This January 1965 issue of the Perfins Bulletin contains two pages of general interest, plus the first ten pages of the new revised listings for "NLY" - the New York Life Insurance Company Perfins. There are a total of 15 pages to this set, and the remaining ones will follow in the next Bulletin. A "tip of the hat" to our hard working Catalog Committee, and thier Chairman - K. F. Lougee (#52), - for the painstaking job of entirely re-writing this complicated listing of the Perfins used at the many branch offices of this large company.

Of all the PERFIN types employing extra holes for the identification of branch offices, those of the New York Life Insurance company are by far the most involved as to number of offices. Based upon our analysis of the arrangement of extra holes, a theoretical possible total of about 210 basic varieties may exist, and of these over 175 have been reported---the majority being at least tentatively identified as to location of usage.

Efforts to obtain aid of the company in completing the identification have met with little success due to company policy. However, it was learned from informed sources that the method used herein for identifying the varieties does not differ much from that used by the company. There are two variable factors as to hole location that determine the ultimate variety. The first of these is fixed by the holes in the central letter "L", which is seven holes high and four holes wide. Although the company plan is believed to begin at the top and number each hole consecutively around, it is more natural to count down from the top on each side. We have therefore arranged the numbering so that the holes to the left and bottom are numbered from "1", while those on the right are numbered from "11", so that there is a mental aid built into the plan.

The second hole factor is thought to be related to the government imposed limitation that the design must fall within a half inch square. The four extra holes located at the corners of a square drawn about the basic design have been designated "A", "B", "C" and "D" from the upper left, counterclockwise in accordance with the company practice. Although it is reported that the company designates the four holes just inside the first four holes by doubling the letters, we have felt it wiser to use the lower case letters instead for convenience in reference to specific holes. In almost every case, the individual types consist of only one or no hole adjacent to the "L", and from none to four holes in the corner arrangement, the inner holes only being used if the corresponding outer hole is used. A few exceptions are known.

One of the exceptions to the normal basic arrangement is used by the central office in New York City. It has only three holes in the base of the "L". This is also used in Canada on revenue stamps.

Company policy influences the distribution to offices using the identification system. In such large cities as New York, Chicago and Los Angeles, it appears that the company operates a number of offices, out of which its full time employees work. Each such individual office has its own identifiable perfin pattern. Outside of these areas, it is known that there are central offices under company control and with identifiable Perfins, but agents located at a distance from these offices supply their own postage (other than perfins) for which there is no need for identification. Some 15 or more, each with its own identifiable perfin, are known to have existed in New York City. Since many of the offices with a large volume of mail are now using meters, there is a limited amount of current material available.

In the preface to the former listing of these patterns it was noted that there was a considerable variance in the distance of the corner control markings to the nearby letter. At that time it was believed that this difference was caused by less than precision workmanship in the making of the dies of the perforator. More recent studies indicate that these differences are actually a part of a distinct pattern, since they appear consistently and were used in two far separated localities.

A similar difference has been noted in both the height of the letter "X", and in the width of the top of the "Y" also indicating the probability of a separate perforator.

A few items apparently identical will be listed herein showing having been used in well separated locations. So far we have been unable to establish that two perforators were involved, hence, for the time being it must be assumed that a perforator was transferred from one location to another.

Some basic patterns have been used in both the United States and Canada. Generally these patterns, while similar, are not identical. Where we have seen copies of these Canadian issues to support us, these will be listed herein as information.

We are indebted to Mr. R. J. Woolley, 1520 Bathurst St., Toronto, Canada, secretary of the British North American Philatelic Society, for permission to list the Canadians.

A few exceptions to the general listing have been seen, but since in most cases but a single copy has been seen, they are NOT listed.

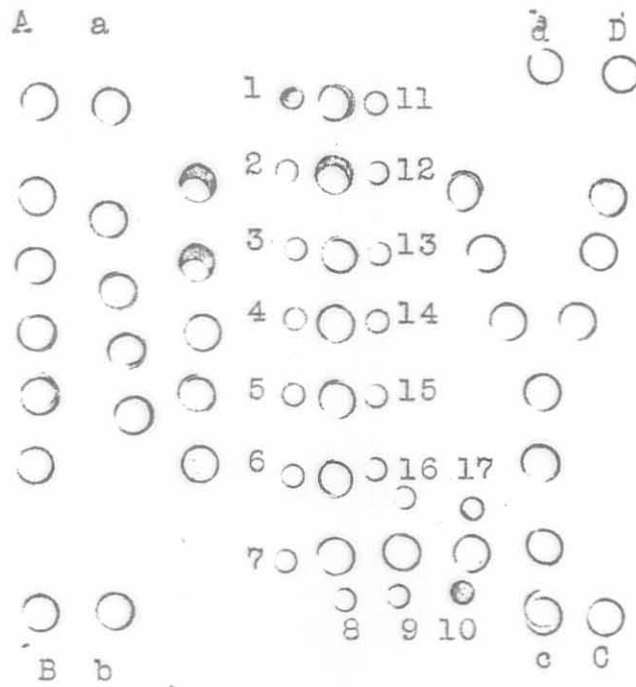
Among them are:

