The Budget Dockets prepared by the component institutions listed below are herewith submitted with my recommendation for ratification or approval, as appropriate, at the meeting of the Board of Regents, in Houston, October 23-24, 1964.

The following changes affecting Central Administration budgetary and fiscal operations are recommended for ratification or approval, as appropriate, by the Board of Regents.

RECOMMENDED AMENDMENTS TO THE 1964-65 CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION BUDGET

- Office of the Chancellor

 1. Change the status of Change the status of Lamier Cox, Vice-Chancellor (Administrative Services) to full time in the Chancellor's Office September 1, 1964 through August 31, 1965. Mr. Cox was originally budgeted for 1/3 time in the Department of General Business (Main University) for the Long Session, but he will be needed full time in his administrative capacity during this Legislative year. Also, increase Mr. Cox's twelve months' salary from \$20,166 to \$20,500 effective September 1, This will adjust his salary for the full \$500 increase allowed for Professors and Administrators in the 1964-65 budget (1963-64 rate was \$20,000). Source of funds for the change of status and the salary increase was the Departmental Salaries account. (RBC 27 and 34)
- 2. Increase the salary of L. D. Hawkew, Vice-Chancellor (Developmental Services) from \$22,667 to \$23,000 for twelve months, effective September 1, 1964. Dr. Haskew's twelve-month rate for 1963-64 was \$22,500. This will adjust his salary for the full \$500 increase allowed for professors and administrators in the 1964-65 budget. Source of funds for the increase was the Departmental Salaries account. (RBC 26)

Institutional Studies Office

Appoint E. Earl Jennings Director, Institutional Studies Office, effective September 1, 1964. Mr. Jennings will be budgeted in this office for 2/3 time September 1 through May 31, and full time June 1 through August 31, at a salary of \$9,234. He is also an Assistant Professor - Educational Psychology (Main University budget) for 1/3 time during the Long Session at a salary of \$2,766(academic rate: \$8,300), Mr. Jennings'total 12 months salary from Central Administration and Main University will be \$12,000. (RBC 16)

Office of the Comptroller

4. Appoint Robert Lee Anderson Assistant Comptroller at a salary of \$12,000 for twelve months effective September 1, 1964. Sources of funds for this appointment were the Comptroller's Office Salaries account (\$10,440) and the Central Administration Unallocated Account (\$1,560). (RBC 21)

University Development Board

5. Effective September 1, 1964, appoint Mrs. Sue C. James Administrative Secretary at a salary of \$4,584 for twelve months. Source of funds for this appointment was the Central Administration Unallocated Account. Mrs. James has been filling this position in the Development Board Office at the same salary rate since June 1, 1964. (RBC 7)

University News and Information Service

6. Create the position of Staff Writer, and appoint Wilbourn 1. McNutt to the position at a salary of \$8,000 for twelve months, effective September 1, 1964. Source of funds was the Central Administration Unallocated Account. Mr. McNutt's area of activity will involve primarily reporting on science programs in the University System. (RBC 18 and 19)

Auditing Oil and Gas Production

7. Create the position of Land and Title Clerk, Trainee, which was omitted by error from the 1964-65 Budget, and appoint Mrs. Susan W. Green to this position effective October 1, 1964 at a twelve months' rate of \$4,200. Source of funds: Available University Fund. (RBC 23 and 28)

University Lands - Geology

8. Change the title of Mr. James B. Zimmerman from Acting Geologist in Charge to Geologist in Charge, and increase his salary from \$10,500 to \$11,000 for twelve months, effective September 1, 1964. Source of funds for this increase is the Departmental Salaries account. (RBC 38)

TRUST AND SPECIAL FUNDS - GIFT, BEQUEST AND ESTATE MATTERS .--

MAIN UNIVERSITY - BEQUEST UNDER THE WILL OF HADLEY ALVA STILES FOR THE J.V. AND E.A. STILES FOUNDATION.--Mr. Harris A. Melasky, Independent Executor of the Estate of Hadley Alva Stiles, has now furnished the University another accounting report through July 20, 1964. The bequest of the residue estate was first reported to the Board of Regents at the July, 1961, meeting. To date, the University has received remittances of principal from the Estate in the total amount of \$239,500 and income collected by the Independent Executor in the amount of \$115,728.79. It appears final distribution to be made later will amount to \$30,000 to \$40,000. Rather than attempt any arrangement with the Board of Regents for indemnification against additional tax claims, Mr. Melasky expects to hold the remainder of the cash, most of which will be carried in interest bearing deposits, until all Federal tax returns have been checked or limitation has run. It appears the final distribution can be made in about another year.

