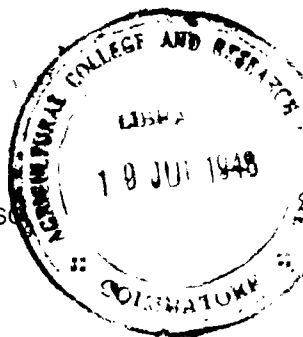

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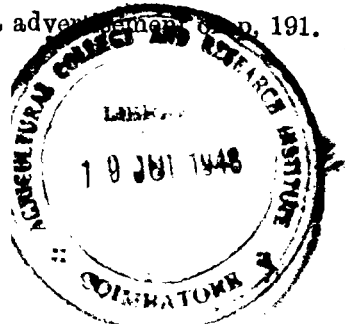

Every student is required to pay 4 as. along with his first payment of fees, as annual subscription to College Union Society.

Hostel Facilities : There are three residential halls, Selaiyur Hall, St., Thomas's, Hall, and Bishop Heber Hall, each containing single rooms for about 150 students, and a few double rooms. Applications for admission to residence must be made on the special form provided for the purpose, and must be submitted along with application for admission to College. The total cost of board and residence need not exceed Rs. 98-8- per term for students in non-vegetarian messes, and Rs. 108-8-0 for those in vegetarian messes, payable in two instalments. There is a special European mess at Rs. 60 a month in Selaiyur and Bishop Heber Halls. An advance payment of Rs. 20 will be required from intending residents along with the advance payment of College fees.

The College does not conduct a hostel for women Students. Women students other than those who reside with relatives, are required to reside in some hostel outside Tambaram approved by the College.

(a) Intermediate candidates, on joining, shall also pay a University Matriculation fee of Rs. 2/- unless they have passed the Matriculation Examination of the Madras University.

(b) Candidates who passed the S. S. L. C. Examination from a school within the Andhra University area shall, on joining, pay a scrutiny fee of Rs. 3/- and those from the Travancore University area shall pay a Recognition fee of Rs. 5/-.

Hostel Facilities: The College Hostel can accommodate 500 students in single rooms. Last year's average daily rates in the various messes were as follows :

The establishment charges, covering room rent, electricity and water supply, hostel staff and medical attendance, (but not hot baths, oil baths, dhoby and barber) are paid in three instalments of Rs. 40 for upstairs rooms and Rs. 36 for downstairs rooms each, at the beginning of every term. In addition to the above establishment charges every student shall, on joining the hostel, pay an advance of Rs. 70. This advance is to meet his boarding expenses, and not to be drawn upon for needs.

Rooms will be reserved only for those who have been admitted into the College and have paid the Hostel advance of Rs. 70 - Senior students (II, IV and V year classes) before the 15th June; Junior students (I & III year classes) before the 30th.

N.B. For those who take Military Science certain exemptions are granted. In the Intermediate, candidates may drop one of the 3 group subjects. In the B. A. Course they may drop Shakespeare and Modern Poetry. In the B. Sc. Course they may drop one of the subsidiary subjects.

3. QUEEN MARY'S COLLEGE MADRAS †

B.A. :—Parts I, II and under Part III Group II (Physics main with Chemistry subsidiary) & (Chemistry main with Physics subsidiary) Group IV-A (History and Economics), Group IV-B (Economics and History), Group VI (Indian Music), and Group VII (Geography).

B. Sc. Home Science: Under Part II instruction is given in Sanskrit, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, Urdu, French and Hindi.

Candidates for admission to B.Sc. Home Science must have taken Chemistry and either Physics or Natural Science.

Candidates for admission to B. A. Group VII (Geography) must have taken Geography in the Intermediate.

Rs. 12/- per annum. Special Fees :—Students' Union : Rs. 8/- per annum ; Matriculation (first year students) Rs. 2/- ; Medical examination (first & 3rd year students) Re. 1/-.

Hostel : The College is residential. All students who do not live with their parents at Madras must reside in the hostel. All necessary furniture is provided including cot but not bedding. Room rent at Rs. 18/- per year is charged. This must be paid into the office by the student in advance in three instalments of Rs. 6/- each along with the term fees.

Boarding arrangements are organized in three sections as shown below. Present rates are approximately as follows 1. European : about Rs. 50/- per mensem. 2. Vegetarian : about Rs. 30/- per mensem. 3. Non-vegetarian : about Rs. 40/- per mensem.

Compulsory additional charges are :—Rs. 2/- per month for electrical light. Re. 1/- per term for medical attendance.

Each member of the hostel must on arrival give to the Manager a deposit advance of Rs. 45/- except in the European section for which the amount is Rs. 60/-. Hostel bills are presented for payment at the end of each month.

A registration fee of Rs. 2/- to be paid after arrival at College by each student entering the Madras University Classes for the first time.

A recognition fee in addition to the registration fee from each student coming from the region of another University.

A recognition fee of Rs. 5/- in addition to the registration fee from each student who has taken for entrance an examination other than the S. S. L.C Examination.

Hostel Facilities: The College is situated in its own grounds in College Road, Nungambakkam, and provides residence for about a hundred and fifty students. Boarding fees are approximately Rs. 30 to 35 or according to costs. Vegetarian and non-vegetarian Indian foods are provided. A deposit of Rs. 30 is required from each student on arrival and will be refunded at the end of the College year.

Women students are ordinarily admitted only into those courses of study for which no provision is made in the Women's College in Madras.

dition for 40 students. There is at present only one vegetarian section. There are both bus and tram connection from the hostel to the College.

Besides these fees, science students will also have to make a laboratory caution deposit of Rs. 10 (if they belong to the Intermediate) or of Rs. 15 (if they belong to the B. Sc. Pass or Honours) at the time of admission. The deposit is returnable at the end of the course.

Hostel Facilities : Attached to the College is a Hostel, which provides accommodation for about 125 students. The College, however, does not guarantee a seat in the Hostel for every student, who applies therefor. But students admitted into the College and not living with their parents or guardians will be expected to live in lodgings approved by the Principal. The Principal may also insist on certain students living in the College Hostel.

Registration fee for applications: Applications for admission should be submitted to the Principal, within 30 days after the results of the S.S.L.C. Public Examination are published, accompanied by a registration fee of Rs. 3/-

Applicants should have completed 14 years and 3 months before the 15th July 1948.

Fees: The rate of tuition fees and the special fees to be paid will be notified.

PROFESSIONAL COLLEGES

1. AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES IN THE PROVINCE COIMBATORE † AND BAPATLA †

Date of reopening : 2nd July 1948.

Course of Instruction :

B. Sc. (Ag.) The course extends over a period of three years. The College at Coimbatore is affiliated to the University of Madras and that at Bapatla to the Andhra University.

Students of each year form a separate class. The number of students admitted into each College each year is restricted to 96 including 3 seats for lady students.

Students from all parts of India, without distinction of caste or nationality, are eligible for admission, but preference will be given to those from the Madras Presidency. An endeavour will be made to ensure, as far as possible, that students from the Madras and Andhra Universities are fairly represented in the respective Colleges. Selections are made by the Principals of the Agricultural Colleges, Coimbatore and Bapatla. Candidates for admission will be interviewed at the following centres in the latter half of June on the dates that will be notified : Bapatla Madras and Coimbatore.

Qualifications for Admission: Candidates should have passed the Intermediate Examination in Arts and Science of the Madras, Andhra or other Universities having offered as optional Chemistry and any two of the following subjects: (1) Mathematics; (2) Physics; (3) Natural Science; (4) Botany; (5) Zoology including human physiology; (6) Agriculture or any examinations accepted by the Syndicate of the Madras or Andhra Universities as equivalent thereto.

Candidates must have attained the age of 17 years at the time of joining the College.

Students who have failed in the University Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture may be re-admitted at the discretion of the Principal, on payment of the prescribed fees.

Registration Fee for Applications:

All applications for admission should be made to the Principal, on or before the 15th June accompanied by a registration fee of Rs. 5/-

Fees: Students admitted from the Madras Presidency and Coorg shall be charged a tuition fee of Rs. 40 per term or Rs. 120 per annum and a lodging fee of Rs. 4-0 per mensem. In addition, a sum of about Re. 1 will be charged per mensem for electric lights.

In the case of re-admission of students who were prevented from sitting for the University examination on account of illness or other causes beyond their control, the lower fee of Rs. 40 per term or Rs. 120 per annum shall be charged in addition to the lodging fees and lighting charges. In the case of students who sat and failed in the examination and also of students who were not allowed to appear for the examination for unsatisfactory progress in studies, the combined fee of Rs. 50 per term or Rs. 150 per annum shall be charged.

The fees are payable in advance within a fortnight of the commencement of the term.

Students from other parts of India including India States whether admitted for the first time or re-admitted after failure, will be charged a fee of Rs. 400 per term payable in advance for tuition.

All students shall pay a combined subscription of Rs. 9 every year to the Athletic Club and Reading Room, payable in three equal instalments along with the College fees.

Every student on joining the College, shall deposit a sum of Rs. 10 as caution money to cover fines, breakage, etc., if any. Any balance at the credit of the student shall be repaid at the end of the course.

Tours: Students may be taken on tours of enquiry to such places as may be fixed by the Principal, under the orders of the Director of Agriculture. During such tours they shall be entitled to free carriage of themselves by road and rail. All other expenditure shall be borne by the students themselves.

Uniform :

Each student on joining the College must provide himself with the uniform prescribed for games and ceremonial occasions. This will cost about Rs. 15 and should not require renewal during his course. He must also provide himself with the customary dress for field work, viz., khaki coat, shorts, shirt and tie which will cost about Rs. 15 per set.

Hostel Facilities :

All students are required to reside in the hostel attached to the College.

They shall ordinarily have their meals in one of the hostel messes which will be arranged by the Warden.

Every student, shall on joining the mess, deposit a sum of Rs. 50 the balance of which will be refunded when the student leaves the College. A monthly fee of annas twelve to cover expenses of management, etc., must be paid by each student whether he joins a mess or not.

On joining a mess, or on every occasion on which the mess advance has been adjusted to pay up arrears, registration fee of Re. 1 is payable.

2. MADRAS VETERINARY COLLEGE, VEPERY†

The B. V. Sc. course extends for a period of four academic years and one term (ordinarily consecutive). The academic year consists of three terms: July to September; October to December and January to March, except in the case of the final year when it is four terms and in addition extends from April to June. The examination consists of a Preliminary, Intermediate Part I, Intermediate Part II and a Final Examination. The examinations are held twice a year in the months April and October for Preliminary, Intermediate Part I and Intermediate Part II and in June and December for the final B. V. Sc. Candidates on admission will be on probation for the first year of the course.

