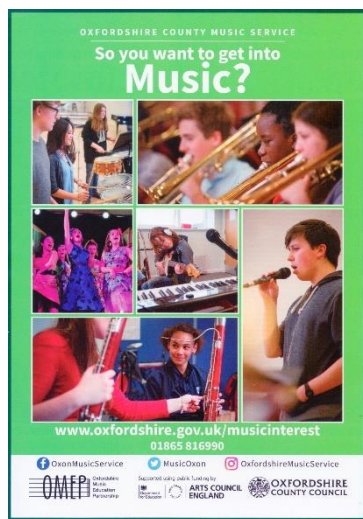


The Warriner School Instrumental Teaching – Music Department



My name is Mark Probert and I am an Instrumental Teacher with the Oxfordshire County Music Service.

I have been a teacher for nearly fifteen years.

I studied at the Royal College of Music in London, graduating with a Bachelor of Music Degree and a Masters in Advanced Performance.

I teach students of all ages from beginner up to Grade 8 and beyond.

I help students to prepare for a range of performances, and use both ABRSM and Trinity Boards for those who wish to take exams.

When are brass lessons?

They are on Thursdays between 11 am and 1pm. Lesson times move around so that you don't miss the same bit of same lesson every week.

How much are instrumental lessons through Oxfordshire County Music Service?

The cost of tuition is dependent on the length of lesson and the number of pupils in each group, starting from £6.75 for a 20 minute small group lesson. Endangered instruments such as French Horn, Trombone, Euphonium and Tuba qualify for a 25% discount.
