Wilma Menaces Mexico

Powerful storm takes aim at Yucatan with Fla. next in line

CANCUN, MEXICO | Tourists packed Cancun's airport and shuttled from luxury hotels to spartan emergency shelters Thursday, desperately trying to escape Hurricane Wilma as its outer bands battered the resort's whitesand beaches.

Wilma, a Category 4 storm with winds of 150 mph, churned toward the Yucatan peninsula and south Florida after its outer bands hit Haiti and Jamaica, where it killed at least 13 people. The storm was expected to strike Cancun and its surrounding resorts and sideswipe Cuba early Friday.

Forecasters said Wilma likely would make a sharp right turn toward Florida after getting caught in the westerlies, the strong wind current that generally blows toward the east. It is expected to make landfall in Florida,

WASHINGTON | Congress voted Thursday to sweep away the ability of gun crime victims to sue firearms manufacturers and dealers for damages, answering complaints by President Bush and the gun industry that big jury awards could lead to bankruptcy.

Opponents called the 283-144 vote in the House proof of the gun lobby's power over the Republican-controlled Congress, but Bush said he looked forward to signing the bill.

"Our laws should punish criminals who use guns to commit crimes, not law-abiding manufacturers of lawful products," the president said.

When Bush signs the measure into law, a half-dozen pending lawsuits filed by cities and counties against the gun industry would be dismissed.

"This is a get-out-of-liability-free card," said John Russo, city attorney for Oakland, one of 11 cities and counties in California whose suits against the industry would be dismissed. (AP)

The Coast Guard resumed searching for two missing children, aged 6 and 16 months, Thursday, a day after their mother allegedly threw them into San Francisco Bay. The body of a third sibling, a 3-yearold, was recovered. The mother, Lashaun Harris, 23, of Oakland, was booked on three counts of murder, the San Francisco Chronicle reported Thursday. Official: FEMA Ignored Warnings

Agency told of Katrina's effects, operative says

WASHINGTON | In the midst of the chaos that followed Hurricane Katrina, a Federal Emergency Management Agency official in New Orleans sent a dire e-mail to Director Michael Brown saying victims had no food and were dying.

No response came from Brown. Instead, less than three hours later, an aide to Brown sent an e-mail saying her boss wanted to go on a television program that night — and needed at least an hour to eat dinner at a Baton Rouge, La., restaurant.

The e-mails were made public Thursday at a Senate Homeland Security Committee hearing featuring Marty Bahamonde, the first agency official to arrive in New Orleans in advance of the Aug. 29 storm. The hurricane killed more than 1,200 people and forced hundreds of thousands to evacuate.

Bahamonde said the correspondence illustrates the government's failure to grasp what was happening. "There was a systematic failure at all levels of government to understand the magnitude of the situation," Bahamonde testified. "The leadership from top down in our agency is unprepared and out of touch."

The 19 pages of internal FEMA e-mails show Bahamonde gave regular updates to people in contact with Brown as early as Aug. 28, the day before Katrina made landfall. They appear to contradict Brown, who has said he was not fully aware of the conditions until days after the storm hit. Brown quit after being recalled from New Orleans.

On Aug. 31, Bahamonde e-mailed Brown to tell him that thousands were gathering in the streets with no food or water and that "estimates are many will die within hours."

A short time later, Brown's press secretary, Sharon Worthy, wrote colleagues to complain that Brown needed more time to eat dinner. "We now have traffic to encounter to go to and from a location of his choise (sic), followed by wait service from the restaurant staff, eating, etc.," she wrote. HOPE YEN (AP)

DeLay Booked in Texas, Released on \$10K Bond

HOUSTON | Rep. Tom DeLay turned himself in Thursday at the sheriff's office and was fingerprinted, photographed and released on \$10,000 bail on conspiracy and money-laundering charges.

Accompanied by his attorney, Dick DeGuerin, the former House majority leader showed up about midday, appeared before a judge and was gone in less than 30 minutes, sheriff's Lt. John Martin said.

"Now Ronnie Earle has the mugshot he wanted," DeGuerin said, referring to the Travis County district attorney who brought the charges. DeLay and his lawyer have accused the district attorney of trying to make headlines for himself.



Tough Times in Leak Case

White House defense crumbles as aides reveal internal talks

WASHINGTON | The evidence prosecutors have assembled in the CIA leak case suggests Vice President Dick Cheney's chief of staff sought out reporters in the weeks before an undercover operative's identity was compromised in the news media, casting doubt on one of the White House's main lines of defense.

For months, the White House and its supporters have argued presidential aides did not knowingly expose Valerie Plame, the wife of Bush critic Joseph Wilson, as a CIA operative.

At most, the aides passed on information about her that entered the White House from reporters, the supporters argued.

Special Counsel Patrick Fitzgerald now knows that Cheney aide I. Lewis "Scooter" Libby met three times with a New York Times reporter before the leak of Plame's identity, initiated a call to NBC's Tim Russert and was a confirming source about Wilson's wife for a Time magazine reporter.


And in a new twist, presidential political adviser Karl Rove has testified that it's possible Libby was his source before Rove talked to two reporters about the CIA operative. While Libby maintains that he

didn't know Plame's name until it



was published in the news media. the now-public evidence suggests Libby at least was aware that Wilson's wife worked at the CIA and that he spread the information.

Diabetes Pill Might Be Harmful

Medicine could double risk of heart attack, stroke, study says

CHICAGO | A new diabetes pill that was headed for government approval has been linked to deaths, heart attacks and strokes, a medical journal reported Thursday.

The study by leading heart researchers found twice as many deaths and cardiovascular problems in diabetic adults taking the drug Pargluva as those on dummy pills or a competing drug. It was posted on the Web site of the Journal of the American Medical Association.