Applications for admission should be submitted so as to reach the Principal not later than 10th June 1948. Admission is by selection.

Qualifications for Admission:

All Candidates irrespective of the column should have passed the Intermediate examination in Arts and Science of the Madras University or an examination accepted by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto having offered Chemistry or Natural Science as one of the optional subjects. Candidates must not be under 17 years of age on the date of commencement of the academic year. In ordinary circumstances no person over 22 years of age will be admitted.

Candidates who have passed the Physical or Natural Science group of the B.A., B.Sc., B.Sc. (Hons.) or B.A. (Hons.) Degree Examination of the Madras University with Chemistry or Zoology as their main optional subject and Botany as the subsidiary for Zoology or an examination of any other Indian University accepted by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto shall be exempted from undergoing the B. V. Sc. Preliminary course and the examination in the respective subjects in which they have passed the Degree Examination provided, however, that exemption in the case of graduates of other Universities shall be restricted to not more than one subject which shall be the main subject in which they have obtained the highest proficiency. Such candidates shall, however, be required to pay the fee prescribed for the whole examination. At the end of the first year course of study, the students shall have to undergo a course of practical training in a Farm for one and a half months during the vacation. *Fees:* A tuition fee of Rs. 120 per annum shall be levied from the Presidency students including Coorg. A tuition fee of Rs. 550 per annum shall be levied from the students coming from Indian States and other Governments. A sum of Rs. 8 towards Sports fee, Rs. 5 towards Medical Association fees, As. 12 being the fee for Medi-

al Inspection and Re. 1 towards the cost of the College Calendar shall be levied from all the students of Madras Presidency and Coorg, Indian States and other Governments. Students who reside in the hostel should pay a ration fee of Rs. 10 towards room rent, electric current and water charges, etc. The above fees are payable in advance and must be paid at the time of admission.

Scholarships of the value of Rs. 30/- each per mensem shall be awarded to 50/ percent of the students of communities in accordance with the principle of communal rotation subject to a maximum of 30 in each ss. When held by members of backward classes, the scholarship shall be of the value of Rs. 40/- per mensem.

Hostel Facilities :

A room rent of Rs. 3 per mensem will be levied on all students residing in the hostel. In addition, students residing in the hostel will be required to every month a General Fund subscription of 12 as each, electric current charges varying from Re. 1 Rs. 1-8-0 and water charges from Re. 1 to Rs. 1-8-0 boarding charges for each student will generally between Rs. 45 and Rs. 50 per mensem. A mess ion of Rs. 60 and a general fund charge of Rs. 3 must be paid when admitted.

3. THE Y. M. C. A. COLLEGE OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION SAIDAPET, MADRAS

Date of re-opening: 1st July 1948.

Instruction: The Instruction given at the College is along modern and scientific lines. It includes both theory and practice. Coaching of athletics and major games, instruction in self-defence arts, keep fit exercise for individuals and groups, marching and squad drills rhythmic activities and folk dances, etc. form a part of the physical instruction given at the College. Special emphasis is given to the national and indigenous activities, games and exercises. Physical activities for women is planned to suit their interests and needs. Health education, explaining how the individual, the school, and the community can help to improve and maintain high standards of health, is a special feature. All students are assigned to take physical education lessons in nearby schools.

Students intending to go abroad for higher studies in physical education will do well to spend a year at the College. Some of the Colleges in the U. S. A. recognise the credits earned at the College.

The College provides training for the following Diplomas and Certificates:—

Diploma in Physical Education: This is awarded to students who successfully complete the Diploma Course offered at the College. Candidates for the Diploma Course should possess a Degree from a recognised University. The Diploma of the College is recognised by the Departments of Education in practically all the Provinces and States of the Indian Union and ^{Pakistan} towards

The Madras University is likely to institute a Diploma Course in Physical Education in the near future in which case it is the plan of the College to prepare candidates for this University Diploma.

Government Certificates: (a) **HIGHER GRADE CERTIFICATE**-Candidates must possess a recognised Secondary Teacher's Certificate or have passed the Intermediate Examination of a recognised University. (b) **LOWER GRADE CERTIFICATE**-Candidates must have passed the S. S. L. C.

Note: Besides the above Diploma and certificates, the College will offer its own certificates to such of the students who successfully pass the examinations conducted by the College. This is mainly intended for students who come from Provinces other than Madras and Indian States, Ceylon, Burma, etc., where the Y. M. C. A. College Certificates and Diplomas are recognised.

Age: Candidates should be preferably between the ages of twenty and twenty-five. Candidates who are above thirty years of age are not eligible for admission.

Hostel Facilities: The College is entirely residential. All the students stay on the campus and are divided into various Houses. Separate hostels are provided for men and women. Hostels are of the Cottage type with space enough for six to eight students, in each cottage. Wholesome vegetarian and Non-vegetarian meals are served to suit both North and South Indian tastes.

Registration of Applicants: Application forms should be filled in and sent to the Principal so as to reach him on or before the 15th of June, with the

required certificates and a sum of Rs. 12-8-0 to cover admission fee and hostel rent, etc., for the first month.

College Fees : 1. Admission fee-Rs. 5 (To be submitted with application. This will be refunded if admission is refused but not otherwise). 2. Tuition Fee-(a) Diploma Course-Rs. 15/- per month. (b) Higher Grade Certificate-Rs. 12-8-0 per month. (c) Lower Grade Certificate-Rs. 10/- per month. 3. Hostel rent, Lighting, Water, Sanitation-Rs. 7-8-0 per month. (For the first month this should be sent along with the application for admission. Refundable only if admission is refused). 4. Library Fee- Re.1/- per month. 5. Physical Activities Fee- Re.1/- per month. 6. Health Service Fee - Re.1/-per month. 7. Mess Establishment Fee- Re.1/- per month. 8. Mess - Rs.35/- to Rs.40/- per month. (Because of the strenuous physical activities a nutritious diet is essential). 9. Regulation Uniform (payable on joining)- Rs.25. 10. Student Association Fees (Payable on joining) -Rs. 5. 11- Camp, Excursions, Visits, etc. (payable when notified)-Rs. 15/-. 12. Caution fee (refundable) (payable on joining) Rs. 15/ 13. Examination Fee (payable when notified). Diploma-Rs. 14/-, Higher Grade Rs. 10/-, Lower Grade - Rs. 6/-.

Note: All College fees are to be paid in advance in three instalments, at the beginning of each term: in July, in October, and in January. Mess fee for a particular month should be paid by the 10th of that month.

4. COLLEGE OF INDIAN MEDICINE KILPAUK, MADRAS +

Date of re opening: 2nd July 1948.

Instruction:

The college is located at Madras and offers instruction in Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani.

2. Applications in the prescribed form for admission in the College should be submitted to the Special Officer for the Reorganization of the Department of Indian Medicine, Room No. 267, Secretariat Buildings, Fort St. George, Madras.

3. The course extends over a period of five academic years and is intended to provide such training to its alumni as will enable them to become competent practitioners in Indian Systems of Medicine with a good working knowledge of the western system also.

4. Media of Instruction:-(a) In the Ayurvedic section the medium of instruction shall, as a rule, be Sanskrit. In Siddha and Unani sections Tamil and Urdu shall respectively be the medium of instruction. English or other languages may also be made the media depending upon the capacity of students to understand the subjects thoroughly. (b) The subject of Western Medicine will be taught in English.

5. General educational qualification:- The minimum educational qualifications prescribed for the students seeking admission into the College are:- (i) For Ayurvedic Section:- Intermediate Examination of an University, preference being given to those whose Second Language is Sanskrit; or a pass in Siromani or Entrance Examination to the Oriental Titles Examination of an University or an equivalent Knowledge in Sanskrit tested by an Entrance Examination.

Note: Candidates who have passed the Intermediate Examination with an optional language other than Sanskrit in Part II will have to undergo special coaching in Sanskrit after admission. (ii) For Siddha Section:-

Intermediate Examination of an University with Tamil as Second Language; or a pass in the Vidwan Examination of an university (iii) For Unani Section:- Intermediate Examination of an University with Urdu as Second language; or a pass in Adebī Urdu, or Munshi Fazil of an University.

5. a. Candidates who have not passed Intermediate examination but have the other qualifications prescribed should have knowledge of English of the standard of S. S. L. C.

6. Age:- Candidates seeking admission to the college should not be below 17 years of age at the time of their admission to the College.

Registration fee for Applications: Rs. 5.-

College Fees:- The tuition fees payable by students will be as follows:- (a) Candidates belonging to the Province of Madras, Rs. 150/- per annum payable in advance in three equal instalments viz., Rs. 50/ each,

Other candidates Rs. 300/ per annum payable in advance in three equal instalments viz., Rs. 100/ each.

(b) Athletic and Literary Union Fees: An annual fee of Rs. 5/ for the college Athletic Club and the annual fee of Re. 1/ for the College Association, and Rs. 2/ for the College Magazine (when published) shall be paid in advance by all students.

Hostel Facilities: There are 2 hostels attached to the College, one for male students and the other for female students, situated very near the College. Both vegetarian and non-vegetarian meals are provided. All students who do not reside either with their parents or bonafide guardians in the City are expected to live in the hostel where there is accommodation for about 150 students.

Room rent is Rs.3 per seat per mensem. Electric and water charges are based upon actual expenditure and are divided equally among the members on roll during the month. The monthly establishment charges will include the amount required for the vacation months also and shall be paid in 9 instalments (July to March). The mess will be run either on contract or cost-sharing basis.

Each student, on admission, shall pay a caution money of Rs.40 and also a month's room rent of Rs.3 as deposit. The caution money and room rent deposits shall be adjusted to the student's account when the student leaves the Hostel for good and the balance, if any, returned to him/her only during the last week of the succeeding month in which the student leaves the Hostel.

5. ENGINEERING COLLEGES IN THE PROVINCE

COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING, GUINDY; ARTHUR HOPE COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY, COIMBATORE, COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING, COCANADA, AND COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING, ANANTAPUR

Courses of study : The Degree courses of four years' duration, offered by the various colleges are: (i) College of Engineering, Guindy - Civil, Mechanical, Electrical, Highways and Telecommunication Engineering; (ii) Arthur Hope College of Technology, Coimbatore - Civil and Electrical Engineering; (iii) College of Engineering - Cocanada - Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering and (iv) College of Engineering, Ananta-

pur - Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering. Candidates must state, in the "Remarks" column in the application form, the choice of their subjects in order of preference. The College of Engineering, Guindy, has an Overseer course in Civil Engineering of two years' duration. The Licentiate in Civil Engineering course has been abolished.