- 1- Three holes instead of two in the Aa location together with a hole at the C location, and holes at 3 and 13.
- 2- ABB group with holes at #4, #8, and a hole at each side of the stem of Y at the top of the stem.
- 3- What would be an AC pattern, with holes in the #3 and #6 location.
- 4- D-16. O e type shows the bar of N in a straight line, while the other more common type shows the top left hole of the bar DIRECTLY OVER the second hole.

In the attached listing, the last column shows the range of issues on which the pattern has been found. THIS IS NOT INTENDED TO BE ANY* THING OTHER THAN A GENERAL STATEMENT, so is by no means necessarily complete.

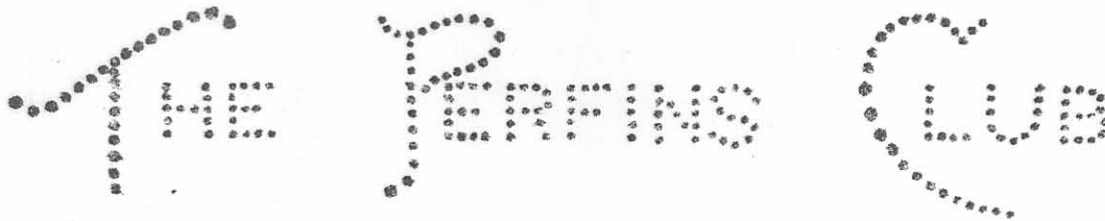

SOMETHING NEW HAS BEEN ADDED!

From our Catalog Chairman K.F. Lougee, comes the word that state of Illinois has replaced their old perforator with a new a totally different one. You will recall that the Perfin used for years has been the upper case letter "E" enclosed by an outline map of the state of Illinois. Mr. T. R. Leth, Assistant to the Superintendent of Budgets, Springfield, Illinois, has verified by letter to Mr. Lougee that the new Perfin - now in use - is a single letter "I", with serifs. The top and bottom serifs are comprised of 4 holes each, while the vertical line of the "I" has three holes. It will be listed in the Perfins Catalog as:

#0.5 I H 6 State of Illinois. We have tried to show it above. For the benefit of new members: The Catalog language means this: "0.5" is the Catalog number. It is a decimal, because we have established a firm numbering system for the U.S. Perfins Catalog, and when new discoveries are made, they must be placed in the proper order. As we cannot change numbers around, we resort to decimals. "I" - is the description of the Perfin. "H" - means that it is arranged horizontally, and all on one line. If it had been on two lines the notation would have been "2H", and if it had been diagonally arranged, the "H" would have been a "D". The "6" is the overall height of the Perfin in millimeters. Had there been another letter of different height on the same line, there would have been another number to show its height. Had there been two letters, on two lines, then these measurement numbers would have been separated by a "Slash" - "/"

MEMBER ACTIVITY:

Mrs. John A. Lyons, not a Perfins Club member, but certainly a Perfin booster, writes that at a recent meeting held by her local Club in Zionsville, Indiana, Perfins were the feature of the evening. Perfins were featured by showing a series of 60 slides, depicting all types, sizes, and kinds of Perfins, with their history, and both foreign, officials, and United States Perfins were shown. This set of 60 slides are of the common "35 mm" type, and in color. Accompanying the slides, is a "talk" - or description of them, which can be read off to describe the Perfins as they appear on the slides. These slides are the property of your Editor, but may be borrowed by any member with no charge except payment of postage both ways. You may borrow them to show at your Club's meeting, but better check a month or so in advance, to make sure nobody else is using them. They are not always home!

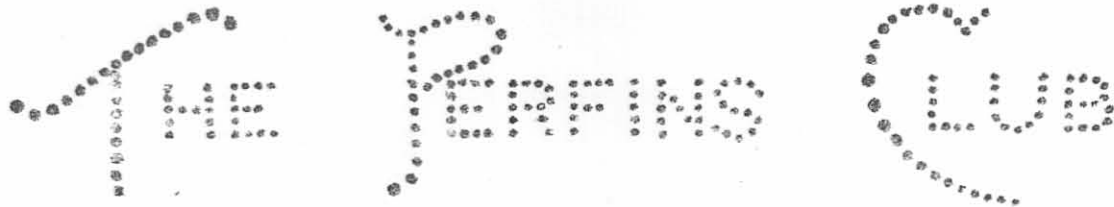

MEMBERSHIP ACTIVITY:

