 2 hereof, within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at the northwest corner of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and ninety-seven (1197); thence running east to the eastern boundary line of the said City of San Diego; thence running southeasterly along said boundary line to its intersection with the north line of Pueblo Lot numbered thirteen hundred and fifty (1350); thence running westerly along the southern boundary line of the said First Ward to a point where the said southern boundary line of the said First Ward would intersect the division line between Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and twenty-two (1122) and Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and twenty-three (1123), if such division line were extended southerly to the center line of Upas street; thence running north to the south line of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and five (1105); thence running westerly to the southwest corner of said Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and five (1105); thence running northerly to the northeast corner of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and four (1104); thence running westerly to the boundary line between Pueblo Lots numbered eleven hundred and seventy-five (1175) and numbered eleven hundred and seventy-six (1176); thence running north to the northwest corner of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and ninety-seven (1197), and place of beginning.

SECOND PRECINCT, FIRST WARD.

The Second Precinct of the First Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said First Ward of said city, within the following boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the south line of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eight (1208) intersects the shore of False Bay; thence running east to the northeast corner of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and ninety-six (1196); thence running south to the north line of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and four (1104); thence running easterly to the northeast corner of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and four (1104); thence running southerly to the south-

west corner of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and five (1105); thence running easterly to the northeast corner of Pueblo Lot numbered eleven hundred and nineteen (1119); thence running south to the center line of Upas street in Horton's Addition; thence following the south line of the First Ward westerly and southwesterly to the Bay of San Diego; thence following the bay shore to the line between Pueblo Lots numbered two hundred and thirty (230) and numbered two hundred and thirty-one (231); thence running northwesterly on said line to False bay; thence following the easterly bay shore of said False bay to the place of beginning.

THIRD PRECINCT, FIRST WARD.

The Third Precinct of the First Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said First Ward of said city lying southwest of the southwest line of forty-acre range of Pueblo Lots numbered from two hundred and fourteen (214) to two hundred and thirty-one (231).

FOURTH PRECINCT, FIRST WARD.

The Fourth Precinct of the First Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said First Ward of said city, within the following described boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the north line of Pueblo Lot numbered seventeen hundred and seventy-three (1773) intersects the shore line of the Pacific ocean; thence in an easterly direction, following the north line of Pueblo Lots numbered seventeen hundred and seventy-three (1773), seventeen hundred and seventy-four (1774), and seventeen hundred and seventy-five (1775), to the corner common to Pueblo Lots numbered seventeen hundred and seventy-five (1775), seventeen hundred and seventy-six (1776), twelve hundred and fifty-four (1254); and twelve hundred and fifty-five (1255); thence in a northerly direction following the east line of Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and fifty-five (1255), twelve hundred and sixty-four (1264), and twelve hundred and eighty-seven (1287), to the southerly line of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eighty-eight (1288); thence running in a northwesterly direction to the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and eighty-six (1286) and twelve hundred and eighty-eight (1288); thence in a northeasterly direction following the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and eighty-six (1286) and twelve hundred and eighty-eight (1288) to the east corner of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eighty-six (1286); thence in a northwesterly direction following the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and eighty-six (1286) and twelve hundred and eighty-eight (1288) to the east line of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eighty-one (1281); thence in a northerly direction, following the east line of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eighty-one (1281) to the shore line of the Pacific Ocean; thence in a northerly direction following the shore line of the Pacific Ocean to its intersection with the east line of the Pueblo of San Diego; thence in a southeasterly direction, following the east line of the Pueblo of San Diego to the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred (1200) and twelve hundred and one (1201); thence following the south line of Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and one (1201), twelve hundred and two (1202), twelve hundred and three (1203), twelve hundred and four (1204), twelve hundred and five (1205), twelve hundred and six (1206), twelve hundred and seven (1207), and twelve hundred and eight (1208), to the east shore line of False bay; thence following the north and west shore lines of False bay to the shore line of the Pacific Ocean; thence in a northerly direction, following the shore line of the Pacific Ocean, to the point or place of beginning.

FIFTH PRECINCT, FIRST WARD.

The Fifth Precinct of the First Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said First Ward of said city within the following described boundaries, viz: Commencing at a point where the north line of Pueblo Lot numbered seventeen hundred and seventy-three (1773) intersects the shore line of the Pacific Ocean; thence in an easterly direction, following the north line of Pueblo Lots numbered seventeen hundred and seventy-three (1773), seventeen hundred and seventy-four (1774), and seventeen hundred and seventy-five (1775) to the corner common to Pueblo Lots numbered seventeen hundred and seventy-five (1775), seventeen hundred and seventy-six (1776), twelve hundred and fifty-four (1254), and twelve hundred and fifty-five (1255); thence in a northerly direction following the east line of Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and fifty-five (1255), twelve hundred and sixty-four (1264), and twelve hundred and eighty-seven (1287) to the southerly line of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eighty-eight (1288); thence in a northwesterly direction to the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and eighty-six (1286) and twelve hundred and eighty-eight (1288); thence in a northeasterly direction following the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and eighty-six (1286) and twelve hundred and eighty-eight (1288) to the east corner of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eighty-six (1286); thence in a northwesterly direction following the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered twelve hundred and eighty-six (1286) and twelve hundred and eighty-eight (1288) to the east line of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eighty-one (1281); thence in a northerly direction, following the east line of Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and eighty-one (1281), to the shore line of the Pacific Ocean; thence following the shore line of the Pacific Ocean in a southerly direction to the point or place of beginning.

FIRST PRECINCT, SECOND WARD.

The First Precinct of the Second Ward of said City, as described in Section 3 hereof, shall consist of all that portion of the said Second Ward lying east of the center line of First street.

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SECOND PRECINCT, SECOND WARD.

The Second Precinct of the Second Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said Second Ward lying west of the center line of First street.

FIRST PRECINCT, THIRD WARD. The First Precinct of the Third Ward of said City, as described in Section 4 hereof, shall consist of all that portion of the said Third Ward lying east of the center line of First street.

SECOND PRECINCT, THIRD WARD.

The Second Precinct of the Third Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said Third Ward lying west of the center line of First street.

FIRST PRECINCT, FOURTH WARD.

The First Precinct of the Fourth Ward of said City, as described in Section 5 hereof, shall consist of all that portion of the said Fourth Ward lying east of the center line of Tenth street, were such Tenth street extended north to the northern boundary line of the Fourth Ward.

SECOND PRECINCT, FOURTH WARD.

The Second Precinct of the Fourth Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said Fourth Ward lying west of the center line of Tenth street, were such Tenth street extended north to the northern boundary line of the Fourth Ward.

FIRST PRECINCT, FIFTH WARD.

The First Precinct of the Fifth Ward of said City, as described in Section 6 hereof, shall consist of all that portion of the said Fifth Ward lying east of the center line of First Street, were such center line extended as far south as the southern boundary line of the city.

SECOND PRECINCT, FIFTH WARD.

The Second Precinct of the Fifth Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said Fifth Ward lying west of the center line of First street, were such center line extended as far south as the southern boundary line of the city.

FIRST PRECINCT, SIXTH WARD.

The First Precinct of the Sixth Ward of said City, as described in Section 7 hereof, shall consist of all that portion of the said Sixth Ward lying north of the center line of "H" street.

SECOND PRECINCT, SIXTH WARD.

The Second Precinct of the Sixth Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said Sixth Ward lying south of the center line of "H" street.

FIRST PRECINCT, SEVENTH WARD.

The First Precinct of the Seventh Ward of said City, as described in Section 8 hereof, shall consist of all that portion of the said Seventh Ward lying east of the center line of Sixteenth street.

SECOND PRECINCT, SEVENTH WARD.

The Second Precinct of the Seventh Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said Seventh Ward lying west of the center line of Sixteenth street.

FIRST PRECINCT, EIGHTH WARD.

The First Precinct of the Eighth Ward of said City, as described in Section 9 hereof, shall consist of all that portion of the said Eighth Ward lying east of the center line of Sixteenth street.

SECOND PRECINCT, EIGHTH WARD.

The Second Precinct of the Eighth Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said Eighth Ward lying west of the center line of Sixteenth street.

FIRST PRECINCT, NINTH WARD.

The First Precinct of the Ninth Ward of said City, as described in Section 10 hereof, shall consist of all that portion of the said Ninth Ward lying east of the center line of Twenty-eighth street.

SECOND PRECINCT, NINTH WARD.

The Second Precinct of the Ninth Ward shall consist of all that portion of the said Ninth Ward lying west of the center line of Twenty-eighth street.

Section 14. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 15. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 17. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the city official newspaper of said City, to-wit: the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

Ordinance No. 1277

An Ordinance Directing the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, to Advertise for Bids and Let a Contract for Lighting the Streets, Avenues and Parks of Said City, With Electric Lights, for a Period of One Year, Beginning on the First Day of April, 1903.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be and said Board of Public Works is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance, to advertise for at least ten days for bids and let a contract to the lowest responsible bidder, for lighting the streets, avenues, and parks of said City of San Diego with electric lights for a period of one year, beginning on the first day of April, 1903, and ending on the 31st day of March, 1904.

Said notice and advertisement shall call for bids, naming the price per month, per arc lamp, for fifty-three (53) arc lamps of two thousand candle power each, to be placed upon towers within said city, located and described as follows, viz:

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Fourth and Cedar streets, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of "A" and India streets, upon which tower there shall be placed three of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of "B" and Twelfth streets, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Thirteenth and "H" streets, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Twenty-first and "J" streets, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Twenty-eighth street and National avenue, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Beardsley street and Milton avenue, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Third and Juniper streets, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Sampson street and Franklin avenue, upon which tower there shall be placed three of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 115 feet high, located at the intersection of Sixth street and University avenue, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One iron tower, 100 feet high, located at the intersection of State and Hawthorn streets, upon which tower there shall be placed three of such arc lamps;

One wooden tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Walnut avenue and Fourth street, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One wooden tower, 125 feet high, located at the intersection of Twenty-fifth and "C" streets, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps;

One wooden tower, 75 feet high, located at the south corner of the State Normal School campus on University Heights, upon which tower there shall be placed four of such arc lamps.

Provided, that if any person, company or corporation, other than the company at present lighting the said City with electric lights, secures the contract in pursuance of such notice and advertisement, the said towers shall be placed at the intersection of such streets as the Board of Public Works of said City may designate, but not to be more than one block from the location above designated; said towers to be constructed and erected in a manner similar to the towers now in use by the San Diego Gas and Electric Light Company, in furnishing electric lights to said City of San Diego.

Said notice and advertisement shall also call for bids, naming the price per month, per arc lamp, for seventy-seven (77) arc lamps of two thousand candle power each, in addition to the above fifty-three (53) arc lamps hereinbefore provided for, to be placed on iron arms 22 feet in length, extended from wooden poles 27 feet high, with one such lamp on each of such arms, to be located within said City of San Diego, as follows:

One at the intersection of Atlantic and "H" streets;

One at the intersection of Atlantic and "F" streets.

One at the intersection of Arctic and "H" streets;

Ordinance No. 1278.

An Ordinance Prescribing Certain Regulations for the Laying of Sidewalks and Curbs in the City of San Diego, California, and Repairing Ordinance No. 1120 of the Ordinances of Said City, Approved on the 6th Day of May, 1902.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to lay or put in place any sidewalk or curb in or upon any street in the City of San Diego, California, without first obtaining permission so to do from the Board of Public Works of said City. Any person desiring to construct a sidewalk or curb upon any street in the said City of San Diego shall make application in writing to the said Board of Public Works for permission so to do; said application shall state the place where said sidewalk or curb is to be laid, and the number of feet of said sidewalk or curb to be constructed.

Said applicant shall deposit with the said Board of Public Works the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of sidewalk and curb, or fractional part thereof where the applicant desires to construct both a sidewalk and curb at the same time in front of the same property, or ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of sidewalk, or fractional part thereof, where the applicant desires to construct a sidewalk without constructing a curb at the same time in front of the same property, or ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of curb, or fractional part thereof, where the applicant does not desire to construct a sidewalk at the same time in front of the same property, as security for the removal of all debris and surplus material from the street in said City when said sidewalk or curb has been constructed, and also as security that said sidewalk and curb shall be laid to the official grade of said street; provided, that in lieu of the cash deposit above specified, any contractor regularly engaged in the business of laying cement or other sidewalks, or in constructing concrete, natural stone, or other curbs in the said City of San Diego, California, may furnish and deliver to the said Board of Public Works a bond payable to the said City of San Diego in the penal sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00), with two sufficient sureties, to be approved by the said Board of Public Works, as security for the removal of all debris and surplus material from the street in said City when the said work shall have been constructed, and also as security that said sidewalk and curb shall be laid to the official grade of said street.

That in the event any person giving such bond, or his assigns, shall fail for a period of five days, after the completion of such work, to remove said debris or surplus material from said street, the said Board of Public Works shall cause said debris to be removed from said street, and said person giving said bond and the sureties thereon shall be liable to said City, in a civil action, upon said bond, for the expenses of so removing the same, and in the event that such person giving said bond shall fail to construct said sidewalk or curb to the official grade of said street, and shall fail or refuse for a period of ten days, after having been notified by the owner of the property, in front of which and for whom said work is being done, or his agent, to put and construct said sidewalk or curb to the official grade of said street, then the said owner may put and construct, or cause to be put and constructed, said work to the official grade of said street, and said person giving said bond and the sureties thereon shall be liable upon said bond for all costs and expenses incurred by the owner of said property in putting and constructing said work to the official grade of said street, and also for all damages suffered by said owner on account thereof.

Every bond so executed under the provisions of this ordinance is in force and obligatory upon the principal and sureties therein, to and for the said City of San Diego, and to and for the use and benefit of all persons who may be injured or aggrieved by the person giving said bond failing to remove said debris and surplus material, or to, construct said work to the official grade of said street; and any person so injured or aggrieved may bring suit upon such bond in his own name, without any assignment thereof; no such bond is void on the first recovery of a judgment thereon, but suit may be afterwards brought, from time to time, and judgment recovered thereon by the said City of San Diego, or by any person to whom a right of action has accrued against the principal and the sureties of said bond, until the whole penalty of said bond is exhausted; whenever such bond does not contain the substantial matter or conditions required by this ordinance, or there are any defects in the approval or filing of said bond, it is not void so as to discharge such person giving such bond and his sureties, but they are equitably bound to the said City of San Diego or any party interested, and the said City, or such party may, by a civil action in court, suggest the defect in such bond, approval, or filing, and recover the proper and equitable demand or damages from the principal of such bond and the persons who intended to become and were included as sureties in such

bond. In the event any obligation of said bond has been violated, the said Board of Public Works shall not thereafter issue any permit to the person giving such bond for doing any other work, unless specifically authorized so to do by said Common Council.

Upon said application being made and said sum being so deposited with the said Board of Public Works, or said bond being so furnished, the said Board of Public Works shall issue a permit to the applicant for the construction of the work described in the application, and shall immediately notify the City Engineer of said City of the issuance of such permit, and thereafter the said City Engineer shall set the grade stakes for the construction of the said work, which stakes shall be to the official grade of said street; and thereafter said work shall be constructed according to the said grade stakes and according to the official grade of said street, and according to the specifications prescribed for doing such work by the ordinances of said City in force at the time such work is done, and not otherwise.

After said work shall have been so constructed, the said City Engineer shall survey the same for the purpose of ascertaining whether said work has been constructed to the official grade of said street, and according to the stakes set therefor. If the said City Engineer shall find that the said work has been constructed according to the official grade of said street, he shall issue, to the person for whom the said work has been constructed, a certificate in writing certifying that fact, but he shall not issue any certificate if he finds that the said work has not been constructed according to the official grade of said street; when the said City Engineer issues such certificate, the said Board of Public Works shall thereafter return said deposit, provided, that said surplus material and debris have been removed from said street upon which said work has been so constructed. If the said City Engineer shall find that the said work has not been constructed according to the official grade of said street, he shall immediately notify the said Board of Public Works of that fact, and said deposit shall not be returned until said work has been constructed according to the official grade of said street, and a certificate issued to that effect by the said City Engineer.

Provided, however, that no permit shall be issued by the said Board of Public Works for the construction of bituminous rock or asphalt sidewalks or wooden curbs; nor shall a permit be issued by said Board of Public Works for the construction of a concrete or other sidewalk or curb after a resolution of intention has been passed by the Common Council of said City to sidewalk or curb that portion of the street upon which the applicant desires to construct such sidewalk or curb, without special permission having been first had and obtained from the Common Council of said City.

The said City Engineer shall charge the regular fees for making such survey and setting such stakes as prescribed by the ordinances of this City, except that no extra fees shall be charged for checking up work after the completion thereof. This ordinance shall not apply to work done under a contract by the Superintendent of Streets under the General Street Law of the State of California, where an assessment is to be levied therefor.

Section 2. That it shall be and it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person, constructing any sidewalk or curb under any permit issued by the Board of Public Works of said City, as herein provided, to fail or refuse, for a period of five days after the completion of said work, to remove from said street upon which said work has been constructed, all debris or surplus material, or to lay or construct any sidewalk or curb other than to the official grade of the said street.

Section 3. That Ordinance No. 1120 of the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, California, approved on the 6th day of May, 1902, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 4. That any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the city jail of said City for a period not exceeding fifty (50) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Ordinance No. 1279.

An Ordinance Declaring the Grade of That Portion of "K" Street in the City of San Diego, California, to be Changed at a Point on the South Line of Said "K" Street 250 Feet East of the Point Where the Said South Line of "K" Street Intersects the East Line of Fourteenth Street, and at a Point on the North Line of Said "K" Street 250 Feet East of a Point Where the Said North Line of "K" Street Intersects the Said East Line of Fourteenth Street, and Establishing the Grade of the Same at the Said Points.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, on the 31st day of December, 1902, duly passed and adopted a Resolution of Intention to change and establish the grade of that portion of "K" street in the said City of San Diego, at a point on the south line of said "K" street 250 feet east of the point where the said south line of "K" street intersects the east line of Fourteenth street, and at a point on the north line of said "K" street 250 feet east of a point where the said north line of "K" street intersects the said east line of Fourteenth street; and

Whereas, the said Resolution of Intention was approved by the Mayor of said City on the 6th day of January, 1903, which resolution described the proposed change of grade; and

Whereas, said Common Council in and by said Resolution designated and described the district to be benefited by said change of grade, and to be assessed to pay the cost of the same; and

Whereas, said Resolution of Intention was duly published for ten (10) days in the newspaper of said City in which the official notices of the Common Council of said City are usually printed and published, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee, in every regular issue of said newspaper during the said period of ten (10) days, as directed by the said Resolution of Intention, and in the manner and by the persons required by law; and

Whereas, the Superintendent of Streets of said City within five (5) days after the first publication of the said Resolution of Intention duly caused notices of the passage of said Resolution of Intention to be conspicuously posted within said district in the manner and form required by law; and

Whereas, more than thirty (30) days have elapsed from the time of the first publication of said Resolution of Intention in said newspaper as aforesaid, and no objection or objections to said proposed change of grade have been filed with the Clerk of said Common Council, and no objection has been made to said proposed change of grade; and

Whereas, the petition of the owners of a majority of the property affected by said proposed change of grade has been duly filed with the Clerk of said Common Council and presented to this Common Council as required by law; therefore,

Be it further ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

That the grade of that portion of "K" street in the said City of San Diego at a point on the south line of said "K" street 250 feet east of the point where the said south line of "K" street intersects the east line of Fourteenth street, and at a point on the north line of said "K" street 250 feet east of a point where the said north line of "K" street intersects the said east line of Fourteenth street, be and the same is hereby changed and established, and declared to be in conformity with said Resolution of Intention, as follows:

At the said point on the said south line of "K" street, 250 feet east of the point where the said south line of "K" street intersects the said east line of Fourteenth street, the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from thirteen (13) feet above the datum line of levels as fixed by Ordinance No. 3 of the ordinances of said City, entitled, "An ordinance establishing a datum line for the grading of streets in the City of San Diego, State of California, and providing for the manner of establishing grades by ordinance," approved on the 30th day of June, 1886, to fourteen and two-tenths (14.2) feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the said point on the said north line of "K" street 250 feet east of the said point where the said north line of "K" street intersects the said east line of Fourteenth street, the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from thirteen (13) feet above said datum line of levels to fourteen and eight-tenths (14.8) feet above said datum line of levels.

