BLIND, AND THE SICK AND DISABLED.

INSANE.

The total number of persons in the United States living on the 1st day of June, 1890, and reported as insane, was 106,254, of whom 53,264 were males and 52,990 were females; 99,719 were white, and of these 64,419 were native born and 35,300 were foreign born; 6,535 were colored, of whom 3,013 were males and 3,522 were females. The total number of insane per 1,000,000 of population was, for the census of 1890, 1,697; for 1880, 1,833; for 1870, 971; for 1860, 765. The decrease in the proportion from 1880 to 1890 may indicate either that there was an actual decrease or that the numbers have not been as fully and completely returned in the Eleventh as they were in the Tenth Census.

For the purpose of further comparison the United States is divided into 5 geographical divisions. The following table gives a comparison of the number of insane in 1,000,000 of population found in each of these divisions in the censuses of 1890 and 1880:

It will be seen from this table that the proportion of insane to living population, as reported, is less in each division in 1890 than it was in 1880, but that the diminution is proportionally greater in the south than it is in the north and west.

FEEBLE MINDED.

The total number of persons living in the United States on the 1st day of June, 1890, and reported as feeble minded or idiotic, was 95,571, of whom 52,940 were males and 42,631 were females; 84,997 were white, of whom 75,910 were native born and 9,087 were foreign born; 10,574 were colored, of whom 5,788 were males and 4,786 were females. The total number of feeble minded per 1,000,000 of population was, for the census of 1890, 1,526; for 1880, 1,533; for 1870, 636; for 1860, 602.

The following table gives a comparison of the number of feeble minded in 1,000,000 of population found in each of the geographical divisions in the censuses of 1890 and 1880:

DEAF AND DUMB.

The total number of persons living in the United States on the 1st day of June, 1890, and reported as deaf and dumb, was 41,283, of whom 22,783 were males and 18,500 were females; 38,158 were white, of whom 33,929 were native born and 4,229 were foreign born; 3,125 were colored, of whom 1,775 were males and 1,350 were females. The total number of the deaf and dumb per 1,000,000 of population was, for the census of 1890, 659; for 1880, 675; for 1870, 420; for 1860, 408.

The following table gives a comparison of the number of deaf and dumb in 1,000,000 of population found in each of the geographical divisions in the censuses of 1890 and 1880:

In addition to those reported as being deaf and dumb, there were reported 79,895 persons as being so deaf as to be unable to hear loud conversation but able to speak. Of these 493 were children (5 to 10 years of age); 2,648 were youths (10 to 20 years of age); 27,841 were adults (20 to 50 years of age), and 48,198 were in old age (50 years and over). The ages of 715 were not stated. Of the deaf only 39.3 per 1,000 were of school ages; of the deaf and dumb, 385.4 were of school ages.

BLIND.

The total number of persons living in the United States on the 1st day of June, 1890, and reported as blind in both eyes, was 50,411, of whom 27,983 were males and 22,428 were females. The number of the blind in both eyes per 1,000,000 of population was, for the census of 1890, 805; for 1880, 976; for 1870, 527; for 1860, 403.

The following table gives a comparison of the number of blind in both eyes in 1,000,000 of population found in each of the geographical divisions in the censuses of 1890 and 1880:

Of persons blind in one eye only, there were reported as living in the United States 93,988, of whom 68,605 were males and 25,383 were females, 84,378 were white and 9,610 were colored.

SICK AND DISABLED.

In a population of 13,394,347 living in the registration states on June 1, 1890, 194,027 were found to be so affected with various forms of disease as to be unable to follow their ordinary avocations, giving a proportion thus affected of 14.49 per 1,000. In each 10,000 of the population there were 43.4 affected with rheumatism; 17.7 with diseases of the respiratory system, excluding consumption; 6.0 with acute fevers; 5.3 with diarrheal diseases; 10.5 with diseases of the digestive system; 7.2 with consumption; 3.8 with cancers and tumors; 9.2 with diseases of the nervous system; 13.1 with diseases of the circulatory system; 7.8 with diseases of the urinary organs; 8.9 with diseases of the bones and joints, and 11.9 with other diseases. In addition to those affected with diseases, in every 10,000 13.0 were sufferers from the effects of accidents and injuries; 13.8 were paralyzed; 16.1 were lame from various causes; 3.8 had lost one arm; 3.5 had lost one leg, and 3.8 were affected with deformed or contracted limbs. It is evident that these figures are very incomplete, especially as regards consumption; nevertheless, in the aggregate, they compare favorably with the results obtained in the Tenth Census, and with similar figures in the Irish census.