Developed by Bristol-Myers Squibb and Merck & Co., the drug, known generically as muraglitazar, was endorsed by a Food and Drug Administration panel last month. It is a treatment for Type 2 diabetes, the most common form of the condition and one that occurs most often in people who are overweight. If the analysis is correct, the drug could have meant a "public health catastrophe" since 18 million Americans have diabetes, said Dr. Steven Nissen, who worked on the analysis. (AP)





Report Ties Syria to Hariri's Death

U.N. probe also links Lebanese officials to February assassination

UNITED NATIONS | A U.N. investigation concluded that high-ranking Syrian and Lebanese security officials were involved in the assassination of former Lebanese Prime Minister Rafik Hariri, according to a report released Thursday.

The strongly worded report by chief investigator Detlev Mehlis said the two nations' intelligence services kept tabs on Hariri before his assassination by wiretapping his phone, and there was evidence a telecommunications antenna was jammed

near the scene of the car bomb that killed him and 20 others on Feb. 14. The decision

to assassinate Hariri "could Hariri

not have been discount the approval of topranked Syrian security official and could not have been further organized without the collusion of their counterparts in the Lebanese security services," the report said.

Mehlis' 53-page report accused Syrian authorities of trying to mislead his investigation, and directly accused Foreign Minister Farouk al-Sharaa of lying in a letter sent to his commission.

The commission said Syria "has impeded the investigation and made it difficult to follow leads established by the evidence collected from a variety of sources."

Top Aid Official Urges More Help For Quake Victims

MUZAFFARABAD, PAKISTAN | A top U.N. official on Thursday urged the world to step up efforts to reach more than 3 million people left homeless by the South Asian earthquake, while the deaths of three survivors from tetanus reinforced fears that disease and infected injuries will drive the death toll of 79,000 far higher.

In Geneva, Jan Egeland, the U.N. relief coordinator, said he was appealing to NATO and other potential donors to step in with "a second Berlin air bridge" of helicopters flying in relief supplies and evacuating perhaps hundreds of thousands of people.

"The world is not doing enough," Egeland said. "We should be able to do this."

He said he could foresee flights reminiscent of the U.S. and British airlift of supplies to West Berlin in the late 1940s when Soviet forces cut the city off from the West. (AP)

Cancun Braces for Hit From Wilma

CANCUN, MEXICO | Hundreds of schools in Mexico's Yucatan peninsula were ordered closed Thursday and Friday — many of them turned into shelters — and airlines started canceling flights as Hurricane Wilma closed in on the region.

At 5 p.m. EDT, the storm's wobbly center was roughly 135 miles southeast of Cozumel, a popular vacation island, the hurricane center said. Its forecast track would carry it directly to Cancun, a city of some 500,000 people by early Friday.

At the Cancun airport, hun-

dreds of tourists waited for flights or sought rental cars, taxis or ATMs.

Matt Williams and Jeff Davidson of Westfield, N.J., were going back to their hotel in Playa del Carmen south of Cancun after their flight to Fort Lauderdale, Fla. was canceled. At the hotel, they faced a night in a ballroom-turned-emergency shelter.

"You see the lines. I don't want to stand there for two hours and then decide what to do," said Williams, 26. Increasingly high winds bent palm trees and strong waves pounded Cancun's beaches. Mayor Francisco Antonio Alor said 20,000 tourists remained in the city Thursday, down from 35,000 the day before.

In Cuba, whose tip is 130 miles east of Cancun, civil defense officials said 220,000 people were evacuated by midday.

An additional 14,500 students at boarding schools outside Havana were sent home until after the storm. WILL WEISSERT (AP)

Afghan Outcry on Desecration

Backlash feared over allegations GIs burned 2 dead Taliban fighters

KABUL, AFGHANISTAN | Islamic clerics expressed outrage Thursday at television footage that purportedly shows U.S. soldiers burning the bodies of two dead Taliban fighters to taunt other militants and warned of a possible violent anti-American backlash.

President Hamid Karzai condemned the alleged desecration and ordered an inquiry. The operational commander of the U.S. military in Afghanistan, which launched its own criminal probe, said the alleged act, if true, was "repugnant."

Cremating bodies is banned under Islam, and one Muslim leader in Afghanistan compared the video to photographs of U.S. troops abusing prisoners at Iraq's Abu Ghraib prison.

"Abu Ghraib ruined the reputation of the Americans in Iraq and to me this is even worse," said Faiz Mohammed, a top cleric in northern Kunduz province.

Australia's SBS television broadcast the video purportedly showing soldiers burning the bodies of two suspected Taliban fighters in hills outside Gonbaz village in the southern Shah Wali Kot district an area plagued by Taliban activity and considered too dangerous to venture into unless accompanied by U.S. troops. Rocket Hits School in Iraq

Attacks kill at least 15; witness in Saddam's trial to testify Sunday

BAGHDAD, IRAQ | Violence in and around Baghdad Thursday killed at least 15 Iraqi civilians and police. In one attack, a rocket hit a public school in Baghdad for students aged 12-15, killing a student and a nearby shopkeeper and wounding five students.

Also Thursday, the U.S. military announced the deaths of five service members, including three who were killed Wednesday by a roadside bomb near the town of Balad, north of Baghdad, and one on the same day by a suicide car bomb near the Syrian border. A fifth soldier died from a non-hostile gunshot, the military said.

Iraqi Interior Minister Bayan Jabr claimed a major break in the fight against Iraq's Sunni-led insurgency with the arrest of one of Saddam Hussein's nephews in Tikrit on Wednesday, the day the ousted dictator's trial opened. Officials said Thursday that a key prosecution witness in Saddam's trial will testify at an unexpected session Sunday because the former intelligence official is seriously ill with cancer.

