WESTERN KENTUCKY (7-4) AT NORTH TEXAS (1-9, 1-5) Nov. 24, 2007 • Fouts Field (30,500) Denton, Texas • 3:05 p.m. CST

THE PARTICULARS

North Texas (1-9, 1-5) will play its final home game of the 2007 season when it hosts Western Kentucky (7-4) in a non-conference game. It will be the final home game in the career of 17 Mean Green seniors who will be recognized prior to the start of the game. The game will be televised back to the Bowling Green, Ky. as part of a Western Kentucky television production. The game can be heard locally on the Mean Green Radio Network with George Dunham and Hank Dickenson.

THE **P**RINCIPALS

North Texas is coming off a heartbreaking loss at Arkansas State in which the Mean Green led the entire game before the Indians scored a touchdown with two seconds remaining in the game to win 31-27. North Texas led by as much as 21 points in the first half but surrendered a 27-yard touchdown with two seconds remaining to suffer its fourth-straight loss. North Texas leads the Sun Belt Conference and ranks No. 8 nationally in passing offense. Western Kentucky is making the transition from the Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision of the NCAA and will be a football-playing member of the Sun Belt beginning in 2008.

The Series

This will be the first-ever meeting between North Texas and Western Kentucky who will begin playing as Sun Belt Conference foes in 2008. The Hilltoppers have played two current Sun Belt teams this year, defeating Middle Tennessee 20-17 and losing to Troy 21-17.

Next Game

North Texas will play its season finale at Florida International in the Orange Bowl on Dec. 1. This will be the last game of the season for Western Kentucky.

A CLOSER LOOK AT WESTERN KENTUCKY

Head Coach David Elson – Western Kentucky head coach David Elson is in his fifth year and has an overall record of 37-24. Elson has been on the Hilltopper staff since 1996, serving as the defensive coordinator prior to becoming the head coach in 2003. In his 12 years on staff Elson, 36, has seen the Hilltoppers win a Div. I-AA national championship in 2002 and post a winning record every year. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson I-AA Coach of the Year Award in 2004 after leading his team to a 9-3 record and the postseason playoffs. Elson was a three-year letterwinner while starting at strong safety for Butler University. He graduated from Butler in 1994 and served as a graduate assistant coach at Southern Illinois in 1994-95.

The Matchup – North Texas leads the Sun Belt Conference and ranks 14th nationally in passing offense with an average of 302.1 yards per game. Western Kentucky has only allowed two of its 11 opponents to throw for over 300 yards all season, Florida (325) in the season opener and Bowling Green (301) on Sept. 29th... The 183.0 passing yards per game allowed by the Hilltoppers this season would rank second in the Sun Belt Conference... Western Kentucky has averaged 249.1 yards rushing per game while North Texas ranks last in the Sun Belt in rushing defense, allowing an average of 241.4... The two teams are nearly identical in total offense, with North Texas averaging 415.9 yards per game and Western Kentucky averaging 414.3... Western Kentucky has 12 quarterback sacks on the season coming from 15 different defenders. North Texas has 12 quarterback sacks which have come from just four players... Western Kentucky has totaled over 400 yards of offense in six of its last seven games failing to hit that mark last week when it had 382 yards in a 52-12 win over Morehead State.

Being recognized will be Josh Alexander, Lawrence Brown, Blake Burruss, Brian Carlson, Jeremiah Chapman, Roderick Cotton, Deavin Cox, Brandon Dixon, Raifu Durodoye, Cliff Higgs, Maurice Holman, Brandon Jackson, Derek Mendoza, Brandon Monroe, Montey Stevenson, Jamario Thomas, Adam Venegas and Aaron Weathers. Of the 18 seniors being honored, 11 will finish their careers as four-year letterwinners. There are 259 career starts by the 18 seniors, led by Jeremiah Chapman who will be starting his 35th game this week. Five of the 18 seniors being recognized this week played in the last bowl game that North Texas participated in. Maurice Holman, Brandon Jackson, Derek Mendoza, Brandon Monroe and Jamario Thomas all saw significant action as freshmen in the 2004 New Orleans Bowl.