Mr. Melasky's reports show Executor's commission, at 5% of receipts and disbursements, chargeable against the residue estate in the amount of \$58,227.96. About \$19,000 of this amount has not yet been charged against the Estate. The gross Estate amounted to about \$1,200,000, and the calculation of Executor's commission appears legally in order. The reports show a total of \$25,000 attorneys' fees paid to the firm of Melasky and Bullion. Mr. Melasky's interest in the firm is 50%. Taking into account the amount of the Executor's commission and legal questions as to payment of the attorneys' fees to the firm, it is recommended that the Board of Regents authorize the Endowment Office to notify Mr. Melasky that it approves the Executor's commission stated above, plus any additional commission legally chargeable between now and final closing, but that as to attorneys' fees, a charge of \$12,500 to Thomas M. Bullion should be substituted for the charge of \$25,000 in favor of Melasky and Bullion.

TRUST AND SPECIAL FUNDS - REAL ESTATE MATTERS .--

MAIN UNIVERSITY - MURRAY CASE SELLS ESTATE - REPORT FOR RATIFICATION OF EXECUTION OF INSTRUMENTS BY CHANCELLOR. -- The Board of Regents, on July 22, 1961, authorized the Chancellor to execute instruments from time to time on behalf of the University with respect to the mineral holdings of the Sells Estate with such actions to be reported for ratification by the Board.

1. Overriding Royalty of Fugene McElvaney et al., Trustees, Sells Leases No. 2309, Mary J. Urquhart, and No. 2805, Nathaniel Haggerty et ux., Urquhart Gas Unit, Woodlawn Field, Harrison County, Texas. This instrument, designed to reduce the overriding royalty of Eugene McElvaney et al., Trustees, covering the undeveloped non-producing prospective zones under the subject leases, was signed by Dr. Ransom on September 16, 1964.



2. Overriding Royalty of Eugene McElvaney et al., Trustees, Sells Leases No. 2601, Thelma Bristow et al., and No. 2602, Ford A. Yates et al., Garza Field, Garza County, Texas. This instrument affects the Trustees' overriding royalty interest in and under a 40-acre tract covered by the subject leases and was signed by Dr. Rapsom on October 2, 1964.

It is recommended that the signing of the instruments listed above by the Chancellor be ratified by the Board of Regents.

MAIN UNIVERSITY - ARCHER M. HUNTINGTON MUSEUM FUND - PROPOSED AMEND-MENT TO OIL, GAS, AND MINERAL LEASE TO SUN OIL COMPANY TO COVER ADDITIONAL ACREAGE. - At the February, 1964, meeting, the Board of Regents authorized an oil, gas, and mineral lease to Sun Oil Company on Huntington acreage in the S. C. Bundick League, Calveston County, for a primary term of 5 years, bonus of \$60 per acre, annual delay rental of \$10 per acre, and 1/6 royalty. The acreage to be covered was stated as approximately 362 in the recommendation to the Board but further calculation after clarification of the area Sun wished to have covered by the lease brought it to 467 acres. This lease is dated March 31, 1964.

In August, 1959, the Board of Regents authorized a lease to Pan American Petroleum Corporation covering 950 acres in the Bundick League for primary term of 5 years, bonus of 550 per acre, annual delay rental of \$10 per acre, and 1/6 royalty. The lease was dated September 29, 1959, and, after payment of 4 delay rentals on the entire acreage, expired under its terms on September 28, 1964. Pan American did no drilling. The upper part of the acreage covered by this lease adjoins the acreage leased to Sun Oil Company, and Sun now proposes that their lease be amended to cover approximately 220 acres of this adjoining land which was under the Pan American lease at the same bonus, rental, and royalty as carried in the lease already in effect. The primary term of the entire lease will thus expire on March 30, 1969, and full bonus and rentals will be paid for the additional acreage without pro-

It is recommended that the Board of Regents accept this proposal and authorize its Chairman to execute the amendment to the lease when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

TEXAS WESTERN COLLEGE - LUCILLE T. STEVENS ESTATE - PROPOSED LEASE
TO WALGREEN DRUG STORES OF PROPERTY AT MESA AND TEXAS IN EL PASO.—The principal part of a bequest of Mrs. Lucille T. Stevens of El Paso, who died in
1955, to Texas Western College for scholarship purposes is a commercial building on the northeast corner of the Mesa and Texas intersection in downtown
El Paso. The ground is 1/2 of Lot 24, Block 4, Mills Map Addition to the City
of El Paso, fronting 86-2/3 feet on North Mesa and 60 feet on Texas. The
building, constructed around 1909, with remodeling and renovation work from
time to time thereafter, has two stories and a basement. The property was
leased by Mrs. Stevens to Nathan Feder for 25 years from January 1, 1941, to
December 31, 1965, and was later sub-leased by Mr. Feder to Grayson-Robinson
Stores at gross rental of \$36,000 annually to Mr. Feder. Rental paid by the
Feder Estate to Texas Western College under the terms of the lease is \$15,000,
net rental, plus approximately \$2,100 due to tax provisions in the original
lease. Since the property passed to the College under the terms of the Will,
it has been exempt from ad valorem taxes.