Registration fee etc:

The Registration fee for the degree course is Rs.5.- and for the Overseer course Rs.3/-

Application for admission to any of the four Colleges should be submitted to the Principal, College of Engineering, Guindy, Saidapet P. O., Madras 15, not later than the 20th May 1948. Candidates must state the choice of the four Colleges in order of preference. Allotment of selected candidates to the various colleges will be made by a selection Committee.

Qualifications for admission:

Candidates for admission to the Degree course must have passed the Intermediate Examination of the Madras or Andhra University with Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry as optionals, or an examination in some other University accepted as equivalent thereto by one of these Universities. Candidates who have appeared at the Intermediate Examination this year may apply pending the publication of their results.

Candidates for admission to the Overseer course must be either holders of the Secondary School-Leaving Certificate and declared eligible for University Course of study, or must have passed an examination accepted by the Government as equivalent thereto. Candidates who have appeared at the Secondary School-Leav-

In 1947 the Syndicate of the University sanctioned the admission of ten men students to the Pre-registration class in addition to 25 women.

Also permission has been given for the admission of five women candidates for the shortened M. B. B. S. course for L. M. P. and D. M. & S. graduates.

The College buildings and women's hostel are housed in splendid buildings at Thorapadi, four miles south of Vellore in a beautiful 200 acre site. The men are also housed in a temporary hostel at the college site. The College Hospital is situated in the town of Vellore which has a population of approximately 1,00,000. It is a general hospital with accommodation for approximately 425- patients, while in the Schell Eye Hospital there is accommodation for 40 patients. Clinical material is drawn not only from the town itself, but from the surrounding villages in a large radius, and many patients come from distances for special consultation and treatment. Regular travelling dispensaries are also run weekly to the villages within a twentyfive miles radius.

Most of the pre-clinical work is done at the College while the clinical work is all done in the Hospital and allied institutions. Transportation of students is by College buses.

Student initiative and self-expression are encouraged through the activities of student societies of which the most popular is the Student Christian Movement. Wednesday afternoon is always devoted by the students to social uplift and medical work in the surrounding villages. They give simple medical treatments, conduct classes in adult literacy and strive to become acquainted with the people and their problems. They also conduct an adult literacy campaign amongst the serving staff of

College. Morning and evening prayers are held regularly in the Chapel while on Sunday evening a regular service of Worship is conducted by members of staff or visiting preachers. Bible classes and religious discussion groups are held regularly each week, and students conduct a regular Sunday school for the children of the College compound and pay weekly visits to the jail.

Instruction in Tamil will be compulsory for all non-Tamilian students during their first year course and a fee of not more than Rs. 2/- per month will be charged.

Date of reopening : 1st July 1948.

Admission:

Candidates must have completed 17 years of age, and must have passed the Intermediate Examination Medical Group of the Madras University or an examination accepted by the Syndicate of the Madras University as equivalent thereto. The Pre-Registration course will be abolished from July 1948, and only candidates who have passed the Intermediate with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as practicals will be admitted. Applications for admission should be submitted on or before April 7th.

All candidates are required to take the preliminary written tests. These are given at centres scattered throughout India. All those wishing to apply for admission must send in the application form on or before April 7th. These must be sent although examination results are not yet known. Accompanying these must be two identical recent photographs of pass-port size and an application fee of Rs. 10/- (not returnable). There are written tests in general knowledge, natural science, and intelligence, and require only one day. These tests will be given on or about April 28th at the following centres.

Candidates will come for their interviews at their own expense with the following exception—Unsuccessful candidates who come from a distance of more than 200 miles will have a third class train fare paid by the College for their return journey in excess of this distance, if claim for this help is made to the Principal on the grounds of financial need. However, all candidates should bring with them money sufficient to pay their return fare. Anybody wishing to apply for this aid, will then send in a formal application for this aid, to the Principal through the Registrar.

Charges for Board while at the College are Rs.2/- per day. Successful candidates will stay on till College opens.

Hostel Facilities:—

Residence in college hostels is essential. Vegetarian and non-vegetarian food is provided.

Rs. 5/- per mensem for Establishment, full 12 months by 1st & 2nd year students and full 6 months by 3rd, 4th and 5th year students.

Rs. 25/- per mensem for women students and for men students for boarding to be adjusted according to the length of stay in the hostel by all students. It is liable to increase if necessary.

7. TEACHERS COLLEGE, SAIDAPET

The course of training in 1948-49 in the collegiate department (B. T. Section) of the Teachers College, Saidapet extends from July 1948 to April 1949.

Under the orders of the Government of Madras no Malayalee student will be trained in this college; but Students from British Malabar may apply to this college in response to this notification.

10 of them will be selected for admission into the Government Training College, Trichur, and the Madras Government will pay their tuition fees to the Cochin State.

Kannada students will continue to be trained in the Teachers College, Saidapet, and these students will be given teaching practice in Kannada in the Christian College High School, Madras.

Courses of Instruction :-

The College provides instruction in any two of the following optional subjects both being not of the same group mentioned below :-

Note :—Students offering Geography as one of their optionals should preferably have a degree in that subject whenever possible and should have the diploma in Géography, or should have taken Geography in their Intermediate. The applications of those for admission into the Géography will be considered on the merits of each case. Such students will have to be exempted from possessing a degree or diploma in Geography or Geography in the Intermediate course, by the University of Madras and they will have to undergo a special course in the subject matter of Geography in this Collage.

One of the two subjects should necessarily be the main optional subject studied by them during their graduate or post-graduate course.

Qualifications for admission :—

Only candidates who have passed a Degree examination of the Madras University or a Degree examination of some other University accepted as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission. Those who have taken Tamil under Part II of the B. A. Degree examination and in addition those who hold a degree in the language are eligible for admission into the Tamil section. A degree examination of a University other than Madras is acceptable as equivalent to the corresponding examination of the Madras University only if (1) the length of the course leading to the examination sought to be recognised has been pursued in the University or in the college recognised by the University. Further the examination sought to be recognised should be in the subjects which are prescribed by the Madras University for its examination qualifying for admission to the the course.

(a) Candidates blind in one eye are not eligible for admission and therefore should not apply. (b) Those who are crippled or physically deformed (either natural or acquired) are not eligible for admission to the course of training.

Every student will be on probation for 50 working days.

Registration fee for applications :—

Applications should reach the Principal on or before the 15th April 1948 accompanied by a registration fee Rs. 3/-.

Fees :—

No stipends will be paid from Provincial fund. Candidates should be prepared to undergo training at their own expense. (b) Candidates coming from States and Provinces outside the jurisdiction of the Madras Government will be required to pay tuition fee of Rs. 54/- for each of the 3 terms or Rs. 160/- in lump sum. All such candidates must submit the applications through the administrative heads of the States and Provinces concerned.

Hostel Facilities :—

There is a hostel attached to the College which provides board and accommodation for all communities. All students not residing with their family or relations recognised by the college authorities must necessarily reside in the college hostel.

M. Ed. Course.

University of Madras.

The M. Ed. course is a one year course and includes the following subjects :—

(a) Education Psychology with emphasis on experimental education; (b) Educational Organisation Administration (c) History of Education; (d) Current Problems in Indian Education; (e) Thesis subject approved by University.

The course is conducted on a co-operative basis the four constituent training colleges and University will be held in Meston Training College, except psychology class which will be held in the University. The course commences in July 1948. Graduates who have passed the L. T., or B. T., degree examination should apply to the Principal of the college.

Registration fee for applications:—

Applications for admission should be submitted through the Principal of the respective colleges before 15th March accompanied by a registration fee of Rs. 3/-.

ES:—

The tuition fee for the course is Rs. 120/- payable in three instalments or Rs. 40/- per term.

Hostel:—

Hostel accommodation is arranged.

8. LADY WILLINGDON TRAINING COLLEGE, MADRAS†

The course of training extends from 2nd July 1948 to the end of March 1949. It includes (a) lectures and practical work in the subjects prescribed for the B. T. degree examination of the Madras University, (b) teaching practice in the schools selected by the

College. During their training students may not appear for examinations other than those prescribed by the College.

Qualifications for admission :—

Graduates of Universities other than the University of Madras are only eligible for admission if their degrees conform to the conditions laid down by the University of Madras for recognition. These conditions are as follows :—(1) The length of the course leading to examination sought to be recognized should not be less than that for the corresponding examination of the Madras University. (2) The course of study for the examination should have been pursued in a University or in a college recognised by a University; and (3) The examination should be in the subjects which are prescribed by the Madras University for its examination qualifying for admission to the course.

Applicants should not ordinarily be over 25 years nor less than 18 years of age. In the case of a candidate who has been employed as a teacher in a recognized school for not less than three years the age limit is 35 years.

Applicants blind in one eye, deaf or having any physical deformity are not eligible for admission and should not apply. Applicants unable to take part in the physical activities programme are also ineligible.

Every student will be on probation for 50 working yrs from the date of reopening.

Registration fee for applications :—

Applications for admission should reach the Principal not later than 1st April 1948 accompanied a registration fee of Rs. 3/-.

Students may take any one of the following pairs of Optional Subjects according to their academic qualification :—

Group I. English & Geography; Gr. II. English & History; Gr. III. English & Mathematics; Gr. IV. English & Physical Science; Gr. V. Geography & History; Gr. VI. Mathematics & Physical Science.

N. B. :—One of the two subjects offered should be of the Degree standard and the other of the Degree standard whenever possible, or at least of the Intermediate or Diploma standard.

Those applying for Geography who do not possess the above qualifications may be granted provisional admission and application may be made to the University for exemption after a preliminary test. The University fee for considering such application is Rs. 10/-

M. Ed. Degree Course :—

This higher course for those who have already taken the B. T. or L. T. Degree or an equivalent Degree is conducted on a co-operative basis by the four constituent Training Colleges and the University.

Scoutmaster's Training Course :—

The South Madras Boys Scouts Association undertakes to arrange a Scoutmaster's Training course for the students of the College once a year in July and August. The course will be on a week-end basis. The present rate of fee for the course is about Rs. 5/-.

Registration fee for Applications :—

Application for admission must be made in the prescribed form before the 15th March, accompanied by a registration fee of Rs. 3/-.

Ordinary fee:—(1) Students belonging to the Madras Presidency Rs. 50/- a year in one sum or 3 instalments of Rs. 17/- (2) Students from outside the Madras Presidency, Rs. 160/- a year in one sum or 3 instalments of Rs. 54/- There will be no Government stipends.