That the grade of all points heretofore fixed by the ordinances of said City shall be and remain as they now are on the said "K" street, except as herein provided to be changed.

That there shall be a uniform ascent and descent between all points at which the grade elevations shall be so established.

Ordinance No. 1783.

An Ordinance Providing For The Furnishing To The Common Council of An Estimated Cost of Certain Buildings For the use of the Fire Department of the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be, and said Board of Public Works is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and furnish to this Common Council an estimate of the cost of the construction of certain buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City, viz:

A house for Fire Engine No. 2, to be located between Sixth Street and Tenth Street and "A" Street and "D" Street. This house to be used for Fire Department headquarters, and to be a double house two stories high, fifty feet (50) front and one hundred (100) feet deep; said house to be built of brick and stone, the front, sides, and rear of which shall be sixteen (16") inches thick, the lower floor to be finished in cement and wood, the second floor to be of wood with joists. Said building to be fitted up with rooms for the Board of Fire Commissioners, for the Chief of the Fire Department, and with rooms properly arranged for the three permanent men of Engine No. 2 and five extra men of the Fire Department; also a suitable room for the fire alarm apparatus, together with suitable stalls for four horses, a sliding pole for the men, and with heavy front doors.

Also a fire engine house for Fire Engine No. 1, to be located between Second and Fourth Streets and "B" and "I" Streets. This house to be a double house one story in height, fifty (50) feet front and one hundred (100) feet deep, and to be built of brick and stone, the walls to be sixteen (16") inches thick, the lower floor to be finished in cement and wood with suitable stalls for five horses, and rooms for four permanent men and eight extra men.

Also for a fire engine house for Hose Company No. 3, to be located between "H" and "K" Streets and Sixth and Ninth Streets. This house to be two stories high and to be built of wood, with thirty (30) feet front and sixty (60) feet deep. The lower floor shall be finished in wood, with suitable stalls for two horses, the second floor to have suitable rooms for one permanent man and five extra men.

Also a fire engine house for Chemical Engine, to be located between Laurel and Olive Streets and Second and Fourth Streets, which house shall be two stories high and built of wood, with thirty (30) feet front and sixty (60) feet deep, the lower floor to be finished in cement and wood with suitable stalls for two horses, and rooms for one permanent man and five extra men.

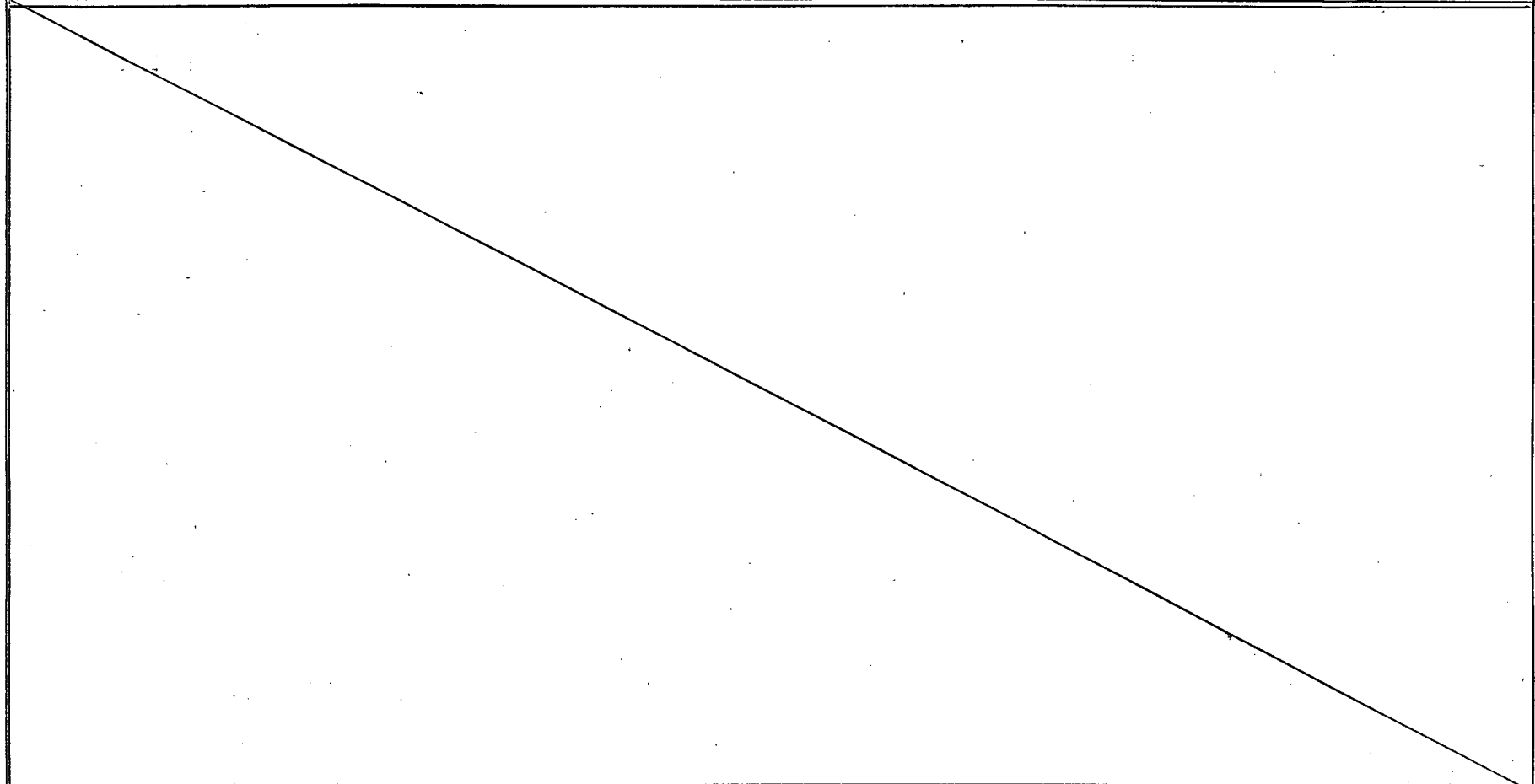

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the City of San Diego, California, enter into a contract for the purchase of water from the San Diego, Flume Company, fit and proper for domestic use, for the use of the said City of San Diego and its inhabitants.

That the price to be paid for said water shall be as follows: the sum of four (4) cents per one thousand (1000) gallons for said water from the date of the execution of said contract up to the first day of May, 1903, and thereafter as long as the said San Diego Flume Company can supply water to the said City of San Diego from the running streams through its flume; that after the said first day of May, 1903, and after the said San Diego Flume Company shall cease to be able to furnish water to the said City of San Diego from said running streams through its said flume, and shall be required to take the same from the La Mesa Reservoir, then and from that time the price for said water shall be five (5) cents per one thousand (1000) gallons.

That the time for the commencement of the furnishing of said water shall be five days after the approval of this Ordinance. That said water shall be delivered to the said City of San Diego at and measured by a meter in the meter house of the said San Diego Flume Company on the eastern boundary of said City, which meter house shall be accessible at all times to the superintendent of the water system of the said City of San Diego; Provided, that the amount thereof shall not exceed the amount of water deemed necessary to supply the consumers of the said City of San Diego with water. The water furnished in any one month to be paid for in warrants of said City drawn upon the water fund thereof on the first Thursday of the following month; Provided, that said contract may be terminated at the option of either the said City of San Diego or the said San Diego Flume Company upon thirty (30) days notice in writing to be given by the party desiring to terminate the contract to the other party.

That the Mayor of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf, in the name, and as the act and deed of the said City of San Diego, to enter into a contract with the San Diego Flume Company for the purchase of said water, as above provided, and that the City Clerk of said City be and he is

Ordinance No. 1291.

An Ordinance Establishing the Water Rates in the City of San Diego, California, for the Year Beginning July First, 1903, and Ending June 30th, 1904. Be it Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows: Section 1. That the rates and compensation to be collected for water furnished by the City of San Diego, California, to the inhabitants thereof for family, private, and all other purposes for the year commencing July 1st, 1903, and ending June 30th, 1904, are hereby fixed as follows:

- BATHS AND CLOSETS. 1. Bath tubs in private residence, 25 cents each per month. 2. Bath tubs, public, \$1.25 each per month. 3. Water closets in business houses, \$1.00 per month for each water closet, and 25 cents per month for each urinal in said business houses. 4. Water closets in private residences, 25 cents per month for each water closet. 5. Water closets, public, \$2.00 each per month, and for each urinal, 50 cents per month. BUSINESS HOUSES, OFFICES, ETC. 6. Barber shops, single chair, 75 cents per month; each additional chair, 25 cents per month. 7. Business offices, 75 cents per month. 8. Rooms in second and third stories occupied as offices, for each room, per month, 20 cents. 9. Dental rooms, \$2.00 per month. 10. Drug stores, \$3.00 per month. 11. Photograph galleries, \$5.00 per month. 12. Stores and business houses employing not to exceed 3 persons, \$1.00 per month, and for each additional person, 15 cents per month. 13. Warehouses, \$3.00 per month.

- FAMILIES. 14. Dwellings, tenements, flats, and other apartments, the same being occupied by not more than three persons, \$1.00 per month, and for each additional person, 15 cents per month. HOTELS, RESTAURANTS, ETC. 15. Boarding houses, in addition to family rates, 15 cents per month for each person. 16. Coffee houses, open day and night, \$3.50 per month. 17. Hotels, in addition to family rates, 15 cents per month for each bed. The keeper of hotels, lodging-houses and boarding-houses shall furnish to the Board of Public Works of said City (under oath if required) a correct list of the number of persons in his or their families, and the number of lodgers. 18. Lodging-houses, in addition to family rates, 10 cents per month for each bed. 19. Restaurants, and eating houses, \$3.50 per month. 20. Saloons, \$3.50 per month.

- IRRIGATION. 21. For water to be used for irrigating one-half acre and under one acre, 10 cents per 1000 gallons; for one acre and under two acres, 8 cents per 1000 gallons; for two acres or more, 6 cents per 1000 gallons; to be measured by meter to be placed at the expense of the party to whom the water is furnished; such acreage to include town lots where there is sufficient number of lots in one body or tract collectively to make one-half acre or more; provided, that where meter rates are charged for irrigation under this section, no extra charge shall be made for domestic, family or household use; and provided further, that the rates herein specified shall apply only to the irrigation of lands cultivated for the purpose of making a profit or livelihood, and not to irrigation for ornamental purposes; provided, further, that no person, company, or corporation shall be entitled to the above rates for irrigation unless the above quantities of land are actually being cultivated and irrigated; provided, also, that the rate for water furnished for the irrigation of cemeteries shall be six cents per 1000 gallons. 22. Irrigation of lawns, trees, shrubbery, etc., 1 cent per month for each and every month in the year, for every front foot, including the irrigation of sidewalks, in front of the lot, provided, that said rate of 1 cent per month for every front foot shall not apply to acre property, or to any property except to town lots. And provided further, that said rate of 1 cent per month for every front foot shall not apply to acreage property, or to any property except to town lots not considered as acreage. LIVERIES, ETC. 23. Feed yards, \$5.00 per month. 24. Horse and carriage, 35 cents per month, and 20 cents per month for each additional horse. 25. Livery stables, including carriage washing, for each horse, 35 cents per month. 26. Horses, mules, and cows, each 20 cents per month.

- METER RATES. 27. The rate for water furnished to consumers through meters, except as otherwise herein provided, is fixed as follows: 20 cents per 1000 gallons. 28. Where water is furnished for steam engines, gas, machines or works, wash houses (Chinese or otherwise), or for any other purpose whatever, and no compensation is herein fixed therefor, and satisfactory rates cannot be agreed upon, meter rates shall be charged for the water, so furnished, to be measured by a meter. The said City shall be entitled to collect a minimum rate of \$1.00 per month where water is furnished at meter rates, and an additional minimum sum of 25 cents for each additional house, whether occupied or not, and each flat, whether occupied or not, supplied with water through the same meter. Provided, that such minimum charge shall entitle the consumer to use no more than 5000 gallons per month for one house or flat and 1250 gallons more for each additional house or flat. That said City shall be entitled to collect a minimum meter rate of \$1.00 per month where water is furnished at meter rates for each meter supplying any business block or business building, and 25 cents for each additional ground floor store or business room or place, in any business block or business building, supplied from the same meter, whether occupied or not. Provided that such minimum charge shall entitle the consumer to use no more than 5000 gallons per month for one business block, and 1250 gallons more for each additional store or business room. 29. Water shall be furnished and delivered by meter measurement to shipping lying alongside of any of the wharves on the water front, where water pipes or mains are laid, upon application being made therefor, at the following rates: 50 cents per 1000 gallons. Water shall be supplied and delivered to water supply boats at any of the wharves on the water front above mentioned, for the purpose of supplying shipping in the bay of San Diego, upon application being made therefor, at the rate of 50 cents per 1000 gallons. No water boat, furnishing and supplying water to the shipping lying at anchor within the limits of the waters of the City of San Diego shall charge a rate to exceed \$3.00 per 1000 gallons.

MISCELLANEOUS.

- 30. Bakeries, for each 25 barrels of flour, \$2.00 per month. 31. Water for hydraulic elevators and motors in hotels and stores, 10 cents per 1000 gallons, to be measured by a meter. 32. The regular charge for making and placing taps and laying pipe shall be made for any taps placed or pipe laid or connected with the mains for fire apparatus, which shall be used only in case of fire, but, no other charge shall be made for such fire apparatus if used only in case of fire; provided, that if any person shall at any time use such fire apparatus for other than fire purposes, the said Board of Public Works shall have the right to charge and collect from such person the sum of \$50.00 for said fire apparatus connection for said year. 33. Horse-shoeing only, \$1.50 per month. 34. Soda fountains, 50 cents per month each; each jet, 50 cents per month; each tumbler washer, 50 cents per month. 35. Persons slacking lime, 15 cents per barrel; and cement, 10 cents per barrel; for wetting brick, 15 cents per 1000. 36. Wagon and blacksmith shops, including horse-shoeing, \$2.50 per month. 37. Breweries, ice manufacturing plants, and cold storage plants, 12 cents per 1000 gallons. 38. That water furnished to all charitable institutions, such as "The Helping Hand," "King's Daughters," "Boarding Club," "Seaman's Rest," and "Children's Home," shall be \$1.00 per annum; provided, that if water is wasted by any such institution, meter rates shall thereafter be charged. Provided, that this provision shall not apply to hospitals and sanitariums. 39. Parks on private land, but open to the public and maintained by private subscriptions, such as the "H-Street Park," "K-Street Park," and "Park," at southwest corner of Twenty-second and "K" streets, 10 cents per 1000 gallons.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Section 2. Any water rate payer shall have the right to demand a meter and pay a meter rate upon tendering the said Board of Public Works the sum of \$5.00 for placing and connecting the meter with the supply pipe of such water rate payer; upon such demand or payment, or the tender of such sum by any water rate payer, it shall be the duty of the said Board of Public Works to furnish, place, and maintain a meter; provided, that the said charge of five dollars shall not apply to any meter the supply pipe of which exceeds three-quarters of an inch in diameter, and that if a larger meter is demanded by any water rate payer, under any provision of this ordinance, such water rate payer shall pay to the said Board of Public Works, for the purpose of placing, connecting, and maintaining such meter, a sum equal to the cost of the meter demanded; provided, that any rate payer who has heretofore paid for placing and maintaining a meter shall not be obliged to pay an additional sum therefor. The said Board of Public Works shall have the right at any time to place a meter on the service pipe of any water consumer and charge meter rates for water used through it; provided, that such meter shall be placed and maintained at the expense of the said City. Upon the demand of any consumer and the payment or tender of payment of the sum of three dollars (\$3.00), the said Board of Public Works shall place and maintain on the said consumer's supply pipe an air valve, in connection with the meter, of the latest and most improved pattern.

Section 3. That all flat rate payers must pay their water bills for the current month on or before the 20th day of each month; that all meter rate payers shall pay their water bills on or before the 20th day of each month for water furnished for the preceding month; that the said Board of Public Works be, and said Board of Public Works is hereby, authorized and directed to shut off the water from the premises, unless such bills are so paid; and not to turn the same on again until the payment of all arrearages and amounts due, and the sum of one dollar for turning on the water; that no water tap or service pipe connected with said system of water works shall be placed nearer than two feet from any sewer pipe ditch in said City. Section 4. Any employee of the Water Department of said City, when directed by the said Board of Public Works, under this ordinance, shall be allowed free access to make personal examination of the premises of any applicant for or consumer of water for the purpose of designating the rate established and for the inspection of water pipes and apparatus. Section 5. When water is furnished by meter, the meter shall be read at monthly intervals or as near monthly intervals as the ordinary course of business will permit. Section 6. That all water rates shall be paid by the owners of the property upon which water is used, or upon a written guaranty to be signed by the owner of the property, that the water furnished upon said property shall be paid for at the rates fixed by this ordinance; that in the event that the owner of the property refuses to agree to pay for the water and refuses to execute such guaranty, then the said Board of Public Works shall have the right to demand, as security for the payment of the monthly water bills when the same is not paid in advance, a sum sufficient to pay the water bill for water used on said property for any month during the year. Section 7. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval. Section 8. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published three (3) times in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

Ordinance No. 1292.

An Ordinance Regulating the Use of Water in the City of San Diego, California. Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the use of water for irrigation from the system of water works of the City of San Diego, California, in that portion of said City known as "Pacific Beach", according to the official map thereof on file in the office of the County Recorder of the County of San Diego, State of California, be and the same is hereby prohibited from six o'clock p. m. of every day in the week to six o'clock a. m. of the following day, and on Sunday from six o'clock a. m. to 8 o'clock p. m. during the months of May, June, July, August, September, October, and November, 1903.

Section 2. That if the water which is being supplied, from the system of water works of said City, to the residents of any neighborhood or vicinity therein, is only sufficient or insufficient in quantity to supply the needs and demands of the residents of such neighborhood or vicinity with water for household purposes, it shall be and is hereby made the duty of the Board of Public Works of said City to notify, in writing any person using water in such neighborhood or vicinity for irrigation purposes, to immediately cease using water for irrigation purposes; and if such person shall thereafter continue to use water for irrigation purposes, during the time that the amount of water so furnished is only sufficient or insufficient to supply the residents of such neighborhood or vicinity with water for household purposes, such action shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

Section 3. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be, and said Board of Public Works is hereby authorized to enforce these regulations, and to shut off the water from any person violating any provision of this ordinance, and not to turn the same on again until the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) has been paid to said Board.

Section 4. That any person using water contrary to the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the city jail of said City for a period not exceeding fifty (50) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. That said Board of Public Works shall cause a copy of this Ordinance to be served on all water rate payers.

Section 5. That Ordinance No. 1184 of the ordinances of said City approved on the 3rd day of September, 1902, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 6. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after five (5) days after its passage and approval.