The trial suffered its first setback when a lawyer for one of Saddam's co-defendants in the mass-murder trial was kidnapped from his Baghdad office late Thursday. Police said Saadoun Sughaiyer al-Janabi was snatched by 10 masked gunmen.

Meanwhile, a journalist for a British newspaper who was kidnapped was released unharmed Thursday after a day in captivity, the publication said. (AP)

Ford Plans Plant Closings, Layoffs

DEARBORN, MICH. | Ford Motor Co., its profits dragged down by poor performance in North America, will announce "significant" U.S. plant closings and layoffs in January another heavy blow to the nation's autoworkers. The company reported a third-quarter loss of \$284 million on Thursday.

Ford and other U.S. automakers have been hurt by competition from Asia, slumping sales of gasguzzling sport utility vehicles, high health care and materials costs and bloated plant capacity.

Ford Chairman and CEO Bill Ford said he will complete the restructuring plan in December and announce it in January. He said the plan was painful but essential and would affect salaried workers and hourly workers represented by the United Auto Workers.

The nation's second biggest automaker lost 15 cents per share for the quarter ending Sept. 30.

Bill Ford said the Dearbornbased company needs to align its plant capacity with its shrinking U.S. market share, which was at 17.7 percent in the first nine months of 2005 compared to 18.4 percent in 2004. He wouldn't say how many plants need to close, but he said the company will keep enough capacity to meet its future sales goals.





The Ethics of Truth

Truman Capote's pen was a weapon of mass description

FILM | The day, in 1959, after a pair of drifters broke into the home of the Clutter family in Holcomb, Kan., and shot all four of its members after failing to find the \$10,000 they believed to be stashed there, Truman Capote clipped an item about the murders in The New York Times and called William Shawn at the New Yorker.

That night, the flamboyant author of "Breakfast at Tiffany's" andpopularman-about-Manhattan boarded a train to Kansas with his childhood friend Nelle Harper Lee with the intention of writing a magazine piece on how the murders had affected the quiet farming community. Six years later, he published "In Cold Blood," a "nonfiction novel" that made him the most famous writer in America and ruined his life.

Bennett Miller's "Capote," written by Dan Futterman and starring

Philip Seymour Hoffman, carefully re-creates the agonizing stretch of years between Capote's first trip to Holcomb and the spectacular

success of his book. Arriving on the heels of the execution by hanging of Richard Hickock and Perry Smith, the book was hailed for its objectivity and steady-handed sangfroid. But Capote's own experience of the story was harrowing and deeply personal. What began as an investigation of "two Americas" - one quiet and conservative, the other rootless and violent – evolved into a chillingly intimate portrait of the killers, in whose lives the writer would eventually play a not-insignificant role.


Miller and Futterman refuse to mythologize the artist, plunging instead into the soul of the man, reconstructing a world as gorgeously stark, clear and straightforward as that of the book.

In the film's view, Capote's fluid, adaptive morality pegs him as a pioneer and harbinger for the cult of success-at-any-cost that would soon become the norm in America.

Hoffman's nuanced, insightful portrait of Capote is as empathetic as it is brutally honest. He captures an astonishing capacity for insinuation and connects it to a deep understanding of the basic human need for connection. Carina Chocano (LOS ANGELES TIMES)

A lousy adaptation spells 'Doom' for video-game movies

FILM | "Doom," the latest videogame-turned-action-movie, sticks to the essentials of the source material, Marines blowing away zombies and mutant monsters on Mars. And it doesn't bring much more to it.

Director Andrzej Bartkowiak keeps the lighting low and the action a blur, and he apparently never saw

No one really behaves as broadly as these 'Kids in America'

FILM | A well-intentioned attempt to make fun of joyless, sanctimonious authority figures that stifle creativity in public schools, "Kids in America" ends up trivializing the subject through cutesiness and villains too farcical to believe in.

This low-budget comedy has the youthful earnestness of a student film, yet its lack of polish and real wit makes it not much more interesting than the sort of teen audiovisual club projects it spoofs. Director Josh Stolberg co-wrote the script with producer Andrew Shaifer, who also co-stars as a toadying, pretentious drama teacher. Stolberg and Shaifer create a parade of teen types and imbue them with energy and irreverence, yet few teens will see themselves reflected in these grinning crusaders.

Leading the cast is young rebel Holden Donovan, who teams with classmates in his audiovisual club in a student rebellion after school Principal Weller (Julie Bowen) goes on a rampage of suspensions.

An abstinence advocate is kicked out of school for covering

her clothes in condoms to promote safe sex. Another teen gets the boot for writing poetry with violent images in her private journal. Holden himself is banished for a performance art piece in which he fakes a suicide attempt.

Speaking Up For Heroism

In 'North Country,' one woman takes down her harassers

FILM | "North Country," the new film from "Whale Rider" director Niki Caro, about one woman who fought the horrors of sexual harassment at a northern Minnesota iron mine by filing an unprecedented classaction lawsuit, feels like a glorified TV movie, with its topical subject matter, emotional turnarounds and corny courtroom ending.

What elevates the film are the performances – especially from Charlize Theron, powerfully reserved but still radiant. Frances McDormand has a no-nonsense likability as the friend who encourages her to take a job at the mine, Sissy Spacek is quietly moving as Theron's mother, and Thomas Curtis has some wrenching moments as her unsympathetic teenage son.

But for a movie about sexual harassment — which can be a gray area in terms of interpretation - nearly everyone and everything about "North Country" is painted in black and white.

Inspired by a true story, the film stars Theron as Josey Aimes, a single mother of two who returns to her hometown after leaving her abusive husband and applies for a job at the local mine at the urging of her friend Glory (McDormand).

Glory warns Josey that the work can be tough and the treatment from male colleagues can be tougher. A sex toy hidden in a young woman's lunch box eventually gives way to unwanted physical contact in dark corners and dirty words smeared in feces on the walls of the women's locker room.