Pushing Record Attendance – North Texas will be very close to setting an all-time home attendance record in this week's game against Western Kentucky. The highest average attendance for North Texas during a season is 19,704 which was set in four games during the 1997 season and included a game against Texas A&M at Texas Stadium. The highest average attendance with all games at Fouts Field is 19,517 which was set in 1994. The Mean Green needs to have 14,878 at Fouts Field this week to average 19,705 for the season.

Slumping after Fast Starts – The last two games, North Texas has had great success early in the game before hitting a slump midway through that allowed come-from-behind victories for Navy and Arkansas State. Against Navy, the Mean Green scored touchdowns on seven of its first eight offensive possessions, racking up 411 yards and 49 points and holding an 18-point lead with four minutes remaining in the first half. After that point, North Texas had seven offensive possessions and totaled 218 yards and 13 points and lost 74-62. The following week against Arkansas State the Mean Green scored touchdowns on three of its first six possessions and led 21-0 before hitting the skids. From that point on, North Texas was outscored 31-6 and failed to score a touchdown.

Reviewing a Record Night – It was a record-breaking night when North Texas lost to Navy 74-62, Nov. 10. For starters, the combined score of 136 was the most points scored by both teams in a game decided in regulation. It ties the record for most combined points scored in any game, which was set earlier this year when Boise State and Nevada combined for 136 in a four-overtime game. North Texas and Navy also combined to score 63 points in the second quarter, breaking the NCAA record of 61 set by San Jose State and Hawaii in 1999. The 19 combined touchdowns in the game tied an NCAA record which was set by San Jose State and Rice in 2004. Mean Green true freshman quarterback Giovanni Vizza set the NCAA record for touchdown passes by a freshman with eight, breaking the record of six held by Bob Hoernschemeyer of Indiana and Luke McCown of Louisiana Tech. Vizza's seven touchdowns in the first half also tied an NCAA record for most touchdowns in a half.

Big Gains on First Down – The North Texas offense has done a better job lately of picking up substantial yardage on first down, but still has only out-gained one opponent on first down this year. The Mean Green has averaged nearly seven yards on first down in the last two games after a season-low average of 2.5 yards on first down against Troy. The Mean Green defense has struggled in stopping opponents on first down, allowing six of its 10 opponents to gain at least seven yards. North Texas allowed Navy an average of 13.9 yards on first down and 503 of the Midshipmen's 680 yards of total offense came on first down. Below is a look at how North Texas and its opponents have done on first down plays:

Locker Room Lethargy – In the first eight games of the season North Texas didn't score any points on its opening drive of the game. The last two games, the Mean Green has been successful in mounting long drives that have ended in a touchdown on its opening drive of the first quarter. The first drive of the second half has been another story for North Texas. In 10 games, North Texas has scored just three points on its initial drive of the second half. Here is a look at the results of the Mean Green's first series of the game and first series of the second half this year:

Big Plays Plentiful – After 10 games this year, North Texas has had 25 plays from scrimmage go for at least 30 yards. Of those 25 plays, 20 have been passes and five have been runs and 10 have gone for touchdowns. Wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald leads the way as the "big play" man, with eight plays covering at least 30 yards while Brandon Jackson is close behind with five. In all 12 games last year, the North Texas offense had eight plays that went for 30 yards or more.

Productive Losses – In four of its nine losses this year, North Texas has out-gained its opponent in total offense. The four losses this year where North Texas has out-gained its opponent are SMU (613-534), Florida Atlantic (466-406), Louisiana-Lafayette (527-414) and Middle Tennessee (383-335). Between the TCU game in 2002 and the end of the 2006 season the Mean Green had 29 losses and had only out-gained its opponent in total offense three times in those games.