Special Fees :—

For Reading Room, Games, Hand work, Excursions, etc. Rs. 20/- per annum payable in advance.

Library Deposit :

Each student will pay a deposit of Rs. 10/- returnable at the end of the year.

University Fees :

(1) Examination Fees : Rs. 20/- for each student, payable in December. (2) For graduates of Universities other than Madras University (i) Recognition fee: Rs. 5/- for each student (ii) Matriculation fee: Rs. 2/- for each student who is not already a matriculate of the Madras University - payable on admission.

Agreement :

Every untrained student from the Madras Presidency will be required to enter into an agreement with the Government in the form prescribed in Rule 5 of the Madras Educational Rules. (The agreement binds the student inter alia to complete the full course at the college and not to engage in any other avocation or to attend any other institution during the course: to appear for the next ensuing B. T. examination or examinations until he passes; and to serve for three years as a teacher in an institution recognized by the

Madras Government within six years after completing his course of training. The amount for which the agreement should be executed is determined by Government. If the student fails to take necessary action soon after training to fulfil the above conditions he will be required to refund to the Government the amount mentioned in his agreement.

Note —The Civil and Military Station, Bangalore, is outside the jurisdiction of the Madras Educational Department.

Probation :

Every student admitted shall be considered to be on probation for fifty working days ; and if it shall appear to the Principal that any student is not likely to prove an efficient teacher such student shall be required to leave the institution. In such an event he will be required to pay full fees for one term of the year.

Hostel Facilities:-

Meston College Hostel and Wesley Hostel.

The Hostels are under the supervision of Wardens who are members of the College staff. They are open to students of the Meston Training College only.

Students selected for residence in either Hostel are expected to remain in residence for the period of the College year (excluding the vacations) subject to the approval of the Warden.

On admission to the Hostel, a sum of Rs. 10/- must be deposited by each member as caution money, which is repayable at the end of the course. This will be kept in a separate account and is not to be regarded as an advance on mess or other accounts.

Room rent is charged at rates between Rs. 2/- and 5/- per mensem, for the period of the College year.

The Establishment Charges are Rs. 4/- per mensem including amounts due for electric light (up to a maximum of Rs. 1-8-0 allowed for each member per mensem), water, hostel (not mess) service, reading room, games and maintenance of mess vessels.

If in any month the cost of electric light exceeds Rs. 1-8-0 per head, the members are liable to be charged equal shares of the excess amount.

Meston Hostel has a non-vegetarian and Wesleyan vegetarian mess.

Mess costs and mess management are subject to variation owing to present conditions. The average monthly mess charge at the time of printing is Rs. 25/- mensem.

On the first working day of each month, members are required to pay an advance of Rs. 35/- towards their Hostel charges for that month. An adjustment is made on the basis of the actual mess expenses for the previous month is to be made by extra payment or refund on the 15th of the month.

Late payments will be subject to fines at the discretion of the Warden up to the 10th of the month after which date no member in arrears will be permitted to remain in the Hostel.

10. ST. CHRISTOPHER'S TRAINING COLLEGE (FOR WOMEN), VEPERY, MADRAS†

The college prepares students for the B. T. Degree examination conducted by the Madras University. It also participates in the training of students for the Master of Education degree of the University of Madras classes for which are held at Meston Training College and at the University. Opportunities for teaching, observation and practice teaching are provided in the high school under its own management (The Bentinck Girls High School) and in other secondary schools in the City.

Date of re-opening : 7th July 1948.

Courses of Instruction :

The following optional subjects will be offered for the B.T. Course in the College during the year 1948-49. The course extends from July 1948 to April 1949 and each B. T. student is required to take two subjects (a) Telugu, (b) English, (c) Primary Education (d) Physical Science, (e) Natural Science. (f) History (g) Geography, (h) Home Science and (i) Tamil (subject to recognition by the University).

Applicants should clearly specify the two subjects they wish to take. Not more than one subject may ordinarily be taken from any one of the following groups: (1) Natural Science or Home Science or Physical Science (2) History (3) Primary Education Geography, Telugu or Tamil (which is subject to recognition by the University) (4) English.

One of the optional subjects should be of the degree standard, and the other should be at least of the

intermediate or Diploma standard. This does not apply to Primary education. Students with a lower qualification in Geography may be exempted, on recommendation of the Principal and on payment of an exemption fee of Rs. 10.

A test in English will be given for those choosing English as an optional subject and for those wishing to do practice teaching for Primary Education in English.
Qualifications for admission :

Applicants who have passed examinations of other universities will be provisionally admitted, subject to their examination being recognized by the University of Madras.

Applicants who have passed University examinations without undergoing a full course in a recognised college will not ordinarily be admitted. If such an applicant is admitted, she must submit a statement indicating the circumstances under which she was permitted to appear for the degree examination as a private candidate.

Registration Fee for Applications :

Application for admission should be made to the Principal so as to reach her not later than 31st March 1948 accompanied by an application fee of Re. 1. The Principal will notify each applicant for whom a place is available. On receipt of such notification the applicant should remit a registration fee of Rs. 7-8-0. This will be credited towards the fees to be collected from the applicant during the first term but will be forfeited if she does not appear on the opening day of the College.

Fees :

College Fees : 1. Tuition : Students from outside the Madras Presidency Rs. 27/- for each of the

three terms; or Rs. 80/- in one instalment. Students belonging to Madras Presidency Rs. 40/- a year.

N. B.—The above rates may be modified by Government and the students in training will, if rates are modified be required to pay according to the modified rates. There will be no Government stipends. Applications for fee concessions will not ordinarily be recommended.

Day students are required to pay a fee for overhead expenses of Re. 1/- per month for 9 months during the year.

University Fees :

- (1) Examination Fees : Rs. 20/- for each student
 (2) For graduates of Universities or Bodies other than University of Madras. (i) Recognition fee : Rs. 5 for each student (ii) Matriculation fee Rs. 2 for each student who is not already a Matriculate of Madras University (iii) Migration Certificate fee : As charged by the respective Universities or Bodies.

Time and method of paying fees:—

B. T. Students must pay the following fees on the first day of term.

Tuition and special fees amounting to Rs. 64/-

Thereafter fees are collected on alternate Saturdays. A fine is levied for late payment.

A student withdrawing during the course will be required to pay special fees in full and tuition fees as follows:— during or at the end of the first term Rs. 27; during or at the end of the second term Rs. 54; during the third term Rs. 80; Bonds (required as per rule 135 of the Madras Educational Rules.)

Each B. T. student who pays a tuition fee of Rs. 40 a year shall be required to enter into agreement with the Government in the form prescribed in Rule 135 of the Madras Educational Rules. According to this agreement she must within six years after completing her course of training, serve as a teacher in a recognised institution for a period of two years or keep a recognised elementary or secondary school within the jurisdiction of Madras Educational Department (i.e., Madras Presidency) and teach in the same during such period. The amount for which the agreement should be executed is Rs. 80. If the student fails to take necessary action soon after training to fulfil the above conditions she will be required to refund to the Principal the amount mentioned in her agreement.

Hostel Facilities

The college is residential. On the first day of term students should be in college by 4 p. m. Students should write informing the Principal beforehand, of the time of their arrival. Any new student who requests it, will be met at the station.

Dinner will be provided for all resident students; other meals will be provided free of-charge only to such students as have informed the Principal or member of staff in charge, of the time of their arrival.

Every student dining in grade B is asked to bring a brass tumbler to college and she is expected to buy an aluminium plate provided by the college on her arrival.

Crockery is supplied for students dining in grade A. Students in grade A are required to pay Rs.2 down to cover breakages and wear and tear of dining room furnishings.

Cots will be provided. Students must provide their own bedding, but they may not bring their own cots.

All cloths should be marked. All students should bring umbrellas.

Hostel Fees:

Board Grade A: About Rs.30/- per month. Rs.2 a year for breakages and replacements.

Grade B: About Rs.18/- per month. Students will manage their own housekeeping.

Furniture Deposit:- Re.1

Establishment fees: Rs.6 per month for 9 months for B. T. students, Rs.7 per month for M. Ed. students

Note:

A student admitted as a resident student is required to pay the resident establishment fees unless and until her place in the hostel is taken by an other student.

11. GOVERNMENT TRAINING COLLEGE RAJAHMUNDRY ††

The course of training extends from July 1948 to March 1949. The mother tongue or the second language of the candidate should be Telugu. All applications for admission should reach the Principal not later than the 10th March 1948.

Under the revised regulations for the B. Ed. Course each B. Ed. student will have the option to take two subjects. This college provides instruction in any two of the following optional subjects both being not of the same group mentioned below:

A. Group	B. Group	C. Group
Mathematics	Physical Science	English
Geography	History	Telugu.

The two subjects shall ordinarily be chosen from those studied by them during their graduate or post-graduate course.

Only candidates who have passed a Degree Examination of the Andhra University or a Degree Examination of some other University duly accepted by the Syndicate of the Andhra University as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission. The following examinations have been recognised by the Academic Council of the Andhra University as equivalent to the B. A. Degree Examination of the Andhra University.

The B. A. and B. Sc. Degree Examinations of all other Statutory Indian Universities and Mysore University.

The B. Com. Degree Examination of all other Statutory Indian Universities.

The age of an applicant should not exceed 25 years on 1st July 1948. An applicant whose age exceeds 25 years but not 35 years is eligible for admission if he has been employed as a teacher in a recognized school for not less than three years.

It shall, however, be in the power of the Controlling Authority in very special circumstances to admit a candidate relaxing the upper age limit.

Registration fee for applications Rs.3/-

FEES:

No stipends will be paid from Provincial Fund. Candidates should be prepared to undergo training at their own expense.

Candidates coming from States and Provinces outside the jurisdiction of the Madras Government will be required to pay tuition fee of Rs.54/- for each of the three terms or Rs.160/- for the year, if paid in advance. All such candidates must submit their applications through the heads of the States and Provinces concerned.

Every student selected for training will be on probation for fifty working days, and will be required to execute a bond in which he undertakes to pay the sum of Rs.320/- should he fail to serve as a teacher in a recognized school for three years after training.

Students selected for training should deposit Rs. 25 as caution money for the college and Rs.50/- for the hostel and Re.1/- as hostel admission fee.

Hostel Facilities:

All students not residing with the families must necessarily reside in the hostel attached to the college unless otherwise exempted.