Josey's lawyer (Woody Harrelson) turns her down when she first comes to him with the idea of filing a class-action lawsuit against the mine, but eventually changes his mind - only because it had never been done before.

At least his inclination is honest, which can't be said for everyone else's behavior as the film draws to a maudlin close. CHRISTY LEMIRE (AP)

THE ARISTOCRATS (Unrated, 87 minutes) The joke whose punch line lends this documentary its title isn't especially funny. Filthy, yes, but not a laugh riot, except in the way its structure lends itselfto extended riffs of jazz-like improvisation on the part of the 100 or so comedians who line up to tell it. What makes us laugh is the joke's sheer excess. Far more fascinating, however, than its many tellings and retellings, is the footage of comics talking about the joke, which has been a staple of backstage banter between comedians since vaudeville. (MO)

CHARLIE AND THE CHOCOLATE FACTORY (PG, 115 minutes) Johnny Depp's oddball eccentricity as Willy Wonka is an unsettling amalgam of Michael Jackson, Edward Scissorhands and Lisa Kudrow's Phoebe from "Friends." But there are other watchable delights: Wonka's factory is a wonderland of chocolate lakes and candy-grass banks. There are some hilarious routines performed by the diminutive Oompa Loompas. And Freddie Highmore is a charmer as Charlie, the poor kid who wins a ticket to

tour Wonka's factory. (DT)

THE CONSTANT GARDENER (R, 123 minutes) Vivid performances drive Brazilian director Fernando Meirelles' fine adaptation of the John Le Carre novel. Justin Quayle (Ralph Fiennes), a mild-mannered junior diplomat in Kenya, is shattered when his wife, Tessa (Rachel Weisz), is violently murdered on a "research trip" far up country. He learns quickly enough that Tessa had acquired a "reputation" in the tight world of British diplomacy. The movie chronicles Justin's growth as he begins to understand what sort of a woman he had married. The guick evocations of diplomatic life, corporate dealings and even the world of anonymous travel off-passport are splendidlv done. (sн)

DOMINO (R, 128 minutes) It seems the only true thing about this movie, which begins with the disclaimer that it is based on a true story... "sort of," is the name of its title character, the daughter of actor Laurence Harvey who embarked on a troubled girlhood and ended up as a bounty hunter. The film pivots around an illfated gig that Domino (Keira Knightley) is explaining to an FBI psychologist (Lucy Liu), entailing lots of doubling and tripling back in time. The effect is edgy, tough and sneakily seductive, as

Domino plies her trade, using whatever ittakes—assault weapons or lap dances — to get her man. There's a manic kind of pleasure in all this, but it turns out to be a tiresome trip. (AH)

ELIZABETHTOWN (PG-13, 123 minutes) Cameron Crowe's misfired romance features Orlando Bloom as recently fired shoe designer Drew Baylor and Kristen Dunst as life-affirmative flight attendant Claire, who meets him on the plane he has to take to Elizabethtown, Ky. (His father has just died there.) Drew is mopey and despondent and contemplating suicide. Claire gives him directions to Elizabethtown and to her big, homefried heart. There's not much specialness between Bloom and Dunst, other than the surface appeal of two attractive people making (or almost making) kissy face. Sweet delay before the inevitable coupling is a mainstay in every romance. but Crowe turns that delay into the waitina room from hell. (рт)

EVERYTHING IS ILLUMINATED (PG-13, 100 minutes) Liev Schreiber's directorial debut faithfully honors the trippy appeal of Jonathan Safran Foer's tale of a New Yorker's journey to Ukraine to "collect" objects or information about the shtetl where his grandfather lived before the Holocaust. As Foer's fictional rendering of himself, Elijah Wood is mostly flat. But just as the book was saved by the malapropped English narration of the faux-Foer's Odessan guide, the movie is more than illuminated by Eugene Hutz's comically endearing portrayal of Alexander Perchov — a nightclubbin' mack daddy wannabe. But when they find the land where the shtetl stood, Schreiber and his casttake the coincidental, emotional symmetry a notch too far. (HANK STUEVER)

FLIGHTPLAN (PG-13, 88 minutes) In Alfred Hitchcock's 1938 thriller, "The Lady Vanishes," the conveyance on which she disappeared was a train. In "Flightplan," a small child disappears on a jumbo jet, with all sorts of compartments, bays and hidey-holes for a little kid to crawl into, and the movie gives viewers the impression of being on that plane as Jodie Foster — playing the girl's desperate mother, who may or may not be mentally unhinged — tries to lead her fellow passengers in a search. Striking just the right balance between claustrophobia and terrifying emptiness, the young Germandirector Robert Schwentkeratchets up the tension with good taste and quiet, unfussy skill. It all falls apart with the Big Reveal. (AH)

THE FOG (PG-13, 100 Minutes) There may be more narrative explanation and higher-priced special effects in this remake of horrormeister John Carpenter's 1980 ghost story, but there are far fewer chills, plenty of dead spots and some genuinely bad acting. A peaceful and prosperous island community off the Oregon coast plans to honor its founding fathers with the unveiling of a statue. Not so fast, though. A boatload of vengeful 19th-century spirits rises from the sea and moves upon the place in a roiling, spectral, insidious fog that picks and chooses where it will seep, engulf and kill. Contains stabbings, drownings, people on fire, pierced by glass shards or just plain disintegrating. (JANE HORWITZ)

THE 40-YEAR-OLD VIRGIN (R, 111 minutes) Filthy, funny and sweet in equal measure, the feature directorial debut of writer-producer Judd Apatow is a Rob Schneider movie with the soul of a chick flick. That's not actually fair. While it's true that the comedy — revolving around the efforts of three friends (Paul Rudd, Romany Malco and Seth Rogen) to get their geeky nice-guy co-worker (Steve Carell) deflowered — has a lot of smutty humor, it's also pretty smart. In the end, the organ it's really all about exercising is the human heart. (MO)