Peculiar Twist – In North Texas' only win of the season against Louisiana-Monroe, the Mean Green was out-gained in total offense 421-373. So far this year North Texas is 0-4 when gaining more yards of total offense than its opponent and 1-5 when it has less yards of total offense.

Basking in the Sun Belt – Since the beginning of the Sun Belt Conference in 2001, North Texas has enjoyed much more success against conference teams than it has in non-league games. North Texas is 30-16 (.652) all-time in Sun Belt Conference games and 5-32 (.135) in non-conference games. Against Sun Belt Conference teams all-time, the Mean Green has averaged 26.6 points and 346.8 yards of offense per game. In non-conference games during the same time, North Texas has averaged 14.4 points and 259.8 yards of offense per game.

Starting Field Position – For the first time this season, North Texas won the battle of field position but lost the game. Against Arkansas State the Mean Green averaged the 35-yard line to start its drives while the Indians averaged the 29 to start theirs. In the first nine games of the year, North Texas had only won the battle of field position one time – the win over Louisiana-Monroe. For the year the Mean Green is still seven yards deeper in its own territory on average to start its offensive drives. Here is a look at the average starting field position for North Texas and its opponents this season:

Three and Out – North Texas head coach Todd Dodge sets specific offensive and defensive goals for his team, one of which involves three-and-out series. The number of three-and-out drives has been directly proportional to the team's success this year. In the three games that North Texas has lost by a large margin, the offense has had at least five, three-and-out series while forcing two or less. The last two games, the Mean Green offense has only had two, three-and-out series. Here is a look at the number of three-and-out series per game by North Texas and its opponents:

Third Down Distance – Todd Dodge has emphasized that his offense is most successful when not faced with third and long situations. The philosophy is to methodically move the chains by gaining enough yards on first and second down that third down doesn't become a statistical improbability with a long distance to gain. It is no coincidence that North Texas' two-best third down conversion efforts this season came against SMU and Navy when it had the fewest third-and-long situations. This year, North Texas is 27-of-112 (24 percent) converting third downs of five yards or more and 30-of-48 (63 percent) when faced with less than five yards on third down. Here is a breakdown of the third down situations and distance to gain for each game:

Turnover Trouble – North Texas ranks seventh in the Sun Belt Conference and 106th nationally in turnover margin, giving up 29 turnovers while gaining 21. The Mean Green has won the turnover battle only twice this season, in a win against Louisiana-Monroe and in a loss to Troy. In the last three games, North Texas has been -6 on turnovers, losing nine and gaining three. Dating back to the beginning of the 2004 season, North Texas is 3-27 when committing more turnovers than its opponent and 9-3 when committing less.

Points Off Turnovers – The bigger problem for North Texas than the actual number of turnovers this year is what the Mean Green and its opponents are doing with ball after getting a turnover. In its only win of the year against Louisiana-Monroe, North Texas scored 17 points of three turnovers for a success rate of 100 percent. In its nine losses it has gained 21 turnovers and only scored four times for a success rate of 19 percent. Mean Green opponents have created 28 turnovers and scored 15 times for a success rate of 54 percent. Against Troy, North Texas gained seven turnovers and didn't score any points off those opportunities. North Texas has scored a total of 37 points off of 21 turnovers while its opponents have scored 97 points off of 28 turnovers.

Going Long – North Texas quarterback Giovanni Vizza and wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald hooked up for a 99-yard touchdown in the win against Louisiana-Monroe earlier this year, setting a school record for the longest play ever from scrimmage. It was only the 16th time in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision history and the first time in Sun Belt Conference history that any team had completed a 99-yard touchdown pass. It was the longest scoring play by North Texas since T.J. Covington returned a fumble 100 yards against Utah State in 2004.

Youthful Front – North Texas is playing with a very inexperienced offensive line this year, with only one starter returning from last year's team. Coming into this year, senior Adam Venegas is the only offensive lineman who has any career starts at North Texas. Of the other four starters, two are sophomores and two are freshmen. Before this season, Venegas had started 12 games and played in 20. Combined, the other four starters on this year's offensive line had played in 12 games and started none prior to this year.