NATIVITY.

As to the nativity of 57,310 white prisoners (52,894 men and 4,416 women), 40,471 (38,156 men and 2,315 women) were born in the United States, 15,932 (13,869 men and 2,063 women) were born abroad, and the birthplace of 907 (869 men and 38 women) is unknown.

Omitting those whose nativity is not given, the percentage of native whites is 71.75, and of the foreign whites 28.25.

The Chinese and Japanese were, of course, born abroad, while the Negroes and Indians may be supposed to have been born in this country.

PARENTAGE.

Of the 40,471 whites born in the United States, 21,037 (20,101 men and 936 women) had a native father and a native mother, 12,601 (11,766 men and 835 women) had both parents foreign born, 2,881 (2,729 men and 152 women) had one native and one foreign parent, and the parentage of 3,952 (3,560 men and 392 women) is unknown as to one or both parents.

Omitting the latter, the percentage of native whites of purely native origin is 57.61, of purely foreign origin 34.50, and of mixed origin 7.89.

The native white prisoners who are born of a native white father and a native white mother constitute the purely native-element in the prison population.

The foreign born prisoners whose parents are both foreign born constitute, on the other hand, the purely foreign element in the prison population.

Between these two elements is found a mixed element which includes—

1. Prisoners born in the United States, both of whose parents were foreign born.
2. Prisoners born in the United States, one of whose parents was foreign born and the other native.

ONE PARENT FOREIGN.

The number of white prisoners born in the United States who had one native parent and one parent foreign born is 2,881 (2,729 men and 152 women).

Of these 2,881 there are 1,176 (1,114 men and 62 women) with American fathers and 1,705 (1,615 men and 90 women) with American mothers.

Both these groups are combined in the following statement. The first column of figures shows the number of foreign born parents in the aggregate and of each nationality, the second that of foreign born fathers, the third that of foreign born mothers.

BOTH PARENTS FOREIGN.

The number of white prisoners born in the United States, but having both parents foreign born, is 12,601 (11,766 men and 835 women). Of these, 12,601 there are 11,327 (10,574 men and 753 women) whose parents are of the same nationality, and 1,274 (1,192 men and 82 women) whose parents are of different nationalities.

The 11,327 who compose the first of these two groups are distributed by nationalities as follows:

ONE OR BOTH PARENTS UNKNOWN.

The number of white prisoners the birthplace of one or both whose parents is unknown is 3,952 (3,560 men and 392 women). These 3,952 may be divided into 5 groups:

1. In 2,969 cases (2,646 men and 323 women) the birthplace of both parents is unknown.
2. In 291 cases (277 men and 14 women) the father is known to have been a native.
3. In 486 cases (450 men and 36 women) the mother is known to have been a native.
4. In 113 cases (107 men and 6 women) the father is known to have been foreign born. These 113 fathers were born as follows: In England, 17; Ireland, 54; Scotland, 6; Wales, 1; Germany, 15; France, 5; Sweden, 1; Canada, English, 10; Canada, French, 2; Prussia, 1; East Indies, 1.
5. In 93 cases (80 men and 13 women) the mother is known to have been foreign born. These 93 mothers were born as follows: In England, 9; Ireland, 41; Scotland, 6; Wales, 1; Germany, 16; France, 2; Scandinavia, 1; Canada, English, 13; Mexico, 1; Holland, 2; Switzerland, 1.

CONCLUSION.

As the result of this minute inquiry into the parental origin of the prisoners in the United States in 1890, the following conclusions are deduced: the total number of white prisoners is 57,310; they must have had 114,620 parents of both sexes.