The mimeographing of the June Bulletin, as well as the collating, stapling, stamping, and folding, placing the U.S. stamps, and packaging and separating for the post office, has all been done by Len Paul and Lyle Steele, Jr. Their usual playmate, Dave Stump, is in Europe on vacation for a while. Did you note that this Bulletin is franked by a Precancel? But note well, - it is a precancel Perfin. The initials in the stamp are "JH", and this stands for James Harris, #637, and were produced by a Perfin "machine" of his own making. The stamps were purchased by your Club in Devon, precancelled there, and then sent to Wilmington, North Carolina where Mr. Harris lives, and he performed the perforation work and returned them to your Editor. We can recall only one other member who had - or who made - his own device for perforating stamps. That was Jo Ro Jung, former member #152. His "puncture" was "JO/RO", and he had two of them. The first was too large and consequently illegal, but the second was all right. This Perfin is listed in your U.S. Perfins Catalog in the J section - J-115.

THUMB-NAIL SKETCHES #54,

Frank C. Neal, #179, Secretary of the Perfins Club, is 40 years old, married, and has two girls and one boy. Has been employed by the Post Office for 20 years. Collects U.S., Canada, Perfins, and Precancels, and with the help of the whole family, there is a General Foreign Collection. Also has First Day, First Trip, and First Flight Covers, thanks to a kindly father-in-law! Haven't been able to work much on stamps the past several years, but have constantly continued to accumulate stamps during this period and am now trying hard to straighten out the "mess"!

I started collecting about 30 years ago, only to be told after several years of collecting, that my stamps were no good to be collected. They were mostly Perfins and Precancels! However, I kept the stamps, and several years later met a man who specialized in precancels. He helped me start my precancel collection and also told me about the Perfins Club. So, then I went back to collecting, but only had to shelve it again, while I started raising a family. But now my family helps me with the collecting. And I guess it is a good thing that they do help me, for now with the many letters I have to write as Club Secretary, there is not too much time left to spend on stamps anymore!

MEMBER DOINGS:

We have on hand a copy of the "Florida Philatelist" and quote direct from it as follows: "An outstanding program was a talk by Mrs. Henry T. Van Dyke on, 'Perfins, What and How'. These stamps with holes in them, called 'moth-eaten' by Col. Townsend, are fast becoming a major field for collecting and study, and their adherents deserve admiration and respect for the scientific methods which they are following in their research and the presentation of their findings. For years Polly was the only Perfin collector we knew. Now we are running out of fingers to count them in our club alone. To increase at that rate, the hole business most surely has something to offer." (Editor's Note: Polly VanDyke is Perfin Club member #224, and has been a member for over ten years. There are 10 members living in Florida.)

CLOSED ALBUMS:

No doubt many members read of the death of Dr. Floyd Leach, of Rowayton, Connecticut. An Episcopal Clergyman, Rev. Dr. Leach was Perfin member #81. An avid philatelist, he was an honorary life member of the Greenwich Stamp & Coin Club (Conn.), and founder, honorary member, and honorary life-time Chairman of Ye Olde Kings Highway Stamp Club. During 1958 he celebrated two golden anniversaries 50 years as a clergyman, and his 50th wedding anniversary. In addition he has been active in Masonic circles for over 60 years, holds 43 Masonic degrees (including the coveted rare 33rd^o), and was a member of the Royal Select Masters. A versatile man, he possesses four earned college degrees. His hobbies, in addition to philately, include many - his home is filled with bookshelves containing volumes on every subject his attic holds thousands of negatives he has taken, a completely equipped workshop is in his basement, and a beautiful garden, planted and maintained by him, graces the grounds of his home in Rowayton, Ct. In spite of his active life, Dr. Leach often passed on suggestions to the betterment of the Perfins Club, and only resigned when failing eyesight prevented his enjoying them any more. His entire philatelic holdings were donated to the Smithsonian Institution.

During the last 20 years, I have purchased hundreds of thousands of Perfins, until now I believe I must have one of the largest collections of foreign perfins in existence. PERFIN BOOSTING!

Your Editor has a set of 60 transparencies - 35 mm slides - telling the story about Perfins. They can be borrowed at any time by any member who wants to put on a "show" or a "talk" at his or her local stamp club. L.O.Sapp (#608) was the last one to use them, and he writes that the Waltham (Mass.) Stamp Club had a big turnout for the evening that the Perfins were featured - with people coming - visitors - from as far as 30 miles. Many questions asked and much interest shown. He showed them again at Norfolk Prison, where they had a big - shall we call it a "turn-in", instead of a "turn-out"? About thirty attended, and Mr. Sapp writes: "They would not let me go by any one slide without discussion." These slides fit any standard projector and there are several pages of "patter" to go along with them. All you have to do is to flash the slides and read what has been keyed in on the paper. No fuss, no strain, anybody can do it. Maybe YOU could do it at a future meeting of your Club? Write to the Editor in order to reserve your time to borrow the slides.

