- As for Member States, list of speakers will be established by drawing of lots at the intersessional meeting of CCPCJ (to be scheduled in due course).

STATEMENTS

- Speakers are also able to address via pre-recorded video statements.
- Statements should be limited to 3 minutes (approximately 300 words). Chairs of regional groups will be allotted a speaking time of a maximum of 5 minutes.
- All the statements made during the high-level segment by speakers representing Member States will be made available on the website of the 14th Crime Congress.




A broader policy debate would take place under the agenda item – in comparison to the "corresponding" workshop which was more focused and technical in nature






The item would start with an introduction of the working paper prepared by the Secretariat.

Panel discussions followed by interventions from the floor




Formulation of recommendations – included in the Congress report





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