G (R,96 minutes) This contrived exercise in vanity and product placement is being billed as a modern-day, hip-hop version of F. Scott Fitzgerald's novel "The Great Gatsby." Summer G (Richard T. Jones) is a hip-hop producer who has amassed a fortune and moved into a seaside mansion. True to Fitzgerald's original story, G has moved there to win the affection of a social climber who is the love of his life, a woman named Sky Hightower (Chenoa Maxwell), wife of snobby scion Chip (Blair Underwood). Things go wrong, really wrong —the plot is a shambles, the acting is atrocious and there is too much concern with getting certain brand labels in the shot. (AH)

GOOD NIGHT, AND GOOD LUCK (PG-13, 93 minutes) George Clooney, who directed and co-wrote, retells the story of crusading journalist Ed Murrow, who stood up to braying political bully Joe McCarthy. The stylizations of '50s TV drama, including black-and-white cinematography, are terrific. Clooney casts himself as Murrow's producer, Fred W. Friendly, but hardly registers. Neither do any of the other CBS minions, even though they're played by such names as Jeff Daniels, Robert Downey Jr. and Patricia Clarkson. Only two people register, David Strathairn as Murrow and Joe McCarthy as Joe McCarthy. Strathairn dominates the movie with furious intelligence, guts, will and nobility. (SH)





they're spirited away and pressed into the government army. If they return alive, they come back as hardened machines, their innocence lost. What makes the ordeal more acute for Chava (Carlos Padilla) is his natural empathy for the rebels, one of whom is his beloved uncle. Mandoki finds a satisfying blend of sentimentality and hard-core realism. (pt)

INTO THE BLUE (PG-13, 110 minutes) Never get between a shark and his coke stash. That's the lesson from the climactic scene of this waterlogged thriller, whose chief purpose otherwise seems to be allowing viewers to ogle some of Hollywood's tannest, buffest young things undulating sexily through the water. Paul Walker and Jessica Alba play two earnest, honest and hot treasure hunters living in the Bahamas who discover a downed plane stuffed with cocaine; Scott Caan and Ashley Scott play two sleazy, avaricious and hot friends who arrive on the scene and set a risky scheme in motion involving midnight dives and drugs and ruby-encrusted scabbards. (AH)

JUST LIKE HEAVEN (PG-13, 101 minutes) All that some filmgoers need to

know about this romance is that it features three shots of Mark Ruffalo getting out of the shower. Ruffalo has carved out a winning sideline as a scruffy, thoroughly charming romantic leading man, in this case the credible love interest for Reese Witherspoon. When David Abbott (Ruffalo) moves into a fantastic San Francisco apartment and is immediately told to move out by its former tenant — Elizabeth Martinson (Witherspoon), who three months earlier was hit headon by a truck — their banter crackles with tart, unforced verve. In a bummer of a bait-and-switch, though, the whimsical romance undergoes a fatal shift in tone. (AH)

LORD OF WAR (R, 122 minutes) Surfaceto-air missiles, Kalashnikov rifles, hand grenades, bullets: These are the phallic treasures of Andrew Niccol's schizophrenic movie that revels lasciviously in the sins of arms dealing before declaring such activity bad, bad, bad. The weaponry is the stock and trade of Yuri Orlov (Nicolas Cage), a Ukrainian emigre who sets himself up as an arms dealer and rises guickly to the top ranks of the international rogue circuit, trying to keep a step ahead of Interpol agent Jack Valentine (Ethan Hawke). Despite its jauntily satirical air, "Lord of War" is never better than dour and smug. (DT)

MIRRORMASK (Unrated, 101 minutes)

Helena (Stephanie Leonidas) is a reluctant supporting act for her circusperforming parents and dreams of living in "the real world," When her mother (Gina McKee) takes ill, Helena finds herself lost in an alternative dream world full of strange beings. Accompanied by a masked juggler named Valentine (Jason Barry). Helena learns she must find a "mirror mask" to save her mother, the good queen of this shadow world. The storyline is a monotonous spin-cycling of elements from "The Wizard of Oz," "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland" and other fairy tales in which an innocent girl faces up to an evil queen. (DT)

NAPOLEON DYNAMITE (PG, 86 minutes) In Jared Hess' deadpan-funny indie comedy, Napoleon Dynamite (Jon Heder) is a scrawny nerd from Preston, Idaho, whose eyes are lost behind the semi-opaque haze of his glasses and who packs some wicked comments for his tormentors. Jon Gries is hilariously out-there as Napoleon's incredibly narcissistic Uncle Rico. So is Aaron Ruell as his reclusive, thirtysomething brother, Kip.

THE PRIZE WINNER OF DEFIANCE, OHIO (PG-13, 90 minutes) In this movie, adapted from Terry Ryan's memoir of her mother, Julianne Moore is Evelyn, a woman of endless optimism who reared 10 children and supported an alcoholic and abusive husband by entering jingle-writing contests. As one of her kids observes in the film, were it not for the sexism of the era, Evelyn would have been running an ad agency or penning her own column for the Chicago Tribune. The film isn't very cinematic, but it has its own subversive power, as it elevates one family's struggle for working-class survival and valo-

PROOF (PG-13, 100 minutes) Director John Madden parks his camera in close as Gwyneth Paltrow fights madness and grief in this adaptation of David Auburn's Pulitzer Prize-winning play. Catherine (Paltrow) is the daughter of a legendary math professor who lost his mind (Anthony Hopkins). Does she have his gifts? Is she getting his disease? Is there proof? The story, adapted by Auburn and Rebecca Miller, retains the play's clever twists and entertaining, logic-driven dialogue. (NELSON PRESSLEY)