COMING!

The July Bulletin will contain a complete roster of the Perfins Club, giving name and address of all members who are in good standing. This has been delayed a bit in order to include all of the new members who have come to us as a result of the wonderful publicity we enjoyed in the January 29th issue of Linn's Weekly Stamp News. You just can't beat Linn's for drawing power, and news. The last week of every month is devoted to featuring the activities of one of the many specialty clubs. Keith Misegades (#63), worked hard in assembling and editing the material submitted by other hardworking Perfin members, and as a result we obtained about 60 or more new members and sold so many complete U.S.Catalogs that we still haven't been able to deliver them all yet! This is a case where good work gave good results.

THUMB-NAIL SKETCHES #55,

Howard E. Ferguson, #255, of Yarmouth Port, Massachusetts, was born in Lawrence, Massachusetts during 1909. Went to school there and at Whitman. Trained as a carpenter and millwright, and now employed as a construction inspector.

I now have three children, scattered across the country; a son in the state of Washington, a daughter in Illinois, and another son in Florida, - but not one of them is a stamp collector! I was exempt from military service during World War II because of family and employment on defense work, (installing ordnance on ships), however I did spend the year 1952 in Korea, with the 27th Infantry, Wolfhound Regiment.

First started collecting stamps when I was about 10 or 11 years old, but around 1932 I started to specialize in railroad items. I still maintain a General Foreign collection as well as a fair United States collection, but my main interest is in railroad items, - anything to do with railroads, in a philatelic nature. Bob Gray (#80) and I have exchanged railroad Perfins for close to thirty years, but he did not succeed in persuading me to join the Perfins Club until about 1953.

EDITOR ACTIVITY:

There were no visitors at the Perfins Clubhouse this month, -(170 Steeplechase Rd.),- but we were able to go visit ourselves!

On vacation, first stop was England, and we were fortunate to be invited to visit at the home of Chris J.T. Carr, (#451), who lives in Erith, a suburb of London. Invited for "tea" at 7PM, we took the "underground" and changed to a railroad train, met Bob Bowman (#168), at the Erith Station, and he drove us to our destination. (I am ashamed to mention that due to a heavy sightseeing program, we were an hour late, but we had telephoned ahead and secured advance forgiveness. Being Americans, we wondered what an 8PM tea was, but soon found out that it was delightful. Assorted cold cuts, with bread or rolls, tea or coffee, and a large assortment of cookies, cakes, and candy, just "hit the spot", for we had done as the English do - eaten our heavy meal at noon. Mrs. Carr and her two pretty daughters are not stamp collectors - yet - but we enjoyed meeting them, and Phyllis was a lovely hostess. Altogether, we had a fine "Perfin-evening", for in addition to Bob Bowman, who has for years been the Secretary of the British Perfins Group (i.e. Security Endorsement & Perfin Society of G.B.); and Chris Carr, who is also one of the founders of the G.B. Group and has been Editor of their News-Sheet; there was also Basil Tomkins, who is Editor of the G.B. Perfins Catalog. As both Bob and Basil lived considerable distance from the Carrs, the evening did not involve a "midnight session", but we enjoyed ourselves and parted company at a "decent" hour.

While in Munich, Germany, we paid a visit to Münchener Philatelistische Bibliothek. This is a large city-sponsored philatelic library, and we have sent Perfin Bulletins to them for years. We were shown through the Library by the Assistant Librarian, and were amazed at the number of books and pamphlets beautifully cataloged and arranged on shelves. Still in Germany and when visiting Heidelberg, we met (by prior arrangement), Major Joseph Balough (#497), his wife and two boys. Unfortunately our schedule allowed us less than two hours of free time, but the Baloughs whisked us off to the Army Officers' Club nearby, and when we were comfortably seated at a table, in came the waiter with the biggest and most beautiful cake you ever saw! Written on the cake was: "Happy Birthday, Dave Stump". Now those who know me are aware that there is nothing I like better than a cake with icing at least 2" deep, and on this day I really got my fill! - for Major Balough insisted that I take the uneaten part along with me. I did, and it wasn't uneaten long! We were sorry that we couldn't stay with these nice people longer, but our touring schedule could not be changed.

In the meantime, E. J. Enschede, (#235), who lives near Amsterdam in Holland, had written to us and we were delighted when he dropped in at our hotel room in the Amsterdam-Hilton to spend the evening. Mr. Enschede is related to the family of the same name who print most of the stamps of the Netherlands, and also some of their money. However, this does not help his Perfins collection a single bit! He showed us some selected pages from his collection - which certainly must be one of the largest in the Club, - and we really got an eyefull. Our evening was interesting and he showed us some unusual Perfins on covers mailed from New York to home offices of Dutch business houses. The evening ended all too soon, and we were sorry when he had to leave.