Section 7. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this Ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the city official newspaper of said City, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

Ordinance No. 1293

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, ON TUESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF APRIL, 1903, DIVIDING THE CITY INTO ELECTION PRECINCTS, APPOINTING POLLING PLACES, INSPECTORS, JUDGES, CLERKS, AND BALLOT CLERKS OF ELECTION, AND FIXING THEIR COMPENSATION AND ORDERING THE CITY CLERK TO PREPARE AND HAVE PRINTED THE REQUISITE NUMBER OF BALLOTS AND OTHER ELECTION SUPPLIES AS SPECIFIED BY LAW.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows: Section 1. That the qualified electors of the City of San Diego, California, be and they are hereby notified that a general municipal election will be held in the said city of San Diego on Tuesday, the 7th day of April, 1903, for the purpose of electing the following municipal officers of said City, to-wit:

- A Mayor; A City Treasurer; Four members of the Board of Aldermen of the Common Council of said City for the full term of four years; One member of the Board of Aldermen of the Common Council of said City to fill the unexpired term of G. M. Hawley; One member of the Board of Aldermen of the Common Council of said City to fill the unexpired term of Sam'l G. Ordinance No. 1294.

An Ordinance Providing Certain Regulations in the Operation of the System of Water works Owned by the City of San Diego, California.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows: Section 1. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person, company, or corporation to tap, open or connect with any water main or pipe which forms any part of the system of water works of the City of San Diego, California, without first obtaining written permission so to do from the Board of Public Works of said City.

That it shall be and it is hereby made unlawful for any person, other than the employes of the said City of San Diego, to turn on any water after the same shall have been turned off, as herein provided, without the consent of the said Board of Public Works of said City; also for any plasterer, bricklayer, stone mason, concrete layer, worker in concrete, or contractor to take or use water from said system of water works without written permission from the said Board of Public Works; and all owners and occupants of property are hereby prohibited from furnishing water for such purposes until the said Board of Public Works has so given permission so to do; it shall also be unlawful for any person or persons to place upon or about any fire hydrant or stopcock connected with the water pipes of the said system of water works any building material or other substance so as to prevent free access to the same at all times; also for any water taker to supply water to any person, company, or corporation other than the occupant or occupants of the premises of said water taker, or for any person to conduct or carry away any water from any fire hydrant, watering trough, or public fountain without a permit from the said Board of Public Works of said City; or for any person to knowingly permit leaks or wastage of water, or allow water to flow or escape unnecessarily while washing pavements, sprinkling lawns, gardens or trees.

That any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine in a sum not exceeding \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the city jail of said City for a period not exceeding fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2. That any person, company, or corporation desiring to have a tap made or service pipe laid and connected with the water mains or pipes of said system of water works, shall make application in writing to the said Board of Public Works therefor, and deposit with such application the amount of the expenses to be incurred therefor as herein provided; that no main or water pipe forming any part or portion of said system of water works shall be opened or tapped except by the employes of the said City of San Diego under the supervision of the Superintendent of Water Works; that the size of all taps shall be determined by the said Board of Public Works of the said City of San Diego; that the fees to be charged by the said City of San Diego and collected by the said Board of Public Works in making and placing a tap (which shall include making the aperture in the main and furnishing and placing the tapping cock), shall be as follows:

- For one-half inch tap on all kinds of pipe, \$3.00;
- For three-quarter inch tap on all kinds of pipe, \$3.50;
- For one-inch tap on all kinds of pipe, \$4.00;
- For one and one-half inch tap on four-inch pipe of all kinds, \$6.00;
- For one and one-half inch tap on six-inch pipe of all kinds, \$6.50;
- For one and one-half inch tap on eight-inch pipe of all kinds, \$7.00;
- For one and one-half inch tap on ten-inch pipe of all kinds, \$8.00;
- For one and one-half inch tap on twelve-inch pipe of all kinds, \$9.00.
- For two-inch tap on four-inch pipe of all kinds, \$9.00;
- For two-inch tap on six-inch pipe of all kinds, \$9.50;
- For two-inch tap on eight-inch pipe of all kinds, \$10.00;
- For two-inch tap on ten-inch pipe of all kinds, \$11.00;
- For two-inch tap on twelve-inch pipe of all kinds, \$12.00.

That the compensation which shall be charged by the said City of San Diego and collected by the said Board of Public Works for laying all service pipes shall be the actual cost to said City of the material and labor furnished in so laying said service pipes; which service pipes shall extend from the water main to a point one foot inside of the curb line.

That the property-owner or person making application for a tap or service pipe shall be required to furnish and set without cost to the City on all sidewalks, the whole width of which is paved with brick, asphalt, or concrete, a cast iron cover or frame twenty-five inches by twenty-five inches outside measurement, together with such a foundation of brick or concrete therefor as shall be determined by the said Board of Public Works, for the purpose of enclosing and protecting the curb cock and meter after one is put in place.

That the repair of all service pipes and connections, not owned by the said City of San Diego, within the streets to a foot inside of the curb, and all hydrants, faucets, water closets, stopcock boxes, and all other attachments inside of a line drawn one foot inside of the curb line shall be kept in good condition and repair at all times by the owner or occupant of the premises; and upon failure so to do, after a reasonable notice, the water shall be shut off from the premises; that no person, except the officers and employes of the Water Department of the said City of San Diego, will be allowed to take off or repair any meter attached to the said system of water works; that if a meter gets out of order and fails to register correctly, the consumer shall be charged with an average daily consumption as shown by the meter when in order under similar conditions; that the said Board of Public Works shall not supply or allow to be supplied, any water to a tenant of any premises until a written guarantee or bond as security for the payment of all water rates for water furnished upon said premises, or to the tenants thereof, shall be executed and delivered by the owner of said premises to the said City of San Diego.

Section 3. That any water rate payer shall have the right to demand that the meter, through which such water rate payer is being furnished with water, be examined and tested by the said City of San Diego for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not it is registering accurately and correctly the amount of water being delivered through it by the said City of San Diego to such water rate payer; provided, that when any water-rate payer desires to have the said meter so examined and tested, such water rate payer shall make application therefor in writing to the said Board of Public Works, and shall deposit with the said application the sum of one dollar. Upon said application being made, it shall be the duty of the said Board of Public Works to cause said meter to be examined and tested for the purpose of ascertaining whether it is registering accurately and correctly the water being

so delivered through it. If upon such examination said meter shall be found to register accurately and correctly the amount of water which passes through it, then the said sum of one dollar shall be paid into the City Treasury of said City to the credit of the Water Fund thereof, but if it is found upon such examination, that the said meter does not register accurately and correctly, then the said sum of one dollar shall be returned to the person making the application. Such application shall be made in writing upon a printed form to be furnished by the said Board of Public Works, and shall designate the place where such meter is located, contain a request that said meter be examined and tested by the said Board of Public Works, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent. That said Board of Public Works shall cause a copy of this ordinance to be served on all water rate payers.

Section 4. That Ordinance No. 998 of the ordinances of said City, approved on the 10th day of October, 1901, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Ordinance No. 1296

An Ordinance Regulating the Speed of Automobiles Upon the Streets in the City of San Diego, California.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to run, drive, or operate, or cause to be run, driven or operated, any automobile, or other carriage or vehicle operated by steam, gasoline, electricity, or other power at a rate of speed faster than eight miles an hour, upon any of the streets in that portion of the City of San Diego, California, bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point where the north line of Cedar street intersects the west line of Third street; thence running east along the said north line of Cedar street to a point where the said north line of Cedar street intersects the east line of Seventh street; thence running south along the said east line of Seventh street to a point where the said east line of Seventh street intersects the south line of "K" street; thence west along the said south line of "K" street to a point where the said south line of "K" street intersects the said west line of Third street; thence running north along the said west line of Third street to the place of beginning.

Section 2. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00), or by imprisonment in the city jail of said City for a period not exceeding one hundred days (100), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

An Ordinance Providing for the Preparation of Plans, Drawings, and Cross-Sections for the Paving of Cross Walks and Gutters of Fifth Street in the City of San Diego, California, from the North Line of "B" Street to the South Line of University Avenue, Except that Portion Thereof West of the Center Line Thereof from the North Line of "B" Street to the South Line of "A" Street, with Asphalt Upon Asphalt Concrete Base.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the City Engineer of the City of San Diego, California, be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and furnish to this Common Council plans, drawings, and cross-sections for the paving of the gutter and cross-walks on both sides of Fifth street in the City of San Diego, California, from the north line of "B" street to the south line of University avenue, including all intersections of streets between said points, with an asphalt pavement upon an asphalt concrete base, except the gutter west of the center line of the said Fifth street between the north line of "B" street and the south line of "A" street; and except also in the construction of said gutters and cross-walks that portion of the said Fifth street and the intersections thereof with cross streets, between said points, having railroad or street car tracks thereon. Said gutter to extend from the curb line to a point five (5) feet from the curb line. Said gutters to be constructed at the intersection of the said Fifth street with all cross streets between said points, so that the inside line of said gutter shall continue in a straight line with a line five (5) feet from the curb line and parallel thereto, if said line should be extended across the intersection, and so that the outside line of the said gutter at said intersections shall adjoin the inside line of the cross-walks; said cross-walks to be five feet and four inches (5-4) in width and to extend north and south across the intersections of all cross streets with Fifth street between said points, and run from one curb line of one return to the curb line of the other return, and shall occupy the same width of space in such street intersections that the sidewalks on the said Fifth street would if extended across such intersections; that said cross-walks shall only extend north and south on the east and west side of the intersection of the said Fifth street with the cross streets between said points. That said plans, drawings, and cross-sections shall also contain a plan, drawing, and cross-section of all culverts to be constructed at the intersection of the said Fifth street with all cross streets between said points.

That said plans, drawing, and cross-sections shall comply with the provisions of Ordinance No. 1129 of the ordinances of said city, entitled, "An ordinance prescribing specifications for asphalt pavement on asphalt concrete base in the City of San Diego, California," approved on the 3rd day of June, 1902, as amended by Ordinance No. 1147 of the ordinances of said City, entitled, "An ordinance amending section 2 of Ordinance No. 1129 of the ordinances of said city, approved on the 3rd day of June, 1902," approved on the 17th day of June, 1902. 

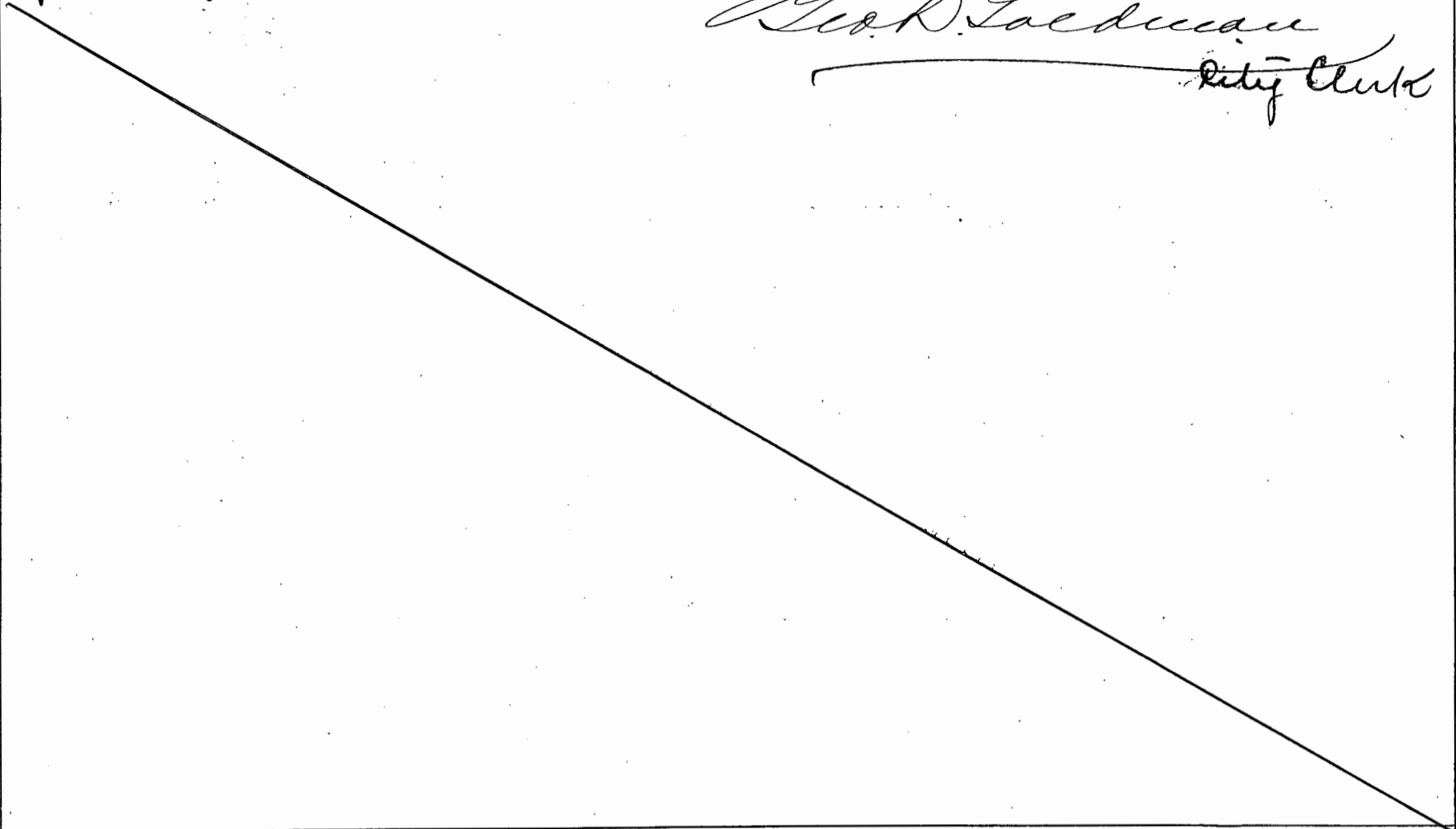



Ordinance No. 1305.

An Ordinance Imposing A License Upon Circuses And Shows in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person, Company or Corporation to engage in the business or to carry on the business of Opening, Conducting, or exhibiting, or causing to be carried on, opened, conducted, or exhibited, or to carry on, open, conduct, or exhibit or cause to be carried on opened, conducted, or exhibited under a Canvas, tent, or in any enclosure, except within a building in the City of San Diego, California, any Circus, Menagerie, or Show without first procuring a license therefor from the City Auditor of the City of San Diego, California, as herein provided.

Section 2. That the license fee for each circus or show, including Menageries or Side Shows, shall be as follows:

For each Circus or Show with a seating Capacity for six thousand or more people, \$300.00 per day;

For each Circus or Show with a seating Capacity for four thousand people or under six thousand people, \$200.00 per day.

For each Circus or show with a seating Capacity for two thousand people or under four thousand people, \$100.00 per day;

For each circus or show with a seating Capacity for less than two thousand people, \$50.00 per day;

For each Menagerie or side-show under separate tent conducted, run, or operated in connection with a circus or show, the license shall be \$25.00 per day;

The words "Seating Capacity", as used herein, mean the number of persons which the seats, provided or erected for the use of the audience or patrons of the said Circus or show, will accommodate, allowing a seating space of two linear feet for each person, except where individual or separate seats with backs are provided, in which case each individual or separate seat shall constitute seating space for one person.

Section 3. That the Auditor of the said City of San Diego be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue all licenses provided for by this Ordinance, and no license shall be issued or delivered until the amount required to be paid therefor has been paid to the City Tax Collector of said City, and his receipt therefor endorsed upon said license.

Section 4. That any person, Company, or Corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than four hundred dollars nor less than forty dollars, or shall be imprisoned in the City Jail of said City for a period of not more than two hundred days nor less than twenty days, or shall suffer both such fine and imprisonment.



Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, by Ordinance No. 1277 of the Ordinances of the said City of San Diego, approved on the 17th day of February 1903, authorized and directed the Board of Public Works of said City to advertise for bids for lighting the streets, Avenues, and Parks of said City with electric lights for a period of one year, beginning on the first day of April, 1903, and ending on the 31st day of March 1904; and

At a point on the east line of Fourteenth street, ten feet south of the last named point, forty-nine and fifty hundredths feet.

At the intersection of the east line of Fourteenth street with the south line of the said alley in Block No. 177 of Horton's Addition, forty-nine and sixty-five hundredths feet.

At the intersection of the west line of Fifteenth street with the north line of the alley in Block No. 6 of Culverwell's Addition to the City of San Diego, California, forty-seven and fifty-two hundredths feet.

At a point on the west line of Fifteenth street ten feet south of the last named point, forty-six and seventy-five hundredths feet.

At the intersection of the west line of Fifteenth street, with the south line of the said alley in Block No. 6 of the said Culverwell's Addition, forty-six and ninety-seven hundredths feet.

That the grade of the alley between the points fixed by this ordinance shall be of uniform ascent and descent.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

An Ordinance Calling a Special Election to be Held in the City of San Diego, California, on the Twenty-Fifth day of April, Nineteen Hundred and Three, and Submitting to the Qualified Electors of said City the Following Propositions of Incurring Debts, to-wit: The Proposition of Incurring a debt in the sum of One Hundred and Ninety-Nine Thousand Dollars in Lawful Money of the United States for the Purpose of Constructing Certain Improvements and Extensions of the System of Water Works of said City; Also the Proposition of Incurring a Debt in the sum of One Hundred and Forty Thousand Dollars in Lawful Money of the United States for the Purpose of Constructing Certain Improvements and Extensions of the System of Sewers of said City; Also the Proposition of Incurring a Debt in the sum of Thirty-Nine Thousand Dollars in Lawful Money of the United States for the Purpose of Constructing Certain Street Work in said City; Also the Proposition of Incurring a Debt in the sum of Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars in Lawful Money of the United States for the Purpose of Acquiring Certain Land and Constructing Certain Buildings for the Use of the Fire Department of said City; Also the Proposition of Incurring a Debt in the sum of Sixty-Six Thousand Dollars in Lawful Money of the United States for the Purpose of Constructing a Certain Farm

Whereas, the Board of Aldermen of the Common Council of said City of San Diego, at its meeting held on the sixteenth day of March, Nineteen Hundred and Three, by a vote of more than two-thirds of all its members, and the Board of Delegates of the Common Council of said City, at its meeting held on the said sixteenth day of March, Nineteen Hundred and Three, by a vote of more than two-thirds of all its members, duly passed and adopted Joint Resolution Numbered Fifteen Hundred and Ten, entitled, "A Resolution Determining and Declaring that the Public Interest and Necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the Inhabitants Thereof, Demand the Construction of Certain Improvements and Extensions of the System of Water Works of the said City; Also the Construction of Certain Improvements and Extensions of the System of Sewers of said City; Also the construction of Certain Street work; Also the acquisition of Land and the Construction of Buildings for the Use of the Fire Department of said City; Also the Construction of a Storm Sewer in said City; Also the Construction of Two Bridges on "B" Street in said City; Also the acquisition of Land and a Building for a City Hall for said City: That the Estimated Cost of said Improvements and Extensions of said System of Water Works is One Hundred and Ninety-Nine Thousand Dollars; That the estimated Cost of the said Improvements and Extensions of said System of Sewers is One Hundred and Forty Thousand Dollars; That the Estimated Cost of the Construction of said Street Work is Thirty-Nine Thousand Dollars; That the Estimated Cost of said Land and the Construction of said Buildings for the Use of the said Fire Department is Thirty-Seven Thousand Dal-

lars; That the Estimated Cost of the Construction of the said Storm Sewer is Fifty-Six Thousand Dollars; That the Estimated Cost of the Construction of the said Bridges on "B" Street is Five Thousand Dollars; That the Estimated Cost of said Land and Building for a City Hall is the Sum of Fourteen Thousand Dollars; That each of said Respective Sums for said Municipal Improvements will be too Great to be Paid out of the Ordinary Annual Income and Revenue of said City; And the Intention of the Legislative Branch of the Government of said City to Take Proceedings for the Acquisition of said Real Property and the Construction of said Municipal Improvements; which Joint Resolution was approved by the executive of said City, to-wit, the Mayor of said City, on the seventeenth day of March, Nineteen Hundred and Three, and was published in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee, a daily newspaper printed and published in said City, on the nineteenth, twentieth, and twenty-first days of March, Nineteen Hundred and Three; and