RED EYE (PG-13, 85 minutes) Filmmaker Wes Craven's airplane-set thriller about a traveler (Rachel McAdams) held hostage by a smooth-talking criminal (Cillian Murphy) is a taut and supple entertainment, especially when it has nowhere to go but inside the characters' heads. Although it doesn't exactly fall apart in the film's final reel, when the action leaves the plane's cabin for the larger world, it does lose some of the pressure-cooker intensity of the film's first hour. (MD)


ROLL BOUNCE (PG-13, 107 minutes) If you were a junior-higher back in the '70s and early '80s, then your idea of a hot Saturday night was hanging out at the local roller rink, and director Malcolm Lee captures that time, with the insulta-thons, the preening and posturing of polyester-clad lotharios and the angst of young love. And for the most part, he got the cast right. What Lee doesn't pull off is the story. (Tw)

SEPARATE LIES (R, 85 minutes) In this psycho-emotional thriller, three members of the English upper class behave terribly well when they find themselves in a spot of trouble involving adultery, manslaughter and obstruction of justice. Writerdirector Whedon has boiled off a lot of the complexity and introduced a new character, the ruthless Operative (Chiwetel Ejiofor), an agent for the Big-Brotherish federal government that runs Mal's galaxy. It's entertaining, especially because of Mal's colorful followers and Whedon's snappy, often poignant pen. (рт)

SKY HIGH (PG, 99 minutes) "Sky High" is a slight but sure-footed, live-action comic fantasy from Disney. Director Mike *Continued on page 24*

Mitchell deftly blends two genres — the high school romance and the specialeffects-laden superhero comic book adaptation — and manages to spoof yet salute both with a refreshing lack of pretension. (JANE HORWITZ)

TIM BURTON'S CORPSE BRIDE (PG, 76 minutes) Sure, she's cute, but she has aneye that pops out at inopportune moments, thanks to the talking maggot renting space in its socket. Not exactly marriage material, as Victor, voiced by Johnny Depp, discovers when he's dragged from the Land of the Living by the Corpse Bride (Helena Bonham Carter). Will true love with a living lass (Emily Watson) prevail over the Corpse Bride's determination? The movie is breathtaking viewing, shot in sumptuous shades of blacks, whites and grays; and wry with kitschy musical numbers. (TW) TWO FOR THE MONEY (R, 132 minutes) Al Pacino has played the dark mentor so many times, he ought to get a kingmaker's award. So when you see Pacino playing betting-firm capo Walter Abrams and

leading ex-football player Brandon Lang (Matthew McConaughey) into the greedy underworld of high-stakes sports gambling, well, you know to expect certain things. Sure, "Two for the Money" takes us to the dark side, but it does so with such a fat dose of equivocation. (pt) THE UNTOLD STORY OF EMMETT LOUIS TILL (Unrated, 70 minutes) In this documentary about the notorious killing in Mississippi in 1955, we see how a grieving mother created a landmark moment in American history. This is powerful material, but for a documentary that bills itself as "untold," director Kevin Beauchamp never makes clear what he's telling that is new. (NEELY TUCKER)

WAITING (R, 93 minutes) This teen grossout comedy is a puerile, pointless piece of work in which a group of young waiters and waitresses engages in a collective obsession with genitalia, bodily excretions, sexual put-downs and free-floating misanthropy. (AH)

WALLACE & GROMIT: THE CURSE OF THE WERE-RABBIT (G, 85 minutes) Directed by animators Nick Park and Steve Box, the feature film debut of Wallace and Gromit opens with the dotty English inventor and his quietly superior dog working at yet another ingenious business called Anti-Pesto, which humanely removes fourlegged creatures from their town's vegetable gardens. Things are just swell until one of Wallace's schemes goes awry, and the gardens are soon being vandalized by the King Kong of rabbits. Gromit, who might be the most expressive silent movie star since Buster Keaton, is pure magic. (АН)

THE WAR WITHIN (Unrated, 90 minutes) Toward the end of this unsettling film, a brown man with a Muslim name sits in a car, contemplating a bridge leading to a city where twin towers once pierced the sky. In a nasty bit of racial profiling, he's quickly arrested, but they've got nothing on him, so they let him go. The irony: Hassan, the man in the car, really is up to no good. Therein lies the power of this taut tale of terrorism and the fundamentalist ties that bind. Hassan didn't start out this way. The film teases out complex and uncomfortable questions about faith and the impact of American actions on the rest of the world. (Tw)

WEDDING CRASHERS (R, 119 minutes) Jeremy (Vince Vaughn) and John (Owen Wilson) are scoundrels who crash weddings so they can score with women, in this often-funny caper. But when they attend a big-time Washington wedding party for the daughter of Secretary of the Treasury William Cleary (Christopher Walken), things change: They each fall for one of the Cleary daughters (Isla Fisher and Rachel McAdams). Vaughn is definitely the best man in this wedding comedy. He's a cad and a half who can motormouth like a machine gun. (DT)

Fox vs. Watchdogs

Parents TV Council announces list of worst family viewing

SOUR 'TOONS | Four Fox network programs, led by the comedies "The War at Home," "Family Guy" and "American Dad," topped a parents group's annual listing of the worst prime-time shows for familv viewing.

The Parents Television Council rated two aspirational reality shows. ABC's "Extreme Makeover: Home Edition" and NBC's new "Three Wishes," as the best programs for family viewing.

The group's president, L. Brent Bozell, said he was alarmed that the three Fox Sunday-night comedies are being marketed as family friendly: "Families should not be deceived," he said. "The top three worst shows all contain crude and raunchy dialogue with sex-themed jokes and foul language. Even worse is the fact that Hollywood is peddling its filth to families with cartoons."

