Cow, and one feather bed and furniture, To be paid to him  
when he arrives to the age of twenty one years, I also bequeath  
the Sum of one thousand Dollars to be expended in the Education  
of my said Son Edward, to be paid to my friend Herin Ester  
for that purpose, who under the Direction of the Orphans Court  
is to apply it in a manner the most advantageous to Carry  
out the Object of this bequest

Item - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Owens  
Sum of one thousand Dollars, provided that Sum should  
not have been paid to her husband, by Herin Ester out of the  
which he owes me for Tobacco, before my death

Item - It is my will and desire that all my debts

...should remain in the possession of my Executor and  
Executor herein after named, for the support and maintenance  
of my wife, and such of Children as remain single, and make  
a part of her family, until my son Edward arrives to the  
age of twenty one years, immediately after which I desire that  
my lands may be sold at public sale, subject to <sup>my</sup> wife's Dower,  
by my Best surviving son, who is authorized and empowered  
to make the sale, upon such terms and conditions as the  
Orphan Court shall direct, and upon the payment of the  
purchase money to execute a Deed or Deeds to the purchaser or  
purchasers, which shall be good and available to convey all  
the right and Estate which I have in said lands.

Item - Having already advanced to my son Benjamin the  
sum of five thousand dollars, and to my daughter Sarah  
Owens the sum of sixteen hundred dollars, and desiring to pay  
all my Children on the same footing, I hereby give and bequeath  
to all my other Children and their heirs, such sums respectively  
as with what I have hereby bequeathed to them, shall amount  
to the sum of five thousand dollars, and to my daughter Sarah  
Owens, such sum as with what ~~she has~~ <sup>she may</sup> be advanced to her at the time of my death, will amount

At the same time Jane Creek appears before me and being also sworn as above, deposes and saith that she was at Charles Creeks with William Court the Deponent above mentioned, on Friday last, when she heard Said Creek express himself with regard to his Tobacco in the manner related by William Court in the above Deposition, and that she heard Said Creek say something about his black Mare, but she (this Deponent) being in great trouble at the time, does not recollect precisely what it was - except that the balance of the money after paying Mr. Collins was for Sophy.