The present sub-tenant is in bankruptcy proceedings. Though the Feder Estate as lessee is considered entirely responsible and has paid its rental to the College as agreed, it is expected that the current lease may be given up earlier than its expiration on December 31, 1965, if the Board of Regents has another tenant and is willing to release the Feder Estate. The property has been appraised by Mr. Ted Cottle of El Paso at a value of \$432,000. Other appraisals have given some lower values.

The Board of Regents authorized an exclusive listing for sale at \$432,000 or for lease on terms satisfactory to the Board to Mr. Ted Cottle for six months to expire October 31, 1964, and in September granted an extension of six months for this listing.

Mr. Cottle, after thorough investigation of prospects for sale or for lease, now has a firm proposal from Walgreen Drug Stores which he recommends. The proposal is substantially as follows, except for minor additions by the University staff, and it is recommended that the Board of Regents authorize a lease to Walgreen under the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Lease will be for a term of 30 years and 2 months with the right to cancel by tenant at the end of the first 10 years and 2 months and at the end of the 20th year and 2 months by giving one year's notice in advance.
- 2. Minimum guaranteed rental of \$26,000 annually plus a sum of money annually, necessary to amortize the cost of remodeling the building for Walgreen's use, on a 20-year amortization plan at 5% interest and to be paid on a constant basis monthly as rent, to be added to the minimum guarantee. The sum of these two figures is to be against 3% of sales, excluding cigarettes, to the minimum guarantee. (Minimum annual guarantee being \$26,000 plus the annual amortization sum and then 2-1/2% of sales, excluding cigarette sales, above the minimum.) Said minimum guaranteed rental to be paid monthly along with the amortization payment on the first of each month and any overage rent, if any, to be paid within 60 days after the end of the fiscal year, accompanied by certified statement signed by an officer of the Walgreen Drug Stores, setting out the gross sales for the year. It is understood that at the end of 20 years when the amortization of the improvements has been paid for, that the breaking point on which overage rent will be paid will drop down to \$866,667 annually and any sales in excess of this amount will be paid for at the rate of 2-1/2% of gross sales.
- 3. Landlord is to contribute in cash the amount of money necessary to remodel and modernize this property for Walgreen's use, but it is understood that in no event is the landlord to spend more than \$100,000 for such real estate improvements. Any cost over \$100,000 is to be paid in cash by Walgreen. It is also understood that this cost is to be amortized over a

20-year period at 5% interest and paid to the landlord by Walgreen on a constant basis monthly, as rent, to be added to the minimum guaranteed monthly rent. It is further understood that in the event the tenant cancels out the lease at the end of the 10th year, that they will pay off the entire remaining balance of said loan at that time, leaving the property clear of indebtedness.

- 4. All maintenance including plate glass, exterior and interior repairs, and modernization to be at the cost of the tenant except the roof, structural walls, and foundation, which will be taken care of by the landlord.
- 5. The tenant is to pay for all utilities and all personal property taxes on merchandise, fixtures and equipment.
- 6. The premises are to be used as a retail drug store for the sale of all merchandise customarily sold in a Walgreen Drug Store.
- 7. Landlord is to be responsible for all ad valorem taxes on the land and building up to the amount of taxes for the 9th year of the lease, or in the event the property is exempt from ad valorem taxes during that year, the amount of such taxes that would be assessable against the property at tax and assessment rates in effect during that 9th year. Tenant will be responsible for all such taxes in excess of those for the 9th year but will have the right to recoup any such payment for taxes out of sales overages, according to percentages set out above for that particular year. The right to recoup is not cumulative and each year must stand on its own.
- 8. Possession is to be given Walgreen at any time on 60 days' prior notice from March 1, 1965, to not later than February 1, 1966, and tenant will be given the first 2 months of possession rent free while the property is being modernized, but rent is to start on the third month of possession.
- 9. Commission at 5% of rentals collected throughout the entire term of the lease will be paid by landlord to J. Ted Cottle of El Paso, payments to be within 15 days after receipts of rental by landlord.