Whereas, by said Joint Resolution Number Fifteen Hundred and Ten, the legislative branch of said City declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction, by said City, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of said improvements and extensions of the system of water works of said City for the purpose of supplying said City and its inhabitants with water, and that the construction of said improvements and extensions of said system of water works is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of San Diego; and

Whereas, the estimated cost of said improvements and extensions of said system of water works is one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City of San Diego; and

Whereas, by said Joint Resolution Number Fifteen

hundred and ten, the legislative branch of said City declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction, by said City, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers of said City for the collection and disposition of the sewerage of said City, and that the construction of said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of San Diego; and

Whereas, the estimated cost of said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers is one hundred and forty thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City of San Diego; and

Whereas, by said Joint Resolution Number Fifteen Hundred and Ten, the legislative branch of said City declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction, by said City, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of said street work, and that the construction of said street work is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of San Diego; and

Whereas, the estimated cost of said street work is thirty-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City of San Diego; and

Whereas, by said Joint Resolution Number Fifteen Hundred and Ten, the legislative branch of said City declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the acquisition, by said City, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the acquisition

of said land and the construction of said buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City, and that the acquisition of said land and the construction of said buildings are necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes and powers of the municipality of San Diego; and

Whereas, the estimated cost of the acquisition of said land and the construction of said buildings is thirty-seven thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City of San Diego; and Whereas, by said Joint Resolution Number Fifteen Hundred and Ten, the legislative branch of said City declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction, by said City, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of a storm sewer for the purpose of carrying off the surface and storm water, and that the construction of said storm sewer is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes and powers of the municipality of San Diego; and

Whereas, the estimated cost of the construction of said storm sewer is sixty-six thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City of San Diego; and

Whereas, by said Joint Resolution Number Fifteen Hundred and Ten, the legislative branch of said City declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction, by said City, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of said bridges on "B" street, and that the construction of said bridges is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of San Diego; and

Whereas, the estimated cost of the construction of said bridges is five thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City of San Diego; and

Whereas, by said Joint Resolution Number Fifteen Hundred and Ten, the legislative branch of said City declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the acquisition, by said city, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the acquisition of said land and building for the purpose of a City Hall, and that the acquisition of said land and building for the purpose of a City Hall is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes and powers of the municipality of San Diego; and

Whereas, the estimated cost of the acquisition of said land and building is fourteen thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City of San Diego; and

Whereas, the legislative branch of the said City of San Diego has, by the said Joint Resolution Numbered Fifteen Hundred and Ten, declared its intention to take proceedings for the construction of said improvements and extensions of said system of water works, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum of one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States by the issuance of bonds for said purpose; also for the construction of said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum of one hundred and forty thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States by the issuance of bonds for said purpose; also the construction of said street work, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum of thirty-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States by the issuance of bonds for said purpose; also the acquisition of said land and the construction of said building for the use of the Fire Department of said City, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum of thirty-seven thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States by the issuance of bonds for said purpose; also for the construction of said storm sewer, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum of sixty-six thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States by the issuance of bonds for said purpose; also the con-

struction of said two bridges on "B" street and to incur an indebtedness in said sum of five thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States by the issuance of bonds for said purpose; also for the acquisition of said land and building for the use of a City Hall, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum of fourteen thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States for said purposes.

Now, Therefore, Be It Further Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section Two. That a Special Election be held in said City on Saturday, the twenty-fifth day of April, Nineteen Hundred and Thrus, and said Common Council does hereby call a Special Election to be held in said City on Saturday, the twenty-fifth day of April, Nineteen Hundred and Thrus, for the purpose of submitting, and does hereby submit to the qualified voters of said City the propositions of incurring debts, by the said City of San Diego, for the purposes set forth in said Joint Resolution Numbered Fifteen Hundred and Ten, and hereinafter stated, and to issue the bonds of said City therefor as herein set forth.

Section Three. That the objects, and purposes for which said indebtedness is proposed to be incurred are the following, to-wit:

First: The construction, by the said City of San Diego, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of certain improvements and extensions of the system of water-works of the said City of San Diego for the purpose of supplying said City and its inhabitants with water, said improvements and extensions thereof being situated in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, and described more particularly as follows, to-wit:

A water pipe line on Fifth street from Upas street to a point twenty feet north of the north line of Juniper street, and from Hawthorn street to "A" street, consisting of forty-one hundred and thirty linear feet of sixteen-inch cast iron water pipe; three thousand and ten linear feet of twelve-inch cast iron water pipe; fifty-four linear feet of ten-inch cast iron water pipe; one hundred and eighty-eight linear feet of six-inch cast iron water pipe; thirty-two linear feet of four-inch cast iron water pipe; thirteen thousand and nine hundred pounds of lead, and six hundred and sixty-five pounds of hemp; also the following special castings: One sixteen-inch by

Second: The construction, by the said City of San Diego, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say; the construction of certain improvements and extensions of the system of sewers of the said City of

San Diego, for the collection and disposition of the sewerage of said City; said system of sewers, and the improvements and extensions of said system of sewers, being situated in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California and described more particularly as follows:

A main sewer commencing at the south line of the intersection of Atlantic and Ash streets; running thence on Ash street to Union street; running thence on Union street to Albatross street; running thence on Albatross street to Laurel street; running thence on Laurel street to Fourth street; running thence on Fourth street to Walnut avenue; running thence on Walnut avenue to Fifth street; running thence on Fifth street to University Avenue, consisting of ten thousand eight hundred and eighty linear feet of twelve-inch sewer pipe; twenty-seven hundred and fifty linear feet of ten-inch sewer pipe; three hundred and thirty-four twelve-inch y's; ninety-one ten-inch y's; thirty-eight manholes, and one flush tank located at the intersection of Laurel street and Albatross street.

Also a sewer in the alley between Campus Avenue and Cleveland Avenue, running from the center line of Lincoln Avenue to Mead Avenue, consisting of twenty-two hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; seventy-eight six-inch r/s; sixty linear feet of trussing; five manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer commencing at a point in the center line of the alley running east and west from Eighth Street to Ninth Street, and between Monterey Avenue and University Avenue; thence running north through the alley parallel to Eighth Street and Ninth Street, to Monterey Avenue, consisting of six hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; eighteen six-inch r/s; one manhole, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer running from Eighth Street through the alley between University Avenue and Monterey Avenue to Tenth Street, consisting of six hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twelve six-inch r/s; two flush tanks, one located at the east end of said line of sewer, and one at the west end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in Ninth Street, running from the center line of University Avenue north to the alley running east and west between Monterey Avenue and University Avenue, consisting of one hundred and twenty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, and one manhole;

Also one flush tank at the intersection of Walnut Avenue and Fifth Street;

Also a sewer in Front Street extending from the center line of Laurel Street to Walnut Avenue, consisting of thirty-six hundred and thirty linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe; seventy-nine eight-inch r/o; six manholes; four hand holes, and fourteen hundred and eighty-five linear feet of trestle;

Also a sewer in Walnut Avenue extending from the center line of Front Street to the center line of the alley between First and Second streets, consisting of two hundred and sixty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe;

Also a sewer in Walnut Avenue, extending from the center line of Front Street to the center line of the alley between First Street and Albatross Street, consisting of two hundred and sixty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe;

Also a sewer in the alley between First Street and Albatross Street, running from Walnut Avenue to Robinson Avenue, consisting of nineteen hundred and seventy linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; forty-eight six-inch r/o; four manholes; two hand holes; six hundred and fifty linear feet of trestling, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between First and Second streets, running from Walnut Avenue to Brookes Avenue, consisting of six hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twenty-four six-inch r/o; two manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in Brookes Avenue extending from the alley between First Street and Albatross Street to the alley between Second and Third streets, consisting of seven hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, and two manholes;

Also a sewer in the alley between First and Second streets, extending from Brookes Avenue to University Avenue, consisting of seventeen hundred and sixty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; fifty six-inch r/o; four manholes, one hand hole, and one flush tank located at the extreme north end of said line of sewer; and four hundred and ten linear feet of trestle between Brookes Avenue and Thornton Avenue;

Also a sewer in the alley between Second and Third streets, extending from Brookes Avenue to University Avenue, consisting of seventeen hundred and sixty-six

each foot of six-inch sewer pipe; sixty-four six-inch y's; five manholes and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer; also one hundred feet of breathing;

Also a sewer in the alley between Second and Third Streets, extending from the center line of Brookes Avenue southerly one hundred and sixty-six feet, consisting of one hundred and sixty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, six six-inch y's, and one manhole;

Also a sewer in the alley between Fourth and Fifth streets, extending from a point one hundred and fifty feet north of Brookes Avenue to University Avenue, consisting of fifteen hundred and sixty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; sixty-four six-inch y's; four manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Fourth and Fifth streets extending from Walnut Avenue to Brookes Avenue, consisting of six hundred and eight linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twenty-four six-inch y's; one manhole, and one flush tank located at the south end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Third and Fourth streets, extending from Walnut Avenue to Brookes Avenue, consisting of six hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twenty-four six-inch y's; one manhole, and one flush tank located at the south end of said line of sewer;

Also an outfall sewer commencing at a point on the center line of Beardsley Street twenty feet south of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue thence running in a southwesterly direction four hundred and seventy-five feet, consisting of four hundred and seventy-five linear feet of twenty-inch sewer pipe and three manholes;

Also an outfall sewer commencing at a point four hundred and seventy-five feet southwest of a point on the center line of Beardsley Street twenty feet south of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue; thence running in a southwesterly direction for a distance of eight hundred feet into the Bay of San Diego, to be supported by one hundred and eighty-five piles, and to consist of eight hundred linear feet of twenty inch cast iron pipe; seven manholes; one twenty-inch gate, and one cast iron bend;

Also a main sewer running from a point on Beardsley Street twenty feet south of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue, thence running through the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue to Sigbee Street; thence running in a straight line to a point in the alley between Main Street and Pierce Avenue two hundred and fifty feet northwest of the northwest line of Sigbee Street; thence running in a straight line northeasterly to the northeasterly line of Main Street; thence running in a straight line to a point where the north line of Manasse & Dehiller's Addition intersects the southwest line of Logan Avenue; thence running in a straight line east to the northwest end of the alley in the block between Everett Avenue and Twenty-eighth Street; thence running southeasterly through said alley to the center line of Twenty-eighth Street; thence running south along Twenty-eighth Street to a point on the center line of Twenty-eighth Street fifty feet south of the alley between Franklin Avenue and Grant Avenue, consisting of twenty-three hundred and forty linear feet of sixteen-inch sewer pipe; thirty-two hundred and ten linear feet of fourteen-inch sewer pipe; eight hundred and fifty linear feet of twelve-inch sewer pipe; six hundred and twenty linear feet of ten-inch sewer pipe; five hundred linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe; eight hundred and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twenty-four sixteen-inch y's; twelve fourteen-inch y's; ten twelve-inch y's; eight ten-inch y's; ten eight-inch y's; two six-inch y's; twenty-eight manholes; and two large flush tanks, one of said flush tanks to be located at the end of the said sewer line on Twenty-eighth Street, and one to be located at the south end of Twentieth Street.

Also a main sewer running from a point on the center line of Beardsley Street twenty feet south of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue in a straight line to a point on the center line of Deard Street opposite the alley between Pierce Avenue and Railroad Avenue; thence running along Deard Street to the center line of Twenty-sixth Street; thence running along Twenty-sixth Street to Marcey Avenue; thence running along Marcey Avenue to Twenty-eighth Street; thence running north to the southeasterly line of Deard Street, consisting of four thou-

sand and ten linear feet of twelve inch sewer pipe; sixteen hundred linear feet of ten-inch sewer pipe; nine hundred linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe; eleven hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; fifty-eight twelve-inch y's; forty-eight eight-inch y's; three six-inch y's; twenty-two manholes, and two large flush tanks, one of said flush tanks to be located at the north end of said line of sewer, and one at the intersection of Deard street and Milton Avenue;

Also a sewer in the alley between Newton Avenue and Main Street, running from Evans street to a point in said alley three hundred feet northwest of the northwest line of Sigbee Street, consisting of three thousand linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; one hundred and twelve six-inch y's; nine manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Milton Avenue and Newton Avenue, running from Dampson Street to a point in said alley one hundred and eighty feet southeast of the southeast line of Fifteenth street, consisting of thirty-six hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; one hundred and thirty six six-inch y's; eleven manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Logan Avenue and Milton Avenue, running from a point one hundred and seventy-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Evans street to a point in said alley seventy feet southeast of the southeast line of Fifteenth street, consisting of twenty-nine hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; one hundred and ten six-inch y's; ten manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Julian Avenue and Kearney Avenue, running from Evans street to a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of said alley, consisting of twenty-four hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; ninety-two six-inch y's; eight manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Julian Ave-

now and Irving Avenue, commencing at Evans street and running in a straight line to a point sixty-five feet west of the south end of the west line of twenty-second street, consisting of two thousand and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; seventy-four six-inch r's; six manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Harrison Avenue and Irving Avenue, running in a straight line from a point one hundred and seventy-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Dampson Street to a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of said alley, consisting of twenty-one hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; eighty six-inch r's; seven manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Grant Avenue and Harrison Avenue, running in a straight line from a point two hundred feet southeast of the southeast line of Evans street to a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of said alley, consisting of thirteen hundred and ninety linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; fifty-four six-inch r's; four manholes; and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Franklin Avenue and Grant Avenue, running in a straight line from Twenty-eighth street to a point on the west line of Dewey street one hundred and fifty feet northeast of the northeast line of Grant Avenue; consisting of seventeen hundred and twenty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; sixty-four six-inch r's; five manholes; and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Everett Avenue and Franklin Avenue, running from Dampson Street to a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of said alley, consisting of eight hundred and forty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; thirty-four six-inch r's; two manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between "N" Street and Webster Avenue, running from a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of the alley, in block three hundred and seventeen of the San Diego Land and Town

Company's Addition, to Thirty-second street, consisting of twenty-eight hundred linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe; one hundred eight-inch r's; nine manholes; and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between Webster Avenue and Clay Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-eighth street to Thirtieth street, consisting of thirteen hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; forty-eight six-inch r's; four manholes; and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between Clay Avenue and Franklin Avenue running from the center line of Twenty-eighth street to Thirtieth street, consisting of thirteen hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; forty-eight six-inch r's; four manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley in blocks three hundred and seventeen and three hundred and twenty-four of Reed and Daley's Addition, running from the center line of Twenty-eighth street to a point one hundred and twenty-five feet west of the west line of Thirtieth street, consisting of thirteen hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; forty-eight six-inch r's; four manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer running through the alley in blocks one and two of Reed and Hubbell's Addition, and running from the west line of Twenty-eighth street to a point one hundred feet west of the west line of Thirty-first street, consisting of nineteen hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; sixty six inch r's; five manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between Logan Avenue and National Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-sixth street to a point one hundred and fifty feet east of the east line of Thirty-first street, consisting of thirty-five hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; one hundred and twenty-four six-inch r's; ten manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between National Avenue

and Grand Avenue, running from the west line of Twenty-sixth street to a point one hundred and fifty feet west of the west line of Thirty-second street, consisting of four thousand and forty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; one hundred and thirty four six-inch y's; twelve manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Grand Avenue and Boston Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-sixth street to a point one hundred and fifty feet west of the west line of Thirty-second street, consisting of thirty-seven hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; one hundred and twenty-eight six-inch y's; eleven manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Boston Avenue and Main street, running from the center line of Main street to a point three hundred feet west of the west line of Thirty-second street, consisting of thirty-six hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; one hundred and twenty-six six-inch y's; ten manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Milton Avenue and Newton Avenue running from the center line of Deard street to Sampson street, consisting of six hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twenty-four six-inch y's; two manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Logan Avenue and Milton Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-sixth street to a point sixty-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Evans street, consisting of four thousand and fifty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; fifty six-inch y's; four manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Julian Avenue and Kearney Avenue, running from the center line of Marcey Avenue along Deard street to the alley between Julian Avenue and Kearney Avenue, and thence along said alley to the southeast line of Evans street, consisting of five thousand and seventy linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; forty-eight six-inch y's; two manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Irving Avenue and

Julian Avenue, running from the intersection of Twenty-eighth street and Marcey Avenue to Evans street, consisting of two thousand and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twenty-eight six-inch r.p.s.; six manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Harrison Avenue and Irving Avenue, running from Twenty-eighth street to a point sixty-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Dampson street, consisting of twelve hundred ^{linear} feet of six-inch sewer pipe; forty-two six-inch r.p.s.; three manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Grant Avenue and Harrison Avenue, running from Twenty-eighth street to a point in said alley two hundred and seventy-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Dampson street, consisting of eleven hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; fifty-two six-inch r.p.s.; three manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer running from the southeast end of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue, thence along Schley street to Twenty-sixth street; thence along Twenty-sixth street to the alley between Grand Avenue and Boston Avenue, consisting of ten hundred and thirty linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe; twenty-six six-inch r.p.s.; six hundred and fifty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, and five manholes:

Also a sewer running from a point on Fourth street fifty feet south of the south line of Juniper street along Fourth street to the south line of Laurel street, consisting of eight hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twenty-six six-inch r.p.s.; two manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer running from a point on Twenty-third street thirty feet of the south line of "B" street east along "B" street to Twenty-fourth street, thence running north on Twenty-fourth street to "A" street; thence running east on "A" street to a point twenty-five feet west of the west line of Twenty-fifth street, consisting of twelve hundred and thirty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; thirty-two six-inch r.p.s.; five manholes, and

one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer running from the west end of the alley in block seventy-eight of Deaman and Choate's Addition to the center line of Thirtieth street, thence running south along the center line of Thirtieth street to the center line of the alley between "N" street and Webster Avenue, consisting of thirteen hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; three manholes; twenty-four y's, and one flush tank located at the west end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer running from the west end of the alley in block seventy-seven of Deaman and Choate's Addition east through the said alley to the center line of Thirtieth street, consisting of six hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; two manholes; twenty-four y's, and one flush tank located at the west end of said line of sewer:

Also the removal of six hundred and forty linear feet of old sewer pipe in Fifth street, running north from the center line of Walnut Avenue; also the removal of two hundred and eighty linear feet of old sewer pipe in Walnut Avenue between Fourth and Fifth streets; and also the removal of three thousand linear feet of old sewer pipe in Union street and in Albatross street, running from the center line of Ash street north for a distance of three thousand feet, first along Union street to Albatross street, and thence along Albatross street; also the removal and relaying of two hundred and fifty linear feet of cast iron sewer pipe, commencing at a point five feet north-west of the northwest end of the alley between Logan Avenue and Kearney Avenue, thence running in a south-easterly direction two hundred and fifty feet.

That said sewers follow the center line of all streets and alleys, except at the intersection of streets and alleys. All sewer pipe will consist of vitrified iron stone salt-glazed sewer pipe, except where pipe is placed on trestles where it will consist of kalamain pipe. There being no sewers over any portion of said routes except that which will be so removed.

The construction of the said improvements and extensions to said system of sewers to include the furnishing of all labor and material in removing said old sewer

pipe, and in making all excavations for trenches, laying and putting in place all sewer pipe and 40. back-filling the trenches and excavations, constructing all drestles, manholes, hand holes, and flush tanks, and completing the same in every particular ready for use.