12. ST. JOSEPH'S TRAINING COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, GUNTUR††

Course of Instruction :

B. Ed.—Students may take any two of the following optional subjects according to their academic qualifications. Method of teaching 1. Mathematics
Physical Science 3. English 4. History
Geography.

Admission: Application for admission must be made in the prescribed form before the 15th May accompanied by a registration fee of Rs. 3/-.

Fees :

(1) Students belonging to the Madras Presidency do not pay tuition fees except those who have already undergone their Secondary Training. (2) Students from outside the Madras Presidency pay Rs. 80/- a year in one sum or three instalments of Rs. 27/-; Rs. 15/- recognition fee; Rs. 5/- Matriculation fee for each student who is not already a Matriculate of the Andhra University. (3) Special fees are charged at the following rates per term :

6. In addition, Physical Science students pay Rs. 6/- (For Carpentry, Photography, and Laboratory Practical). Students shall pay a cash security of Rs. 25/- which will be returned at the end of the course, provided it has been satisfactorily completed.

Hostel Facilities :

Vegetarians and non-vegetarians are admitted. Copy of Hostel Rules will be sent on receipt of As. 4 along with the Registration Fee of Rs. 3/-

13. GOVERNMENT MEDICAL COLLEGES IN THE MADRAS PROVINCE

(Medical College, Madras; Stanley Medical College, Madras; Medical College, Guntur; Andhra Medical College, Vizagapatam.)

The curriculum for the Pre-Registration course extends to 6 months and that for M. B. B. S. Medical course extends to five years.

Note: A candidate who fails in the Pre-Registration examination four times will not be permitted to take that examination again but in the case of candidates joining the Andhra Medical College, Vizagapatam affiliated to the Andhra University, those who fail 3 times, will not be permitted to take that examination again.

Date of reopening: 2nd July 1948.

Admission: Application forms will be supplied by the Vice-Principal, Medical College, Madras, before the 28th May 1948 on receipt of a self-addressed envelope sufficiently stamped. No notice will be taken of a requisition which is not accompanied by that envelope.

Application forms duly filled in should be submitted to the Principal, Medical College, Park Town P. O., Madras, accompanied by a registration fee of Rs. 5, so as to reach him not later than 12 noon the 2nd June

1948. Candidates should state the College they desire to be admitted, but they must be prepared to join the college for which they are selected. Requests from candidates for transfer from one college to another will receive no attention.

Applications from candidates belonging to Travancore and Cochin States should be sent to the respective Governments for selection for admission to Madras Medical College.

Applications from students of Civil and Military Station, Bangalore, should be sent to the Honourable the Resident, in Mysore for selection for admission to Medical Colleges.

If a selected candidate fails to submit the Government treasury receipt or pay the fees to the respective office on or before 2nd July 1948 or fails to join for any reason whatsoever before the date notified in the intimation, the seat will be forfeited and will be filled up by another candidate.

Qualifications for Admission :

The following are eligible for admission into the M. B. B. S. Class : (a) candidates who have passed the Intermediate Examination in Arts and Science of the Madras or Andhra University taking Physics and Chemistry as two of the optional subjects under Part III of the Intermediate Examination. (b) Those who have passed examination accepted by the Syndicate of the Madras or Andhra University as equivalent thereto.

Those who have passed the examination of Universities other than that of Madras or that of Andhra University must apply in time to the Registrar of the Universities concerned and obtain acceptance of the Syndicate before being admitted into the College.

Their admission to the Medical Colleges is at their own risk as recognition is entirely left to the University.

Applicants should have completed 17 years of age on or before registration as a Medical student which will be subsequent of passing Pre-Registration Examination, so that no candidate whose date of birth is subsequent to the 1st January 1931 need apply.

College Fees :

The scale of fees is as below : I Pre-Registration course for 6 months in Inorganic Chemistry, Physics and Bio-Chemistry :

(i) Fee for the whole Pre-Registration course

(The annual registration fee of Rs. 5 will not be levied in the case of students of the Pre-Registration class).

The annual registration fee of Rs. 5 will also be levied in respect of students not belonging to the Madras Presidency. All the fees except registration fee of Rs. 5 shall be levied at twice the above rates.

Women students will pay college fees at half the prescribed rates together with a registration fee of Rs. 5 each year. (Those who have been admitted in the Government Medical Colleges prior to July 1945 will continue to be eligible for free tuition.)

Women students who belong to the Muslim community or the Backward and the Scheduled classes will continue to be eligible for free tuition.

Free studentships will be reserved for deserving poor women students not belonging to the Muslim community or the Backward and Scheduled classes, 3 in the Madras Medical college, 2 in the Stanley Medical College and 1 in the Andhra Medical College.

Women students not belonging to the Madras Presidency should pay fees at twice the ordinary rates prescribed for men students.

Candidates of the Madras University who may be selected for admission into the Medical Colleges affiliated to Andhra University should pay the prescribed fee of Rs. 2 to the credit of the Madras University for registration as a Matriculate of that University & obtain the migration certificate which should be presented to the Andhra University before obtaining a recognition certificate from that University on payment of Rs. 5, the prescribed fee. All this can be done after joining the college.

Hostel :

Students who are admitted to the Madras Medical College should sign a hostel discipline declaration and live in hostels attached to the College unless specially exempted by the Principal.

DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY

Course of Instruction:

The course extends over two years. Those who have passed the Matriculation Examination or who have qualified for the S.S.L.C. taking Physics or Chemistry as "C" Group subjects for the Public Examination are eligible for admission.

Admission:

Application for admission to this class should be sent to the Principal, Medical College, before the 16 th June with a treasury or bank chalan for Rs. 2.

Fees:

The fee for each subject of the course is Rs. 12.

TRAINING OF SANITARY INSPECTORS

Courses of Instruction:

The course of instruction is given in the Madras Medical College, and in the King Institute of Preventive Medicine, Guindy, and extends from 1st July each year for a period of 12 calendar months.

The course consists of: (a) Theoretical and Practical Training in general Hygiene including demonstrations in Bacteriology. (b) Physiology including First Aid. (c) Training in Practical Sanitation by the Health Officer of the Corporation of Madras. (d) Training in Elementary Sanitary Engineering. (e) A theoretical course of Training in Vaccination at the King Institute of Preventive Medicine, Guindy, for a period of 15 days and a practical course of Vaccination under the Health Officer, Corporation of Madras for a period of 6 weeks except for candidates who have served as Vaccinators in the Province for a continuous period of not less than one year.

Candidates who have successfully completed the course prescribed for the lower subordinate class in the College of Engineering, Vizagapatam & candidates who have successfully undergone the Vaccination course in the King Institute, Guindy should obtain a first class vaccinators certificate. Candidates who have served as Vaccinators in the Province for a continuous period of not less than one year will not be required to take the course in Elementary Sanitary Engineering, Vaccination and the 6 weeks practical course in Vaccination under the Health Officer, Corporation of Madras, respectively although they will be required to pass the examinations in the subjects. These candidates except the last need not pay the fees prescribed for the course but should pay the fee of Rs. 10 for the theoretical course of training at the King Institute, Guindy, and also the examination fees.

Candidates should secure not less than 50 per cent the marks in each subject for a pass. For a distinction in any subject candidates should obtain not less than 75 per cent in that subject at the first time of the sitting for that examination.

Candidates who pass the above examination shall be designated as Sanitary Inspector and will be given a Government Certificate signed by the Chairman, Board of Examiners.

The Government have decided that demobilised personnel and discharged workers in war may be admitted to the course of training up to the limit of the strength of the class, i.e. 150.

The Government have also decided that, after provision is made for demobilised personnel and discharged workers in war works the cases of young widows and wives of soldiers will be given preference.

Admission:

Applications from candidates should be sent to the Principal, Medical College, Madras, between 15th of April and the 11th of June. The application should be made on the printed forms which will be forwarded till the 31st of May by the Principal, Medical College, Madras on requisition.

Applications for admission to the Sanitary Inspector's course will also be considered as applications for admission to the course of training in Vaccination at the King Institute of Preventive Medicine, Guindy.

Applications should reach the Principal not later than 12 noon on Friday the 11th June 1948 accompanied by a registration fee of Rs. 2/-

Qualifications for admission:

Candidates for admission to the Sanitary Inspector's course

(i) should have been declared eligible for admission to the University course of study in Madras, Andhra or Annamalai Universities. or

(ii) should hold a completed Secondary School Leaving Certificate. The holder of the Secondary School Lea-

ing certificate should have obtained at the Public Examination not less than 35 per cent of the marks in each of the subjects in Group A and in each of the 2 optional subjects in the case of old regulations or in one subject in the case of new regulations in Group B other than Music, Shorthand, Typewriting, Practical Telegraphy & Needle Craft. Preference will be given to those who have taken Algebra and Geometry, Botany, Physics, Chemistry or Psychology as an optional in Group C, or

(iii) should have passed any higher or any of the examination recognised as equivalent to (i) and (ii) above.

No exemption from the prescribed general educational qualifications is granted, but the Director of Public Health has been empowered to exempt for special reasons, any deserving cases, such as candidates who are working in Health Department of Madras Government, local boards and municipal councils.

Fees:

The College fee prescribed in the course of Hygiene and Physiology including First Aid and Elementary Sanitary Engineering is Rs. 90 and the fee for the course of training in Vaccination is Rs. 30.

All the candidates should pay at the College office in cash the sum of Rs. 8 towards the subscription to the College Athletic Club.

The collection of fees for tuition and examination will be waived in the case of demobilised personnel.

Note: The rate of fees shall be subject to such modification as may be made by any rule or order that may be in force at the time of admission of the selected candidates.

DIPLOMA COURSE IN CLINICAL LABORATORY SCIENCE

Courses of Instruction:

The Diploma course is open to: (a) Graduates in Medicine of the Madras University or other approved Universities and (b) Registered Medical Practitioners selected by the Principal, Medical College, Madras in consultation with the Professors concerned.

The course will be from July 1948 to June 1949 and the number of students taken will be limited to 6 at a time.

Students selected for admission are required to pursue an approved course of instruction and training lasting at least one calendar year as wholtime workers under the Principal, Medical College, Madras, and under direct supervision of the heads of the departments of Pathology, Bacteriology & Bio-Chemistry, & Director, King Institute of Preventive Medicine, Guindy.

Candidates who secure at least 50 per cent of the marks in the practical and oral taken in each of the subjects Pathology, Bacteriology and Bio-Chemistry, shall be declared to have passed. All other candidates shall be deemed to have failed.

Failed candidates who wish to appear for the examination again should undergo an additional course for 3 months and appear for all the subjects.