The distribution of these prisoners and their parents among the elements of the population and the number of parents (of both sexes) corresponding to the number of prisoners in each element are shown in the statement below:

Taking into account only the 105,885 parents whose nativity is known, 43.19 per cent of crime committed in the United States by white men and women is chargeable to the native white element of the population and 56.81 per cent to the foreign element.

NATIVITY.

As to the nativity of 66,578 white paupers (37,387 men and 29,191 women), 36,656 (19,375 men and 17,281 women) were born in the United States, 27,648 (16,938 men and 10,710 women) were born abroad, and the birthplace of 2,274 (1,074 men and 1,200 women) is unknown.

Omitting those whose nativity is not given, the percentage of native whites is 57.00 and of foreign whites 43.00.

PARENTAGE.

Of the 36,656 whites born in the United States 21,519 (11,123 men and 10,396 women) had a native father and a native mother; 3,580 (2,176 men and 1,404 women) had both parents foreign born; 949 (538 men and 411 women) had one native and one foreign parent, and the parentage of 10,608 (5,538 men and 5,070 women) is unknown as to one or both parents.

Omitting the latter, the percentage of native whites of purely native origin is 82.61; of purely foreign origin, 13.75, and of mixed origin, 3.64.

ONE PARENT FOREIGN.

The number of white paupers born in the United States who have one native parent and one parent foreign born is 949 (538 men and 411 women).

Of these 949 there are 333 (187 men and 146 women) with American fathers and 616 (351 men and 265 women) with American mothers.

Both these groups are combined in the following statement. The first column of figures shows the number of foreign born parents in the aggregate and of each nationality, the second that of foreign born fathers, the third that of foreign born mothers:

BOTH PARENTS FOREIGN.

The number of white paupers born in the United States, but having both parents foreign born, is 3,580 (2,176 men and 1,404 women). Of these 3,580 there are 3,333 (2,020 men and 1,313 women) whose parents are of the same nationality and 247 (156 men and 91 women) whose parents are of different nationalities.

The 3,333 who composed the first of these two groups are distributed by nationalities as follows:

ONE OR BOTH PARENTS UNKNOWN.

The number of white paupers the birthplace of one or both whose parents is unknown is 10,608 (5,538 men and 5,070 women).

These 10,608 may be divided into 5 groups:

1. In 9,198 cases (4,786 men and 4,412 women) the birthplace of both parents is unknown.

2. In 394 cases (208 men and 186 women) the father is known to have been a native.

3. In 834 cases (446 men and 388 women) the mother is known to have been a native.

4. In 70 cases (37 men and 33 women) the father is known to have been foreign born. These 70 fathers were born as follows: in England, 12; Ireland, 17; Scotland, 4; Wales, 2; Germany, 14; France, 2; Sweden, 2; Canada, English, 10; Canada, French, 1; Mexico, 1; at sea, 4; Hungary, 1.

5. In 112 cases (61 men and 51 women) the mother is known to have been foreign born. These 112 mothers were born as follows: in England, 11; Ireland, 45; Scotland, 5; Germany, 18; France, 3; Italy, 1; Sweden, 2; Norway, 1; Canada, English, 10; Canada, French, 7; Spain, 1; Holland, 2; Belgium, 1; Russia, 1; West Indies, 1; Poland, 1; Iceland, 1; at sea, 1.

CONCLUSION.

As the result of this minute inquiry into the parental origin of the paupers in the United States in 1890, the following conclusions are deduced: the total number of white paupers was 66,578; they must have had 133,156 parents of both sexes.

The distribution of these paupers and their parents among the elements of the population and the number of parents (of both sexes) corresponding to the number of paupers in each element are shown in the statement below:

Taking into account only the 108,802 parents whose nativity is known, 41.56 per cent of the white inmates of almshouses in the United States (men and women) is of the native white element and 58.44 per cent is of the foreign element.

BENEVOLENT INSTITUTIONS.