IRISH PERFINS:

Who is interested in Irish Perfins??? According to a census taken sometime ago, 37 members of our Club reported that they had collections of Irish Perfins. The largest collection numbered 112, so my little group of only 65 is far down on the list. However, some interest is being shown, and we will show a summary of what is known about them.

"Sometime ago a member of the Irish Philatelic Circle started to compile a list of Irish Perfins, namely, - Perfins on the stamps of Eire; Great Britain stamps used in Ireland before the partition in 1922; and lastly, Great Britain stamps used in Northern Ireland. After appealing to the I.P.C. membership, the list was sent to interested members of the S. E. & P.S. of G.B. From this early beginning a catalog was formed of approximately 120 Perfins, of which about 35% were identified.

Very little has appeared in the philatelic press about this subject, but the following have been noted:
STAMP MAGAZINE, January 1954. "Holes", by R. J. Sutton. However, the section dealing with Irish Perfins seems to be based on conjecture rather than fact.

GREEN ISLE PHILATELY, January 1955. "Irish SPIFS or Perfins", written by "Hibernicus". This article deals lightly with the whole aspect but pays particular attention to the fact that most Irish Perfins that the author has seen are very badly perforated. This point is emphasized by 31 illustrations. A further article appeared in May, but this I have not seen.

STAMP COLLECTING, November 30th, 1956. "Security Endorsements of G.B." by Charles Jennings. Part of this deals with Irish Railway Perfins and is of course the same section as in his present book "Introduction of Perfins". Following the publication of the "S.C." article, two letters appeared giving further details, on December 21st.

Recently the I.P.C. formed a very small group to have another look at the whole aspect of Irish Perfins, with the eventual hope of bringing the listings up-to-date and to make them more detailed.

It is believed that at least two Perfins are provisional i.e., "GS/R" - in this case the "R" is to be found in many positions below the "GS". "IS/L" - this Perfin appears to be formed by three separate operations. Unfortunately there is no definite proof that these are - or are not - provisionals.

Members of the Perfins Club are invited to help in this venture. If you have any helpful details, - how about letting me have them, so that everybody will benefit? My address is:

CLOSED ALBUMS:

We have no details at all, but have been informed that Gordon Clark, #625, of Los Padres, California, "died some time ago, after having been seriously ill. He has given all of his Perfins to a friend."

RECAPITULATION:

This July 1965 issue of the PERFINS BULLETIN, coming to you a bit late, due to "vacation troubles", contains four pages of general interest; one page of Topicals - "Steamship Companies"; plus seven pages comprising the complete 1965 Roster of Perfin Club members. This makes a total of twelve pages in all.

THUMB-NAIL SKETCHES, #56,

William T. Norris, #361, born November 4th, 1898, in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Collected stamps in early youth, but in 1929 really "got the bug". After a few years of collecting United States, Canada, Canal Zone, and Philippines, began to branch out to collect everything. Now collect postage stamps of the world, also - revenues, charity seals, poster stamps, match box labels, trading stamps. Since 1932, have conducted a stamp column in the local weekly under the title: "Bill's Stamp Column", but of late years it appears infrequently due to crowded condition of the paper.

