Common Skin Conditions in Skin of Color

Tonsillitis (Strep Throat)

Strep throat is an infection of the tonsils, which are tissue in the back of the throat. It is caused by a specific type of bacteria (group A beta-hemolytic streptococcus). It is most common in children three to 15 years of age.

Tonsil Stones

Tonsil stones are small lumps of hard material that form in the tonsils. Tonsil stones are usually no painful or harmful but they can cause bad breath. They are also called tonsilloliths (TON-sill-uh-lithe)