Dodge Ball Has Begun – Todd Dodge became the 16th head coach in North Texas football history when he was hired to lead the Mean Green on Dec. 12, 2006. Dodge is back for his second tour of duty at North Texas after serving as the Mean Green passing game coordinator in 1992 and 1993. Over the last five years as the head coach at Southlake Carroll High School, Dodge led his team to an amazing 79-1 record while winning four state championships. His only loss during that time was by a single point in the 2003 state championship game.

A Return to the North Texas Sideline – Mean Green head coach Todd Dodge is making his second tour of duty on the North Texas sideline after he was an assistant coach under Dennis Parker in 1992 and 1993. Dodge was the passing game coordinator under Parker, helping teach the most prolific passer in North Texas history Mitch Maher. During his two years as the passing game coordinator, Dodge's offense totaled 4,806 passing yards for an average of 218.5 yards per game. Under his guidance in 1993, North Texas had 2,626 yards and 24 passing touchdowns, both of which have only been surpassed one time since then - and that was the year after Dodge left (1994). Maher, who holds North Texas passing records for career yards with 8,515, attributes much of his development to Dodge. North Texas has not had over 2,000 yards passing as a team since 1995, which was the first year the Mean Green returned to Div. I-A.

Making the Rare Jump – North Texas head coach Todd Dodge became just the sixth coach in history to make the rare jump from high school to major college head coach when he was announced as the new Mean Green boss on Dec. 12, 2006. Dodge joins Paul Brown of Ohio State, who came from Massillon, Ohio High School in 1941; Roy Lester of Maryland, who came from Montgomery High School in Rockville, Md. in 1969; Bob Commings of Iowa, who came from Massillon High School in 1974; Jerry Faust of Notre Dame, who came from Moeller High School in Cincinnati in 1981 and Dennis Parker who came to North Texas from Marshall (Texas) High School in 1991. Brown coached for three seasons at Ohio State and had a career record of 18-8-1. Lester was 7-25 in three years at Maryland, Commings was 17-38 in five years at Iowa, Faust was 30-26-1 in five years at Notre Dame and Parker was 11-21-1 during his three years at North Texas.

First-Year Head Coaches – Of the 24 Football Bowl Subdivision schools that made coaching changes this year, 13 hired coaches who have never been a college head coach. Through 11 weeks of the season, the 13 first-time head coaches have a combined record of 51-93 (.354). None of the first-time head coaches are undefeated this season. There are 10 new head coaches at non-BCS schools this year and those coaches have combined for a 41-78 (.346) record so far. The combined record of all 24 teams with new head coaches in 2007 is 112-152 (.424).

Captains Named – North Texas head coach Todd Dodge announced that six players will serve as team captains for the 2007 season following a vote by team members. Seniors Jeremiah Chapman, Maurice Holman, Brandon Jackson, Derek Mendoza, Jamario Thomas and Aaron Weathers were chosen by their peers to lead the Mean Green this season.

Home Grown – Of the 104 players on the North Texas roster, 94, or 90.4 percent, come from the state of Texas. Only four Football Bowl Subdivision schools have a higher percentage of in-state players on their respective rosters. San Jose State leads the way with 97.0 percent of its players (98 of 101) from the state of California. Florida Atlantic comes in second with 95.6 percent (88 of 92) of its players coming from Florida. Fresno State has 92.4 percent of its players (97 of 105) from California.

Fresh Faces – North Texas had 21 players make their first appearance in a game during the season-opening loss to Oklahoma. Of those 21 who saw their first action, 15 were freshman, including nine true freshmen. For redshirt freshmen offensive linemen Matt Menard and Esteban Santiago it was not only their first action in a game, it was also their first career start. Walk-on true freshman kicker Thomas Moreland also saw his first action.