Third: The construction, by the said City of San Diego, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of certain street work in said City, situated in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, and described more particularly as follows, to-wit:

The grading of a driveway twenty feet in width and coating the surface thereof with crude petroleum, the center line of which driveway is described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the intersection of the unnamed street on the southwest boundary of Old Town with the northwesterly line of Witherby street, thence running five hundred and eighteen and five tenths feet to the center of the intersection of First street and Couts street in Middletown; thence running along the center line of First street eleven hundred and forty and five tenths feet to the center line of Estudillo street; thence running along the center line of Estudillo street two hundred and seventy-four and five tenths feet to the center line of Second street; thence running along the center line of Second street eleven hundred and forty-one and three tenths feet to the center line of Clayton street; thence running along the center line of Clayton street four hundred and thirty-five and seven tenths feet to the center of California street; that there will also be constructed, in constructing said street work over said line, three small wooden culverts, the estimated cost of which completed is seventy-two dollars in lawful money of the United States.

Also beginning at a point on the westerly line of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and two, two hundred and sixty feet from the United States Military Reservation line; thence running south seventy-seven degrees and twenty minutes east two hundred and fifty-eight and eight tenths feet; thence running

south twelve degrees and fifty-five minutes west one hundred and sixty and two tenths feet; thence running east forty feet from and parallel to the United States Military Reservation line seven hundred and five and three tenths feet to the easterly line of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and two; thence running north twelve degrees and forty-two minutes east along the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered one hundred and two, one hundred and five, one hundred and four, one hundred and twenty-nine, and one hundred and forty-two, sixteen hundred and fifty-two and five tenths feet to the northeasterly corner of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and four; thence running north thirteen degrees and twenty-two minutes east along the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered one hundred and forty-two, one hundred and forty-three, one hundred and forty-eight, one thousand and two tenths feet to the northwesterly corner of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and forty-eight; thence running south seventy-six degrees and forty-eight minutes east along the northerly line of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and forty-eight, six hundred and sixty and seven tenths feet to the northeasterly corner thereof; thence running north thirteen degrees and thirty-one minutes east between Pueblo Lots numbered one hundred and forty-nine and one hundred and seventy, eighty-five and eight tenths feet; thence running south seventy-six degrees and forty-five minutes east through Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and forty-nine, forty from and parallel to the southerly line of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and sixty-nine, five hundred and five feet; thence running through blocks numbered one hundred and sixty, one hundred and sixty-eight and one hundred and sixty-seven of La Playa, and Pueblo Lots numbered one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and seventy-four, and one hundred and seventy-eight and through blocks numbered three, four and five of Stanton, as follows, North twenty-seven degrees and thirty-one minutes east three hundred and thirty-eight and seven tenths feet; thence running south eighty-seven degrees and thirty-five minutes east two hundred and forty-seven and three tenths feet; thence running north twenty-two degrees and fifty-six minutes east forty-nine and seven tenths feet; thence running north forty-eight degrees and fifteen minutes east fifty feet;

thence running north twenty-seven degrees and forty one minutes east two hundred feet; thence running north fifty-five degrees and thirty-one minutes east two hundred and thirty-one and six tenths feet; thence running north forty degrees and twenty-seven minutes east one hundred and twenty-five and seven tenths feet; thence running north twenty-four degrees and thirty-five minutes east one hundred and eighty-five and five tenths feet; thence running north forty degrees and three minutes east two hundred and nine and five tenths feet; thence running north twenty-one degrees and two minutes east one hundred and seventy-six feet; thence running north forty-six degrees and forty-four minutes east three hundred and forty-seven and five tenths feet; thence running north thirty-nine degrees and forty-four minutes east eight hundred and seventy-two feet to the center line of Magnetic Avenue in Ironton; thence running south seventy-six degrees and forty-two minutes east along the center line of Magnetic Avenue four hundred and seventy-four and three tenths feet to the center line of Main street, New Basville; that there will also be constructed, in constructing said street work over said line, twenty-two small wooden culverts, the estimated cost of which completed is four hundred and twenty-two dollars in lawful money of the United States.

Also beginning at the intersection of a line forty feet north of the south line of University Avenue with the center line of Fifth street, thence running north eighty-nine degrees and fifty-eight minutes west, parallel to the south line of University Avenue seven hundred and fifteen feet to the center line of Third street; thence running through Pueblo Lot "C" north six hundred and twelve and two tenths feet; thence running north eighty-nine degrees and fifty-five minutes west, twelve hundred and sixty-two and eight tenths feet; thence running south seventeen degrees and forty-one minutes west one hundred and eighty-three feet; thence running south eighty-two degrees and thirty-seven minutes west one hundred and two feet; thence running north fifty-one degrees and forty-nine minutes west three hundred and four feet to the center line of Wash-

ington street on the easterly boundary of Arnold and
 Choate's Addition; thence running along the center line
 of Washington street north eighty-nine degrees and fifty-
 five minutes west fifteen hundred and forty-eight and
 six tenths feet to the center line of this street; thence
 running north five minutes east three hundred and
 forty-nine and six tenths feet to the center line of
 Gatti street; thence running along the center line of
 Gatti street north eighty-nine degrees and fifty-six
 minutes west eight hundred and thirty-nine and
 six tenths feet to the center line of Clay street; thence run-
 ning along the center line of Clay street north nine
 minutes east three hundred and fifty and nine tenths
 feet to the center line of Lewis street; thence running along
 the center line of Lewis street north eighty-nine degrees

That the construction of said street work will include the furnishing of all labor and material necessary in completing and finishing the the grading of said driveway and coating the same with four thousand barrels of crude petroleum; furnishing all labor and material necessary in completing and finishing said culverts and bridges ready for use; that there is now no graded driveway

over said line and route.

Fourth: The acquisition, by the said City of San Diego, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the acquisition of certain land and the construction of certain buildings by the said City of San Diego for the use of the Fire Department of said City; said land being situated in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California; that the acquisition of said land and construction of said improvements are described more particularly as follows, to-wit: the acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep, within that district bounded on the north by "B" street, on the east by Eighth street, on the south by "D" street, and on the west by Seventh street. The estimated cost of said lot or piece of land being three thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number One, being a brick building with a pressed brick front; two stories high and ninety feet long and fifty feet wide. The lower story walls will be eighteen inches thick, and the upper story walls will be twelve inches thick. The lower story ceiling will be twelve feet high, and the upper story ceiling will be ten feet high. The lower story floor will consist of six inches of concrete with a two inch wearing surface of bitumen. The upper floor joists will be two inches thick and fourteen inches wide. The upper ceiling joists will be two inches thick and six inches wide. The roof joists will be two inches thick and six inches wide. The building will have a flat tin roof with skylight. The walls and ceiling upstairs will be lathed and plastered, the walls and ceiling downstairs will be finished in wood. All framing lumber will be Oregon Pine, and all finishing lumber will be redwood. The estimated cost of said building completed is ten thousand five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. Said building to be constructed according to the plan therefor set forth in that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows: "Document No 3085. Filed Mar. 2, 1903. Geo. D. Goldman, City Clerk, Plans and Estimates of cost of Fire Engine House No 1.", to which reference is here-

by made for further particulars.

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep within that district bounded by "D" street on the north, Third street on the east, "F" street on the south, and Second street on the west. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is three thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number Two. This building will be built on the same plan as said Fire Engine House Number One, except that the front will be constructed of common brick, and the ground floor walls and the lower floor will be finished in lumber. The estimated cost of said building completed is eighty-five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States.

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep, within that district bounded by "I" street on the north, Eighth street on the east, "K" street on the south, and "Seventh" street on the west. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is eight hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number Three, being a frame building two stories high, and sixty feet long by thirty feet wide. The lower story ceiling will be eleven feet six inches high, and the second story ceiling will be nine feet high. The building will be finished in rustic with a hip roof, celled downstairs, and lathed and plastered upstairs.

The joists of the lower floor will be two inches thick and twelve inches wide; the joists of the upper floor will be two inches thick and fourteen inches wide. The studing for the second floor outside will be two inches thick and four inches wide, and on the inside two inches thick and three inches wide. The studing will be sixteen inches apart and all joists will be sixteen inches apart. All rafters will be two inches thick and four inches wide. All ceiling joists will be two inches thick and four inches wide. All framing lumber will be Oregon Linn, and all finishing lumber, redwood.

Building will be painted inside and out with three coats of paint. The estimated cost of said building completed is thirty-two hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. Said building to be constructed according to the plan therefor set forth in that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows: "Document No. 3087. Filed Mar. 2, 1903. Geo. O. Goldman's City Clerk. Plans & Estimates of Two Engine Houses No 3 & 4. Presented to Council, and adopted March 2nd, 1903." to which reference is hereby made for further particulars.

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep, within that district bounded by Palm street on the north, Third street on the east, Nutmeg street on the south, and Second street on the west. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is nine hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number Four. The estimated cost of said building completed is thirty-two hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. This building will be a frame building and constructed according to the same plan for the said Fire Engine House Number Three.

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred and thirty-five feet deep, located on University Avenue between Seventh street and Ninth street. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is six hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number Two. This building will be a frame building one story high, and sixty-one feet long by thirty-seven feet wide. It will be twelve feet from the ground floor to the ceiling. The floor joists will be two inches thick and twelve inches wide. The ceiling joists will be two inches thick and six inches wide. The studing will be two inches thick and four inches wide. The rafters will be two inches thick and four inches wide. All joists will be set sixteen inches apart, and all rafters will be set twenty-four inches apart. The building will be finished in

rustic with a hip roof, and will be lathed and plastered inside. The estimated cost of said building completed is Twenty-five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. Said building to be constructed according to the plan therefor set forth in that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows: "Document No. 3088. Filed Mar. 2-1903. Geo. D. Goldman, City Clerk. Plans + Estimates of Cost of Fire Engine House No 5. Presented to Council, and adopted March 2d, 1903." to which reference is hereby made for further particulars.

The acquisition of one lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep, located within that district bounded on the north by "H" street, on the east by Thirteenth street, on the south by "I" street, and on the west by Twelfth street. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is eight hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States.

That said City does not own any land within any one of said districts, nor any buildings, except one old building which is in a dilapidated condition and unfit for the use of said Fire Department.

Fifth: The construction by said City of San Diego of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction, by said City of a storm sewer in said City for the collection and disposition of storm and surface water, consisting of an expanded metal concrete conduit, commencing at a point where the west end of "B" street intersects the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence running easterly along "B" street to Tenth street; thence along Tenth street to Ash street; thence to the south line of the City Park; being on the same alignment as the B-street Flume now in place. Said conduit, at the north end thereof, being six feet six inches deep and four feet ten inches wide on the inside; at Fourth street said conduit will be six feet six inches deep and six feet ten inches wide on the inside, and at the outlet at the west end of said conduit it will be twelve feet four inches wide and four feet deep on the inside.

Said conduit will be constructed according to the plan therefor as shown by that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows: "Communication City Engineer Estimate of Cost and plans of 'B' Street Conduit. Document No. 1054. Filed Feb. 11th, 1902. Geo. D. Goldman, City Clerk. Presented to the Council and ordered filed March 7th, 1902; to which reference is hereby made for further particulars. The construction of said storm sewer to include the furnishing of all labor and material in making all excavations and trenches, and laying and putting in place all concrete and other material, backfilling the trenches and excavations, and completing the whole work in every particular so that the same will be ready for use in carrying the storm and surface water. That there is now storm sewer over said route, except an old wooden one which is in a dilapidated condition and unfit for the purpose of carrying said storm and surface water.

Ditch: The construction, by said City of San Diego, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction by said City of two frame bridges on "B" street, situated in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Two wooden bridges upon a driven pile foundation, each of which bridges will be one hundred and twelve feet long and twenty-four feet wide. The first bridge will extend across a ravine from a point on the said "B" street three hundred and seventy feet east of the east line of Twenty-seventh street to a point four hundred and eighty-two feet east of the said east line of Twenty-seventh street. The second bridge will extend across a ravine from a point four hundred and twenty-eight feet east of the east line of Twenty-eighth street to a point five hundred and forty feet east of the said east line of Twenty-eighth street. The center line of each of said bridges will be coincident with the center line of the said "B" street. That there are now no bridges at either of said points. Said bridges to be constructed according to the plans and specifications therefor set forth in that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows:

"Document No. 2955. Filed Feb. 12-1903. Geo. D. Goldman, City Clerk, by H. W. Vincent, Deputy. Communication City Engineer Plans, Estimates, etc., for the grading of "B" street from 22d to 30th st. Presented to the Council and ordered filed February 16th 1903." to which reference is hereby made for further particulars. That the estimated cost of the construction of each of said bridges, completed and ready for use, is twenty-five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States.

Seventh: The acquisition, by the said City of San Diego, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the acquisition of that certain building, and the land upon which the same is constructed, located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Fifth street and "G" street in the City of San Diego, California, being the east ninety feet of lot lettered "L" in block numbered eighty-eight of Horton's Addition in the City of San Diego, California, and the building constructed thereon, for the municipal purposes and use of a City Hall; said building being a four story brick building, and now occupied by said City for the municipal purposes and uses of a City Hall in the said City of San Diego.

That the said City does not now own a City Hall, but has a written contract with the owner of said land and building whereby the said City may acquire the title in and to said land and building by paying the sum of five hundred dollars per month for the use of said building until the month of June, Nineteen Hundred and Four, and then paying the sum of Fourteen Thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States for the title to said property; that the said sum of five hundred dollars per month for the use of said land and building can be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City until the month of June, Nineteen Hundred and Four, but the said sum of Fourteen Thousand dollars cannot be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City.

Section Four. That it be and is hereby declared

and determined that the public interest and necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by said City of said improvements and extensions of said system of water works for the purpose of supplying said City and its inhabitants with water, and that the construction of said improvements and extensions of said system of water works is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said City;

That it be and is hereby declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by said City of said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers for the collection and disposition of the sewerage of said City, and that the construction of said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said City;

That it be and is hereby declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by said City of said street work, and that the construction of said street work is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said City;

That it be and is hereby declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the acquisition by said City of said land and the construction of said buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City, and that the acquisition of said land and the construction of said buildings are necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes and powers of said City;

That it be and is hereby declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by said City of said storm sewer for the purpose of carrying off the storm and surface water, and that the construction of said storm sewer is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said City;

That it be and is hereby declared and determined

That the public interest and necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by said City of said bridges on 'B' street, and that the construction of said bridges is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said City;

That it be and is hereby declared and determined that the public interest and necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the acquisition by said City of said land and building for the purpose of a City Hall, and that the acquisition of said land and building for the purpose of a City Hall, is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes and powers of said City.

Section Five. That the estimated cost of the proposed public improvement first above described, to-wit: the construction of the said improvements and extensions of the said system of water works by said City, is one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that the amount of the principal of the indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that the rate of interest to be paid on said indebtedness is four and one half per cent. per annum; that if the proposition of incurring the indebtedness for said purposes submitted at such election, receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit: two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters voting at such election, bonds of said City to the amount of one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars shall be issued and sold for the purpose of constructing said improvements and extensions of said system of water works; that said bonds shall be two hundred in number and shall be issued in the following denominations, viz., one hundred and sixty bonds of one thousand dollars each, and forty bonds of nine hundred and seventy-five dollars each; said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States in the manner following, viz: The interest shall be payable semi-

annually, and four of said bonds of the denomination of one thousand dollars, and one of said bonds of the denomination of nine hundred and seventy-five dollars shall be paid each and every year at the City Treasury of said City on a day and date to be fixed by the legislative branch of said City, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date.

Section Dix: That the estimated cost of the proposed public improvement second above described, to-wit: the construction of the said improvements and extensions of the said system of sewers of said City, is one hundred and forty thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that the amount of the principal of the indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of one hundred and forty thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that the rate of interest to be paid on said indebtedness is four and one-half per cent per annum; that if the proposition of incurring the indebtedness for said purpose, so submitted at such election, receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit: two thirds of the votes of the qualified voters voting at such election, bonds of said City to the amount of one hundred and forty thousand dollars shall be issued and sold for the purpose of constructing said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers; that said bonds shall be two hundred and eighty in number, and shall be issued in the denomination of five hundred dollars each; said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent, per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be paid in lawful money of the United States in the manner following, viz: The interest shall be payable semi-annually, and seven of said bonds shall be paid each and every year at the City Treasury of said City on a day and date to be fixed by the legislative branch of said City, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date.

Section Deven: That the estimated cost of the proposed public improvement third above described, to-wit: The construction of said street work, is thirty-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that the amount of the principal of the indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of thirty-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that the

rate of interest to be paid on said indebtedness is four and one half per cent, per annum; that if the proposition of incurring the indebtedness for said purpose, so submitted at such election, receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit: two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters voting at such election, bonds of said City to the amount of thirty-nine thousand dollars shall be issued and sold for the purpose of constructing said street work; that said bonds shall be thirty-nine in number and shall be issued in the denomination of one thousand dollars each; said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent, per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States in the manner following, viz: The interest shall be payable semi-annually, and one of said bonds shall be paid each and every year at the City Treasury of said City on a day and date to be fixed by the legislative branch of said City, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date.

Declion Eight. That the estimated cost of the proposed public improvement fourth above described, to-wit, the acquisition of said land and the construction of said buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City, is thirty-seven thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that the amount of the principal of the indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of thirty-seven thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that the rate of interest to be paid on said indebtedness is four and one-half per cent, per annum; that if the proposition of incurring the indebtedness for said purpose, so submitted at such election, receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit, two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters voting at such election, bonds of said City to the amount of thirty-seven thousand dollars shall be issued and sold for the purpose of acquiring said land and constructing said buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City; that said bonds shall be thirty-seven in number, and shall be issued in the denomination of one thousand dollars each; said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per

cent. per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States in the manner following, viz: The interest shall be payable semi-annually, and one of said bonds shall be paid each and every year at the City Treasury of said City on a day and date to be fixed by the legislative branch of said City, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date.

Section Nine. That the estimated cost of the proposed public improvement fifth above described to-wit, the construction of the said storm sewer, is sixty-six thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that the amount of the principal of the indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of sixty-six thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that the amount of the principal of the indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of sixty-six thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States and that the rate of interest to be paid on said indebtedness is four and one-half per cent. per annum; that if the proposition of incurring the indebtedness for said purpose, so submitted at such election, receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit, two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters voting at such election, bonds of said City to the amount of sixty-six thousand dollars shall be issued and sold for the purpose of constructing said storm sewer; that said bonds shall be sixty-six in number, and shall be issued in the denomination of one thousand dollars each; said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States in the manner following, viz: The interest shall be payable semi-annually, and two of said bonds shall be paid each and every year at the City Treasury of said City on a day and date to be fixed by the legislative branch of said City, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date.

Section Ten. That the estimated cost of the proposed public improvement sixth above described, to-wit: the construction of said two bridges on "B" street in said City, is the sum of five thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that the amount of the principal of the

indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of five thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that the rate of interest to be paid on said indebtedness is four and one half per cent per annum; that if the proposition of incurring the indebtedness for said purpose, so submitted at such election, receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit, two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters voting at such election, bonds of said City, to the amount of five thousand dollars, shall be issued and sold for the purpose of constructing said bridges; that said bonds shall be ten in number, and shall be issued in the denomination of five hundred dollars each; said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one half per cent per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States, in the manner following, viz: the said interest shall be payable semi-annually, and one of said bonds shall be paid each and every year at the City Treasury of said City on a day and date to be fixed by the legislative branch of said City, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date.