A commission of 5% is charged on all stamps entered, and any remainders after the packets have been circulated are returned and deducted from the member's credit. All postage is paid by the members using the Exchange. Damaged stamps, and any on paper, cannot be entered. Very common Perfins will not trade, and too many of one type and issue should be avoided, - in fact will be returned to you. 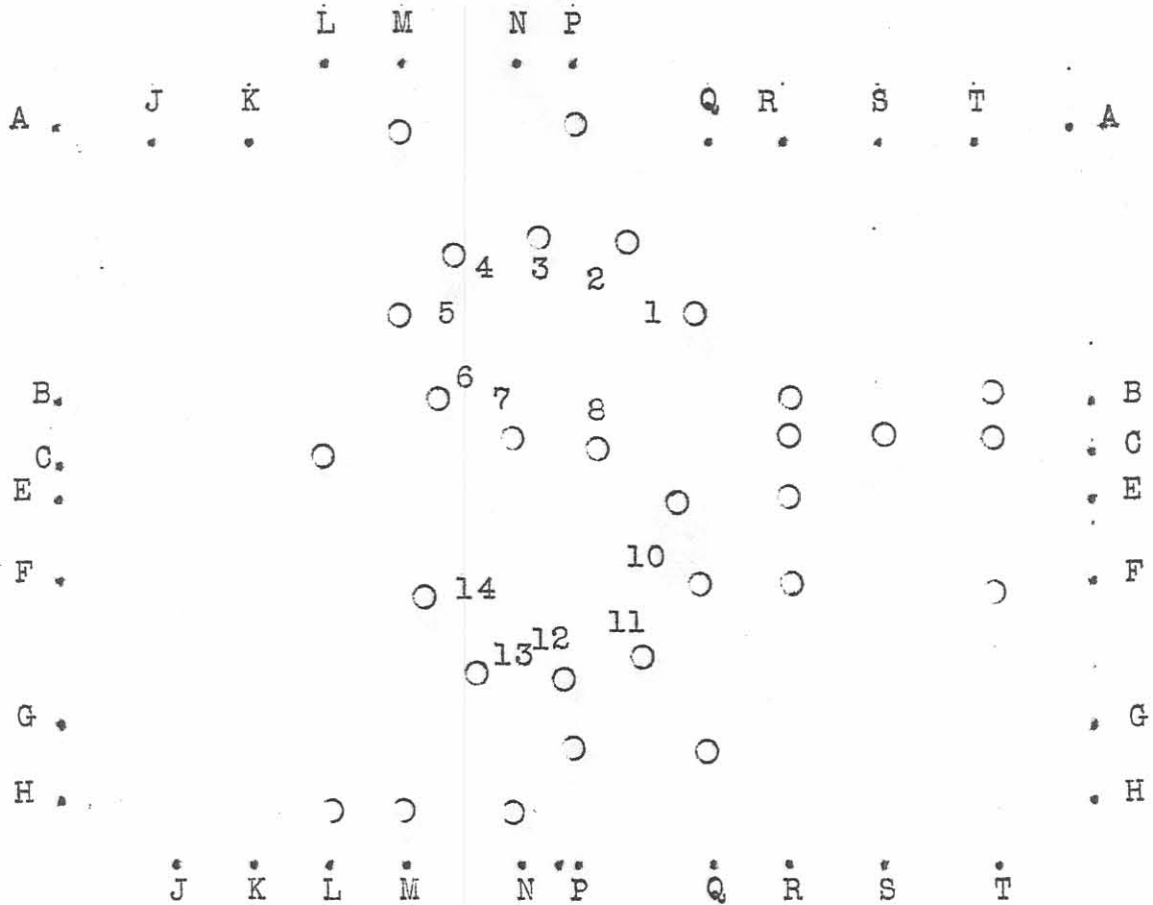

The point of intersection of any two lines is the location of the extra hole designated by the letters assigned to each intersecting line: viz. At the point where line R intersects line C, the extra hole is designated as CR.

At this time no extra holes are known to exist at any intersection of lines J and K with other lines. These lines have appeared on previous charts, as it was then thought extra holes did exist at intersecting points.

The only extra hole now known to exist on the left side of the letter S is at the CL intersection.

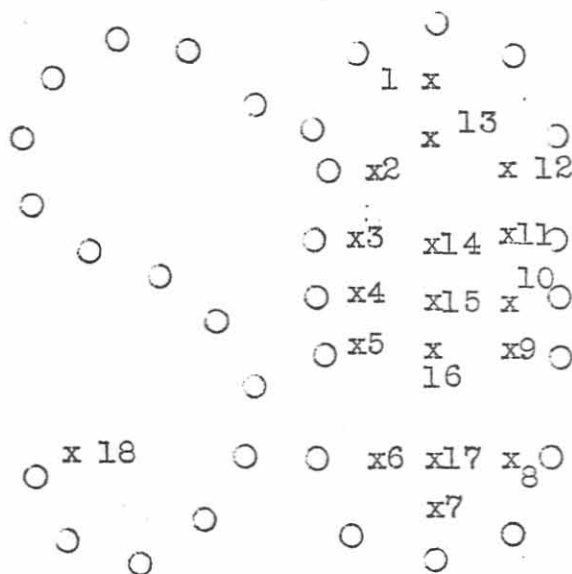

THUMB-NAIL SKETCHES #58,

JAN C. PRINS, #586, was born in The Hague, Netherlands, and since 1914, when I was six years old, I have collected stamps, - and my brother has too. We were always fighting when we got stamps, so one day my father laid down the law. He decided that I would collect stamps of Africa and America, while my brother would collect stamps from Europe, Asia, and Australia. Since then - no more quarrels!

During 1931, I went to what was then called the Dutch East Indies, and I took my collection with me. Unfortunate for me, the Japanese soldiers destroyed my collection when they occupied that portion of the world. After spending three and a half years in a prisoner of war camp in Japan, I returned to the Far East and started again to collect stamps. With the help of my brother, who lived in Holland, I was able to build up a nice collection of France and Colonies (specialized), Italy, Spain, and South East Asian countries.

In 1959 I returned from the Far East to Holland, and a year later I emigrated to the United States. As I cannot afford to spend too much money on stamps, last year I began to collect French Perfins, and I joined the Perfins Club. Recently, I added the Perfins of Spain and Italy.