It is recommended that the Board of Regents authorize execution of the proposed lease instrument, or instruments, by its Chairman when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer. It is further recommended that the funds for remodeling and modernization to be provided by the landlord come from Current Restricted Income funds of the Frank B. Cotton Trust at Texas Western College, which funds now total in excess of \$100,000, with authorization for sale of U.S. Treasury securities held as temporary investments for these funds to the extent necessary. Reimbursement to the Cotton Trust will be in monthly installments, plus the 5% interest to be paid by Walgreen. This arrangement is necessary due to the fact that the Stevens Estate has no cash or securities, other than current rental income used for scholarships.

MAIN UNIVERSITY - HOGG FOUNDATION: WILL C. HOGG MEMORIAL FUND - PROPOSED OIL AND GAS LEASE TO E.M. SMITH ON TRACTS IN JAMES STRANGE SURVEY, HARRIS COUNTY.--As Trustee of Hogg Foundation: Will C. Hogg Memorial Fund, the Board of Regents owns an undivided mineral interest in various lots in the James Strange Survey, Harris County. The Thomas E. Hogg Estate's interest, with the Trustee owning the remainder subject to the life interest of Mrs. Margaret Wells Hogg, ranges from 81/3456 in some lots down to 81/10,368 in others, and the interest of the Trustee from the Will C. Hogg Estate ranges from 108/3456 down to 108/10,368. An oil and gas lease to E. M. Smith with a primary term of 120 days from date of last acknowledgment is being circulated among the many owners. The lease provides for a well to be drilled to 1,300 feet or to salt. There is no cash bonus. Royalty is 1/6. The lots covered

by the lease amount to 13.50 acres in the Hargrave Subdivision and 16.96 acres in the J. R. West Subdivision. It is understood that Mrs. Alice Hanszen, Mrs. Margaret Hogg, Miss Ima Hogg, and all other owners expect to execute the lease. These lots are near the top of the Humble Salt Dome and had some production many years ago. It is recommended that the Board of Regents accept the proposal and authorize the execution of the lease by its Chairman when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

MAIN UNIVERSITY - HOGG FOUNDATION: WILL C. HOGG MEMORIAL FUND - RELEASE OF CERTAIN PRESCRIBED MINERAL AND ROYALTY INTERESTS IN THE STATE OF LOUISIANA.--Mr. Wm. B. Ferguson, Houston attorney, has been engaged in the preparation of releases, on behalf of several clients including Mrs. Alice Nicholson Hanszen, Mrs. Margaret Wells Hogg, and members of the Picton family, covering mineral and/or royalty interests that have expired under Louisiana law. These instruments are being prepared for joinder by the Board of Regents as Trustee of the Hogg Foundation: Will C. Hogg Memorial Fund as to its interests from the Estate of Will C. Hogg and, where appropriate, to show the Trustee's consent as remainderman under the Will of Thomas E. Hogg to the release of such prescribed interests by Mrs. Margaret Wells Hogg, usufructuary as to such Louisiana interests under the Will of Thos. E. Hogg. It is proposed that the various parties joining in these releases share in proportion to their ownership the fee for Mr. Ferguson's services, recording fees, and miscellaneous costs such as reproduction of the instruments.

All of these prescribed interests, which are in the Charenton Field area of St. Mary Parish, come under provisions of the Louisiana statutes which extinguish the title to such interests where there has not been either drilling or production for a period of 10 years. There are other Hogg interests in the Charenton Field which have not extinguished. The principal reason for executing the releases is to avoid the effect of the Louisiana statute which sets out the right of the landowner to sue to clear out such prescribed interests and recover attorney fees, costs, and any damages that can be shown.

The releases for execution by the Trustee as set out above cover parts of the following tracts in St. Mary Parish: (1) A. Veeder Company, Inc., Mineral Property Tracts, (2) Mrs. Anna Veeder et al Mineral Property Tract, (3) Geo. T. Veeder Mineral Property Tract, (4) Mrs. Euranie Alleman Boudreaux Mineral Property Tracts, and (5) Laws Realty Company, Inc., Royalty Property Tract.

