

S.A.D.D. informs us of dangers of driving drunk

Oxford SADD plans activities to promote awareness

Our S.A.D.D. group is approaching a very successful year. With a busy schedule of activities, S.A.D.D. hopes to inform not only our school, but also our community about the dangers of drinking and driving.

S.A.D.D. began the '91-'92 school year with spirit. The group promoted awareness by setting up a display at the high school Open House. S.A.D.D. also spent time making buttons supporting the field hockey team during the state semi-finals. They also arranged to meet with the freshmen to encourage their involvement in the S.A.D.D. program.

A new program in association with S.A.D.D. is called Student Athletes Detest Drugs. S.A.D.D. encourages our school athletes to be drug-free. Other activities planned are to display a wrecked car in front of the school in the spring, support the After-Prom Party at the YMCA, and take part in National S.A.D.D. Awareness Week.

Every year S.A.D.D. also sponsors a spring assembly. Last year's assembly on May 6th was titled, "Celebrate Life, the Best is Yet to Be." During this assembly the entire school heard Officer O'Connell, of the New York State Police, tell about his responsibilities and experiences with drunk drivers. Then we watched a film called "Kevin's Story". It was about a teenager named Kevin who drank and drove and caused the death of another person. His sentence was to give lectures to groups about what he had done.

We returned to the gym to witness a simulation of what it would be like to drink and drive. Each grade level had a group of students volunteer for this activity, which had four phases. The task was to ride a handlebar scooter about fifteen yards, turn around, and return so the next person could go. During the first phase, they simulated non-drinking drivers by operating the scooters with no handicaps. The other three phases simulated drivers who were progressively drunk. Each driver put on lab safety goggles for the second phase, goggles smeared with vaseline for the third phase, and they were blindfolded for the fourth phase. Even though they didn't actually drink, the results showed what visual impairment could do to a driver. It was fun to laugh at how silly the impaired drivers looked, but the point was clear: drinking and driving don't mix.

This year S.A.D.D. hopes to invite a national S.A.D.D. speaker. They would like everyone to remember its slogans: "Don't booze and cruise" and "Friends don't let friends drive drunk."

In December our entire school population was transported to the middle school to see the production of "Halfway There" along with the seventh and eighth grades. The play was a powerful presentation about teenagers recovering from drug and alcohol abuse. The first scene was on the streets and then we saw the same teens interacting in a drug rehabilitation center. The presentation was put on again at night for the community.


Student Government also organizes activities for you. We put on dances and plan and organize Spirit Week. Powder Puff is another activity put together by the Student Government.





Our 1991 varsity softball team had another successful and eventful season with an overall record of 13-7.






that will always be remembered.






For the first time in many years our school had a lot of spirit and support for our athletic teams.


Fortunately for the team, experienced wrestlers will be only two short next season, since they will lose only two seniors. Look for a great team next year as we add some young talent to our great grapplers.

The qualification to get an Academic "O" is to get an 85 average for the year. You must take at least five subjects and you cannot fail even one of your classes or receive an incomplete. You cannot drop a course after the usual drop time.

The grades included in the figuring of the average usually count for the face value of the grade with a

few exceptions: gym, which is not counted; band counts 75% of the grade; and science with a lab, which counts 1.5 times the actual grade.