Successful candidates shall be awarded a diploma signed by the Board of Examiners constituted for the purpose.

Admission.

On sending a stamped and addressed envelope to the Principal, Madras Medical College, before 31st May 1948 necessary application forms will be posted.

Applications for admission in prescribed form must reach the Principal, Medical College, Madras on or before the 7th June 1948 with a treasury or bank chalan for Rs. 2/-

Fees:

The fee charged for the course will be Rs.360 and caution money of Rs.30 should be paid to cover breakages, if any, which amount or balance after deduction for breakage will be refunded at the end of the course. (Fees from Non-Madrasi candidates will be double the above rate).

The fee for the examination shall be Rs. 50.

The fee for additional course shall be Rs.100

M. B. B. S. Course for D. M. S. or L. M. P. Diploma Holders.

The M.B.B.S. Course for D.M.S. or L.M.P. Diploma holders in Madras Medical College, Madras, Stanley Medical College, Madras and Andhra Medical College, Vizagapatam commences in July each year. Application form can be had from the Principal, Medical College, Madras before 31st May 1948. on the transmission of a stamped and addressed envelope. Application for admission should be submitted so as to reach the Principal, Madras Medical College, not later than 12 noon the 7th June 1948.

Qualifications for admission:

A candidate who holds a Government diploma of L. M. P. of this Presidency or any other qualification

accepted by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto will be admitted to the course of M. B. B. S. provided: (i) that he has passed the Matriculation or equivalent examination (ii) that he has subsequently undergone a course of study for the period mentioned below in a College of Medicine affiliated to or recognised by the University of Madras: (a) in the case of ordinary Licentiates - 2 years (b) in the case of Licentiate Commissioned Officers of I. A. M. C. who have not undergone three months extensive course at A. M. T. C. 2 years (c) in the case of Licentiate Officers who have undergone 3 months intensive course at A. M. T. C. - 18 months (d) in the case of Licentiate officers with D. M. S. - and other similar qualifications which involved medical studies for 5 years and have not undergone three months intensive course at A. M. T. C. - 18 months (e) in the case of Licentiate Commissioned Officers of I. A. M. C. with D. M. S. and other similar qualification which involved medical studies for five years and have undergone three months intensive course at A. M. T. C. - 12 months (iii) that he has undergone a course in Anatomy, Physiology, including Bio-chemistry and Pharmacology concurrently with the course in the clinical subjects (iv) that he has attended a course of study in hospital practice for 12 months or one academic year in the clinical subjects and (v) that he has passed Part II of the Second M. B. B. S. and final M. B. B. S. examinations.

Preference in selection for admission of Licentiates in Medical College will be in the following order of preference.

(a) Licentiates in the service of the Madras Government who have done war service and similar service under local bodies; (b) private practitioners of this Province who have done war service; (c) Licentiate

obtained in the I. A. M. C. and who might be recommended by the Government of India for permanent commissions in the army.

DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY COURSE

Andhra Medical College, Vizagapatam.

The Diploma in Pharmacy course in the Andhra Medical college, Vizagapatam starts from 2nd July and extends over two years. The admission is limited to six candidates. Applications for admission should be sent to the Principal, Andhra Medical College, before the 25th June.

Qualifications for admission:

Those who have passed the Matriculation Examination or who have qualified for Secondary School Leaving Certificate taking Physics or Chemistry as "C" Group subjects for the Public Examination are eligible for admission. Preference, however, will be given to

candidates who have passed Part III of the Intermediate Examination in Arts or Science with Botany, Physics and Chemistry as optional subjects.

Fees:

Entrance and Admission: A pass in the entrance test conducted by the Department of Education, Government of Madras, the Secondary Entrance Examination of Mysore, the Upadhyaya Examination of Travancore, the Kavya Pandita Examination of Cochin.

(iv) Music Course-1. The University offers instruction in Music to qualify for the Sangita Bhushana Title in the following subjects - Vocal Music, Vina, Violin, Mridangam.

A course in Tevara Tirumurais is also offered to qualify for the Tiruppanandal Tevara Tirumurai prize of Rs. 500. Course 4 years. A preliminary examination at the end of 2 years and a final examination at the end of 4 years. For students of Vocal music, instruction in the Vina is compulsory in the first two years of the course; to give them a working knowledge of Tamil, instruction is offered in that language. Stipends of the value of Rs. 10 or Rs. 8 will be paid for nine months from July to poor and deserving students. The award of stipends will be decided in August.

2. There is provision for Post Sangita Bhushana course for enabling those qualified in one branch of study to qualify in another branch for the Sangita Bhushana Title after a course of study at the University for a period of two years.

3. A course of one year leading to the award of certificate in Tamil Music is also offered for the benefit of lovers of music with some previous attainments and Post Sangita Bhushana.

Entrance and Admission. No candidate shall be qualified for admission to the Title course unless he shall have completed the age of 15 on the first day of the commencement of the course and shall have passed the entrance examination conducted in accordance with a prescribed syllabus or books recommended for study. Students taking the entrance examination to qualify for admission should meet their own expenses.

The entrance examination shall consist of two tests: (i) A written test in 1. Elementary Mathematics, 2. Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam or Urdu and 3. History and Geography of India; and (ii) A practical test in Vocal or instrumental Music or Mridangam. No candidate shall be permitted to enter upon a course of study for the title unless he has passed both the tests, provided however that students who have been declared eligible for admission to a University course of study shall take only the Music Tests.

Tevara Tirumurai - Music students intending to take the Tevara Tirumurai course will, as a special case, be given facilities to qualify for the Pulavar Preliminary Examination during the Sangita Bhushana Course; Tevara Tirumurai students may also appear for the Pulavar Preliminary Examination after completing the Sangita Bhushana Course with a view to qualify for the Tevara Tirumurai prize.

Fee Regulations:-

(1) Every student shall pay along with his tuition fee an admission fee of Rupees 2/- (2) The entire tuition

on fee is usually payable on admission. But the facility to pay the fee in instalments, not exceeding three, may be granted for convenience of payment. In this case a charge of Rs. 2/- is made both on the second and third instalments only and not on the first payment. (3) Instalment must be paid on or before the due dates. If any instalment is not so paid a sum of Rs. 3/- extra will be charged as penalty therefor.

Every student has to deposit a sum of Rs. 30/- against the lessons that are supplied to him in each part. Thus a student joining for both parts I & II will deposit Rs. 60/-. This deposit will, of course, be refunded when the lessons are returned in good condition. They have to be returned after the examinations.

Hostel Facilities:

(1) Only a limited number of students can be accommodated in the Hostel attached to the College. Rooms are let unfurnished. (2) Students who wish to reside in the College Hostel should apply for seats in advance. The applications should be accompanied by a registration fee of Rs. 2/- and a deposit of Rs. 12/- (3) Those who are not allotted seats will be given a refund of the deposit paid by them. Those who are admitted into the Hostel will have to pay a further sum of Rs. 12/- so that a total sum of Rs.24/- will be with the College Authorities as Caution Fee. The Registration fee of Rs. 2/- will on no account be refunded, whether the student is allotted a seat or not. When the student leaves the Hostel, whatever is found due and payable to him out of the Caution Fee, will be paid to him. (4) The Hostel dues for each month must be paid on or before the 5th day of the succeeding month. Failure to do so will lead to the summary expulsion of the defaulter from Hostel. (5) Students who have made no arrange-

nents for their stay in the City may be allowed to stay in the Hostel for a period not exceeding three days at a nominal fee of Re. 1/- per day. This is, of course subject to the availability of accommodation in the Hostel at the time. (6) In admitting students to the Hostel, preference will be given to those who join for all Parts and who seek admission to the Hostel for the first time, specially if they happen to be also strangers to the City. (7) Every member of the Hostel must mess only in the Jollege Canteen. Only vege tarian food will be provided. (8) Approximate monthly charges for boarding and lodging and other expenses will be around Rs. 55/-

The college also affords postal tuition in Basic English to enable young men and women to reach a high standard in English within the shortest time.

CAMBRIDGE SENIOR:

The Cambridge Senior certificate holders are on a par with graduates of recognised Indian Universities for certain practical purposes.

Candidates irrespective of age, sex, caste or creed are admitted directly to the course provided they have passed the S. S. L. C. or Matriculation or an equivalent examination of a recognised Indian University. Those

who have not reached any of these standards are also admitted under certain special circumstances.

Study of English language is compulsory. Candidates should choose one subject from Group A below and 4 from Group B.

* No additional fee is charged for Tamil, Sanskrit, Hindi, Urdu, Bengali, Punjabi, Gujarati, Persian, Malay. Other Indian languages can be offered only if a special fee is paid to the University 8 months before the examination.

(a) Those who possess the minimum general Educational qualifications—Rs. 150/- advance payment or Rs.40/- on enrolment and Rs.20/- each for 8 consecutive monthly instalments.

(b) Those who have appeared for the S. S. L. C., Matriculation or any equivalent examination of a recognised Indian University but have failed therein are admitted on payment of Rs. 75/- over and above the fees mentioned in (a) above.

Those who have not appeared for the Matriculation or an equivalent examination are admitted on payment of Rs. 125/- over and above the fees mentioned in (a) above.

In addition to tuition fees candidates have to pay an admission fee of Rs.5/- and also Rs.10/- for postal tuition to cover the cost incurred towards communications, etc. The total cost of books may come to about Rs.25/-

Examinations :

The Senior Cambridge examination is held usually in July and December every year. The December examination is usually held at Bangalore, Coonoor, Madras, Trivandrum, etc., while the July examination takes place only at a few centres and that too in certain years only. Examination fees are - (a) £ 1. 17. 6 plus local fee of Rs.15/- for the privilege of taking the examination in India (b) Only the major Indian languages can be offered either free or on payment of 5s. For the minor languages special arrangements can be made by paying a sum of Rs.150/-. The amount is divided equally among the number of candidates who offer that language and the balance refunded to them directly.

CAMBRIDGE HIGHER :

Only those who have passed Cambridge Senior or the Intermediate Examination of a recognised Indian University are eligible to appear for this examination. Exemptions are given in special cases.

