ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

MACDONALD LIGHT DEFAULTS

In administrative proceedings ordered under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the Commission issued Findings and Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions by Default against MacDonald Light. Light failed to answer the Order for Public Proceedings, and therefore was in default.

On the basis of the Order for Public Proceedings, the Commission found that from June 1984 to about June 1986, Light: (1) aided and abetted Cusack Light & Co., Inc.'s (Registrant) violations of various back office provisions of the Exchange Act; (2) was enjoined by a federal district court from further violations of the securities laws; and (3) was responsible for the need of an appointment of a trustee to liquidate Registrant.

The Commission ordered that Light be barred from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser, or municipal securities dealer. (Rel. 34-25684)

JOSEPH A. LUGO BARRED

Administrative Law Judge David J. Markun issued an initial decision barring Joseph A. Lugo from association with a broker-dealer.

The bar is based upon findings that Lugo willfully violated the antifraud provisions of Sections 17(a)(1), 17(a)(2), and 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 in connection with a public distribution of the common stock of Creditbank, Inc., a small Miami-area bank, from May 1980 to July 1981. The decision finds that Lugo, vice president and registered representative of First State Securities Corporation, a Miami broker-dealer, during the relevant period, among other things, dominated and controlled the market for Creditbank during the relevant 14-month period, grossly mispriced the stock, and failed to disclose to customers numerous material facts about Creditbank.

Judge Markun also found that Lugo had been the subject of a number of prior disciplinary actions.

The initial decision is subject to review by the Commission on its own motion or on petition of a party.

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

CRIMINAL CHARGES AGAINST E. F. HUTTON & COMPANY, INC. AND BRIAN J. LAREAU

Lincoln C. Almond, U.S. Attorney for the District of Rhode Island, announced on May 9 the issuance of criminal informations against E. F. Button & Company, Inc. and Brian J. Lareau, a former Button broker. Button is charged with failure to file currency transaction reports in transactions totalling over \$532,000 that were conducted by former Providence, Rhode Island branch office registered representatives Stephen S. Fusco (now deceased) and Lareau. Fusco and Lareau allegedly assisted customers in evading currency transaction reporting requirements by having certain customers' cash converted to cashier's checks in individual amounts not to exceed \$10,000 at various banks in the Providence area. The multiple cashier's checks were then deposited in customer accounts to purchase certificates of deposits and municipal securites in the form of bearer bonds. Some of Fusco's and both of Lareau's customers' accounts, where such transactions occurred, bore false names and social security numbers.

On October 22, 1987, the Commission censured Hutton and ordered undertakings relating to Hutton's cash receipts procedures, and suspended the former manager of its Providence branch office. (U.S. v. E. F. Hutton & Company, Inc., Cr. No. 88-036-L, D RI; U.S. v. Brian J. Lareau, Cr. No. 88-037-B, D RI). (LR-11736)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 6 to request a hearing on a proposal by Northeast Utilities (NU), a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, The Connecticut Light and Power Company, Western Massachusetts Electric Company, Holyoke Water Power Company, Northeast Utilities Service Company (NUSCO), Northeast Utilities Nuclear Energy Company (NNECO), and The Rocky River Realty Company (RRR) (together, Declarants). The Declarants may each borrow under a credit agreement up to \$50 million for up to six months on a revolving basis, provided that the aggregate outstanding amount does not exceed \$50 million. NU will guarantee the obligations of NUSCO, NNECO, and RRR. (Rel. 35-24642 - May 12)

The New York Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NYSE-88-14) that would further amend proposed Rule 36.30. NYSE Rule 36.30 was originally proposed for Commission consideration in File No. SR-NYSE-87-18. The current proposal

would permit a specialist unit to use the telephone line at its trading post location to enter options or futures hedging orders through a member (on the floor) of an options or futures exchange. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of April 16. (Rel. 34-25694)