Walk-On Success – North Texas has had success in developing walk-on players into key contributors over the past few years. On this year's team there are four starters who came to North Texas as walk-ons. Senior linebacker Derek Mendoza, junior punter Truman Spencer and junior wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald all came to North Texas as walk-ons but have earned scholarships in their time on the team. Freshman kicker Thomas Moreland is the remaining starter who came as a non-scholarship player. Perhaps the best player in North Texas history that originally came as a walk-on was linebacker Chris Hurd who concluded his career as the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 2003.

Building a Winning Attitude – Head Coach Todd Dodge has made it a mission to build his team with players who have experienced winning and been around winning programs. The 18 freshmen who make up Dodge's first signing class have combined to play in a total of 11 state championship games in high school. Of those 11 state championship appearances, seven have won state titles. Wide receivers Sam Dibrell and Marcus King, linebacker Justin Padron, defensive end Kyle Russo and quarterback Giovanni Vizza all won at least one state championship in high school.

Ford One of Youngest – North Texas offensive coordinator Todd Ford is the fourthyoungest offensive coordinator in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Div. I-A). Ford was born on March 28, 1973 making him 34 years old during the 2007 season. Only Major Applewhite (29) of Alabama, Brian Harsin (30) of Boise State and Mark Helfrich (33) of Colorado are younger in the OC ranks. Among both offensive and defensive coordinators, Ford ranks as the 10th-youngest in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Letterman Breakdown – Of the 104 players on the current North Texas roster, 45 have earned at least one varsity letter while playing football for the Mean Green. Only 11 players have earned three letters and eight of those are expected to be starters this week. There are 16 players who have earned two letters and 18 who have earned one letter. Of the 59 players who have not yet earned a varsity letter at North Texas, 16 are in the current two-deep.

Television Time – North Texas will play its final television game of the season this week against Western Kentucky. In all North Texas will have played seven times on television during 2007, including a nationally-televised game against Oklahoma to begin the season. The Mean Green was also televised as part of regional packages in games with Florida Atlantic, Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana-Monroe, Troy and Arkansas State.

Four Named Preseason All-Conference – North Texas placed four individuals on the Sun Belt preseason all-conference, which was more than every school in the league except Louisiana-Monroe and Middle Tennessee. Senior defensive end Jeremiah Chapman, senior linebacker Maurice Holman, junior punter Truman Spencer and senior safety Aaron Weathers all earned the prestigious preseason honor.

Coaches Up/Coaches Down – North Texas will put four assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have five assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with running backs coach Shelton Gandy, safeties coach Chuck Petersen and defensive ends coach David Rausch. On the sideline with Dodge will be defensive coordinator Ron Mendoza, defensive tackles coach Robert Drake, wide receivers coach Clayton George, cornerbacks coach Butch LaCroix and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich. Graduate assistant coaches Beau Davidson and Scott Vestal will also be in the press box.

Well Represented in the NFL – North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

Mean Green Offensive Notes

Conference Leaders – North Texas leads the Sun Belt Conference and ranks 14th in the NCAA in passing offense with an average of 302.1 yards per game. North Texas needs 198 yards to break the school record for passing yards in a single season, which was 3,218 set in 1994... North Texas wide receivers Casey Fitzgerald (9.6 rpg and 118.4 ypg) and Brandon Jackson (7.0 rpg and 72.1 ypg) rank first and second respectively in both receptions and receiving yards this year. Fitzgerald has already broke the North Texas single-season record for receiving yards with 1,184. He needs just one touchdown to tie the single-season record for receiving touchdowns in a single season which is held by Ron Shanklin with 13.

Mr. 3000 – Senior running back Jamario Thomas became just the second player in the history of the Sun Belt Conference to rush for over 3,000 career yards when he eclipsed the mark against Louisiana-Lafayette earlier this year.