The number of inmates of benevolent institutions, public and private, June 1, 1890 (not including hospitals for the insane, schools for the deaf and the blind, or asylums for the feeble minded), was 112,263, of whom 55,316 were males and 56,947 were females; 107,182 were white and 5,081 were colored. The classification of inmates of benevolent institutions, public and private, by sex, color, nativity, and race is shown in the following table:

EDUCATIONAL AND CHURCH STATISTICS.

EDUCATION.

INSTITUTIONS.

PUBLIC COMMON SCHOOL ENROLLMENT.

The customary reports of school officers have been utilized to the utmost degree to show the number, sex, and color of teachers and pupils in the schools during the census year. The county reports, to appear in a final volume, are here consolidated for the states. The record was sought in each case for the year closing nearest June 1, 1890. The school year in Georgia, Louisiana, and New Mexico corresponds to the calendar year, and the report here given for each is for the year ended December 31, 1889, being 5 months before the end of the census year, instead of 7 months after it, as December 31, 1890, would have been.

In the present condition of school records the accuracy of number is unavoidably disturbed by duplicate enrollment in every state except Rhode Island, but evidently less than in former years.

The statement for New Mexico was prepared with the utmost care, but can only be regarded as the best possible in the conditions.

Many states keep no record of sex of pupils. The Census Office conducted an extended inquiry to obtain a reasonable basis for estimate of sex in several states. No outlay of labor and money would suffice to secure a fully accurate showing for a year closed without a record of the facts. It was not found practicable to secure a report of the sex of a sufficient number of pupils in Alabama, and an estimate was made upon the basis of the sexes in the adjacent states. The reports of sex from Idaho and Texas were for about one-seventh of the pupils. For Massachusetts and Michigan reports by sex were obtained for about one-half the pupils, and for a larger part in the following states: Connecticut, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Minnesota, New York, reaching eight-ninths in Maryland.

The chief officer of the school system in each of the following units made an addition of sex to his usual report: Alaska, Delaware, Kentucky, New Jersey, North Carolina, Virginia, and Wisconsin. With a continued improvement of records it will hereafter be possible to trace the influence of special employments and the actual relation of the sexes in the higher schools.

California, Nebraska, and Indiana show the color of pupils in their customary reports. The superintendent of New Jersey made thorough inquiry and filled out a complete statement by counties for that state for the census. For other northern states the report of colored pupils is inevitably imperfect, showing only such as were given by local school officers.

Attendance at state universities and professional schools in 1880 was not published. Comparison of population and attendance, therefore, can be for the public common school enrollment only.

In the accompanying tables 65,512 pupils over and under legal school age are included in the public school enrollment of Texas. Such pupils apparently were not included in the census report of 1880.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS, ADDITIONAL TO COMMON SCHOOLS.

There are now many universities, schools for training teachers, and other institutions maintained at public cost which do not appear in the ordinary public-school summaries of the states. They did not appear in the census of 1880, and they are separately shown here as additional public schools, that there may be a fair basis for calculating changes in the decade.

PRIVATE SCHOOLS.

Many private schools are of an exceedingly transient character, and many that continue from year to year feel no such pressure for keeping records as influences public schools. Some defects in public-school reports repeat themselves in private-school reports, and very rapid changes are in progress, private schools and parochial schools in some states increasing more than public schools; public schools, in the south especially, absorbing many private schools. In the present transition condition it is impracticable to determine either the inflation of numbers of pupils by duplicate enrollment in both classes of schools or the deficiency in the numbers from failure of reports. In general, school managers have been very cordial in their coöperation.

The subdivision Parochial schools is given separately.

Statistics for private schools were not published for 1880.

DENOMINATIONAL SCHOOLS.

There is difficulty in drawing a line between schools owned and patronized by members of a communion entirely upon individual preferences and schools of kindred appearance to which the organic support of the denomination is pledged. The complications along that line are so numerous that two persons might reach quite different results in their interpretation of the same returns. There are many private schools in which the religious motive is strong that are supported in such way as to be called by their proprietors or others unsectarian.

PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS.