Section Eleven. That the estimated cost of the proposed public improvement, seventh above described, to-wit, the acquisition of said land and building for the purpose of a City Hall for said City, is the sum of fourteen thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that the amount of the principal of the indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of fourteen thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States and that the rate of interest to be paid on said indebtedness is four and one half per cent per annum; that if the proposition of incurring the indebtedness for said purpose, so submitted at said election, receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit, two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters voting at such election, bonds of said City to the amount of fourteen thousand dollars shall be issued and sold for the purpose of acquiring said land and building for said City Hall; that said bonds shall be fourteen in number and shall be of the denomination of one thousand dol.

lars each: said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States in the manner following, viz: interest shall be paid semiannually and one of said bonds shall be paid each and every year at the City Treasury of said City on a day and date to be fixed by the legislative branch of said City together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date.

Section Twelve. That for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of said bonds, the legislative branch of said City shall, at the time of fixing the general tax levy and in the manner for such general tax levy provided, levy and collect annually each year, until such bonds are paid, or until there shall be a sum in the Treasury of said City set apart for that purpose, sufficient to meet all sums coming due for principal and interest on said bonds, a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on such bonds, and also such part of the principal thereof as shall become due before the time for fixing the next general tax levy. Said taxes shall be in addition to all other taxes levied for municipal purposes, and shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as other municipal taxes are collected and be used for no other purpose than the payment of said bonds and accruing interest.

Section Fourteen. That the poles for said election shall be open at six o'clock in the morning of the day of election and shall be kept open until five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, when said poles shall be closed.

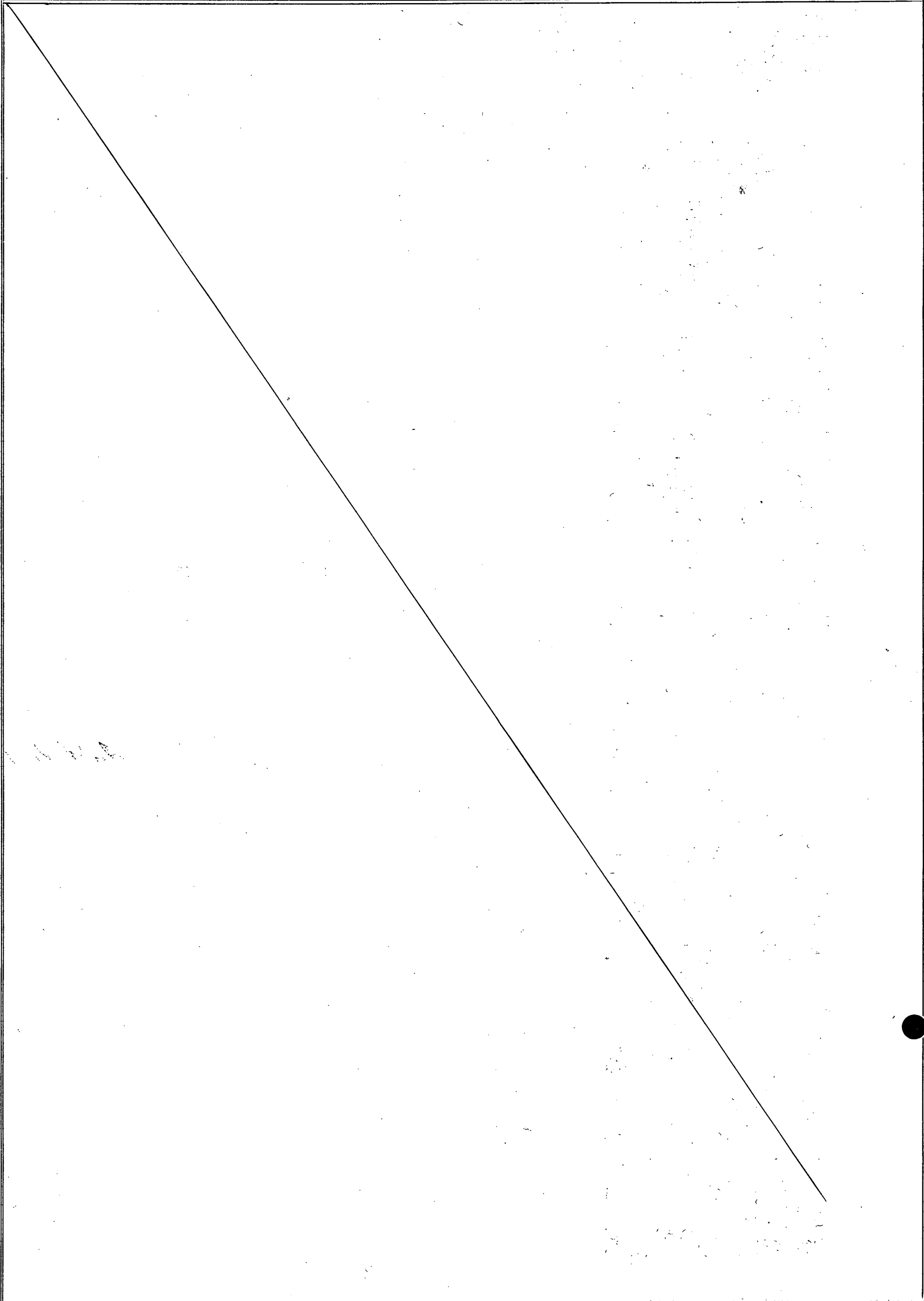

Ordinance No. 1324.

An Ordinance Regulating the Removal of Buildings Over and Along the Streets of the City of San Diego.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to remove or cause to be removed any building over and along any of the streets embraced within the corporate limits of the City of San Diego, California, without first procuring a permit therefor from the Board of Public Works of said City.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the owner, or contractor, or party removing any building when telegraph, telephone, electric light, electric railway or other electric wires or poles become obstructions in the way of such removal, to give written notice of such fact to the Board of Public Works by service on the Secretary thereof and shall also serve written notice on the owners or the superintendent, Secretary or managing agent of the owners of such obstructions between 8:30 o'clock a. m. and 4:30 o'clock p. m., and at least six hours before such building shall reach such obstructions; and the owners of such wires and poles thus notified shall at the time specified in such notice have the requisite linemen and helpers at the place of such obstruction and shall as soon as the building reaches such obstruction cut or remove the same so as to allow the passing of such building, and thereafter repair and replace the same; provided, however, that the owner or contractor removing such building, at the time of the service herein required, shall deposit with the Board of Public Works the sum of Ten Dollars out of which sum the said Board shall pay the actual necessary expenses attaching to the removal and repair of the obstructions aforesaid, and if the said sum of Ten Dollars shall not be sufficient for such purpose, then the owner of the building or the contractor shall pay to said Board the additional amount; the owner or owners of such obstruction or obstructions to file with said Board of Public Works an itemized account of such expenses. And provided further that if the owner of said obstruction after the service of such notice shall fail to have the requisite linemen and helpers in attendance at the time specified in such notice and the party removing such building shall be delayed or otherwise damaged by reason of such failure, the owner of such obstruction shall be liable to the party so removing such building for the actual damage resulting from such delay and said owners of such obstruction shall also be liable to the fine and imprisonments hereafter specified and shall not collect from the party removing such building any sum or sums whatever for the expenses attaching to the removal and repairs of said obstruction or obstructions. Provided further, that where such wires or poles become obstructions and are not erected in compliance with the

requirements of the law and the ordinances of the city as they shall exist at the time of their becoming such obstruction, or where the obstruction consists of a drop wire running across the street to a building, or where on poles required to be 40 feet in length, the wires or cables are lower than thirty feet; then and in any of those events, the party owning said wires or poles shall upon receiving the notice hereinbefore specified be required to remove such obstruction as hereinbefore specified, but shall not be entitled to demand or receive any compensation therefor and for a failure or delay in removing such obstruction shall be liable for damages as hereinbefore specified and subject to fine and imprisonment hereinafter specified.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to remove a building over and along any street of said City occupied by any street, electric or other railway, so as to interfere with the free operation of cars thereon, without the permit aforesaid; provided, however, that the Board of Public Works shall be empowered to permit such removal upon such street; provided, further, that if the person removing the building shall have given the notice to the owner of the said street, electric or other railway as required by Section 2 hereof, then the permission so granted, shall extend for such a period as may be necessary, not exceeding four hours after the linemen shall commence the removal of such obstructions.

Section 4. That any person or persons violating any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine in a sum not to exceed fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the city jail of said City not to exceed twenty-five (25) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. That Ordinance No. 216 of the ordinances of said city, approved March 12th, 1888, and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 7. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego be and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance to publish or cause the same to be published once in the city official newspaper of said City, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

Ordinance No. 1325.

An Ordinance Granting a Franchise to the Southern California Railroad Company (a Corporation), Authorizing It To Construct, Maintain, and Operate, for a Period of Twenty-five (25) Years, a Steam Railroad Along Certain Streets in the City of San Diego, California.

Be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Southern California Railroad Company (a corporation) be and it is, and its successors and assigns be and they are hereby permitted and authorized to construct, maintain, and operate, for a period of twenty-five (25) years, a railroad track for a steam railroad upon, over, and along the public streets of the City of San Diego, California, hereinafter described, subject, however, to all the conditions and requirements provided by law, made or to be made in such cases, and to all the rights of private ownership. Said railroad tracks shall be laid and constructed upon, over, and along that certain route in the City of San Diego, California, described as follows to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the center line of main track of the Southern California Railway in the City of San Diego known as Mile Post 268, plus 1369 feet; thence southeasterly on a turn-out curve to the left 79.5 feet, said turn-out curve consuming an angle of 6 degrees 22½ minutes; thence southeasterly on a tangent to said turn-out curve 57.1 feet; thence southeasterly on a 12-degree curve to the left 149 feet; more or less, to the northeasterly line of the 100-foot right of way of the Southern California Railway Company at a point 27 feet, more or less, southeasterly from the intersection of said right of way line with the north line of "K" street; thence continuing easterly on said 12-degree curve in "K" street 75.4 feet to a point 21 feet south of said north line of "K" street and 43 feet west of the west line of Third street; thence east parallel to said north line of "K" street 603 feet to point of ending in the west line of Fifth street.

The intention of this ordinance is to provide a track franchise for a steam railroad on that certain portion of "K" street in the said City of San Diego, above described.

Section 2. That the said railroad tracks shall be constructed in such a manner that will present the least obstruction to the free use of said street.

Section 3. That this franchise is granted on the following conditions: That the said Southern California Railroad Company, its successors and assigns shall, during the life of said franchise, keep and maintain all portions of said street between the rails of said railroad, and for a distance of two (2) feet on each side thereof, in good condition for public convenience and travel; that it shall relay and replace the pavement (if the street is already paved) in laying the ties and rails for such railroad, in as good condition as before said ties and rails were so put in, and that the laying of said track shall in all cases conform to the official grade of said street.

Section 4. That the said City of San Diego hereby reserves the right to change, pave or repave, macadamize or re-macadamize, sewer, or otherwise improve, alter or repair the said street, or any portion thereof, between said points, over which such franchise is granted; such work to be done so as to obstruct the said railroad as little as possible, and the grantee herein shall shift and reshift its said tracks, so as to avoid the obstructions, made by such work, and in case the said City shall grade, pave, or repave, or otherwise improve said street between said points, or any part or portion thereof, the said grantee, its successors and assigns, shall pave or repave, grade and keep in repair the said street between the rails and tracks, and for at least two feet on each side of the same; and provided further, that neither the said Southern California Railroad Company, its successors or assigns, shall at any time allow cars to remain or stand upon the intersection of the said "K" street with any cross street between said points for over ten minutes at any one time, except in case of unavoidable accident.

Section 5. That the City Engineer of said City shall give the established grade of said street along the line of construction of said tracks, and set stakes indicating the grade; he shall see that the said railroad tracks are constructed in conformity with the terms and requirements of this ordinance, and for his services as herein required he shall receive such fees as are provided for by the ordinances of said City and the same shall be paid for by the said grantee.

Section 6. That the said Southern California Railroad Company, its successors and assigns, shall be liable for all damages, which may be adjudged in favor of the owner or owners of any property or to other persons, because of the granting of such franchise, or the construction of said tracks; provided, further, that the failure of the said Southern California Railroad Company, its successors or assigns, to comply with all the requirements of this ordinance, shall work a forfeiture of all the rights, powers, and privileges granted hereby, and that thereafter the whole of this ordinance shall be null and void.

Section 7. That the said Southern California Railroad Company, its successors and assigns, shall be and are hereby authorized and empowered under this ordinance to use steam, electricity, or other motive power for the purpose of operating a railroad over such right of way.

Section 8. That the Common Council of the said City of San Diego hereby reserves the right to repeal, amend, or modify this ordinance at any time hereafter.

Section 9. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 10. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

An Ordinance Declaring the Result of the Special Election Held in the City of San Diego, California, on the Twenty-fifth Day of April, Nineteen Hundred and Three.

Be It Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego as follows:

Section One. That at the special election held in the City of San Diego, California, on the twenty-fifth day of April, nineteen hundred and three, pursuant to Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, of the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, passed and adopted by the Common Council of said City on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and three and approved by the Mayor of said City on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and three, calling such special election to be held in said City on the said twenty-fifth day of April, 1903, the following propositions were submitted to the qualified electors of said City for their acceptance or rejection, namely:

Fourth: "Shall the City of San Diego incur a bonded debt of thirty-seven thousand dollars for the acquisition of certain land, and the construction of buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City?"

Fifth: "Shall the City of San Diego incur a bonded debt of sixty-six thousand dollars for the purpose of constructing a certain storm sewer in said City?"

Sixth: "Shall the City of San Diego incur a bonded debt of five thousand dollars for the purpose of constructing certain bridges in said City?"

Seventh: "Shall the City of San Diego incur a bonded debt of fourteen thousand dollars for the purpose of ac-

quiring certain land and the buildings thereon for a city hall for said City?"

All of said propositions being more specifically set forth and described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty.

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Ordinance No. 1333.

An Ordinance defining and providing for the Abatement of Nuisances, and the Vacation of Buildings, in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That whenever any premises or place in the City of San Diego, California, either within or outside of buildings, or on unimproved property, becomes or is in a condition so that it endangers the health of the public or of the people living in the vicinity of such property, or of persons occupying such premises or place, or any part or portion thereof, then such premises and place is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Section 2. That whenever the Health Officer of said City shall certify to the Board of Health of said City that such^a nuisance exists, stating the location and the nature of such nuisance, the said Board of Health may cause a written or printed notice to be pasted upon such premises or places, and served on the occupant or occupants, (if the same is occupied?) and said Board of Health shall also cause a copy of such notice to be served on the owner of such premises or place, if he is known to the said Board of Health, and lives in the City of San Diego, California, but if the owner does not live in the said City and has an agent of said property in the said City of San Diego, known to the said Board of Health, a copy of said notice shall be served on the agent. Said notice shall state that the said premises or place (describing it) is in an unsanitary condition, and is endangering the health of the people of the said City, or the people residing in the vicinity of such property, or the occupants of such property, and shall require the owner or agent to put the said premises or place in a sanitary condition within ten days from the date of the service of such notice, and such notice shall state what is required to be done in order to put the said premises or place in a sanitary condition. If the said premises or place is occupied, the notice served on the occupant or occupants shall require him or them to vacate the same within twenty (20) days

from the date of the service of the said notices, unless said premises or places shall have been put in a sanitary condition, since the service of said notices.

Section 3. That any party, person or persons, who shall refuse or fail to comply with the requirements of such notices shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine in a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200.00), or by imprisonment in the City jail of said City for a period not exceeding one hundred (100) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 6. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the city official newspaper of said City, to-wit: the San Diego Union and Daily News.

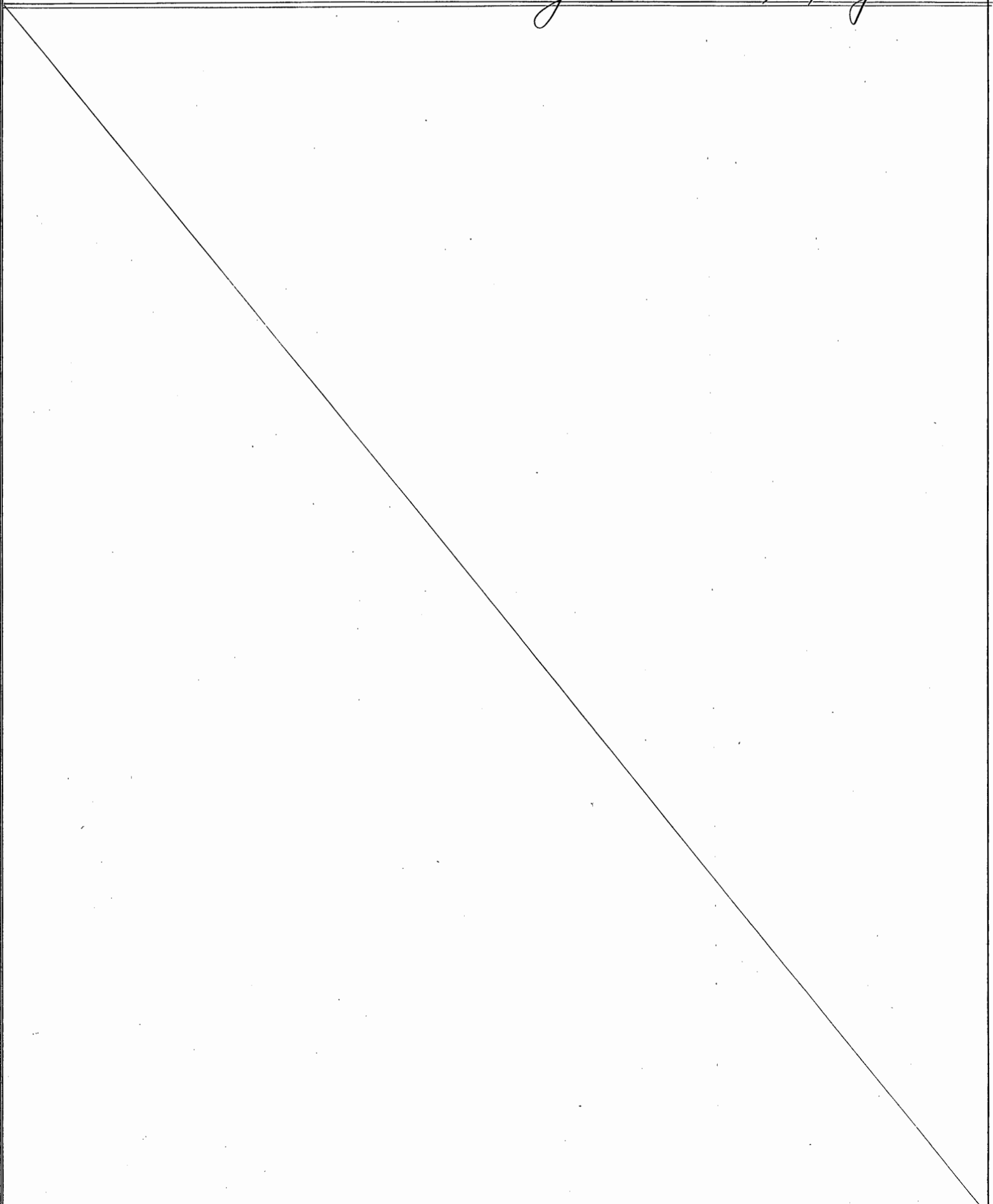

Ordinance No. 1334

An Ordinance Granting a Franchise to Charles B. Richards, and his Successors and Assigns, Authorizing the Construction, Maintenance and Operation, for a Period of Twenty-five Years of a Steam Railroad, along Certain Streets in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Charles B. Richards, be and he is, and his successors and assigns be and they are hereby permitted and authorized to construct, maintain and operate, for a period of twenty-five years, a railroad track, for a steam railroad, upon, over, and along the public streets of the City of San Diego, California, hereinafter described, subject however, to all the conditions and requirements provided by law, made or to be made in such cases, and to all the rights of private ownership. Said railroad tracks shall be laid and constructed upon, over, and along that certain route in the City of San Diego, California, described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing on the east line of the intersection of "L" street with Ninth street; thence running along a line between the center line of Ninth street and the curb line of Ninth street; thence running along Ninth street between said lines and across the intersection of Ninth street and "M" street to the north line of "N" street; thence to a point on the east line of the intersection of the said Ninth street with "N" street twenty feet north of the south line of "N" street.