It is recommended that the Board of Regents authorize its Chairman to execute these releases when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Houston, October 23 and 24, 1964:

RESEARCH CONTRACTS: The following contracts and amendments have been negotiated by the Office of Government Sponsored Research and have been signed by the Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs upon the recommendation of the appropriate Technical Director, the Director of the Office of Government Sponsored Research, and the Business Manager. I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

- 1. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 19(628)-1679, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Electronic Systems Division, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, incorporates into the contract a provisional overhead rate of 36.5% of salaries and wages. The investigation of radiation at 8.6 mm and 3.2 mm wavelength from the region of the galactic center with the 16-foot diameter parabolic antenna and attempt to isolate thermal and non-thermal radiation continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A.W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 2. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 19(628)-2475, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Electronic Systems Division, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, incorporates into the contract a provisional overhead rate of 36.5% of salaries and wages. The research directed toward the development of techniques of investigating thermal behavior of the lower atmosphere was conducted in the Electrical Engineering Research Laborator, under the direction of Dr. A.W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 3. Modification No. 1, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 19(628)-4046, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Electronics Systems Division, Laurence C. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, incorporates into the contract a provisional overhead rate of 36.5% of salaries and wages. The electromagnetic investigations in the .OOL cps to 5 cps region continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A.W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 4. Blanket Supplemental Agreement dated 19 June 1964, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Research and Technology Division, Systems Engineering Group, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, Incorporates the current fixed and/or provisional overhead rates into the following Air Force research contracts:

Modification No. 10 to Contract AF 33(616)-5164, establishes a fixed overhead rate of 20% of salaries and wages for the period 1 September 1960 through 15 July 1961. The research was conducted in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. C.P. Boner, Professor of Physics.

4. Blanket Supplemental Agreement dated 19 June 1964, (continued)

Modification No. 7 to Contract AF 33(616)-5832, establishes a fixed overhead rate of 37.4% of salaries and wages for the period 1 September 1961 through 15 November 1961. The research on relativity and gravitational theories was conducted under the direction of Dr. Alfred Schild, Ashbel Smith Professor of Physics.

4. Blanket Supplemental Agreement dated 19 June 1964, (continued)

Modification No. 8 to Contract AF 33(600)-37590, establishes a fixed overhead rate of 20% of salaries and wages for the period 1 September 1960 through 1 November 1961. The research was conducted in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. C.P. Boner, Professor of Physics.

Modification No. 10 to Contract AF 33(600)-42316, established a fixed overhead rate of 36.5% of salaries and wages for the period 1 September 1960 through 31 August 1962 and a provisional overhead rate of 36.5% of salaries and wages beginning 1 September 1962. The fabrication of Phantom Target Tester was conducted in the Military Physics Research Laboratory under the direction of A.E. Lockenvitz, Professor of Physics.

This decrease in the contract sum is due to a recent overhead rate reduction under the contract. - 19. Amendment No. 2 to Contract Nonr-375(16), by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D.C., extends the period of the contract through January 31, 1965. The research entitled "Drag Forces in Velocity Gradient Fields" continues under the direction of Dr. Frank D. Masch, Associate Professor of Civil Engineering.
- 20. 

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council. I recommend approval:

The Faculty Council on September 9, 1964, approved by the circularization procedure the catalogue changes on page 23 of the College of Fine Arts (D&P 3389 and 3390), changing Plan II, for Students Majoring in Art Education, so as to have Plan IIA, for Students Majoring in Art Education: Secondary Certification; and Plan IIB, for Students Majoring in Art Education: All-Level Certification in order to make the programs comply with the requirements set out by the Texas Education Agency for teaching programs in public schools. Plan IIA differs little from the former Plan II, keeping the same total number of semester hours, namely, 126, to complete the four-year curriculum. Plan IIB the All-Level Certification requires a total of 132 semester hours.
- 2. The Faculty Council at its meeting on September 21, 1964, approved the delegation of authority of the faculty to certify degree candidates during the period October 1, 1964, to September 30, 1965, to the respective deans.
- THE E. M. BOYD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: When the E. M. Boyd Memorial Scholarship Fund was established at the University (reported on M-26, item 5 of the docket prepared for the December 1960 meeting) preference in choosing recipients was to be given to male students in the fields of mathematics, astronomy, or philosophy. Mrs. Boyd now wishes to remove the restriction on academic fields and have the awards made to male students in any academic field who merit the scholarships on the bases of scholastic record and financial need. This is reported for information and ratification.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

I recommend leave of absence for the following faculty member:

Leonard Cardenas, Jr., Assistant Professor in the Department of Government, for the period beginning September 1, 1964 and extending through May 31, 1965. He has been awarded a Fulbright Grant to do research in Bolivia.

PURCHASE OF AIR-CONDITIONING EQUIPMENT

Since it is the policy of the Board of Regents that expenditures for new or additional air-conditioning equipment must be approved in advance by the Board or the Chancellor and since you have approved the following purchase, it is reported here for information:

Four 10,000 c.f.m. evaporative coolers to be installed in Benedict Hall and Worrell Hall. The coolers will cost approximately \$2,000.00 including installation and the source of funds will be Auxiliary Enterprises Funds - Dormitories and Dining Room.