TV Watch, a lobbying organization started by the networks to oppose governmental regulation of television, objected to the list.

"It is far more constructive to encourage parents to decide what

their children watch on TV by using ratings or screening shows than to hurl insults at shows enjoyed by millions of Americans," TV Watch spokeswoman Kathy Roeder said.

The Fox drama "The O.C." was fourth on the PTC's list of worst prime-time shows for families. Add in "That '70s Show" and "Arrested Development," and the network that tries to be hip for young viewers makes up 60 percent of the list.

The group said it makes its determinations based on the amount of bad language and sexual and violent content, giving more weight to shows that appear earlier in the evening when children are likely to be awake, said Melissa Caldwell, its research director.

Fox's "American Idol," which returns in January, made the group's list of best family viewing experiences. Two new shows, CBS' "The Ghost Whisperer" and UPN's "Everybody Hates Chris," also made it.

Bozell said the group couldn't even come up with 10 prime-time shows it would recommend for family viewing. Its list stops at nine. (AP)





REDSKINS | Joe Gibbs returned to the NFL with an offensive playbook that appeared to contain just one deep passing play. That route cut off nine yards down the field and was about as exciting as it was successful.

An offseason perusal of the free agent market showed that neither John Riggins nor "The Hogs" were coming back to rescue the anti-Spurrier.

So Gibbs formulated the following plan: Take a seemingly-too-old quarterback and have him dodge pass rushers almost every play while heaving it up to a speedy new wideout the Jets didn't want anymore.

Some thought a lineup like that would chase Gibbs straight back to NASCAR. But few doubt him as the Redskins enter Sunday as heavy favorites against the San Francisco 49ers.

Sure, Washington's dropped its last two contests. No, the Redskins haven't scored more than 21 points in a game yet, and yes, they struggle in the red zone.

Still, this team is stretching defenses a little more each week.

"I think the way we're doing it now, we're shocking people," receiver Santana Moss said.

Moss is the biggest beneficiary of Gibbs' new (OK, late 1990s) offensive philosophy.

Knowing Gibbs' runfirst reputation, the receiv-

er didn't expect to be such a focal point of the offense. But five games in, he's on track for a career year, hauling in 33 passes for 631 yards and four touchdowns. That includes a pair of scores in Sunday's loss to Kansas City.

"We had four big plays in the game [against Kansas City]," Gibbs said. "That is something we have been putting a lot of emphasis on."

Those big plays came courtesy of the arm of recycled

quarterback Mark Brunell. The 12th-year signal caller looks like a completely different player than last season, and already has more 20-yard completions (12) than he did in the nine games he played last season.

He's hit Moss on screens. He's hit Moss on the fly. He's even finding other receivers like H-back Chris Cooley (23 catches, two TDs) in the

medium-range game. "There's great teamwork going on right now between Mark and the receivers," offensive tackle Jon Jansen said.

Make no mistake: Washington probably isn't going to put up 50 points on San Francisco this weekend. But early returns indicate they've figured out a way to compete on offense. ERIC BRANDNER







World in Their Hands

Strong pitching, lack of success are shared traits for Sox, Astros

WORLD SERIES | When Chicago last hosted the World Series back in 1959, there were just 16 teams, no divisions, no wild cards, no designated hitters — and no Houston Astros.

Windy City vs. Bayou City. Deep dish pizza vs. Texas barbecue.

They have one historic theme in common: decades of futility.

And one current trait that got them to where they are: deep starting pitching.

"I only saw the White Sox play three games. I don't know their team very well," Houston manager Phil Garner said after the Astros beat St. Louis 5-1 on Wednesday night to win the NL pennant.

"I'd just as soon not watch them any more, they look pretty good."

Chicago, which hasn't won the title since 1917, won the AL pennant Sunday against the Los Angeles

Angels and is coming off the best postseason performance by starting pitchers in nearly half a century, with Mark Buehrle, Jon Garland, Freddy Garcia and Jose Contreras throwing consecutive complete games against the Los Angeles Angels. Not since the 1956 New York Yankees strung together five straight had a team pitched four in a row in a postseason series.


Houston, making its first World Series appearance in its 45-year history, became the first team since the 1914 Boston Braves to win a pennant after falling 15 games under .500 during the regular season. The Astros have seven-time Cy Young Award winner Roger Clemens, Andy Pettitte, Roy Oswalt and Brandon Backe.

"Yeah, they obviously have a tremendous pitching staff," Houston closer Brad Lidge said of the White Sox. "Just watching their games on TV, it's amazing that their starters have been able to do what they have done and they seem it get stronger at the end of games."

Chicago is likely to use its bullpen more in the Series. And Houston's bullpen is among baseball's best. "Lidge is probably one of the nastiest pitchers in baseball," Buehrle said.



HEALTH | Four times in his career, Joe Montana uttered the five words every young quarterback dreams of: "I'm going to Disney World!" Now, the 49-year-old Hall of Famer has a different five-word exclamation he's sharing with the world, "Get your blood pressure checked."

Montana was diagnosed in 2002 with high blood pressure and with the aid of medication and some minor lifestyle changes, he successfully lowered it. It afflicts more than 65 million Americans and is referred to as the silent killer because it has few, if any, symptoms.

The words pressure and Montana always went together but never in this fashion. This was the man who was so cool under pressure that he was able to point out comedian John Candy sitting in the stands in the waning minutes of Super Bowl XXIII.

"I didn't think that I would ever have high blood pressure,"

said Montana, in D.C. this week. "I just thought being an athlete, working out, doing the right things, it wouldn't affect me."

Montana is now teaming with his cardiologist, Dr. James Rippe, to travel the country spreading the word about high blood pressure.