MESSAGE TO ALL MEMBERS:

Dear Fellow Members:

Our Specialized Railroad Perfins Catalog was prepared about 10 years ago by the late Walter C. Ayers (#266). Since its publication almost a decade ago, it has not been revised nor even brought up-to-date. As most of you know, information has come to light that justifies deletion of some items and addition of others. Since this catalog is of invaluable aid to the beginner and frequently used by the railroad enthusiast, it is now time to revise it. This can be done only if the club members will get behind the project and push. YOUR HELP is needed and YOU can start by writing to me and answering the questions below.

1. Do you want the same format? If not, what do you suggest?
2. Should the revised catalog be illustrated?
3. Would you like to have the new catalog in two sections? One for the operating railroads (past and present), and a second for the many associated suppliers and other companies such as freight forwarders, expeditors, "routes", etc., etc. Or would you rather have everything altogether? Make your choice and tell me why, please.
4. Should Canadian Railroad Perfins be listed - unless the same pattern is used on a U.S. stamp? Why, or why not? (Your choice!)
5. Send me a list of any items that you think should be deleted, and state your reasons.
6. Send me a list of any items you think should be added, and let me know what information you have to back your request. An example: From the General Perfins Catalog - #G-165 GSI D 5½. My reason is that this Perfin is listed in the General Catalog as being used by the Gulf & Ship Island RR, and is not listed in the present Railroad Catalog. I think it should be listed.
7. Do you think that the revised Railroad Catalog should list railroads (currently listed in our RR Catalog) that are NOT listed as Railroads, or in any way identified in our general catalog. An example: Our RR Catalog: #204 T&O/C. This is listed as #T-123 in the general Catalog, but not identified. There are several of these, and I would appreciate your thoughts as to why (or why not) they should be listed.
8. INFORMATION AS TO DATES OF USE. If you have any information that would help confirm or change the "dates of use" of any Perfin listed in the Railroad Catalog, please let me have this information. Most of the "dates of use" are based on the period of currency of the stamp upon which the Perfin appears. In addition to using the period of time the stamp was in use to determine the "dates of use", if you have any information that might indicate a change, let me know. In sending me such information, please give me both the Railroad Catalog Number and the General Catalog Number for the Perfin.

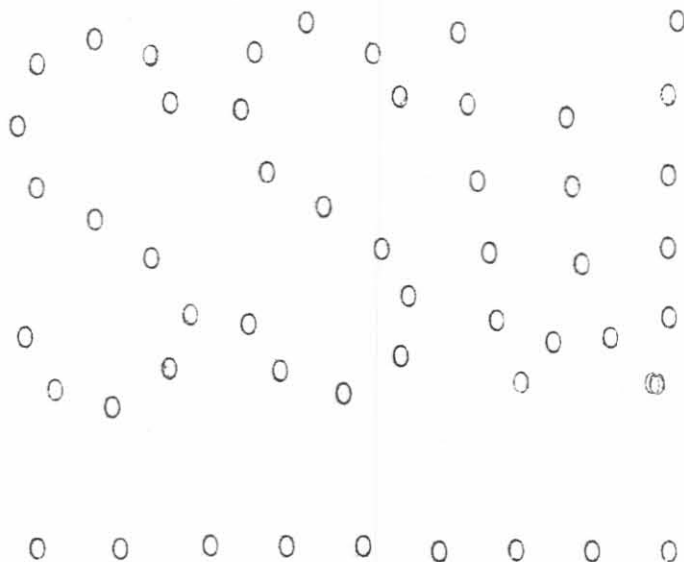

Unfortunately, we were never in Cleveland when we could spare the time to travel to his home and meet him personally....this is something we now sincerely regret....but it is too late.

THUMB-NAIL SKETCHES #59.

Andromeda Helman, #548, was born in Warren County, Ohio, and was graduated from the University of Dayton, Dayton Ohio, then taught in elementary and junior high schools for 40 years. Married, and husband is also interested in stamp collecting. Retired to Florida in 1957, but still substitute in local schools. Hobbies are stamp collecting - all phases, including Perfins of course, and then seals, labels, etc., U.S. & foreign coins, also medals and badges. Also collect dolls, demi-tasse cups and saucers - now have over 400. Would very much like to correspond with any members who share any of these collecting hobbies.

My first interest in stamps was generated 30 years ago when children in my school classes asked if they might have stamps from packages Father received. (We had a bookstore and did a lot of importing.) Then one day I found an old album on the shelves, and was delighted, - for it contained many duplicates of low value Columbian and Pan-American stamps. This pleased the children, for there were enough for everyone to have the same stamp.

A stamp club developed, meeting in my room, and the demand for free stamps increased. Father told me in the start to save one of each kind for myself and build along with the children. He bought me the Scott Catalog and an International Album - both were one volume affairs then! So I got the stamp fever and it has been with me ever since. I graduated to loose-leaf albums, ruling the pages and arranging the stamps in fancy designs, and by the time I married, my albums numbered a hundred.

