Course Description:

A basic, introductory level workshop on the topic of feeding problems in young children. Areas of discussion include physiology of swallowing, normal development of feeding skills in young children, and etiology, assessment and treatment of feeding disorders. Feeding techniques, treatment of feeding refusal behavior, increasing caloric intake and adding new foods into the diet, positioning for stability and parent involvement will be covered. Instructional methods include lecture, case studies, handouts, powerpoint presentation, videos and discussion.

Who Should Attend? Course material is appropriate for Special Instructors, SLPs, OTs, Nutritionists, Social Workers, Psychologists and all related professionals who seek to gain a basic introduction to the subject of Feeding Problems in Young Treatment and Treatment approaches.

Learning Objectives – Upon completion, Participants will be able to:

- Identify underlying issues in assessment of feeding problems with behavioral difficulties.
- Identify different types of reinforcement which can be used in a behavioral feeding intervention.
- Describe the principles of behavioral programming and determine where to start when initiating a feeding program.
- Demonstrate clinical skills for implementing behavioral feeding programs for advancing textures from purees to solids.