It has been the aim to include as parochial the elementary schools supported by congregations making religious instruction prominent, not including temporary catechetical classes, Saturday and Sunday schools. More advanced schools and missionary schools dependent on broader support than that of a congregation have been classed as private schools. The line between the elementary and the secondary schools founded on a religious motive can not now be rigidly drawn, and a few instances occur where a school reported by religious authorities as parochial is maintained as a public school. The table represents a careful inquiry and the cordial coöperation of religious teachers. It presents the parochial schools of the country in one view for the first time. Catholics have about four-fifths of the pupils; Lutherans nearly one-fifth; Evangelicals, Episcopalians, Presbyterians, Reformed and others have small numbers.

Certain public schools sometimes called parochial schools are intentionally omitted from the parochial tables.

The sex and color in private schools and superior public schools are obtainable from reports of individual institutions with reasonable accuracy.

Since the secondary and elementary divisions of the public common schools are not separately shown in most state records, the columns for sex and color for these could only be filled by estimates based on estimates, each introducing a new element of error.

The tables for showing the classification of pupils as superior, secondary, elementary, and commercial have been prepared in the face of such difficulties from incomplete records and imperfect classification in various instances that only the value of a carefully prepared estimate is claimed for their showing as a whole.

By the courtesy of other divisions of the Census Office it can be stated that in addition there are in schools for special classes (deaf mutes, blind, feeble minded) approximately 12,500 pupils; in Indian schools, 12,232; in reformatories, 14,846. The statistics for pupils in other charitable institutions are not yet available.

The public has manifested a constant interest in the comparative statistics of population and education. The general results of census investigations upon education are concentrated above, unfortunately interrupted by the failure to publish statistics of all schools in 1880.

This condensed statement serves further to illustrate how great phenomenal changes in certain portions of the country become equalized under a generally uniform change in the grand whole. It is also apparent that great changes of short periods are toned into the general average for long periods of which they may form a part.

CHURCHES.

All known religious denominations are reported in the accompanying tables, including undenominational or union missions and chapels and independent congregations.

The statistics are for the year 1890.

The term "organizations" includes churches or congregations, and also missions, chapels, etc., when they have members and a form of organization.

By "edifices" is meant all buildings owned and used for religious worship. Two or more denominations are often joint owners of an edifice and its belongings. The fractions do not appear in the following tables.

"Seating capacity" indicates the number of persons a building will seat at any one time. In cases of joint ownership and occupancy the seating capacity of an edifice is given in full in connection with each denomination interested.

The "value" is the estimated worth of church buildings, their furniture, bells, etc., and the ground on which they stand. No account is taken of indebtedness. Parsonages are not included, nor is any other class of church property.

The column of communicants or members includes all who are permitted to partake of the Lord's Supper in denominations observing that sacrament and those having full privileges in denominations like the Friends, the Unitarians, and the Jewish temples.

As the census reports of 1880 contain no church statistics, no opportunity for comparison is afforded.

The denominations are arranged alphabetically, excepting the branches of denominational families, such as the Adventists, Baptists, Lutherans, Methodists, etc., which are given as far as possible in chronological order. Thus the oldest branch of the Adventists is the Evangelical, which therefore stands first in the tables; the Advent Christians come next; the Seventh-day Adventists third; the Church of God is not fourth in order of organization, but is put in that place because it is a secession from and therefore a branch of the Seventh-day body.

For the sake of saving space, columns giving the number of halls, schoolhouses, and private houses, with the seating capacity of the two former, are omitted. The information will be found on page 264.

The (Plymouth) Brethren have no consecrated churches. They own a few halls. Therefore they are scarcely represented in the tables for edifices and value of church property. The (Plymouth) Brethren, Christadelphians, Spiritualists, and several other denominations have no ordained ministers or pastors. Any of their members may exercise ministerial functions.

There are in all 143 denominations specified, and 231 Independent Lutheran and 156 miscellaneous independent congregations, with 111,036 ministers, 165,177 organizations, 142,521 edifices, with a seating capacity of 43,564,863 (*a*); 23,334 halls, schoolhouses, and private houses, with a seating capacity of 2,450,858. The value of the church property is \$679,630,139 and the total number of communicants 20,612,806.