My husband became interested, but being a "perfectionist and a detailist" he decided I should have the Scott Specialty Albums. His worry was that no one could tell what I still needed to complete a set. One day he came home with the volume covering Benelux, and as soon as we finished transferring stamps to the new book another speciality album would arrive! We now have 60 albums, housing various phrases of collecting - U.S. and foreign.

After I retired and we moved to Florida, I began to sort through boxes, bags, baskets, and old albums, all loaded with stamps which had been accumulated, but never had time to sort out. From these I started a PreCancel, collection, also revenue, postal card covers, and several topical collections. After reading the Perfin Issue of Linn's two years ago, I joined the Perfins Club, and went through my duplicates for Perfins, and my husband bought me the available catalogs. I bought mixtures, begged, and swapped, and I now have Perfins from 33 foreign countries, and about 800 U.S. Perfins. Sometimes I get frustrated though, - I would like to trade with other collectors, but I know so little about Perfins as yet, I cannot decide what is "good" trading material and what is just common stuff.

I might add that I have been able to "expose" several to Perfins, as we were instrumental in organizing a Stamp Club in our little town three years ago, - serving as president the first years. So, during this time, we devoted one meeting to Perfins, had a Perfin display at the Show which attracted much attention and unusual comments.

Since we fish nearly every afternoon in the Gulf, and I have so much to do in the various facets of my philatelic activities, I scarcely have time to do my housework anymore! Who said time hangs heavy when one retires??

I have had letters from some - they possess only about 2-300 different Perfins and are discouraged because they do not know how to add to their stock. Some members are very aggressive and advertise in various media, but they are few and far between. Others join the Exchange (Roy Hannan, (#441), will give you all details), but still others just can't seem to "make the grade" and add anything to their collections. This idea of Jim's would be a grand way of helping the neophyte get started, and also a good way of making new friends. Why not give it a try? I will

PHILATELIC EXHIBITIONS:

Many of our members used to show their Perfins at various Exhibitions, but we have had no reports of such activity for a long while. If you can exhibit in the "Miscellaneous" or "All other" or "Specialty" Class, you stand an excellent opportunity of winning an award. However, in an "open" show, where you compete "openly" with every other entry in all classes for a number of points, your chances of winning are considerably diminished. Let's face it - Perfins cannot compete with the classics, nor even with the modern 20th century issues which are often pretty "high-powered."

Andromeda Helman, (#548), our Thumb-Nail Sketch Girl for November, wrote in about a small exhibition staged by her Club in New Port Richey, Florida. The Club is only five years old, and membership is about 35 - including some only present during the winter months. However, this Club has staged three annual exhibits, sponsored two cachets, and has received splendid publicity from the newspapers along the "Sun Coast". She and her husband were the only members who had ever attended a stamp exhibition, at the time the Club held the first show. The last Show was held November 12th, and Andromeda showed four pages of Perfins with proper information as to their use. No prizes have ever been offered, for at first it was too new a project and since then the members seem to feel that the pleasure of showing some of their collection and sharing it with new collectors is prize enough. The Perfins created quite a bit of comment, because so few people collect them in that area. Exhibits like this are very worth while. The Club usually gains new members, the old members become better acquainted, new friends are made, and new additions are made to collections. Most Savings & Loan Associations have "Community Rooms" which are offered free to any reliable organization wishing to hold a meeting - even a Stamp Exhibit!

LONGEST PERFIN ?

Eric A. Gray (#316), claims that he has found the longest Perfin! It is on a one pint distilled spirits bottle, - tax paid stamp. It measures 7-1/8" by 13/16", and reads: "Western Dist Corpn Los Angeles" all in caps. The Perfin itself measures 5 1/2" long by 5/16" high - five holes high. Does anybody dispute his claim?? Editor's Note: We have in our collection the Perfin used by National Bank of the Republic, a now defunct bank located in Chicago. This Perfin was a "blanket" Perfin and really, very little is known about it although intensive research has been done by various members of the Club. The Perfin reads: "NBRepublic" - all in capital letters, but the first three letters - "NBR" are 1 1/2 mm high - or 9 holes high. The remaining letters are 8 1/2 mm high, - or 7 holes high. They are spaced so that the ten letters exactly hit the center of the ten stamps which form one row of the ordinary definitive stamps when issued in panes of one hundred. (10x10). In other words, the Perfin die has ten heads, which is not unusual, but what is unusual is that the 10 heads are different and used to spell the name of the company. Whether this was used exclusively for postage stamps, or mostly for identification or cancellation of financial papers, and occasionally for postage stamps is not known. If any member knows, we would like to hear from him, but at this late date, the secret is probably forever lost.