The intention of this ordinance is to provide a track franchise for a steam railroad over the route above described.

Section 2. That the said railroad track shall be constructed in such a manner that will present the least obstruction to the free use of the street.

Section 3. That this franchise is granted on the following conditions, viz: That the said Charles B. Richards, his successors and assigns, shall during the life of said franchise keep and maintain all portions of said street and street intersections between the rails of said railroad, and for a distance of two feet on each side thereof in good condition for public conveyance and travel, and that the laying of said track shall in

all cases conform to the official grade of said street.

Section 4. That the said City of San Diego hereby reserves the right to change, pave or repave, macadamize or remacadamize, sewer, or otherwise improve, alter or repair said street, or any portion thereof between said points, over which said franchise is granted. Said work to be done so as to obstruct said railroad as little as possible. And the grantee hereby shall shift and reshift said tracks so as to avoid the obstruction made by such work, and in case the said City shall grade, pave or repave, or otherwise improve said street between said points, or any part or portion thereof, the said grantee, his successors and assigns, shall pave or repave, grade and keep in repair the said street between the rails and tracks and for at least two feet on either side of the same.

Section 5. That the City Engineer of said City shall give the established grade of said street and street intersections along the line of construction of said tracks and set stakes indicating the grade. And he shall see that the said railroad tracks are constructed in conformity with the terms and requirements of this ordinance, and for his services as herein required he shall receive such fees as are provided for by the ordinances of said City, which shall be paid by the said grantee.

Section 6. That the said Charles B. Richards, his successors and assigns, shall be liable for all damages which may be adjudged in favor of the owner or owners of any property, or to other persons, because of the granting of such franchise, or the construction of said tracks; provided, that the failure of the said Charles B. Richards, his successors or assigns, to comply with all the requirements of this ordinance, shall work a forfeiture of all the rights, powers, and privileges granted hereby, and that thereafter the whole of this ordinance shall be null and void.

Section 7. That the said Charles B. Richards, his successors and assigns, shall be and are hereby empowered under this ordinance to use steam, electricity, or other motive power for the purpose of operating a railroad over such right of way and

along said route.

Section 8. That the Common Council of said City of San Diego hereby reserves the right to repeal, amend, or modify this ordinance at any time hereafter.

Section 9. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 10. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the city official newspaper of said City, to-wit: the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

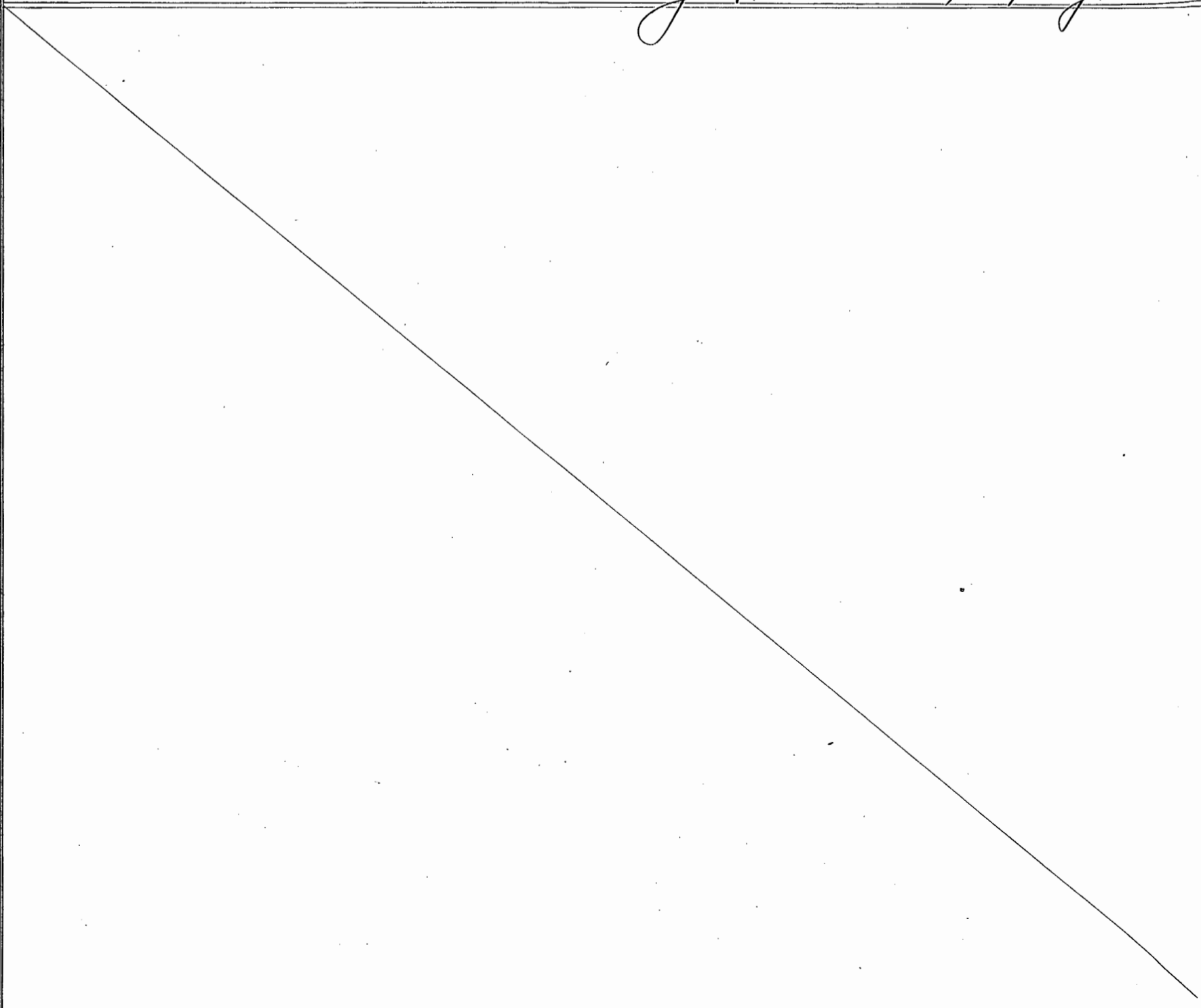

An Ordinance Providing for the Issuance of Bonds by the City of San Diego, California, in the Sum of One Hundred and Ninety-nine Thousand Dollars for the Construction of Improvements and Extensions of the System of Water Works of said City; Also, in the Sum of One Hundred and Forty Thousand Dollars for the Construction of Improvements and Extensions of the System of Sewers of said City; Also, in the Sum of Thirty-seven Thousand Dollars for the Acquisition of Land and the Construction of Buildings for the Use of the Fire Department of said City, and Also in the Sum of Five Thousand Dollars for the Construction of Two Bridges on "B" Street, in said City.

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, being the legislative branch of said City, did on the sixteenth day of March, 1903, pass and adopt by a two-thirds vote of all the members of each Board of said Common Council, resolution number fifteen hundred and ten, by which resolution it was duly determined and declared that the public interest ^{and the public necessity demands} the construction by said City of improvements and extensions of the system of water works of said City, and that the same is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said City, and that the estimated cost of the said improvements and extensions of said system of water works is one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenues of the said City; also, the construction by said City of improvements and extensions of the system of sewers of said City, and that the same is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said City, and that the estimated cost of said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers is one hundred and forty thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the

ordinary annual income and revenue of said City; also, the acquisition by said City of land and the construction of buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City, and that the same are necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said City, and that the estimated cost of the acquisition of said land and construction of said buildings is thirty-seven thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City; also, the construction by said City of two bridges on "B" Street, in said City, and that the same is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the said City, and that the estimated cost of the construction of said bridges is five thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, which cost and sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City; and that all the necessary and proper proceedings should be taken and had according to law to incur a bonded indebtedness for said purposes.

And Whereas, said resolution numbered fifteen hundred and ten was duly approved by the executive of said City, to-wit; the Mayor thereof on the seventeenth day of March, 1903, and was duly published in all respects as required by law in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee, a daily newspaper printed and published in said City on the nineteenth, twentieth, and twenty-first days of March, nineteen hundred and three, and that said publication was made in the said newspaper proper and not in a supplement thereof; the said San Diego Union and Daily Bee at all times herein mentioned being the official newspaper of said City of San Diego, and a daily newspaper published in said City seven days in each week.

And Whereas, on Monday, the sixth day of April, 1903, the said Common Council by a two-thirds vote of all the members of each Board thereof, did duly pass and adopt ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, calling a special election in the said City of San Diego, submitting to the qualified electors of said City the said propositions to incur a bonded indebtedness for said purposes, all as designated and described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, to which reference is

hereby made for further particulars.

And Whereas, said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty was duly approved by the Executive of said City, to-wit, the Mayor thereof on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and three, and was duly published in all respects as required by law and by the terms of said Ordinance, to-wit, for twelve days immediately prior to the twenty-fifth day of April, nineteen hundred and three, in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Star, which newspaper is published seven days in each week in said municipality, to-wit, on the thirteenth, fourteenth, fifteenth, sixteenth, seventeenth, eighteenth, nineteenth, twentieth, twenty-first, twenty-second, twenty-third and twenty-fourth days of April, nineteen hundred and three, and that said publication was made in said newspaper proper and not in a supplement thereof.

And Whereas, on Saturday, April twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred and three, said special election, as specified in said ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, was duly and regularly held and conducted in all respects as required by law, and by said ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty calling said election, and said propositions for the incurring of said indebtedness and the issuance of bonds for each of said purposes, as specified in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, were duly submitted to the qualified electors of said City in all respects as required by law, and the provisions of said Ordinance calling said election.

And Whereas, at said special election more than two-thirds of the qualified electors of said City, voting at said special election, voted in favor of each of the following propositions submitted to them as follows, to-wit: in favor of the incurring of said indebtedness by said City in the sum of one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, payable in forty years, in equal annual installments, with interest thereon at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in like lawful money of the United States, for the construction by said City of the said improvements and extensions of the said system of

water works, as described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, and the issuance of bonds for such indebtedness, as provided by said Ordinance; also, in favor of the incurring of said indebtedness by said City in the sum of one hundred and forty thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, payable in forty years, in equal annual installments, with interest thereon at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in like lawful money of the United States, for the construction by said City of the said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers, as described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, and the issuance of bonds for such indebtedness, as provided by said Ordinance; also, in favor of the incurring of said indebtedness by said City in the sum of thirty-seven thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, payable in thirty-seven years, in equal annual installments, with interest thereon at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in like lawful money of the United States, for the acquisition by said City of said land and the construction by said City of said buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City, as described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, and the issuance of bonds for such indebtedness, as provided by said Ordinance, and also in favor of the incurring of said indebtedness by said City in the sum of five thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, payable in ten years, in equal annual installments with interest thereon at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in like lawful money of the United States, for the construction by said City of said two bridges on "B" street, in said City, as described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, and the issuance of bonds for such indebtedness, as provided by said Ordinance.

And Whereas, all the votes cast at said election were duly and properly cast, and counted, and the returns thereof duly and properly certified, made, canvassed, and declared.

And Whereas, the whole number of votes given at said special election in said City upon said proposition to incur said indebtedness in the said sum of one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars, in lawful

money of the United States, for the construction of said improvements and extensions of said system of water works was 2363, of which number 1596 votes were given in favor of said proposition, and 767 votes were given against said proposition.

And Whereas, the whole number of votes given at said special election in said City upon said proposition to incur a bonded indebtedness in the sum of one hundred and forty thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, for the purpose of constructing said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers, was 2344, of which number 1629 votes were given in favor of said proposition, and 715 votes were given against said proposition.

And Whereas, the whole number of votes given at said special election in said City upon said proposition to incur a bonded indebtedness in the sum of thirty-seven thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, for the acquisition of said land and the construction of said buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City was 2347, of which number 1720 votes were given in favor of said proposition, and 627 votes were given against said proposition.

And Whereas, the whole number of votes given at said special election in said City upon said proposition to incur a bonded indebtedness in the sum of five thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, for the purpose of constructing said two bridges on "B" Street was 2340, of which number 1628 votes were given in favor of said proposition, and 712 votes were given against said proposition.

And Whereas, each of said propositions above described has been duly accepted by the qualified electors of said City, and said City has been and is now authorized and empowered to incur a bonded indebtedness of one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, payable in forty years, in equal annual installments, with interest thereon at the rate of four and one half per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in like lawful money of the United States, for the construction by said City of said improvements and extensions of the

said system of water works, as designated and described in said ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty.

And Whereas, the said City has been and is now authorized and empowered to incur a bonded indebtedness of one hundred and forty thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, payable in forty years, in equal annual installments, with interest thereon at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in like lawful money of the United States, for the construction by said City of said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers in said City, as designated and described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty.

And Whereas, the said City has been and is now authorized and empowered to incur a bonded indebtedness of thirty-seven thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, payable in thirty-seven years, in equal annual installments, with interest thereon at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in like lawful money of the United States, for the requisition by said City of the said land and the construction of said buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City, as designated and described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty.

And Whereas, the said City has been and is now authorized and empowered to incur a bonded indebtedness of five thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, payable in ten years, in equal annual installments, with interest thereon at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in like lawful money of the United States, for the construction by said City of the said two bridges on "B" Street, as designated and described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty.

And Whereas, all and singular the provisions of the Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled, "An Act Authorizing the Incurring of Indebtedness by Cities, Towns, and Municipal Corporations for Municipal Improvements and regulating the Acquisition, Construction or Completion Thereof," and becoming a law February twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred and one, and of the Charter and Ordinances of said City have been fully complied with so as to authorize the issuance of all of

said bonds.

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section Two. said system of sewers, as described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty shall issue as follows: that said bonds shall be negotiable in form, and two hundred and eighty in number, and shall be issued in the denomination of five hundred dollars each, and each of said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States, in the manner following: the interest shall be evidenced by interest coupons, respectively, attached to said bonds and shall be payable semi-annually, and that seven of said bonds of the denomination of five hundred dollars each shall be paid on the following dates, to wit: the first day of July, A. D., nineteen hundred and four, and seven of said bonds on the same day and date of each and every year thereafter, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date, at the City Treasury of the said City of San Diego by the Treasurer of said City who shall be in office as such Treasurer, at the respective times when such payments become due and payable, upon the surrender of said bonds: that the interest on said bonds shall be payable semi-annually, in like lawful money of the United States, at the City Treasury of said City, by the Treasurer of said City who shall be in office as such Treasurer, at the respective times when such payments of interest become due and payable, upon the surrender of the interest coupons evidencing the same. That the bonds of the said City of San Diego for the payment of the acquisition of the said land and the construction of said buildings for the use of the Fire Department of said City, as described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, shall issue as follows: that said bonds shall be negotiable in form, and thirty-seven in number, and shall be issued in the denomination of one thousand dollars each, and each of said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States in the manner following: the interest shall be evidenced by interest coupons respectively, attached to said bonds and shall be payable semi-annually, and that one of said bonds of the denomination of one thousand dollars shall be paid on the following dates to wit: the first day of July, A. D., nineteen hundred and four, and one of said bonds on the same day and date of each and

every year thereafter, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date, at the City Treasury of the said City of San Diego by the Treasurer of said City who shall be in office as such Treasurer, at the respective times when such payments become due and payable, upon the surrender of said bonds: that the interest on said bonds shall be payable semi-annually, in like lawful money of the United States, at the City Treasury of said City, by the Treasurer of said City who shall be in office as such Treasurer, at the respective times when such payments of interest become due and payable, upon the surrender of the interest coupons evidencing the same. That the bonds of the said City of San Diego for the payment of the cost of the construction of said two bridges on "B" street, in said City, as described in said Ordinance number thirteen hundred and twenty, shall issue as follows: that said bonds shall be negotiable in form, and ten in number, and shall be issued in the denomination of five hundred dollars each, and each of said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, and the principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States in the manner following: the interest shall be evidenced by interest coupons, respectively, attached to said bonds and shall be payable semi-annually, and that one of said bonds of the denomination of five hundred dollars shall be paid on the following date, to-wit: the first day of July, A. D., nineteen hundred and four, and one of said bonds on the same day and date of each and every year thereafter, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such date, at the City Treasury of the said City of San Diego, by the Treasurer of said City who shall be in office as such Treasurer, at the respective times when such payments become due and payable, upon the surrender of said bonds: that the interest on said bonds shall be payable semi-annually, in like lawful money of the United States, at the City Treasury of said City, by the Treasurer of said City who shall be in office as such Treasurer, at the respective times when such payments of interest become due and payable, upon the surrender of the interest coupons evidencing the same.

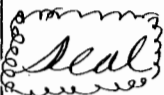

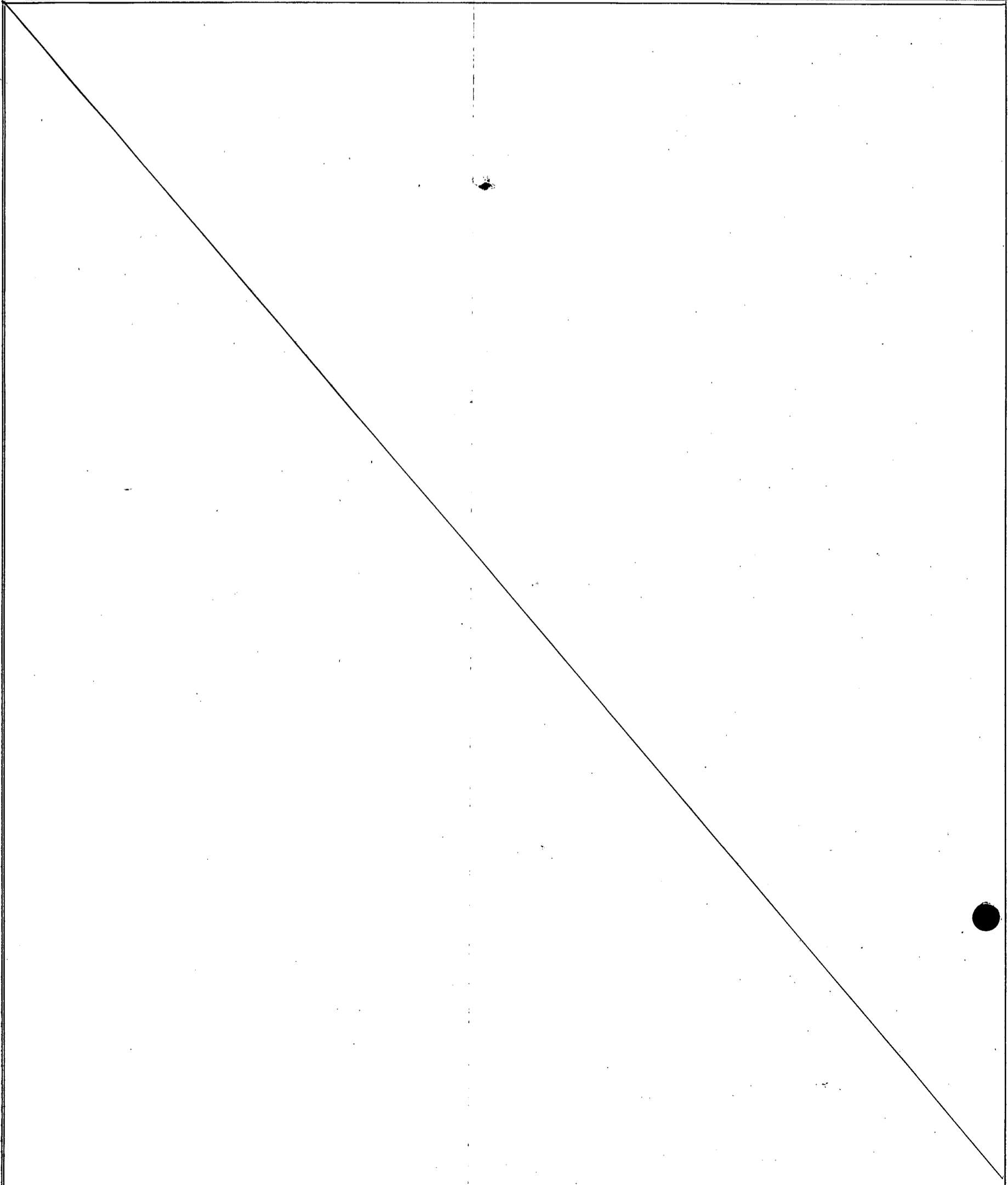

That Section 13 of Ordinance No. 1127, of the Ordinances of the City of San Diego, California, approved on the 3rd day of June, 1902, entitled, "An Ordinance prescribing regulations in making connections with the public sewers, and for plumbing in the City of San Diego, California," be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 13. That every waste pipe shall be of cast iron or lead. All lead pipe connections must be made with a wiped joint. No solder or bolt joint will be allowed. Soft wastes may be of wrought iron. All cast or wrought iron pipes and fittings for waste, vent, or soil pipe must be coated both inside and outside with coal-tar pitch, applied hot, or some equivalent substance.