Thomas moved into second place on the North Texas career rushing leaders list on a 77yard touchdown run against Middle Tennessee and now has 3,289 career yards. Thomas has joined his former teammate Patrick Cobbs as the only two Sun Belt players to ever eclipse the 3,000-yard rushing mark. Thomas ranks 10th among all active Football Bowl Subdivision running backs in career yards, trailing leader Michael Hart of Michigan who has 4,911. He is also second on the North Texas career rushing leaders list, trailing Cobbs by 761 yards.

Giving Them Fitz – North Texas junior wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald has burst onto the scene after finding a happy home in Todd Dodge's new spread offense. The former walk-on leads the Sun Belt Conference and ranks third in the nation in receptions per game (9.6), and fourth in the nation in receiving yards per game (118.4). He has already set the Sun Belt and North Texas record for receptions and yards in a game earlier this year against SMU when he had 18 catches for 327 yards and was named the Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Week. Last week against Navy he set the North Texas and Sun Belt Conference record for touchdown receptions in a game with five. He holds the North Texas singleseason records for receptions with 96 and receiving yards with 1,184.

Vizza Delivery Man – Head coach Todd Dodge made a switch at quarterback for the Louisiana-Lafayette game, going with true freshman Giovanni Vizza over junior Daniel Meager. In his first career start, he threw for 383 yards, which was the most-ever by a quarterback making his first start and the seventh-best passing performance in North Texas history. His eight touchdown passes against Navy broke the NCAA freshman record and his 478 yards in the same game was the fourth-most in school history. With two games remaining, Vizza has already thrown for 1,993 yards which is the most passing yards ever by a freshman at North Texas and ranks as seventh-best single-season performance regardless of classification. Vizza leads all true freshmen quarterbacks in the NCAA this year in passing attempts, completions, yards and touchdowns.

Third Quarter Slump – The Mean Green offense has struggled in the third quarter this year, as is evidence by the scoring and total offensive breakdown by quarter. North Texas has scored 40 points in the third quarter, while scoring 50 in the fourth, 56 in the first and 106 in the second. The Mean Green rushing and passing yards in the third quarter also trail each of the other three quarters. Here is a breakdown of the average total offense in each quarter per game:

Passing Fancy – Through 10 games this season, North Texas has amassed 3,021 yards of passing for an average of 302.1 yards per game, which ranks No. 14 nationally. In the 92-year history of North Texas football, there has only been one time that a North Texas offense has passed for more than 3,021 yards in an entire season, 1994 when it had 3,218.

Record Night – Junior quarterback Daniel Meager and junior wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald stormed their way into the record books with their performances earlier this year against SMU. Meager broke the North Texas single-game records for passing attempts with 64, passing completions with 46 and passing yards with 601. Fitzgerald broke the North Texas and Sun Belt Conference records for single-game receptions with 18 and receiving yards with 327. His reception total ties for the 18th-best in NCAA FBS history and his receiving yards is the fourth-best in NCAA FBS history.

MEAN GREEN DEFENSIVE/SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

Stacking it Up vs. Sun Belt – There is a stark contrast in North Texas' defensive numbers in non-conference games versus conference games this season. In non-conference games, the Mean Green defense has allowed an average of 66 points per game, 366 yards rushing per game and 648 yards of offense per game. In league games, North Texas has allowed an average of 35 points per game, 158 yards rushing per game and 424 yards of total offense per game. In the overall statistics which include all games played North Texas ranks last in the Sun Belt in every defensive statistical category. In Sun Belt only games, ranks seventh in scoring defense, third in rushing defense, seventh in passing defense and sixth in total defense.

Chapman Making Most – Senior defensive end Jeremiah Chapman has been impressive through 10 games this season, leading the Sun Belt Conference with 12 tackles for loss. Chapman also ranks fifth in the league in quarterback sacks with 4.5. The only two games that Chapman didn't have at least one tackle for a loss this season was against Oklahoma and Arkansas. He currently ranks third on the team in total tackles with 54.