Like many with the condition, Montana lowered his blood pressure with medication, increasing his physical activity and, to his chagrin, eaing less salty foods. "I love salt, especially chips," he said. "But my family has been a big key to this. They'll move the salt shakers to the other side of the table or my son will take the cheeseburger away from me and eat it himself." ERIC B. KAY





Stigma and ridicule are part of the ugly side of plastic surgery

Once a secret pursuit of the rich and famous, plastic surgery not only has hit Main Street, but in the last few years there's been a steady uptick in nip-tucks. Nearly 11.9 million surgical and non-surgical cosmetic procedures were performed in the United States last year, according to the American Society for Aesthetic Plastic Surgery. This represents a 44 percent increase over 2003, and a whopping 465 percent increase since 1997.

While patients are typically overjoyed by their new appearance, these statistics don't reveal that they're also sometimes saddened by judgmental responses from families and friends. Reports of jealousy, strained relations and even breakups are not uncommon.

Beauty, it seems, can create beasts.

"There is still a stigma, a lingering Calvinist ethic that says 'you don't change what God gave you," said Elisabeth Reed, a 59-yearCHANGE OF FACE: A nip here, a tuck there. eral were emphatically not. Dr. Patrick J. Byrne, director of the Division of Facial, Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery in the Johns Hopkins Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, is well aware of this phenomenon.

"When facial changes occur,

then, it's only to be expected there will be psychological adjustments," he said.

In their initial consultations, patients tend to focus exclusively on the physical pain involved in the procedures. It is the doctor who usually raises questions of emotional pain, or how surgery may affect interpersonal relationships.

"I feel sometimes like I am half-psychiatrist, half-surgeon,"

said Dr. Randolph Capone of the Facial Plastic Surgicenter in Pikesville, Md.

Capone says his first concern is assessing a patient's narcissism to discern if the patient has sufficient ego strength to weather criticism he or she may receive as a result of a cosmetic procedure.

Those getting liposuction, for example, are sometimes accused of taking the easy way out, rather than losing weight through diet and exercise.

But "when you feel better about yourself, you will feel better about everyone around you," said Dr. Robert Weiss of the Maryland Laser, Skin & Vein Institute in Hunt Valley, Md. 

There's more to know about couscous than what the box says

Couscous is one of the world's most extraordinary foods, more delicate than any gnocchi, light as a snowdrift.

It's also terribly misunderstood


More than just the stuff that comes out of a box, couscous is a whole world of wonderful dishes: sublime stews spooned over the ethereal granules. They can be as luscious as "pappardelle" with rabbit "ragu" or as carefully harmonic as a great pesto. But they also have exotic allure. It might be long-simmered lamb and pumpkin with ginger and saffron, or "loup de

mer" with guince, or perhaps veal and chicken with zucchini and almonds. Chickpeas frequently make an appearance, as do raisins, almonds, dates and spices such as cinnamon and coriander.

"You can push the parameters of couscous the same way you can push pasta," said Paula Wolfert, author of "Couscous and Other Good Food From Morocco." "The difference is the couscous grain. Pasta can't compare with it in delicacy."



Although packages instruct you to boil couscous, steaming it can make it better.

Unfortunately, we've come to think of it as a convenience food - a pre-cooked grain that you pour from the box into a bowl and just add hot water. The result is edible,

but it's not the real couscous. The essential thing about real

couscous is that it's steamed, not soaked in hot water, as the recipe on the couscous package dictates.

Why is couscous steamed? Because of the way it's made, by sprinkling drops of water into a bowl of durum semolina and stirring it until granules form. It's not kneaded at any point, so the granules are not held together by gluten, the way pasta is.

This means couscous can't be boiled without turning into mush, but it's also the reason for its delicacy. The couscous granules have none of the rugged texture that comes from gluten and, when they're steamed, they can swell much more than pasta ever could.

"I can get 16 to 18 cups of cooked couscous out of a pound of dry by steaming," said Wolfert. "But following the box instruction — just leaving the couscous to soak in hot water - I get only six cups."

Moroccans say that understeamed couscous - and this would go double for pour-it-intohot-water couscous - swells up in your stomach.

"Think about, it," Wolfert said. "That grain could have swelled to 16 or 18 cups. It's got room to grow, so it's going to grow somewhere. It's going to grow in your stomach." CHARLES PERRY (LOS ANGELES TIMES)

Hostage in Iraq

MICAH GAREN and MARIE-HELENE CARLETON on Thursday discussed "American Hostage," about his time as a hostage in Iraq | washingtonpost.com/liveonline

What were your thoughts when you were first taken hostage? Did you feel resistance was impossible?

GAREN: I was really determined to resist and break free through the entire 10 days, but I knew it was very dangerous. I put my chances at 10 to 20 percent of making it out alive if we tried to escape. Still, if I knew for certain they were planning to kill me, that is what I had decided to do.

Can you please explain how you were treated as a hostage?

GAREN: The treatment was mixed. On a day-to-day level I was treated with respect. They fed us three times a day and never beat me or directly threatened me. However, they did treat my translator severely. They broke his jaw on the first day and made him walk through fields of thorns without shoes, so his feet were bloody. Even though I was treated OK, it was still clear to me that I had no control over my fate and they could come at any

moment and kill me, and that was psychological torture.

It is advised never to pay ransom as it only encourages more kidnappings. Marie, if you could have obtained Micah's release by paving a ransom, what would you have done?

CARLETON: We are very fortunate that we did not have to make that decision, as Micah's release was brought about by appeals and the work of journalists and others on the ground in Iraq. The position to not negotiate with kidnappers and to not pay a ransom does make sense as a policy, but when a family is faced with the possible murder of a loved one, they of course consider anything. I would not want to judge anyone who has been forced to make a torturous decision where a loved one's life hangs in the balance.