All connections of lead with iron pipe must be made with a brass ferrule of the same size as the lead pipe and caulked into the iron pipe, and connected with the lead pipe by a wiped joint. Reduced ferrules are strictly prohibited. Every line of vent and soil pipe must extend full bore to six inches above the highest ridge of the roof, as herein after provided. Or in case of a building having a flat roof and fire walls, then two feet above the fire walls. In every building there shall be at least one four-inch cast iron pipe running from the sewer to a point six inches above the highest ridge of the roof, where a water closet is located in said building. (except buildings having a flat roof and fire walls).

In all new buildings (except buildings having a flat roof and fire walls) every line of vent and soil pipe must run to the roof and, where at least a sixth bend can be used to make the turn, continue under the roof to a point six inches from the ridge of the roof, and thence run through the roof perpendicular to a point six inches above the highest ridge of the roof. In all buildings built of one thickness of one inch lumber and in all old buildings (except buildings having

a flat roof and fire walls) where new plumbing is put in, and in all buildings where additional plumbing is put in after the roof has been constructed, other than that for the construction of which the original contract was made (except buildings having a flat roof and fire walls), every vent and soil pipe must run perpendicular from the sewer or fixture to a point six inches above the highest point of the roof. Where there is only one water closet on a four-inch stack ^{stack} the ^{will} vent said closet. If there is more than one closet on a stack, each and every closet shall be vented with a two-inch vent. In no case shall a fixture be located more than two feet from its vent. In case an adjoining building, within fifty feet of said pipe, extends one or more stories higher than the building in which the said soil or vent pipes are located, then the said pipes must be carried three feet above all openings or gutters of the highest building and securely fastened, so as to prevent them from falling, by proper guys and support. One inch and a half vents shall be galvanized iron. All other vents shall be of cast iron. The pipes must be enclosed within buildings. This applies also to running pipes under the roof, where a sixth bend can be used. All connections with traps must be made to main, soil, waste, or vent pipes by means of lead-caulked joints. Tap tees are prohibited. No other roof shall be used except the one called for in this ordinance. All soil, waste, vent, or drain pipes inside and outside of the building, from the property line, before being covered up, must have all openings stopped up, and filled with water. This test must be made in the presence of the plumbing inspector. In all cases where the plumbing inspector is not satisfied with the water test, he may use the smoke or peppermint test. All house drains shall, after being laid, be allowed to remain uncovered until inspected by the plumbing inspector. Notice must be given the plumbing inspector when the work is sufficiently advanced for inspection, and every facility must be given the Plumbing Inspector to make a thorough inspection, that is, if any pipes are covered with flooring, siding or lath, or in any way covered that will tend to obstruct a thorough inspection of the plumbing, the said obstruction will have to be removed before the Plumbing Inspector inspects the work. When pipes have been tested in sections, there shall be another test made when connections are ready

to be made with the main sewer. Immediately upon completion of the work, notice must be given the Plumbing Inspector for his final inspection. It shall be the duty of plumbers to report to the Plumbing Inspector the replacing of old closets with new closets, or old bath-tubs with new bath-tubs, or old sinks with new sinks, or any other old fixture with a new fixture, in order that the work of replacing the old material with new material may be inspected by the Plumbing Inspector.

Section 2. That every person violating any of the foregoing provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or by imprisonment in the City jail of said City for a period not exceeding one hundred (100) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 4. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this Ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the City official newspaper of the City, to wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

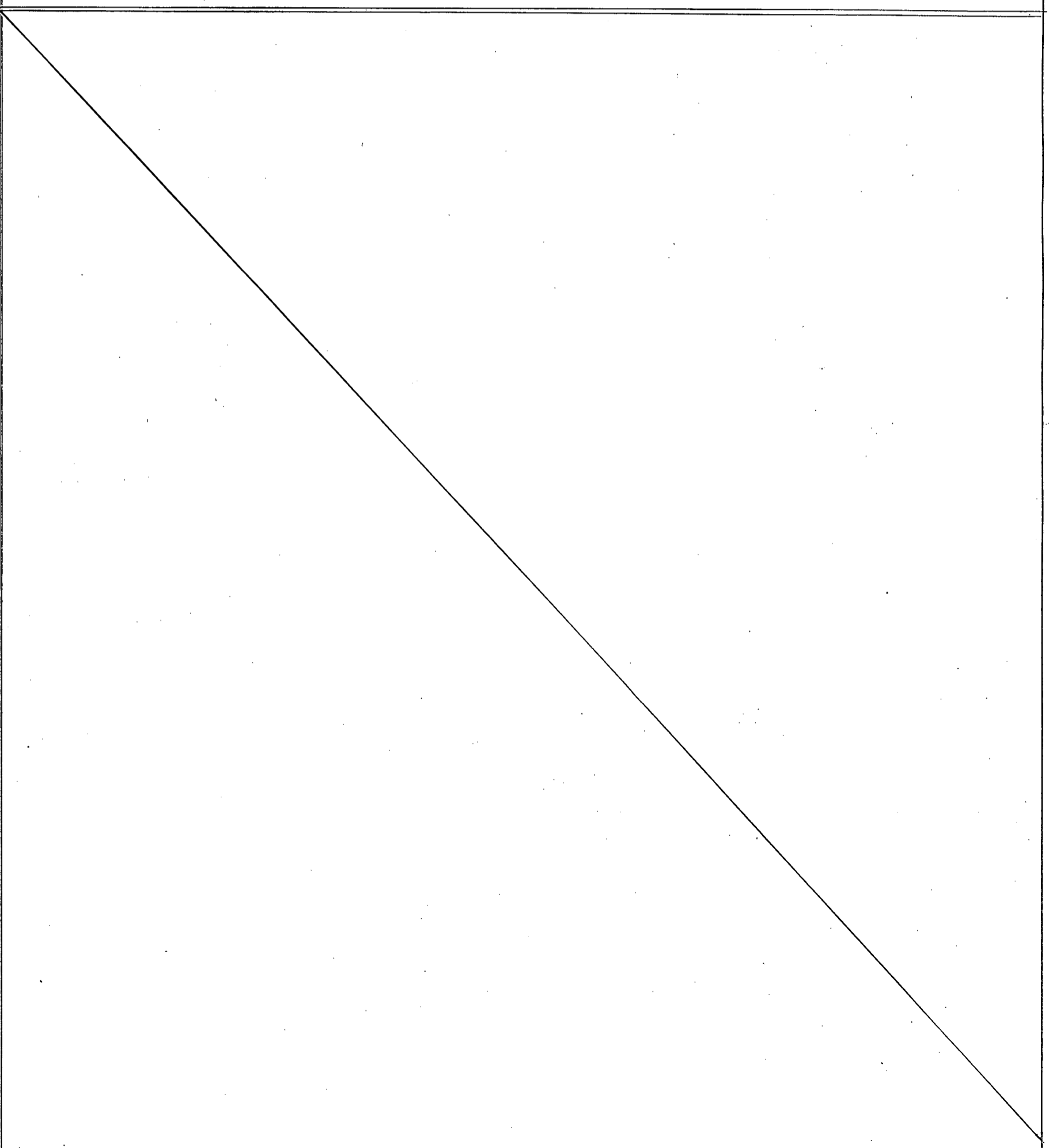

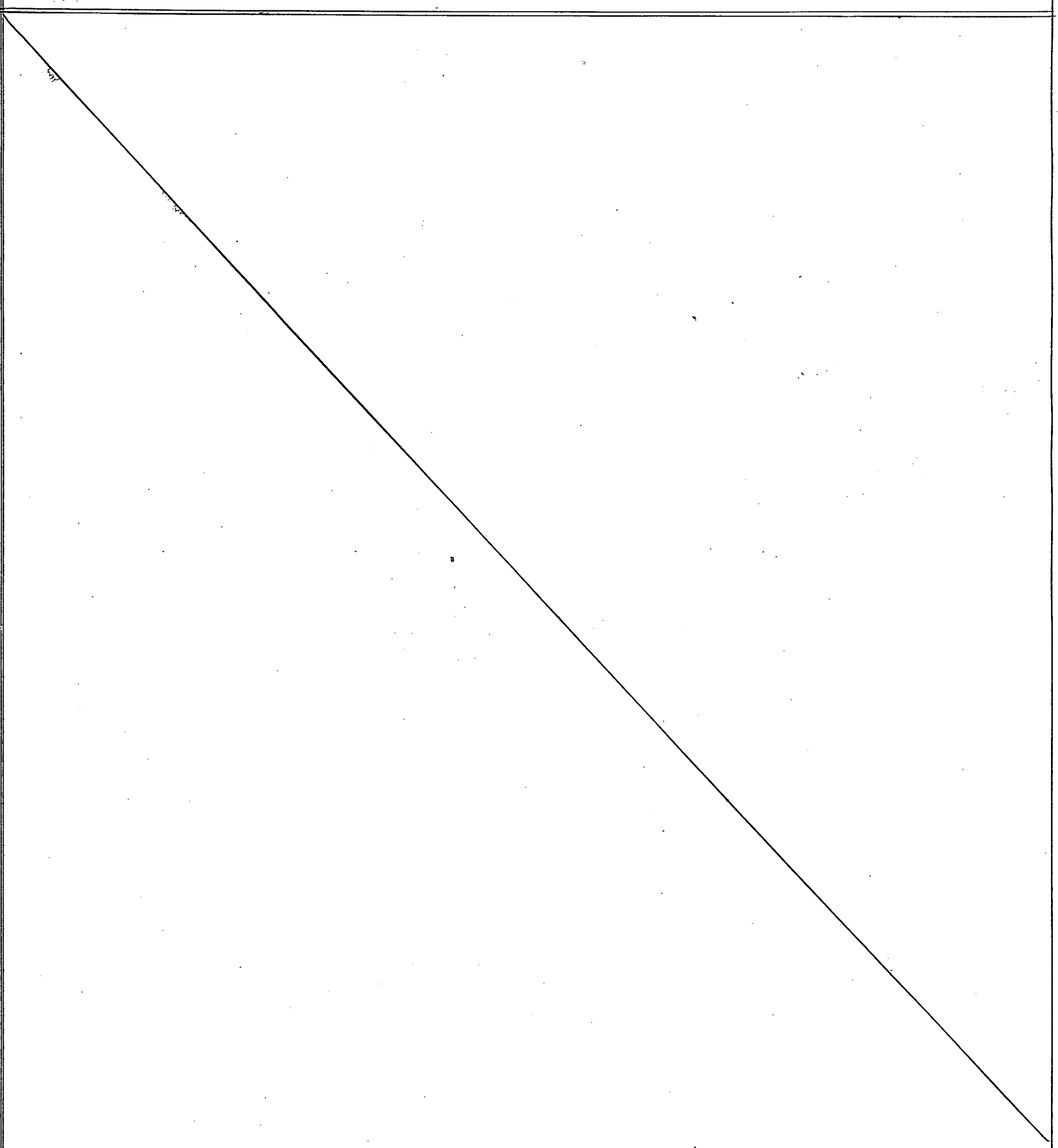

That whenever a warrant has been or may hereafter be issued by any magistrate, charging any person with the violation of any of the provisions of any of the ordinances of said City, where there is by such ordinance imposed a penalty for such violation, and when such warrant has come into the hands of any of the police officers of the said City, it is hereby made the duty of such police officer to arrest such person so charged, and take him before some justice of the peace within said City, to be there dealt with according to law, but if such arrest is made on a legal holiday or at such time when the justices court in said City is not in session, then such police officer shall take such person so arrested to the police office, where such person may deposit with the officer in charge, bail for his appearance at the said justice court, at the opening of its next session; and in default of bail such party must be confined in the City Jail of said City until such court convenes, when he shall be brought before such court to answer such charge.

Section 3. That whenever the provisions of any of the ordinances of the said City are violated, or when an attempt is made to violate any such provisions, in the presence of any police officer of the said City, for the violation of which said ordinance there is by said ordinance a penalty imposed, it is hereby made the duty of such police officer to at once arrest such person without a warrant and take him before some justice of the peace within said City and file, or have filed a complaint against such person charging him with such offense, and when such arrest is made on a legal holiday or in the night or at such time when the justices court in said City is not in session, such officer shall take said person to the police office in said City, where such person may deposit with the officer in charge, bail for his appearance at the first session of the said justice court thereafter, when a complaint shall be filed charging such person with said offense and in default of bail said person shall be confined in the said City Jail until such time as the said justice court shall be in session, when he shall be brought before such court to be dealt with according to law, when bail shall have been given.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 5. That the City Clerk of the said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to publish this ordinance or cause the same to be published once in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit: The San Diego Union and Daily Bee, immediately after its passage and approval.

AN ORDINANCE TO PREVENT DRUNKENNESS AND DISORDERLY CONDUCT AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR ITS VIOLATION, IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to be drunk in or upon any public street, sidewalk, highway, square, park, alley, or in any saloon, store, or other public place within the said City of San Diego, California.

Section 2. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to be guilty of any offensive or disorderly conduct in or upon any of the streets, alleys, sidewalks, squares, parks, or in any saloon or store, or other public place in said City, and it shall be unlawful for any person to make any loud noise, or disturbance, or use any loud, noisy, boisterous, vulgar, or indecent language on any of the streets, alleys, sidewalks, square, park, or in any saloon or store or other public place in said City.

Section 3. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50), or by imprisonment in the City Jail of said City for not exceeding twenty-five (25) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. That it be and is hereby made the duty of every police officer within the said City, to arrest and bring before the Justice of the Peace in said City, any person who shall have violated any of the provisions of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO FLETCHER, DOYLE AND COMPANY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF A RAILWAY IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Fletcher, Doyle and Company, a copartnership, composed of Ed Fletcher and J. L. Doyle, and its assigns, be and are hereby granted, subject, however, to all the conditions and restrictions provided by law, a right of way upon which to construct, maintain, and operate a railway track for a railway and for all purposes necessary and incident to railroad construction maintenance and operation, on the east side of Fourth street, between the center line and the east curb line thereof, from a point twenty-five (25) feet north of the north line of "K" street to the south line of "J" street in the City of San Diego, California. Said railway shall be constructed on or before the first day of January, 1904.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that this right of way is granted on the following conditions: That said person to whom said franchise is granted, or its assigns, shall, during the lifetime of said franchise, keep and maintain all portions of said street between the rails of said railway, and for a distance of two feet on each side thereof, in good condition for public convenience and travel, and shall relay and replace the pavement in laying the ties and rails for such railway in as good condition as before said ties and rails were put in. And that the said Fletcher, Doyle and Company, and its assigns, shall allow any other person to whom a similar right, privilege, or franchise may be granted, to use in common with it, the said railroad track upon such terms as the said Common Council may determine.

Section 2. That said Fletcher, Doyle and Company, or its assigns, shall be liable for all damages which may be adjudged in favor of the owner or owners of any property, or to other persons, because of the adoption of this ordinance.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that the failure of said Fletcher, Doyle and Company, or its assigns, to comply with any or all requirements of this ordinance shall work a forfeiture of all rights, powers, and privileges granted hereby, and thereafter the whole of this ordinance shall be null and void.

Section 3. That the said Fletcher, Doyle and Company, or its assigns, shall be and is hereby empowered under this ordinance to use steam, electricity, or other motive power for the purpose of operating a railway over such right of way.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, on the 22nd day of June, 1903, duly passed and adopted a Resolution of Intention to change and establish the grade of that portion of "K" street in the City of San Diego, California, at a point thereon where the south line of said "K" street intersects the east line of said Twelfth street and at a point thereon where the south line of said "K" street intersects the west line of Thirteenth street; and

WHEREAS, the said Resolution of Intention was approved by the Mayor of said City on the 23rd day of June, 1903, which Resolution of Intention described the proposed change of grade; and

WHEREAS, more than thirty (30) days have elapsed from the time of the first publication of said Resolution of Intention in said newspaper as aforesaid; and no objection or objections to said proposed change of grade have been filed with the Clerk of the said Common Council; and no objection has been made to said proposed change of grade; and

WHEREAS, the petition of the owners of a majority of the property affected by said proposed change of grade has been duly filed with the Clerk of said Common Council and presented to this Common Council as required by law, therefore

That the grade of the said "K" street at a point thereon where the south line of said "K" street intersects the east line of said Twelfth street, and at a point where the said south line of "K" street intersects the west line of Thirteenth street, be and the same is hereby changed and established, and declared to be in conformity with said Resolution of Intention, as follows:

At the said point where the said south line of "K" street intersects the east line of Twelfth street, the grade elevation shall be, and is hereby changed from 19.50 feet above the datum line of levels as fixed by Ordinance No. 3 of the ordinances of said City of San Diego, entitled: "An ordinance establishing a datum line for the grading of streets in the City of San Diego, State of California, and providing for the manner of establishing grades by ordinance," approved on the 30th day of June, 1888, to 18.50 feet above the said datum line of levels; at a point where the said south line of "K" street intersects the west line of said Thirteenth street the grade elevation shall be and the same is hereby changed from 12 feet above said datum line of levels to 11.5 feet above said datum line of levels.

Ordinance No. 1403.

Ordinance No. 1413.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OCCUPYING OF REGULAR STANDS OR PLACES FOR ANY BUSINESS CALLING UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any fakir, religious or other speaker, or any person owning or in possession of any tamale, popcorn, peanut, or other stand, or any person owning or in charge of any delivery wagon, hack, carriage, tally-ho, or other conveyance or vehicle to occupy with such delivery wagon, hack, carriage tally-ho, or other conveyance or vehicle, or stand, or for the purpose of speaking or making addresses, any portion of any street as a regular stand or place for the purpose of following their calling, or to advertise their wares, calling, or business in front, or at the side of any occupied building in the City of San Diego, California, without first having obtained the consent of the person who occupies the ground floor of such building; provided, that the provisions of this section shall not prohibit the using of said streets for said purposes during the hours of the day or night, after the occupant of the ground floor of such building has ceased to transact business therein.

Section 2. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of twenty dollars (\$20), or be imprisoned in the City Jail of said City for a period not exceeding ten (10) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. That it be and is hereby made the duty of any police or peace officer within said city to arrest any person who shall have violated any of the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