4. K. S. AIYAR'S COLLEGE, ROYAPETTAH, MADRAS.

Matriculation classes commence about the end of June and last till the end of February. Coaching for Intermediate, B. A., B. Sc., etc., commences generally in or about the 3rd week of May for the September Examinations and in or about the last week of October for the March Examinations. For Cambridge School-Leaving Certificate, classes commence in the last week of August for the examination in December of the succeeding year. A second session will commence in the middle of January preceding the examination. Candidates who have appeared for the S. S. L. C. or an equivalent entrance examination only are admitted in June preceding the examination. Admission is made only on the basis of a test for which a fee of Rs. 3 is charged. Candidates who have appeared for an entrance examination like S. S. L. C. are exempted from the test. Postal tuition for Cambridge School Certificate can be commenced at any time provided there is a minimum period of 8 to 12 months as may be fixed upon with reference to the attainment of the candidate. For coaching in subjects involving practical examination, students must attend personal tuition classes for at least 3 months at Madras.

The Matriculation Examination of the Madras University is held in March every year at Madras,

Bangalore, Hyderabad (Deccan), Palamcottah, Pondicherry, Tellicherry and Trichinopoly. The subjects of the examination are—English, a Second Language, (coaching is given in the College in Tamil, Sanskrit, French, Telugu and Latin), Mathematics, Elementary Science, History and Geography. All the subjects are compulsory and there are no optional subjects. Private candidates are permitted to appear for the examination under certain conditions. Permission for appearing for the examination must be obtained from the University by application in the prescribed manner before the last day of September preceding the examination. Candidates who are (a) over 20 years old, (b) who have appeared for the S. S. L. C. or an equivalent examination, and (c) who pursue a regular study under proper guidance and produce certificates in evidence are permitted on special application to appear for the examination as private candidates. Admissions to the tutorial classes will generally be made on the basis of a test for which a fee of Rs. 3 is payable. Those who have appeared for an Entrance Examination like S. S. L. C. once are exempted from the Test and are eligible for direct admission.

Bonafide teachers are permitted to appear privately for the Inter. and B. A. Examinations of the Madras and Andhra Universities. Persons in Government Service are permitted to appear as private candidates by the Andhra University under certain conditions. Longer Postal tuition courses are conducted for such candidates. Coaching is given in Part I English and Part III subjects of the Intermediate and the B. A. Examinations; under Part III of the Intermediate, courses are available for Ancient History, Modern History, Indian History, Mathematics and Logic. Under Part III of the B. A., courses available are

Mathematics, Economics, History and Politics. No coaching is available for Part II.

While only teachers can appear as private candidates at the Madras and the Andhra Universities, Nagpur M. A. is open to all Graduates (of any Indian University). Of course only non-Science subjects can be taken by private candidates. Coaching is given in Mathematics, Economics, History, Politics and English Literature.

CAMBRIDGE SCHOOL CERTIFICATE: Every student is coached in six subjects to ensure his success in the examination. To qualify for the certificate it is sufficient if the candidate passes in the compulsory English Language paper and in five other subjects which must include at least one language or a Science subject. 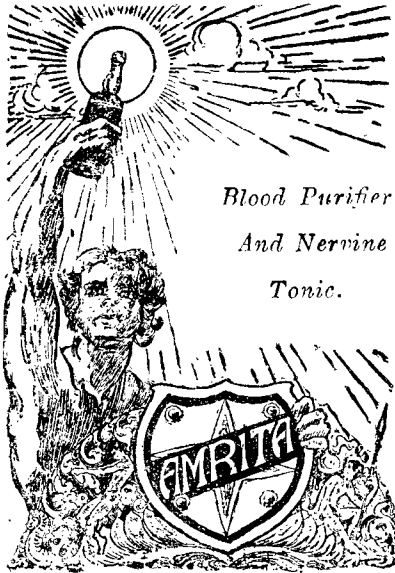

**TECHNICAL INSTITUTIONS IN
THE PROVINCE**

**1. P.T. LEE CHENGALVARAYA
NAICKER'S TECHNICAL AND
INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTE, VEPERY,
MADRAS**

Admissions will be in July every year. Admission to Industrial (Artisan) courses will be made from 1st June to 15th July.

Courses of Instruction:

1. L.M.E. and L.E.E. Diploma Courses: 5 years at the Institute and 2 years practical training.

Admissions to these courses are restricted to holders of Completed Secondary School Leaving certificate who have been declared eligible for the University Courses, or those who have been declared eligible for the public service, preferably those whose optional subjects are Mathematics or Physics.

The standard of instruction, is sufficiently high to enable students to become successful foremen, charge-men, shift engineers, line inspectors, operators, power house assistants, test-room assistants, etc.

The courses of study and syllabuses are so designed that students, who so desire, may sit for several well-recognised examinations held by outside bodies, e.g.

the Madras Government Technical Examinations, the Technological Examinations of the City and Guilds of London Institute, etc. in Mechanical and Electrical Engineering subjects.

2. The Electrical Engineering Certificate Course: 2 years. Admission is, in the first instance given to those who have completed S. S. L. C.; if space permits, a few students who have not completed the S.S.L.C course may be admitted, provided they have at least passed the V Form.

The course includes Engineering Mathematics, Electrical Engineering Lectures, Electric Wiring Practice, Electrical Laboratory Work, Heat Engines, Elementary Mechanical Engineering, Practical, Plane and Solid Geometry, Machine Drawing and Workshop Practice.

The syllabuses and course of study are so designed that successful students find no difficulty in securing employment in the capacities of mechanics, wiremen, switch-board attenders, electricians, etc.

3. Industrial (Artisan) Course: 12 months reach
1. Carpentry 2. Electric Wiring 3. Fitting 4. Moulding and Casting 5. Printing Composing and 6. Proof Reading.

Qualifications required: Good face-test, physical strength and age. Men who are more than labourers but cannot read and write much, and those youths of well-to do parents who were unfortunate in their school education are admitted to these courses.

Every student wishing to resign must give a term's written notice or pay the fee. This fee may be recovered from the parent or guardian or responsible known person who might have signed the student's admission form. In case of neglect of this rule the amount of deposit standing to the credit of the student will not be refunded.

2. THE CENTRAL POLYTECHNIC MADRAS

Application for admission should reach the Principal not later than the 16th of June.

Hours of attendance for part-time students—5-30 to 7-30, p.m. Besides, they undergo training for one full working day in the week from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Courses of Instruction: (the figures in brackets indicate the maximum number of students to be admitted in each course)

(1) Mechanical Engineering Course (L. M. E. Diplomas): Four years in the case of part-time students (60) and three years in the case of full-time students (20), and one year practical training in any recognised workshop.

(2) Electrical Engineering Course (L. M. E. Diplomas): Four years' duration in the case of part-time students (10) and three years in the case of full-time students (20); and one year practical training in any recognised workshop.

Apprenticeships: Apprenticeship in Mechanical Engineering usually extends over a period of five years and in Electrical Engineering over a period of three or five years. The school course is so arranged as to fit in with the practical training of the apprentice at the workshops. Every year a certain number of apprentices are entertained by the various workshops. In some workshops, the apprentices are given graded wages ranging from 6 annas a day in the first year to Rs. 1-4-0 per day in the fifth year. Students should make their own arrangements for joining workshops.

(3) Printing Courses (L.P.T. Diplomas): Five years in the case of part-time students and three years with one year outside practice in case of full-time students (50 and 20 seats in each of the course).

(a) Composing and Proof-reading, two years (Certificate awarded by Technical Diploma Examination Board).

(b) Machine Minding and Binding, Two years (Certificate awarded by Technical Diplomas Examination Board)

(c) General Management and allied subjects for those who have completed courses (a) and (b) and who are holders of S.S.L.Cs., eligible for college admission or Public Services.

(4) Civil Engineering—full-time course of three years' duration (20).

(5) Sanitary Engineering—full-time course of three years' duration (20).

(6) Fisheries Technology and Navigation—full-time course of three years' duration (20).

(7) Cinematography and Sound Engineering Course—three years theoretical instruction followed by one year practical training in a studio (10).

(8) Cinema Operators' Course of 18 months duration of which 6 months will be practical training in a theatre (20). (Certificate awarded by Technical Examination Board).

(9) Practical Electric Wiring Course of two years ended for practical wire-men (60).

(10) Mechanical Drawing courses in vernacular of 2 years each for : (a) Wood workers, such as cabinet-makers and carpenters (20); (b) Metal Workers, such as fitters and turners (3); (c) Bricklayers, masons and masons (30).

(11) Plumbing course of two years (30).

(12) Minor Sanitary Science, 1 year—for those who have passed Plumbing who have studied up to S.S.L.C. (20).

Qualifications for Admission :

Bonafide apprentices and workmen who are actually engaged in the trade they wish to learn will be admitted in the part-time courses.

Mechanical, Electrical and other Engineering courses—Secondary School-Leaving Certificate with eligibility either for college course of studies or for public services. Preference will be given to those whose optionals are Mathematics or Physics.

Cinematography and Sound Engineering Course—Pass in the Intermediate Examination in Science or the possession of the L.E.E. Diploma.

Cinema Operators' course—S.S.L.C. (passed or failed). Candidates with IV Form qualification will also be admitted after exemption.

The fees will be recovered from the students in two equal instalments in advance, one at the commencement of the session, on or before the 15th of July and the other on or before the 15th of January.

A deposit of Rs. 10 should be made by each student of the Engineering courses and Rs. 5 by each student of the Printing, Plumbing, Sanitary Science and Wiring courses, as caution money for breakages,

etc., which will be refunded less deductions, if any, on account of loss or damage caused by the student, at the termination of the course or when he discontinues studies at the school. The deposit should be paid along with the first instalment fees.

Students who wish to borrow books from the library should deposit Rs. 5.

A sports fee of Rs. 5 from the Engineering students and of Rs. 2 from the students of the other classes is levied and collected along with the first instalment of fee payable in July.

Students' Association—Rs. 2 per student, payable along with the first instalment of fee in July of every year.

Hostel :

There is no hostel attached to the School.

3. GOVERNMENT POLYTECHNICS IN MOFUSSIL

The Diploma Courses in the Polytechnics are of 3 years duration, except the overseer's course which is of 2 years. The minimum educational qualification for admission is S. S. L. C. with Mathematics or Physics or Chemistry as optional and eligibility to the College course except for Chemical Engineering and Cinematography and Sound Engineering courses for which a pass in Intermediate in Science is the minimum qualification. The tuition fee is Rs. 36 per year for students belonging to Madras Province.

The certificate courses in the Industrial Schools are of 2 to 5 years duration. The minimum educational qualification is pass in III Form and age should not

exceed 18 years on 1st July 1948. There is no tuition fees, and deserving students will be paid stipends.

Applications for admission will be received by the officers-in-charge of the Institutions till 15th June 1948.