Many Happy Returns – True freshman Micah Mosely is starting to come into his own as a kickoff return specialist for North Texas. Mosely had eight kickoff returns for 161 yards against Navy for an average of 20.1 yards per return. He has four of the team's five longest returns this year, including a season-long 44-yarder against Troy. His average of 18.8 yards per return ranks eighth in the Sun Belt Conference.

Linebackers Picking it Up – Of the 10 interceptions by the North Texas defense this season, six have been picked off by Mean Green linebackers. Freshman linebacker Craig Robertson leads the team with four interceptions, picking up his latest in loss to Arkansas State last week. He is the first linebacker to have four interceptions in a season since Brad Kassell had four during the 2000 season. Linebackers Derek Mendoza and Maurice Holman also each have one interceptions this year, which equals the total by any other Mean Green defender. North Texas' 10 interceptions for the season is four more than the Mean Green had in 12 games last year.

Thrown for a Loss – North Texas has turned up the heat the last six weeks, getting more pressure on the opponent quarterback and throwing running backs for losses. In the first four games, the Mean Green defense had 11 tackles for loss and two quarterback sacks. In the last six games, the Mean Green had 34 tackles for loss and 10 quarterback sacks. Against Louisiana-Monroe, North Texas had four sacks and 12 tackles for losses.

Quick Drives – North Texas opponents have struck very quickly with big plays this year, resulting in very fast scoring drives. Of the 68 scoring drives by Mean Green opponents, 41 have consumed two minutes or less of game clock (60 percent). Only nine of total 68 scoring drives by the opponent have taken 10 or more plays and 32 have taken five plays or less. The average length of scoring drives by North Texas opponents this year is 60.4 yards on 6.2 plays while consuming 1:54 of game clock.

Stopping the Big Run – After allowing seven runs for 20 yards or more against Navy the previous week, the North Texas defense became much stingier last week against Arkansas State allowing just two. In fact, against all six Sun Belt Conference opponents, North Texas has allowed just seven runs of 20 or more yards and three of those came against Louisiana-Lafayette. In four non-conference games, the Mean Green has allowed 19 runs of 20 yards or more.

Looking for a Three-Peat – Aaron Weathers is looking to become the only Mean Green player in history to lead the team in tackles for three consecutive seasons. Weathers led the team with 113 tackles in 2005 and had a team-high 78 last season. He becomes only the seventh player to lead his team in consecutive seasons since North Texas starting keeping tackles as a stat in 1977. Of the seven previous players to lead their teams in back-to-back years, Weathers is the only defensive back. After 10 games this year he is four tackles behind Derek Mendoza who leads the team with 60.

Breaking the Drought – It has been 107 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss against Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. The Mean Green is still well behind the streak leader Missouri, which has gone 278 games without returning a kickoff for a touchdown. North Texas' current streaks ranks as the 12th longest without a kickoff return for a score.



The Oklahoma Sooners needed only 32 seconds to get on the scoreboard.







> Troy's Omar Haugabook threw for 287 yards, completing 25-of-37 passes, including three touchdown passes. He also caught a 22yard touchdown reception from wide receiver Gary Banks on a trick play for the first score of the game.


> "We knew that they had the type of offense that could put up big numbers and we knew that we would have to score when we had the chance and we didn't do that," said Dodge.



Starting in the second quarter, Navy scored touchdowns on eight consecutive possessions. The Midshipmen punted once in the game.

Giovanni Vizza threw eight touchdown passes in the game, which is a NCAA record for most touchdown passes in a game by a freshman. He also tied a NCAA record for touchdown passes in a half with seven. His eight touchdown passes also broke a 38-year old school record for most touchdowns in a single game. The freshman threw for a personal-best 478 yards, which is the fourth most in school history.

Casey Fitzgerald caught a school record five receiving touchdown passes. With his 134 receiving yards, he came up five yards shy of setting the North Texas single-season receiving yards record. Fitzgerald is in second with 1,126 receiving yards. He also moved into second place with 12 receiving touchdowns this season.

The attendance of 26,012 is the third-largest crowd ever to see a game at Fouts Field.


