CARRP Topic	Applicability
CARRP	Agency-wide standards to adjudicate national security concern cases. - RO's must vet and seek concurrence for NS cases.
STEPS:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. ID NS concern</li> <li>2. RO Role:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Internal vetting (may be resolved via security checks, file review, interview/ re-interview, CC research)</li> <li>b. Eligibility Assessment (not necessary to fully vet if a statutory ground exists for denial OR if PA is not eligible for the benefit sought)</li> </ol> </li> <li>3. External Vetting (via HQ review)</li> <li>4. Final Adjudication</li> </ol>