VIII GOVERNMENT COIR SCHOOL, BEYPORE, S. MALABAR:

Certificate Course: Coir and coir products manufacture.—Trained teachers from Local Board and other private schools and boys and girls of 17 years and above with IV Form or VIII Standard qualification are admitted. No fees. All the candidates are eligible for stipends of Rs. 15 per mensem.

4. THE INSTITUTE OF LEATHER TECHNOLOGY, WASHHERMANPET, MADRAS

The session is divided into two terms: (i) From July to December; (ii) From January to April.

Courses of Instruction:

(a) Diploma Course in Leather Technology—(three years) to be followed up by apprenticeship for one year on a tannery. Admission is restricted to students who have passed the S.S.L.C. Examination or any other equivalent examination with Chemistry as

optional subject. Preference will be given to those who are connected with the Leather Industry.

A sum of Rs. 20/- is to be deposited every year by students of the Diploma Course in Leather Technology and Rs. 10/- by those of the Certificate course in Leather Goods Manufacture as Caution Money. (Refundable)

Hostel :

No hostel is at present attached to the Institute.

5. KERALA SOAP INSTITUTE CALICUT

Gives training in Soap manufacture course one year, commencing about the middle of June. Last date for receipt of applications—31st May 1948.

Qualifications for admission: S. S. L. C. except in special cases.

Fees: Rs. 100/- per annum for those coming from the Madras Presidency and Rs. 150/- per annum for those from other Provinces and Indian States.

6. THE INDIAN INSTITUTE OF ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY PURASAWALKAM MADRAS

Courses of Instruction:

Regular courses are conducted in:—

1. A.M.I.E. (Ind). This examination is conducted by the Institute of Engineers, India, twice a year in three branches of Engineering, Civil, Mechanical and Electrical

It consists of a preliminary Examination, and three sectional examinations, viz., Sections A. B. & C. Intermediates of any of the Indian Universities are exempted from the preliminary examination. The duration of the course is one year for each of the Sections.

2. A.M.I.C.E., A.M.I.E.E., A.M.I. Mech. E.&A.M.I. Struct E-(London Examinations):—

These examinations are similar to the above examination. Graduates only are exempted from the preliminary of these examinations.

3. City & Guilds of London Institute. The institute conducts examinations in (a) Structural Engineering (b) Builders quantities (c) Machine design (d) Mechanical Engineers Estimates & Specifications (e) Technical Electricity (f) Transmission & Lines & (g) Electrical Engineering practice.

These examinations are held once a year. Diploma Holders in Engineering (L.C.E., L.M.E., L.E.E., etc.) can complete this course in a year. Candidates with S.S.L.C. (Mathematics Optional) can complete this course in two years.

Practical training will be provided.

Tutorial courses are given in Engineering Examination of the Madras, Andhra Annamalai & other Indian Universities.

F.E. Part I F.E. Part II, B.E. Exam. (Civil Mechanical & Electrical), B.E. (Old Regulations-last chance in 1949), L.C.E., L.E.E. L.M.E., and other Government Diploma Examinations.

Coaching is also given in English under Part I, Tamil, Telugu, Sanskrit & Hindi under Part II of the Intermediate, B.A. & B.Sc., Preliminary examinations Under Part III of the Intermediate, and Part II of the B.Sc., coaching is given in Mathematics, Physics & Chemistry, Main and Subsidiary.

Fees:

2. A.M.I.C.E., A.M.I. Mech.E-A.M.I.E.E. A-M.I. Struct. E.-Rs. 250/- per annum.

Rs. 150/- for all papers except the practical.

A fee of Re 1/- will be charged for registration of every application.

On selection an admission fee of Rs. 2/- besides the fees quoted above should be paid.

Tuition fee may be paid in a lump or in 3 instalments; a charge of Rs. 2/- is made both on the second and third instalments.

Additional fee of about Rs. 100/- is payable for practical training.

Hostel:- No hostel accommodation is provided.

7. VINCENT'S RADIO ENGINEERING COLLEGE, TRICHINOPOLY.

Date of re-opening : 23rd June 1948.

Courses of Instruction :

(a) Radio Engineering (one year) (b) Wireless Telegraphy and (c) Refrigeration Engineering.

Qualifications for admission :

S. S. L. C. or its equivalent.

Examination:

A selection examination is held at the end of the 1st session and successful students are presented to the City & Guild's Examination of the London Institute which is held at Madras annually. The final examination of the institute is held at the end of the second term and Diplomas are issued to the eligible candidates.

Fees:

The fees for Radio Engineering or Wireless Telegraphic course is Rs. 150/- each; but if both the courses are taken simultaneously, there is a reduc-

tion of Rs. 50/- in the total fees namely Rs. 250/- for both the courses. These fees are payable in five equal monthly Instalments, the first one with the application and the balance in four equal monthly instalments, in July to October.

Hostel :

There is no hostel attached to the Institute.

8. V. S. RAJAGOPALAN'S RADIO INSTITUTE, THYAGARAYANAGAR, MADRAS.

Date of re-opening 1st week of July 1948:

Qualifications for Admission and Duration of Course:

Admissions are open to Intermediates and Graduates in Science for a one year course and to S. S. L. C's, for a two-year course. Both the courses lead to the Industrial School Leaving Certificate examination for Radio Servicing and Maintenance held by the Government of Madras and London City and Guild's examination in Radio Service Work.

Fees:

The academic year is divided into three terms and the tuition fee charged is either Rs. 50/- per term paid in a lump or Rs. 52 per term paid in two equal instalments of Rs. 26/- each, one at the beginning of each term and the other a month later. A laboratory fee of Rs. 10/- for the senior students and Rs. 5/- for the junior students, a library fee of Rs. 2/- and a games fee of Rs. 1/- per student are also levied for the academic year and are collected at the beginning of the first term. A deposit of Rs. 50/- per student whether

senior or junior to cover breakages, fines, etc., is collected, the outstanding amount, at the end of the year being refundable. A Students Union subscription of annas 8 per term is payable along with each term fees or the first instalment thereof.

9. KALAKSHETRA, ADYAR, MADRAS.

Date of re-opening 24th June 1948.

Courses of Instruction:

Sangeetha Siromani Course (of the Madras University); 4 years; Kalakshetra Diploma Courses; Vocal, Veena, Gottuvadyam, Mridangam, Bharata Natya, Kathakali Dramatic Art, Violin and Painting; 4 years.

Bharata Natya Teachers' Diploma Course: 2 years for those who have good proficiency in Karnatic Music.

Qualifications of Admission:

Sangeetha Siromani Course - S. S. L. C. with Music as optional or Matriculation with Government Technical Examination Diploma of Music (Higher grade).

Age: Candidates should not have completed 15 years of age on the date of admission.

Fees:

Sangitha Siromani Course - Rs. 100/- per annum in 2 instalments Rs. 60/- and Rs. 40/-.

Kalakshetra Diploma Courses: Junior (Ist and IInd year) students Rs. 75/- for first term and Rs. 50/-

for second term. Senior (III and IVth year) students Rs. 90/- for first term and Rs. 60/- for second term.

Admission fee, Library, etc. Common to all courses. 1st year Rs. 10/-; II, III and IV year Rs. 5/-.

Hostel Facilities:—

There is accommodation for 80 students. Only vegetarian mess is provided. Senior students are allowed double rooms. Junior students are accommodated in cottages, girls 15 in a cottage and boys 6.

Rs. 45/- is collected per mensem from each student towards mess charges, light, water, etc. Caution money Rs. 40/- (refundable).

10. GOVERNMENT SCHOOL OF ARTS AND CRAFTS, MADRAS.

The school-year is divided into two terms—July to December and from January to the end of April.

Courses of Instruction:—

Arts Section (1) General Drawing 2 years course, (2) Painting 3 years, (3) Commercial Art 3 years, (4) Advanced course in Painting 1 year, (5) Advanced Commercial Art 1 year, (6) Modelling 3 years, (7) Sculpture 1 year.

Crafts Section: (1) Woodwork (Elementary) 3 years, (2) Wood work (Advanced) 2 years, (3) Sheet metal work 3 years course, (4) Engraving 3 years course, (5) Gold smithy 3 years course, (6) Enamelling 2 years course, (7) Design 3 years course.

Students who have successfully completed their courses of study in General Drawing, Painting and Commercial Art, Wood Work (Elementary), Wood Work (Advanced), Sheet Metal Work, Engraving, Gold smithy, Enamel and Design will be awarded certificates.

Those who have completed successfully the advanced course in Painting or Commercial Art will be awarded diplomas.

Qualifications for admission:

1. General Drawing - Completion of IV form in a high school.
2. Painting - A certificate issued by the School of Arts and Crafts, Madras in General Drawing.
3. Commercial Art do.
4. Advanced course in painting. } A certificate issued by the School of Arts and
5. Advanced course in Commercial Art. } Crafts, Madras, in Painting or Commercial Art as the case may be.
6. Modelling - A certificate issued by the School of Arts and Crafts, Madras in General Drawing.
7. Sculpture - A certificate issued by the School of Arts and Crafts, Madras in Modelling.

Crafts Section.

1. Wood Work (Elementary) - Completion of III form or VIII standard.
2. Wood Work (Advanced) - A certificate issued by the School of Art Section Crafts, Madras in Wood Work (Elementary).
3. Sheet metal work - Completion of III form or VIII standard.
4. Engraving do.
5. Goldsmithy do.

6. Enamel-work - A certificate issued by the School of Arts and Crafts, in Goldsmithy.

7. Design - A certificate in any one of the courses in the Crafts Section.

Students should not be more than twelve years of age.

Fees :

No fees are charged for the Crafts Section. Fees for the Fine Arts Section are as follows :-

General Drawing - Rs. 12 a year ; Painting and Commercial Art - Rs. 30 each per year ; Advanced course in Painting, Advanced course in Commercial Art, Modelling and Sculpture - Rs. 36 each per year.

Students coming from other provinces and native States are charged double the rate of fees.

Scholarships:

Seventy-six Scholarships to the value of Rs. 10 to Rs. 15 each are awarded in the Crafts Section and 40 scholarships to the value of Rs. 10 to 25 in the Fine Arts Section. The Commissioner of Government awards scholarships to the depressed class students. Besides this, the authorities of the Victoria Technical Institute and the Warden of the Sri Venkateswara Students' Hostel award scholarships ranging from Rs. 10 to 15 per mensem.

Among Government scholarship-holders, the pupils coming from the mufassil will be eligible also to draw a city allowance of Rs. 10. The students from other Provinces and native States are not eligible for the scholarships.

Hostel:

No hostel accommodation is provided.

SOME SPECIAL COURSES IN
